## Marines and Sailors return from across the globe

Nearly 300 Marines and Sailors set foot back onto Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, N.C., Feb. 2 through Feb. 5, returning home from deployments spanning the globe.

The majority of the Marines and Sailors were deployed to Afghanistan from six months to a year. Meanwhile Marines and Sailors with Marine Attack Squadron 231 spent more than 10 months at sea attached to the 22nd Marine Expeditionary Unit, which is one of the longest MEU floats since WWII, said Maj. Ben Hutchins, officer in charge of the VMA-231 detachment.

"Words can't describe how I feel right now. I've been waiting for this moment for a long time," said Lance Cpl. Kristofer H. Lawrence, a chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear defense specialist with Marine Wing Headquarters Squadron 2, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward). "The best part about being deployed was the experience and knowledge I gained in my job. The worst thing, of course, was being away from my family, but now I'm home and the feeling of accomplishment I have right now is great."

### 2nd MAW's F-35B training squadron changes command

**EGLIN AIR FORCE BASE, Fla.** – Lt. Col. James B. Wellons relinquished command of Marine Fighter Attack Training Squadron 501 to Lt. Col. David R. Berke during a change of command ceremony in the squadron's hangar aboard Eglin Air Force Base, Fla., Friday.

In attendance of the ceremony was Lt. Gen. John M. Paxton, II Marine Expeditionary Force commanding general and Maj. Gen. Jon M. Davis, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing commanding general.

In April 2010 the squadron was activated and designated as the VMFAT-501 Warlords. It was formerly Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 451 which was deactivated in January 1997. The squadron now serves as the F-35B Lightning II training squadron.

## Bold Alligator: VMA-542, 231 land aboard USS Kearsarge

**ABOARD USS KEARSARGE, At Sea** – Marine Air Ground Task Forces carry airpower with them wherever they go, be it a full scale Marine Expeditionary Force or a smaller Marine Expeditionary Unit.

Twelve AV-8B Harriers from Marine Attack Squadrons 542 and 231 arrived aboard USS Kearsarge Feb. 1 to serve as part of the aviation combat element during Exercise Bold Alligator 2012, for which they plan to provide airpower in support of the largest amphibious exercise in the past 10 years.

The two squadrons plan to operate the Harriers from Kearsarge throughout the exercise.

"We'll be conducting active air defense and combat air patrols to make sure that no other aircraft are going to come in and attack the ship," said Capt. Arthur Q. Bruggeman, director of safety and standardization for VMA-231. "We'll execute offensive anti-air warfare by attacking the enemy's aerial capability, like air bases, anti-aircraft systems and other fighters. Additional offensive air support includes close air support, armed reconnaissance and strike coordination."

Marines of VMA-231 and 542 will also be spending time getting acquainted with ship life, which is different than operations from their home station of Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, N.C.

"This is my first time being on a ship before, so it's different to see," said Cpl. Blake R. Phillips, a Harrier engine mechanic for VMA-231. "Only about three of 27 of us in our shop have been on ship before for a deployment. When we do deploy, it would be easier to get in the swing of things because we already kind of know the ship."

Getting to know the ship beforehand can pay dividends in a combat situation, according to Sgt. Kenneth W. Bowman, an aviation ordnance specialist of VMA-542. Bowman has had previous experience aboard ship.

"I've done several small things on ships, doing work ups and then went out on the Kearsarge," said Bowman about his last deployment. "We were working all deployment long and at the end we hit Libya. Because of everything we had done up to that point we were moving bombs fast when it was time. We would send them out with full loads, they'd drop their bombs and come back, hit the deck without shutting down, reload them and send them back out again. If that crew had not had enough prior experience on the ship that would have been impossible."

This exercise represents the Navy and Marine Corps' revitalization of the full range of amphibious

After three weeks of studying in the classroom, communication Marines with Marine Wing Communications Squadron 28 took their lessons outside Jan. 30, unrolling wire and positioning tents and antennas for a field exercise dubbed "Grizzly Spartan."

