

Officials ammend regulations

Policy redefines maternity care

amended the definition of medical emergency in the Civilian Health and Medical Plan for Uniformed Services regulation to include emergency maternity in patient

THIS ACTION CORRECTS "catch 22" situation which has prevented some eligible CHAM-PUS inpatient maternity coverage for emergencies associated with their pregnancies. John Moxley III, M.D., Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) explained that, through an oversight, the current CHAMPUS definition of medical energy continuous and the contraction of the cont through an CHAMPUS definition of meuron emergency omitted any reference to maternity care. The amendment clarifies CHAMPUS policy and establishes that a nonavailability statement is not required for maternity-related inpatient care when the care meets the definition of a medical

DR. MOXLEY STATED, "As with any other emergency, in the case of pregnancy a medical emergency must involve a sudden and unexpected medical compli-cation which puts the mother, or baby, or both, at risk."

Examples of medical emer-gencies related to pregnancy include, but are not limited to, hemmorrhage, ruptured mem-brane with prolapsed cord, shock, unconsciousness, heart attack, unconeciousness, heart attack, stroke and injury (as from an automobile accident). Pain alone would not qualify a maternity case as an emergency, nor would insipient birthafter the 34th week of gestation unless an otherwise qualifying medical complication

THE POLICY CLARIFIcation concerning emergency maternity admissions is retroactive to June 1, 1977, the date the current regulation was implemented.

implemented.
Therefore, any beneficiary who has been denied CHAMPUS benefits for a maternity admission which occurred during this period and which she believes could qualify as an emergency should resubmit the claim(s). Such claims should be sent to the CHAMPUS Fiscal Intermediary serving the area where the admission occurred, with a request that the case be reopened

Due to the retroactive nature of

this policy clarification, the filing deadline on such claims is extended to Dec. 31 1981. The deadline on claims for care received in 1981 is Dec. 31, 1982.

WHEN FILING A CHAMPUS claim for emergency care (whether maternity or other) beneficiaries are advised to —

• provide as much detail as ossible about the circumstances

of the emergency and

obtain a statement from the attending physician telling why immediate hospitalization was required and why the patient could not be transported to the nearest uniformed service hospital. If the emergency involves a maternity case, the physician's statement must include a certification that he/she had not been seeing the patient during her pregnancy

Falsifying information on a claim form (such as a fraudulent resident address) in order to circumvent the 40-mile rule applicable to nonavailability statements not involving an emergency is considered to be fraud. Such actions will, at a minimum, result in the govern-ment recovering any payments made on such a claim.

FOR FURTHER information about emergency maternity care, pregnant beneficiaries who are contemplating travel, particularly during the last six weeks of pregnancy, should contact the health benefits advisor at a uniformed service medical

AFTER THE PLEBISCITE vote (statewide people's vote), President Eisenhower signed the Statehood Proclamation, declaring Aug. 21, 1959 as Admission

Day.

Committee lifts limits

WASHINGTON, D.C., (EMB ewsService) — The House NewsService) — The House Armed Services Committee has authorized exchanges in the continental United States to sell continental Onted States to seil microwave ovens and has removed most of the cost-price limits that prevent domestic exchanges from selling items costing over a certain amount.

HASG CHAIRMAN Melvin Price (D-III.) said the committee wants exchanges to promote the sale of American made products whenever possible.

Exchange officials were pleased with the developments. Bill Yingst, Deputy Merchandising Director at the Army and Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES), said the elimination of the cost-price limits would help the exchange system buy better models of things like convection ovens and riding mowers. AAFES exchanges can expect microwave ovens to be on their shelves in

about 60 days, he added.
Military families need microwave ovens because both

husband and wife often work, and husband and wife often work, and they don't have the time to prepare meals in regular ovens, said Lt. Cen. R. Dean Tice, Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Military Personnel Policy. Tice, who oversees exchange and commissary operations, has asked the HASC to drop most costprice limits and permit the microwave oven sales.

"THE MILITARY FAMILY is subject to direct mobility not expected of its civilian counterpart." Tice added. Tice also cited microwave ovens'

energy efficiency.





Representative voices ideas

Chairman suggests alternative

WASHINGTON, D.C. (EBM NewsService) — Rep. Richard White (D-Texas), Chairman of the House Armed Services Investigations Subcommittee, thinks the country needs to draft a reserve force to bolster military preparedness, but he admits the country isn't ready for his idea yet.

"YOU DON'T WANT A BIG standing army because it's too costly. White said. "But you would like to have a quick response of trained people."
"I think there are some real deficiencies

in our services today as a result of not having a broad entry of people in the services," he explained. "You might have to get it through some kind of draft

"I'm not sure that we're ready," White added. "I don't think we've got support in the White House. I don't think we've necessarily got support from the whole nation." He did say, however, that "people are getting to the point where they're recognizing the all-volunteer "force has problems."

"I WOULD DEVELOP SUMMER "I WOULD DEVELOP SUMMER camps (Citizens Military Training Camps) where people drafted into the reserves could go and train in their basic course; then they would go in the inactive reserves with a two-week refresher course about every three years," White said. "They wouldn't have to report to a weekly drill session or anything like that unless they wanted to."

White thinks his proposal would get support from his Texas constituents. "Tve gone and talked about ft throughout

my district," he said. "They know where I stand on that."And I haven't had much reaction from students."

White has another suggestion to

improve the role of the reserves: He would allow students to go into the reserves with time or promotion credits after finishing high school ROTC.

TO IMPROVE THE ALL-volunteer force, a program should be implemented

in cooperation with colleges and universities to allow people who enlist to attend college classes, White added. "The enlistee could take night courses, so he's building up education while he's in," White explained. "We need people who are interested in bettering themselves. They've got more self-discipline, and they're probably more intellectually suited to cope with technological demands."


busses are running 25 to 50 percent more than they should. For the most part, this increase is due to the liberty bus schedule.







survival in Korea will vary with the time of year and the geographical location in which a person find himself. In the high, mountainous regions an evader may not be so vulnerable to detection and capture, but if unprotected, he may succumb to exposure in a matter of hours, particularly during winter. During the summer months, if water and food are not ·available, death could result from numerous factors.

The Korean climate varies from one extreme to the other. During the winter months, the basic problems of survival and evasion would be greatly complicated by low temperatures, snow and wind.

THE MAIN concern of the evader in mountainous areas would be to find immediate shelter. The location of this shelter would determine how far the evader has to travel in search of food and water. Traveling in winter conditions may well consume more energy than may be replaced by the limited food available. Also, climbing in these highlands will result in heavy sweating which, in turn, will increase the likelihood of falling victim to exposure.

Dangerous animals are relatively scarce in Korea but any animal, whether wild or domestic, may be dangerous.

Learning disabilities can he a problem for all levels of intellgence — gifted, average or low achieving.
