President signs pay bill, increase set at 10 to 17%

The day before payday, Oct. 14, President Reagan signed into law a \$4.5 billion military pay raise, the largest increase in military pay in more than 30 years. However, due to the late passage of the 1982 military pay bill, the pay raise was not included in paychecks received Oct. 15. The difference is retroactive to Oct. 1 and will be included in the Oct. 30 paychecks.

THE PAY RAISE will mean a 10 percent increase for privates; 10.7 percent for privates first class and lance corporals; 13 percent for corporals; 16.5 percent for sergeants and staff sergeants; and 17 percent for all senior staff noncommissioned officers. All officers will receive a 14.3 percent increase.

The pay increase is targeted at career Marines in an effort to keep experienced sergeants and staff NCOs in the Corps.

According to a Navy Newsgram (41-81), the pay raise represents an annual pay adjustment and a "catch-up" raise designed to return the military pay to the adequate levels set in 1972, the beginning of the all volunteer force.

In addition to the raise in base pay, all officers and enlisted

Marines receiving the Basic Allowance for Quarters will receive a 14.3 percent increase for that allowance. According to fiscal officers at Headquarters Marine Corps, there will be no increase in partial BAQ.

OTHER ELEMENTS OF THE pay raise include advance payment for dependent travel and dislocation allowance, and a new temporary lodging allowance for permanent changes of station within the continental United States. The monthly Basic Allowance of Subsistence for enlisted Marines will increase to \$135 and \$94.39 for officers.

There will also be an expansion of hazardous duty payments, including flight deck hazardous duty pay. Pay rates for enlisted Marines will be increased from \$55 to \$83 per month for all hazardous duty pay.

The pay increase also authorizes overseas emergency leave travel by commercial aircraft when government flights are not available. There will also be an approximate 33 percent increase in aviation career incentive pay for officers with more than six years of aviation service and who are not receiving the aviation bonus.

Diving pay will increase from

\$110 per month to a maximum of \$300 for enlisted Marines and \$200 for officers. The bill also allows for the simultaneous payment of diving pay and one other hazardous duty incentive pay.

THE MINIMUM ENLISTED

flight pay will increase to \$83 per month.

According to the same Navy Newsgram, implementation of some of the new pay and travel improvements will be delayed until after the Defense Appropriations Bill is passed by Congress later this year.

Week emphasizes conservation

"In today's global climate, the key to a secure future is in many ways dependent upon the energy efficiency of Navy and Marine Corps forces."

That statement, penned in a joint letter to Navy and Marine Corps commands by the Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Robert H. Barrow and the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral T.B. Hayward, reaffirmed the need for

Every dollar saved on energy... can be applied to recruiting, training and equipping our operating forces, improving maintenance and upgrading readiness.

"Your command has a responsibility to enlist the greatest support and participation possible to make this year's Energy Awareness Week a success. Energy conservation programs currently instituted within your activity and new energy saving programs requiring command and community support should be made highly visible during Energy Awareness Week."

Marines discover burglarized armory

At approximately 5 a.m. Oct. 13, Marine armorers returning to work discovered that the armory belonging to Weapons Company, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade had been burglarized.

An inventory conducted subsequently revealed that two M-60 machine guns, seven .45 caliber pistols, one M-16A1 rifle, three M203 grenade launchers and a starlight scope are missing. The value of the missing weapons and equipment is estimated at \$10,300.

The Provost Marshal's Office conducted gate searches of vehicles departing the Air Station from 5:30 a.m. Oct. 13 until 4 p.m. the following day.

The theft is under investigation by the Naval Investigative Service.

festival will feature live entertainment, including the nationally acclaimed musician Dan Deardorf who is a victim of muscular dystrophy. Also, there will be an international fashion show, refreshments and material about the United Nations. All funds raised will be used to provide special services for the disabled who visit the zoo.

Sunday — Many churches will feature information about the United Nations in worship services and classes.

Sunday — At 7 p.m. the annual United Nations banquet will be held at the Princess Kaiulani Hotel. Tickets are being sold by U.N.A. Board members, or reservations may be made by calling the UNICEF office.

