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ON POINT

The Army recently provided 10 guiding principles for implementing the repeal of the Don't Ask, Don't Tell policy.

The first of which is that leadership matters most – "Commander and senior non-commissioned officer leadership and personal commitment to implementation must be visible and unequivocal." Also included in the guiding principles are the following: standards of conduct apply to every Soldier; treat each other with dignity and respect.

The Guiding Principles are focused on emphasizing our role as professional Soldiers, while keeping education and training simple. The principles state that there is no expectation to change religious or moral views, and that good order and discipline will be maintained. The Army guidance reminds Soldiers to stay focused on their mission.
