Marines participate in 'Cobra Gold'

Nations conduct naval exercise

HAT YAI, Thailand—The South Pacific has Bali Hai and Thailand has Hat Yai. Both are distant and exotic sounding names. And both live up to the promise.

Hat Yai is bracketed on the elephant trunk-like, Thai isthmus between the Gulf of Thailand and the Andaman Sea.

IT IS HERE, WHERE THE people are openly friendly but still mysterious, that the jungle spreads across this rugged land with tall teak canopy which blacks out the sun. It is here, too, where the sleepy peace of villages is sometimes broken by gun fire from communist insurgents or bandits slipping back and forth between Thai and Malaysian soldiers, who work both sides of the nearby border.

It is here, amid the protests of the Vietnamese and Kampuchean communists, that the men of the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit, U.S. Seventh Fleet, Royal Thai Navy, Marine Corps and Air Force conducted the largest naval exercise in 15 years since similar operations were held by the Southeast Asian Treaty Organization countries.

With towering storm clouds, monsoon rains and stifling tropic heat, more than 9,000 military men from both countries demonstrated not only U.S. resolve and commitment to this area, but also a spirit of continued

friendship and cooperation.

Even its code name was an exotic sounding nom 'de guerre; Cobra Gold '82.

Cobra Gold was the latest in a series of successful and progressive small scale Thai and U.S. exercises conducted here year by year, explained exercise director Thai vice Admiral Niphon Siritorn. "It combines all the previous exercises we've (U.S. and Thailand) had into one large scale."

Thai Supreme Commander, General Saiyud Kerdpol, explained further, "Cobra Gold confirms the close cooperation between the U.S. and Thai naval forces."

More than that, according to Saiyud, it contributes to the two nations' common goal of peace: "Particularly peace and stability in this region."

AS IF TO DEMONSTRATE backing to Saiyud's words, Thai Prime Minister Prem Tinsulanonda and American Ambassador John Gunther Dean had flown 450 miles south from Bangkok to witness the exercise and to watch leathernecks streak across the beach of The-Pha just south of Hat Yai.

It was the capping of a nine-day exercise, designed to enhance readiness, that started at the Sattahip naval base across the Gulf of Thailand.

It gave sailors and Marines of both nations the opportunity to hone their combat skills in a multi-threat environment; namely practice at

facing opposition from a number of hostile areas.

In the wakes of 27 haze-gray combatants bearing the fluttering red, white and blue national ensigns of the United States and Thailand, were the results of almost four months of involved planning.

"Ships of both nations not only practiced surface warfare, but worked at anti-air, anti-submarine and minesweeping operations," said Niphon. It terminated with Marines of both nations conducting the most difficult of military maneuvers; an amphibious assault.

In the vanguard of the assault waves were the Marines. The Americans, led by Colonel Alan C. McCaulay, consisted of the battalion landing team from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines; 22 aircraft from Marine Medium Helicopter Composite Squadron-165; and support provided by Marine Amphibious Unit Service Support Group-31 based in Hawaii.

They were joined in the beach assault by Royal Thai Marines from 3rd Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment along with OV-10 Broncos and F-5 Fighters from the Royal Thai Air Force's Wings One and Two.

Teamed with support ships of the U.S. 7th Fleet, the Marines had the backing of Amphibious Squadron-7's assault ships.

Perhaps the most striking was the USS Peleliu, an amphibious assault ship. A masterpiece of nautical engineering, the Peleliu's 820 by 106 foot hull includes not only defensive missile and gun systems, but it can discharge Marines through a mix of helicopters while lowering its rear ramp, sending landing vehicles with the tools of war ashore.

Asked if it was a concern that Vietnam and the Soviet Union would condemn the exercise, which they did, General Saiyud said, "It is an ordinary exercise, not intended to challenge anyone, but to boost readiness in sea operations so that we will be able to operate together in the future."

MEANWHILE, VIETNAM AND Kampuchea condemned the exercise as a provocation to the countries of Indochina. Radio Hanoi linked the exercise to increased U.S. military aid to Thailand and said that Washington was planning to use its ally as a springboard for a military return to Southeast Asia's mainland.