Monday — The annual U.N. Art Poster Contest exhibit opens at the Kahala Mall with a reception from 3:30 till 4:30 p.m. The exhibit will continue through Nov. 1. This statewide contest reaches into every school in Hawaii.

Saudis encourage oil market glut

Japan, which must import every drop of oil it uses, recently declined an offer from Mexico to sell it 200,000 more barrels a day on a long-term basis. Japan lately has been able to buy all the oil it needs, and at lower prices than Mexico was asking. Besides, oil consumption in Japan has dropped by about 15 percent in the last year.

shock when a French oil company announced that it was cutting its purchases in half, to 50,000 barrels a day, and for the same reasons. With less publicity, U.S. oil imports from Mexico have declined from 700,000 barrels a day earlier this year to about 400,000 barrels now. That decline is part of a pattern. A year ago the United States was buying a little over 7 million barrels a day of crude oil and refined products overseas; last week the figure was down to slightly over 5 million barrels a day.

Some oil analysts now figure that the world oil surplus—the excess of production over consumption—has reached 3 million barrels a day, despite the production cutbacks by some major exporters. Nigeria, for example, has slashed its output nearly in half, to about 1 million barrels a day. Libya's production has dropped by more than 500,000 barrels a day. Still, the glut grows, because Saudi Arabia, which accounts for more than 40 percent of total Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries produc-

tion, is flooding the market in an effort to force a unified and lower price for oil on its cartel partners. When the Saudis get their unified price, they will rein in their excessive production to try to dry up the surplus.

One OPEC official has predicted that this contest of wills could last through 1982. Libya and Nigeria, which charge more for their oil than other countries, so far seem to fear the precedent of price cuts more than the loss of markets. Britain, a non-OPEC exporter, would rather try to hold onto its markets, and has cut its price more than \$4 a barrel. Mexico's oil minister thought it would be wise to do the same; his action gave his political enemies the chance to force him from office. Mexico now talks of partly restoring \$2 of its \$4 June 1 price cuts while simultaneously slashing production. The effectiveness of that approach remains to be tested.

required to prevent a demand surge that will again send prices soaring.

The answer will depend to some extent on the pace of economic recovery in the recession-hit industrial countries. It will depend to a probably greater extent on how well conservation practices are followed. Here the record looks promising.

Price-induced conservation may be working better than anyone anticipated. In the United States alone, according to a recent study by Lee Schipper of the Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory, conservation measures taken since 1973 are saving up to 6 million barrels of oil a day, with some of the most notable gains being in the residential sector. The full fruits of conservation—through building insulation, improved auto mileage, cogeneration and the like—are yet to be realized. That is the hope for the future.

At some point, equilibrium in the oil market will be restored, probably on the terms that Saudi Arabia wants. The question then will be whether the consuming nations can exercise the restraint

Balanced against this hope is the danger that stable or even declining prices might encourage a relaxation of efforts to hold down the growth rate in oil demand, paving the way for a restoration of a disruptive sellers' market.

ALL ABOUT HAIR

Everyone wants beautiful shiny bouncy hair, and the basis of healthy hair is its condition. I find most people are willing to condition their hair to death to achieve this goal. Students learn about home fire hazards

More than 1,000 pupils of Mokapu Elementary School were educated about the hazards of home fires during a fire prevention demonstration at the school Oct. 9.

The Crash, Fire and Rescue Branch, and the Air Station's Fire Department showed the attentive school kids how to extinguish a house fire and explained the functions of various fire-fighting apparatus. They later answered a barrage of questions.

Winners of the fire prevention poster contest were also awarded their prizes.

According to Robert Porter, coordinator for the event, the objective was to teach the children the importance of fire safety in the home. "It takes only eight to 10 minutes for a house to burn to the ground, so it's important that these children know what can happen," he said.

Porter said the fire prevention demonstrations have been conducted for the past 11 years. Each year featured a different theme such as appliance fires, garage fires and so on.

Navy personnel will support research effort

Polar scientists to explore islands

WASHINGTON — Polar scientists will soon explore three bleak Antarctic islands known to contain fossil dating as far back as 100 million years in an effort to learn more about how the continents of the world split and drifted apart, disrupting oceans, climates and animal life.