"Grizzly Spartan is a unique opportunity for active and reserve communication squadrons to work together," said Capt. Jason Falivene, operations officer for MWCS-28. "The goal of this exercise is to provide advanced military occupational specialty training, culminating in a realistic exercise that prepares the communications Marines to support the command and control requirements of the ACE (aviation combat element)."

MWCS-48, a reserve unit out of Great Lakes, Ill., joined MWCS-28 for the exercise, and the two units have been working hand-in-hand, conducting classes and hands-on training in preparation for the exercise, which is transitioning into its next phase that the Marines call "shoulder

# Chaplain's Corner : Recovering from the church

When I was a kid, my parents got me a banner to hang in my bedroom. It was Lucy, from Peanuts. I wanted Farah Fawcett Majors, but for some reason, my folks thought Lucy Van Pelt on a flannel banner was a smarter move.

Lucy was shouting and the caption was, "I love mankind. It's people I can't stand." Fifty years later, I remember that banner. I also remember the Farah Fawcett Majors poster, but that's another story.

I wonder why my parents got me that banner. I wonder if they saw Lucy's outlook in my young personality. I wonder if some of that perspective colors my thinking today. I haven't quite figured it out, but I'm working on it.

In his book, "Soul Survivor: How Thirteen Unlikely Mentors Helped My Faith Survive the Church," Philip Yancey writes, "When someone tells me yet another horror story about the church, I respond, 'Oh, it's even worse than that. Let me tell you my story.' I have spent most of my life in recovery from the church."

I'm still reading Yancey's book, and so far, I'm impressed with his honesty ... Even when he's being critical of some of his former beliefs and actions ... Even when he's honest about his shortcomings today. But, "surviving the church"? That phrase draws me back to Lucy Van Pelt's declaration that she loves mankind but can't stand people.

I think I'm in the mode of recovery from the church. I haven't had any of the incredibly destructive experiences Philip Yancey had. Far from it. But, I still think I'm in recovery mode.

My faith journey has taken me from Catholic to Agnostic, to Lutheran Brethren, to Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Every church (denomination) has treated me well. So, what am I recovering from? The church. It's made up of way too many people like I am.

"I love the church. It's church people I can't stand." might be one way of translating Lucy's declaration into my relationship with the church. In the grand scheme of things, "the church" is God's idea. It's His design. So, "I love the church."

But in the small scheme of things, God's great idea is made up of people. All kinds of people.

And people can be a pain in the neck. I know. I am one. So, "It's church people I can't stand."

I'm recovering from churches that are way too rigid. I'm recovering from churches that are way too self-centered. I'm recovering from churches that are way too short-sighted. I'm recovering from churches that reflect way too many of my weaknesses.

God is in the recovery business. His plan, which seems odd to me, is to use the church to do the recovering. Not the building but the people. Broken? Certainly. Recovered? Definitely.

Where was Farah Fawcett Majors when I needed her? I wonder where the church was when she needed us. Maybe we were in church. We need to recover and be the church. Does anyone have any thumbtacks? I have a poster to put up.

## Aerially refueling for 50 years

Marine Aerial Refueler Transport Squadron 252 Marines gathered in the squadron's hangar Feb. 1 to celebrate the unit's 50th year anniversary.

It was Feb. 1 in 1962 when the unit officially became an aerial refueling squadron after receiving its first C-130 in October of 1961.

"Gaining the C-130 was a huge milestone for us," said Sgt. Alan J. Stinar, the squadron's assistant historical officer and a fixed wing aircraft mechanic. "There is no other aircraft that can do everything the C-130 does."

The squadron was busy in the spring of 1962, slowly transitioning to the C-130 while still operating two military transport aircraft, the Fairchild R4Q and the Douglas R4D. Multitasking on multiple platforms was difficult, but the Marines embodied the spirit of adapt and overcome, said Stinar.

"Balancing three different aircraft while training and going on deployments was an outstanding accomplishment," he said.

In celebration of the anniversary, Lt. Col. Charles J. Moses, commanding officer of VMGR-252, gave a speech to the Marines followed by a cake cutting ceremony.