However, apparently the Thais do not feel the same. An editorial appearing in the country's second largest English language paper, the *Nation Review* stated, "For a long, long time we have realized that Thailand's national security rests with the Thais. Certainly we would like to accept help from all friendly countries, but in the final analysis we have to rely on ourselves. The basic attitude of the U.S., in our belief, is to help us rely on ourselves."

As the Marines stormed across the beaches near Hat Yai, local villagers cheered, U.S. and Thai liaison officers worked closely together learning from each other. U.S. made-weapons systems interlocked for both countries' forces.

Most importantly, at the end of the exercise, the American forces sailed further south for exercises elsewhere in Asia, while the Thai flag flew alone as it has for its entire history, undominated by any foreign power.

Commandant visits Hawaii leathernecks

"Once when I was at Futenma (Marine Corps Air Station on Okinawa, Japan), I saw two lance corporals standing there, so I thought I'd go over and talk with them — I hardly pass up a chance to do that.

"So I asked one of the young men, 'what outfit are you in?' Quick as a whip he replied: 'summer service alpha, sir.' Well, you ask a dumb question, that's the kind of answer you get."

The Family Theater roared with laughter and with that bit of levity, General Robert H. Barrow, Commandant of the Marine Corps, began his address to brigade and station officers and staff noncommissioned officers.

During his visit here Monday afternoon, the senior Marine told the attentive audience that he was very concerned about the Corps and its future. He predicted that "within the next decade, the Marine Corps will experience a peace-time modernization never seen before.

"The peace-time Marine Corps used to suffer a lot of neglect and we had to remind the public of who we were until the shooting started. That's when we blossomed and flourished," he said. But now, the Commandant declares that that's no longer the case.

"The Corps is no longer being neglected, and the public is asking different questions. They're asking, 'as good as you Marines are, what do you need to be better?'"

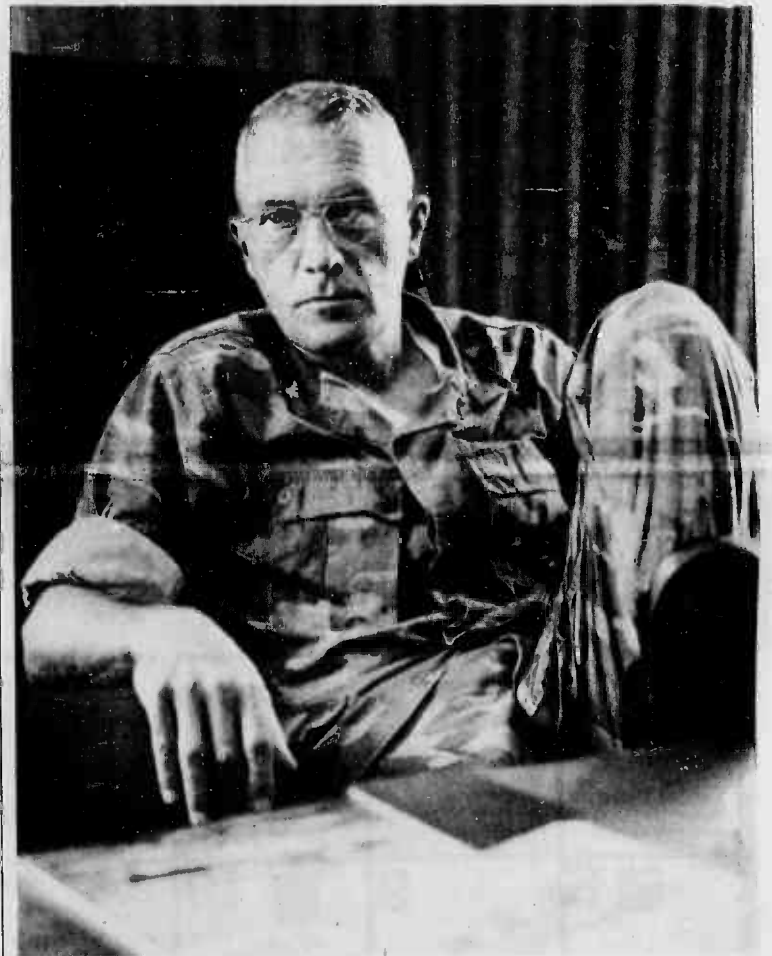
We like those kind of questions," he said.

In his address, the Commandant touched on many important topics concerning the growth, professionalism, and transitory state of the Corps.