The researchers from four universities will work on the James Ross, Snow Hill and Seymour islands, three desolate areas in the Weddell Sea at the northern tip of the Antarctic Peninsula. This expedition — the first major U.S. research effort on the eastern part of the Antarctic Peninsula — is part of the 1981-1982 U.S. Antarctic Research Program which is funded and co-

ordinated by the National Science Foundation.

THE FIRST increment of two-pronged logistics support operation has left for Antarctica to help start the 1981 season for the U.S. Antarctic Research Program. About 100 Navy personnel and 85 employees of ITT Antarctic Services left

their home bases in California and New Jersey and will be followed by hundreds of others who will support the national research effort on the ice-covered continent. Before their mission ends they will have moved hundreds of scientific personnel and tons of supplies and equipment to Antarctica. It is the 17th year that such

support has been supplied for the scientific effort under the direction of the National Science Foundation. The Navy effort is conducted by Commander, Naval Support Force, Antarctica, and Antarctic Development Squadron Six, VX-6. The support operation includes maintaining communications, weather forecasting, air

traffic control, airlifting thousands of tons of cargo, control of fuel and cargo ships, ice-breaker support and medical services.

DURING THE austral summer season, the Commander, Naval Support Force Antarctica is in charge of a varying number of people which peaks at nearly 2,000 at the end of January. They are from units of the Navy, Army, Air Force, Coast Guard and the Military Sealift Command. During the winter period the number drops to fewer than 100 on the continent. Units of the Royal New Zealand army and air force and the Royal Australian army also help support in exchange for U.S. assistance in their own Antarctic programs.

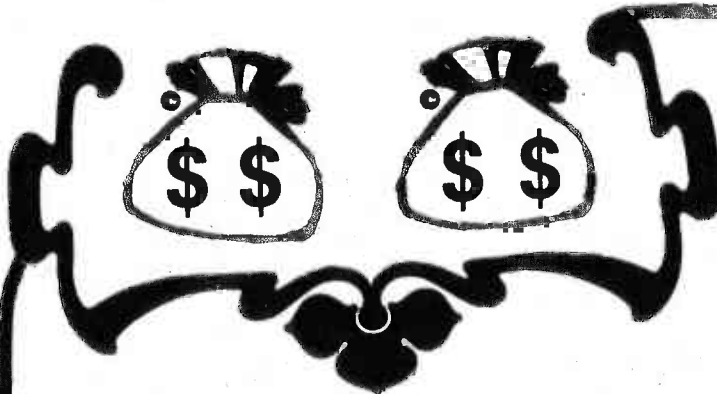

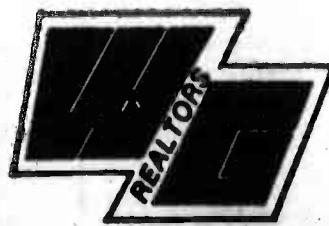

blems involving this facility — appointments, the staff, referrals — are anticipated and would fall to me. I will maintain a line of communication between the patients and staff."

Kuhn's position is mirrored in other civilian and military hospitals that began developing a patient representative as early as the 1950s. The

position proved to be an effective means of not only dealing with patient complaints but also as a way for management to ensure that programs within the hospital were operating efficiently. In the area of risk management, the position has proven to be very cost effective.

As patient representative, Kuhn can move freely throughout the

hospital and deal with an amazing diversity of problems — some social, some financial, some problems with the staff.

THE BOTTOM line is that Kuhn's job feels lost in the system has a person to talk to about problems, real or imagined. Kuhn's job is to look into the individual situation as

quickly as possible and find a solution.

If there is a problem that cannot be resolved through his contacts in the various clinics, then Kuhn reports to the hospital commander through Lieutenant Colonel Alton Sheek, Chief, Clinical Support Division.

The patient representative is also an

asset from management's point of view. Kuhn will be tasked with problems which most ultimately result in optimum delivery of patient care. "He will also keep statistical information," says Sheek, "to apprise the command of trends, including types of patient complaints, procedures within the hospital that are not working, or a problem in interpersonal relationship between patient and staff."

"I THINK that a lot of patient problems are probably caused by misunderstandings or presumptions," says Kuhn. "The position will be a challenge, no doubt about it, but I really enjoy relating to

patients and their needs."