"There isn't a lot of change in the future for VMGR-252," said Maj. Michael J. Carreiro, the executive officer for VMGR-252. "We have been successful in the last 50 years, and we plan to keep doing our mission in this manner."

The Marines of Marine Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron 2 deploy frequently, mostly across the world, and being Johnny-on-the-spot with their cargo is essential. Cpl. "The best part of this job is the travel," said Vang. "This is the second most deployed MOS (military occupational specialty), right behind the grunts (infantry)."

Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point held its first official tactical bike patrol course Jan. 30 through Feb. 3 at the Training and Education building on the air station.

Craven Community College conducted the one-week-long course, designed to train law enforcement how to ride under unforeseen circumstances. Twelve Marines and civilians with the MCAS Cherry Point Provost Marshal's Office participated.

"Any police officer can ride a bike," said Lance Cpl. Christopher W. Pettey, a military police officer with PMO. "But the class is designed for the officers to learn their limitations while riding."

Bike patrolling is a way to try to establish a greater law enforcement presence on base because of the many advantages there can be to using bikes instead of cars.

"You can go places on a bike that you can't in a car," said Cpl. Stephen E. Partridge, a military police officer with PMO.

To test the Marines' endurance, they went on a 25-mile bike ride on base, which was a buildup to the 70-mile ride they completed toward the end of the course. The Marines also learned how to tactically employ their bikes in a hostile environment, where they may need to use a pistol or do take downs from a bike.

Being on a bike makes it possible to go in between houses, down stairs and even ride in the hallways of the barracks, said Partridge.

The course showed the Marines that constantly riding a bike can be exhausting, but at the same time, it is a change of pace from what they're used to.

"You have to be in good physical condition to be a part of the bike patrol," Pettey said. "I'm looking forward to seeing how the bike patrol works for the community."

## Afghanistan chapel dedicated to fallen Marines

**CAMP BASTION, Afghanistan**—A newly-constructed chapel here was dedicated in a ceremony Jan. 31 to Marines who made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their country.

During the ceremony, troops gathered at the chapel to read scripture, sing songs and watch the placement of polished wood plaques bearing the names of their fallen brothers.

"Originally, the chapel was just going to be called the 'Flightline Chapel,'" said U.S. Navy Capt. Rondall Brown, command chaplain for 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward). "After reflecting on the loss and the sacrifice of these men, this chapel had to stand for something more."

The Flightline Memorial Chapel is now dedicated to all members of the Marine Corps aviation community who have lost their lives serving in southwestern Afghanistan.

"I looked at these men and their faithfulness to their commitment to protecting our freedoms, to the point that they gave their own lives for it," Brown said.

The chapel, a small, unassuming metal building, sits just across the street from hangars where Marine Corps helicopters launch around the clock providing air support for NATO's International Security Assistance Force troops fighting insurgency throughout southwestern Afghanistan.

Brown said the chapel will serve as a place of reflection for troops of all faiths and stand as a sanctuary from the stresses of deployment.

"When you first walk in, the first thing you will see are plaques bearing the names of fallen heroes," said Brown. "Unfortunately, I know that they will not be the last to pay such a steep price, and this chapel stands for all of those who gave their life and those that will in the future."

The fallen Marines served as pilots, maintainers, crew chiefs and in other ground support roles in the Marine Corps aviation community. The Marine Corps uses a variety of aircraft in Afghanistan, ranging from light attack helicopters that provide close-air support to ground troops, to the MV-22B Osprey tiltrotor aircraft used to move troops and equipment throughout the battlespace.

"I feel that, though small, this is the most fitting gesture," said Brown. "These men fought and made the ultimate sacrifice to defend the rights we all hold dear."

"Our freedom of speech, our freedom to worship or not to worship is possible because of them," Brown continued. "Their sacrifice is what allows this chapel to exist as a place of sanctuary and reflection for all troops still fulfilling the mission in Afghanistan."





operations to include operating aviation combat elements from a sea-based platform. With the majority of Marines experiencing life on ship for the first time, this exercise will allow them to work under unique conditions from an amphibious ship.

"What's unique to this, for a Harrier squadron, we usually identify nine pilots to work up for a Marine Expeditionary Unit," said Bruggeman. "For us, we're taking an entire squadron and putting them on one ship. We don't usually get to work with F/A-18s, Prowlers and C-130s all in one exercise; that's usually pretty difficult to coordinate."

Bruggeman also said the exercise is unique because in a typical Marine Expeditionary Unit there are often various rotary wing aircraft operating from the same ship. During Bold Alligator, the Kearsarge plans to be a "Harrier carrier" vessel with no other Marine aircraft residing on board.

2nd MAW (Fwd.) accepted responsibility of coalition air combat efforts in the Regional Command Southwest area of operations from 3rd MAW (Fwd.) in early March 2011. Now approximately one year later, 2nd MAW (Fwd.) will hand the reigns back over to 3rd MAW (Fwd.), based in MCAS Miramar, Calif.

"It feels amazing to be home after all this time," said Staff Sgt. Nathan L. Reinke, the mobility chief for MWHS-2. "It was a long year and there's nothing better than coming back home to my wife and my boys. Now it's time to be with them again."

The anticipation seemed evident at each return as the family members and friends waited for their Marines and Sailors to return.

"I'm excited but also nervous and anxious for him to be home," said Jen Reinke, spouse of Staff Sgt. Reinke. "He's been on many deployments and this time his second son was born while he was home on his two weeks of recovery. I'm so proud of him but I'm also just ready for him to be home."

This is only the first wave of 2nd MAW (Fwd.) Marines and Sailors, returning home, with several more to come in the following weeks.

Throughout the deployment at sea or in Afghanistan the Marines and Sailors carried out thousands of missions, including troop transport, aerial resupply, close-air support and tactical recovery of aircraft and personnel.

Lt. Col. Thomas J. Witzak, the commanding officer for MWHS-2 welcomed home many of the Marines and Sailors who returned home Feb. 5.

"Marines deploy, that's what we do," said Witzak. "The most important thing right now is for these Marines to be back with their families and friends. They did an excellent job and now it's time for some rest."

In August 2009, Wellons reported to Eglin AFB, Fla., where he assumed command of VMFAT-501 April 2, 2010.

surfing."

Shoulder surfing starts with MWCS-28 in command of the area of operation, giving MWCS-48 a chance to observe. The following week the squadrons will switch, allowing the reservists to take the helm of the operation.

"The last two weeks is the culminating point of the evolution," said Capt. Duane Wright, MWCS-48 detachment commander and an electronics maintenance officer.

Wright said the first three weeks of the exercise were focused on job related classes, taught by MWCS-28 at the communications training center out of Marine Corps Base Camp Johnson.

"It's been awesome working with MWCS-48," said Sgt. Delrico Perkins, a digital multi-channel wideband transmission equipment operator with MWCS-28. "We have built off of each other both on and off duty."

The classes covered basic and advanced levels of satellite and terrestrial transmission systems, along with networking fundamentals, utilities and tactical telephonic switch board operations. The II Marine Expeditionary Force Communications Training Center also provided training.

"This training is important to the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing because all Marines need select training," said Falivene. "It's the building block approach."

"This has been very interesting and a great opportunity for the reservists," said Sgt. Johanna Garcia, a field radio operator with MWCS-48. "The refresher courses for MWCS-28 are all new to us, and it's good to see the Marines get a chance to learn on new gear like the wireless point to point link, or the WPPL."

Grizzly Spartan continues until Feb. 10, and has already spread to MCB Camp Johnson, MCB Camp Lejeune and Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point.

"The key to take away from this entire evolution is the integration of active and reserve communication squadrons and how it can be done seamlessly," said Wright. "It's very common for reserve units to augment active forces in a deployed environment, and the success of this evolution will demonstrate what Marine forces reserve can bring to the table in that capacity."

Nearly 20 administrators, teachers and service providers from across North Carolina participated in a "Boot Camp for Educators" seminar aboard Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point Friday.

"This event is a co-sponsored event by Family Team Building and the School Liaison Program," said Donna Bagley, school liaison with the Cherry Point Community Planning and Liaison office. She said it was the third time the organizations hosted the event.