Much of his understanding of patient problems were finely tuned during his assignment as supervisor of Pediatrics Clinic, Hickam Air Force Base.

"My job there was one of continual education," Kuhn said. "I'd ask the parents if they understood what the doctor had told them. I found that usually they were so concerned about the child's condition that they either didn't hear or interpret correctly. By taking the time, I was able to ease some of their anxiety and clarify the patient care instructions. I think I'll be involved in

a lot of education here too."

KUHN served at Tripler from 1974-1976 as Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of clinics and was also assistant director of the Emergency Medical Technician Program.

After his retirement from the Army in 1977, Kuhn was an Emergency Room Nurse at Straub Hospital in Honolulu. Prior to his selection as patient representative, Kuhn was assigned to the Department of Nursing, Anesthesia Nursing Section. Patients with problems are encouraged to visit Kuhn in his office.

Fellowship program offers experience

The President's Commission on White House Fellowships has announced the availability of application forms for the 1982-1983 program.

A Federal Information Center spokeswoman explained that the White House Fellowship Program was implemented in 1964 by former President Lyndon Johnson to provide outstanding individuals with first hand experience in governing the nation.

THERE ARE NO educational requirements and no special career or professional categories. Applicants are judged on high

levels of achievement early in their careers which indicates potential for leadership and community or professional contributions.

Applicants chosen for the fellowship program will work for the Cabinet Agency, Executive office of the President or the Vice President for a year.

Marines submitting official applications to the commission are required to forward a copy to the Commandant of the Marine Corps, Code TRE. Marines invited for regional interviews will notify CMC upon receiving; such invitation and provide the

results of interviews.

REQUESTS for the application forms must arrive at Headquarters Marine Corps no later than Nov. 15. Completed applications must be submitted no later than Dec. 1. Exceptions to the two deadlines will not be granted.

Marines selected as White

House Fellows will receive regular pay and allowances and permanent change of duty station orders.

Official application forms contain detailed information on the program and the selection procedures leading to final selection of 14 to 20 applicants. Official application forms can be obtained from CMC (Code TRE).

MAKUA VALLEY, Hawaii — Combat engineers from the 1st Platoon of Engineer Company, Brigade Service Support Group, did a bang-up job while in the field here Oct. 5 through 9.

This valley provided a realistic, combat-like environment for those Marines to undergo advanced demolitions training. The exercise is conducted quarterly and was the last phase of a pre-deployment training cycle. The engineers covered everything from squad tactics to land navigation.

During the week the engineers destroyed wood and steel obstacles, using satchel charges and bangalore torpedoes. Linear charges were employed to break through minefields, and roads were cratered to create vehicle obstacles.

Each exercise was conducted in a stress-producing environment. Quarter-pound TNT charges simulated incoming fire. To give the routine an extra blast, tear gas and aggressors were added to help make the demolition tasks more difficult.

Computers simplify work

In this day of automation, more and more businesses and organizations are discovering that computers can make work go faster, easier and more efficient. The Marine Corps is not being left behind on the climb up the computerized ladder. Recently, the Marine Corps converted all service record books to microfiche at Headquarters Marine Corps and pay is now handled through computers.

Another step in the move toward computerization is a program currently in operation called Automated Data Processing Equipment for the Fleet Marine Force.

"THE CONCEPT has a two-fold use," said Captain Cozy Bailey, former Brigade Information Systems Management Officer. "First, it can be used to enter information into computers at the battalion, squadron and certain company levels. SASSY, the Supply Automated Support System, MIMMS, the Marine Corps Integrated Maintenance Management System and unit diary entries are among the types of information which can

be entered into the computer. "The second use for the program is to give individual units the power of having a computer right there at their location. The computers can be used for specific needs," said Capt. Bailey. The equipment used by the Hawaii-based FMF units participating in the ADPE FMF program is part of a \$13.9 million Marine Corps-wide contract with IBM.

COMPUTERS and data processing equipment have been installed at all battalions and squadrons, Headquarters Company, 1st Marine Brigade, Communication Support Company, Headquarters Company, 3d Marines, and the Brigade's Administrative Assistance Unit. Supporting equipment will also be available soon at SASSY Management and the Disbursing Office.

The computers delivered to the different units have been specifically constructed for rough handling and painted green. These Green Machines, the IBM Series One computers, are operated by persons in the military occupa-

tional specialties being served by the computers.

"A THREE-PHASE training program for teaching the Marines how to run their new machines began last May.

"In that step we taught basic theory on what computers are and what ADPE program is all about," said Capt. Bailey.

Phase two lasted until late July. "During this phase we offered some hands-on familiarization training on the actual Green Machines," he explained. During the third phase, which was completed in mid-September, Marines who would be using the equipment met with representatives from Headquarters Marine Corps, Albany, Ga. and Kansas City, Mo.

The machines were delivered the end of August and the entire system, with the exception of Disbursing and SASSY Management, is now in full swing. Units using the system now make SASSY, MIMMS and unit diary information entries as well as other entries onto diskettes instead of the old keypunch cards.

THE DISKETTES are then delivered to a central point for that particular system. Once at the central points, all the information is consolidated and sent to the Remote Job Entry Station in Building 208.

There the information is transmitted from an IBM Series One, known as the White Machine, to the Automated Services Center-Six at Camp H.M. Smith, ASC-6 then stores the information, processes and forwards the information before returning reports to the units.

The ADPE FMF concept will deploy along with Marines as they take their Green Machines with them while participating in the six-month unit deployment program.

"The first units will deploy with the system in November," said Capt. Bailey. "Having the equipment with them will make reporting in the SASSY and MIMMS systems much easier."

The conversion to the computerized way of life seems inevitable. And the Marine Corps, with its Automated Data Processing Equipment, is not being left behind.

Crew chief receives his ultimate job: HMX-1

Gunnery Sergeant Ralph Sutton considers his new duty assignment to be the ultimate job for a crew chief. It just might be,

considering he is being assigned to the Marine Experimental Helicopter Squadron-1.

When the President

of the United States steps off a helicopter, he is stepping off one provided by HMX-1.

GYSGT SUTTON was the Flight Line Chief/Search and

Rescue Crew Chief with Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron since he arrived here in October 1978. He has already left the Air Station for Quantico, Va., where he will work with other Marines of HMX-1, providing helicopter support to the White House.

"I've been requesting HMX-1 on my fitness reports for years," said GySgt Sutton. "I feel really privileged that I was selected to go."

The presidential helicopter section of

HMX-1 is separate and very elite. "You have to work your way into the presidential helicopter section," said GySgt Sutton. He explained that a security investigation is currently being conducted on him. The investigation could take a year to complete. Until GySgt Sutton has his security clearance he will not be working directly with the president's helicopters.

IN THE MEANTIME, says GySgt Sutton "There are several billets avail-

able and I'm not sure which one I'll be getting."

GySgt Sutton was born in Little Rock, Ark. and claims Benton, Ark. as his home. One day in the summer of 1966 he received his draft notice in the mail. He enlisted in the Marine Corps July 27 that year because "four years in Marine Corps aviation sounded a lot better than two years in the Army carrying a rifle."

During his 15 years in the Corps, GySgt Sutton has served twice in the Republic of

Vietnam and twice on Okinawa. He also spent two years recruiting in Jonesboro, Ark. from 1972 to 1973.

IN ADDITION to his Combat Aircrew Wings and 14 awards of the Air Medal, GySgt Sutton's decorations include the Combat Action Ribbon, the Presidential

Unit Citation, the Navy and Meritorious Unit Commendations, three awards of the Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and the Humanitarian Service Medal.

GySgt Sutton, his wife, Marian, and their three children, Cindy, 14, Lance, 12 and Jason, 5, will be arriving in Quantico

soon. "We always wanted to stay in Hawaii, but not now," he said, "not with orders to HMX-1!"

With just a little more than five years left before retirement GySgt Sutton hopes to make HMX-1 his last duty assignment. "The highest goal I could possibly achieve would be to fly the president around."