The purpose of the event was to expose educators to military culture and help them understand the needs that are unique to military children, said Bagley.

Bagley said she feels the event is critical because of the role MCAS Cherry Point plays in the community and how important it is for everyone to understand each other's unique perspective.

"The installation benefits because we get an idea of what it is that schools need," she said. "The kids are the ones that ultimately benefit from this the most because teachers really understand that transitioning can be extremely difficult for some kids."

This is the third year the event has been hosted aboard MCAS Cherry Point, and attendance was at its peak. It is critical that air station organizations get as many educators as possible to attend future boot camps, said Davis.

# From the clinic:

## Personal health measures for the prevention and control of Norovirus

**RALEIGH, N.C.** – Throughout January, several local health departments across North Carolina have reported multiple outbreaks of norovirus, prompting state public health officials to issue advice on steps everyone can take to avoid this common and unpleasant gastrointestinal illness.

"The most important message we have right now is that people who are ill with vomiting or diarrhea should not work, go to school or attend daycare while they are having symptoms," said state epidemiologist, Dr. Megan Davies. "Everyone needs to wash their hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and water. This is the most effective way to protect yourself and others against norovirus, since hand sanitizers alone are not as effective against this hardy virus."

Norovirus infection usually presents as acute-onset vomiting, watery non-bloody diarrhea with abdominal cramps, and nausea. Low-grade fever also occasionally occurs, and diarrhea is more common than vomiting in children. Dehydration is the most common complication, especially among the young and elderly, and may require medical attention. Norovirus infections usually last 1-3 days. If you are still having symptoms after 3 days, you should probably call your health care provider for medical advice.

**To keep from becoming sick:**

- **Wash hands frequently** – Always after toilet visits and before eating food prepared by someone else.
- **Use soap and warm water** – Alcohol-based hand sanitizers may not be effective against norovirus.
- **Avoid buffet meals** – Especially during periods of widespread community illness of norovirus.

**If you are sick or you are caring for someone who is sick:**

- **Wash hands frequently** – Always after toilet visits and before preparing food/drink for yourself.
- **Use soap and warm water** – Alcohol-based hand sanitizers may not be effective against norovirus.
- **Clean and disinfect surfaces** – Contaminated with

vomit/stool immediately using a bleach-based household cleaner, or dilute household bleach 1:10 in water (must be mixed fresh daily). Never use concentrated bleach.

• **Immediately remove and wash** – Clothing, towels, or bed linens that may be contaminated with vomit/stool using hot water and a detergent.

• **Take a shower several times** – While actively sick with vomiting or diarrhea.

• **Carefully wash and rinse** – Fruits and vegetables before consuming.

• **If you are sick, don't go to work or school, and stay at home if at all possible.**

• People who are infected with norovirus should not prepare food while they have symptoms and for 3 days after they recover from their illness. Food that may have been contaminated by an ill person should be disposed of properly.

There is no specific therapy for norovirus gastroenteritis. Symptomatic therapy consists of replacing fluid losses and correcting electrolyte disturbances through oral and intravenous fluid administration.

**Breakfast foods for your brain****CONTRIBUTED STORY**

MCAS CHERRY POINT

Reams of studies show that fueling the brain with breakfast is important for thinking and learning. That's the basis for the federal School Breakfast Program, which aims to make sure every child begins the school day with a morning meal.

Basically, eating after an all-night fast replenishes the brain with glucose, also called blood sugar, which seems to improve memory — but some breakfasts are better than others.

Research has shown that slower-burning, also called "low glycemic index," or "low-GI", carbohydrates, think oatmeal or a high-fiber, whole-grain cereal, are associated with sustained concentration and attention.

In other words, your brain won't check out mid-morning. Choose a breakfast with a little protein, which keeps you fuller for longer too, to stay satisfied until lunch. After all, who can stay focused with a grumbling tummy?

Try these attention-enhancing breakfasts:

- Whole-grain cereal with nonfat milk and sliced banana
- Oatmeal topped with dried fruit and slivered almonds
- A cup of low-fat yogurt topped with sliced berries and