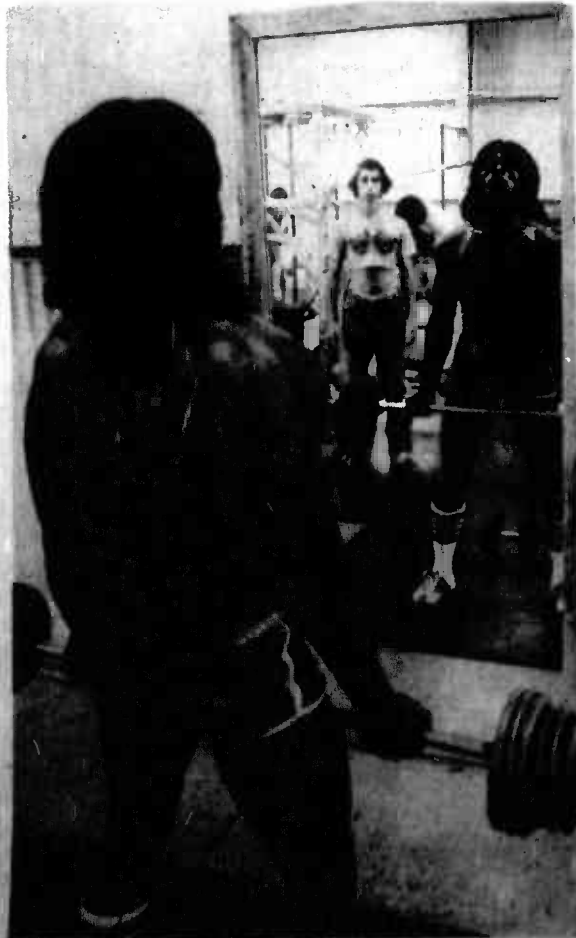

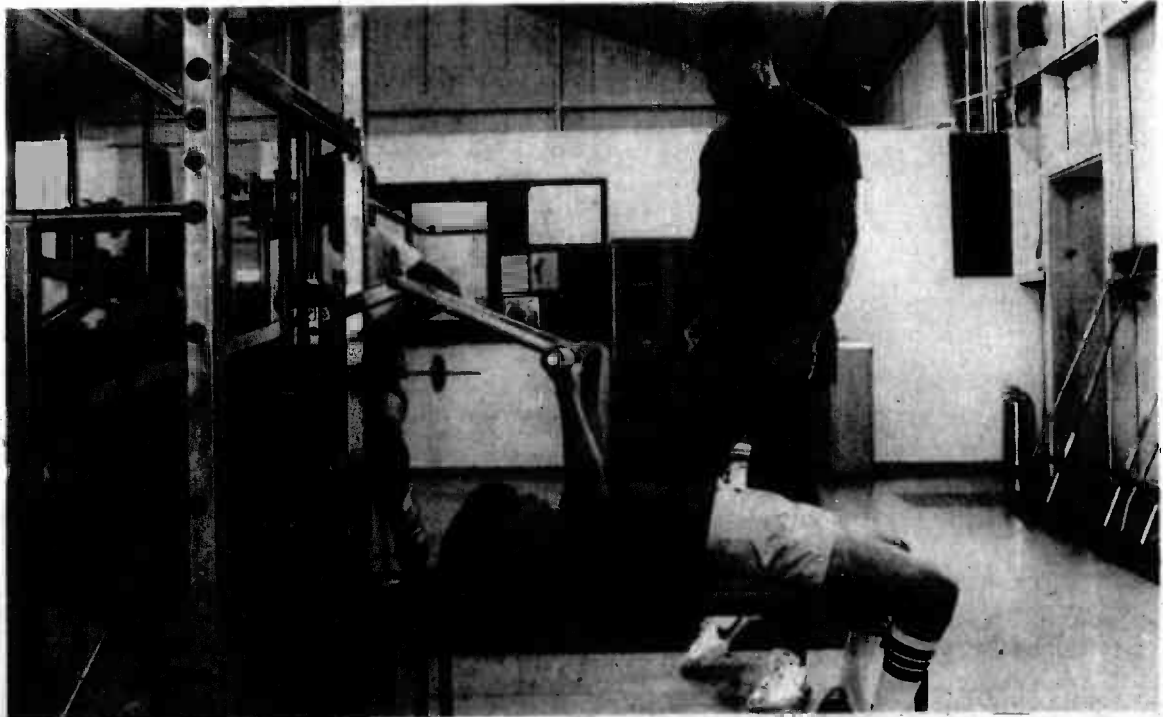
Weight lifters: Program promotes responsibility and enhances youths' comradery