The all-volunteer force: "When the other services lowered their entrance scores, we elected to keep ours the same. Twenty percent of the people who enlisted in 1980 would not be able to enlist today."

Recruiting: "We're building for the future. Our recruiters are doing the toughest job in the Marine Corps, and are doing it well."

Farewell

Marines honor retiring chief of staff

Colonel Merritt W. Dinnage concluded more than 30 years of service Friday at his retirement ceremony held at Dewey Square.

General Jacob W. Moore, Commanding General, 1st Marine Brigade, bade farewell to his chief of staff, with the words, "Today the Marines of 1st Marine Brigade are honored to parade and salute a Marine who has served for over quarter of a century. He has proudly served in combat, and with distinction in time of peace. I've only known Colonel Dinnage for a short time, but I can assure you, he has always been ready."

To the colonel, he added, "We thank you and your family for what you represent to our country. Thank you for your great service to your fellow Americans."

In his closing statement, Dinnage acknowledged his wife and gave her a special thank you. "She was at my side whether I was on deployment or at home," he said. "She took care of the family while I was off doing things a Marine does. To Joyce — thank you."

The former 1st Marine Brigade chief of staff told of a question a Marine had asked him concerning whether he felt the Corps was better years before than it is now.

"You are better. You are more intelligent and you are better equipped," Dinnage said proudly. "But all that means nothing if you fail to keep

up your standards. God bless you."

Dinnage served briefly in the Navy and Marine Corps Reserves before being commissioned Dec. 12, 1953.

He attended the Officer Candidates Course and the First Basic Course at Marine Corps Schools, Quantico, Va. before being assigned to the 1st Infantry Battalion, Camp Pendleton, Calif. His billets at Camp Pendleton included platoon commander, special services officer, executive officer, personal affairs officer, investigating officer, and recruiting officer.

In 1956, Dinnage served at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, Calif. as a series commander.

Over the next 20 years the colonel served at Pensacola, Fla.; Corpus Christi, Texas; Okinawa, Japan; Bethesda, Md.; Headquarters Marine Corps; and El Toro, Calif.

From 1966 to 1967, Dinnage served in Vietnam with Marine Corps Composite Reconnaissance Squadron-1.

In 1976, he attended the National War College in Arlington, Va.

Dinnage was assigned as director of operations, Camp H. M. Smith, Hawaii in 1977 and served with Headquarters and Service Battalion, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific in 1978.

In May 1980, Dinnage was assigned as chief of staff, Headquarters Company, 1st Marine Brigade.

Sept. 1, 1982, he will be placed on the Marine Corps Officers Retired List.

SGLI premiums

WASHINGTON — Servicemen's Group Life Insurance premiums have been reduced for 2.2 million active duty service people and 900,000 reservists, according to the Veterans Administration.

New maximum monthly premium is \$4.06 for \$35,000 of coverage, instead of \$5.25.

Cocaine substitutes

WASHINGTON — The Food and Drug Administration said July 8 that "novelty cocaine substitutes" sold under various names "can be as deadly as the high-priced original," and cited several deaths reported from injecting or sniffing the substances.

The substitutes, many of which are sold as a white powder, "can collapse blood vessels, depress heart muscle strength and cause low blood pressure," according to the FDA. The warning was contained in a request to manufacturers of the ingredients to tighten distribution standards or face "further regulatory control."

Many of the imitations contain local anesthetics, such as lidocaine, procaine and tetracaine. FDA commissioner, Arthur Hull Hayes Jr., said his agency is "asking all manufacturers and distributors to help stop this diversion of these relatives of cocaine." He termed the misuse of the substitutes "a newly emerging public health problem with deadly consequences."

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The United States Naval Institute "General Prize Essay Contest" is accepting entries for this year's competition.

Entries must not exceed 4,000 words and must be related to "the advancement of professional, literary and scientific knowledge in the Naval and maritime service and the advancement of the knowledge of seapower."

The contests is open to military personnel and civilians. First prize is \$1,500, a gold medal and life membership in the institute. First honorable mention will win \$1,000 and a silver medal, and second honorable mention will receive \$750 and a bronze medal.

Judging will be based on the entries' analysis and interpretation of the issue. The deadline for entry is Dec. 31.

"Australia, sir!"

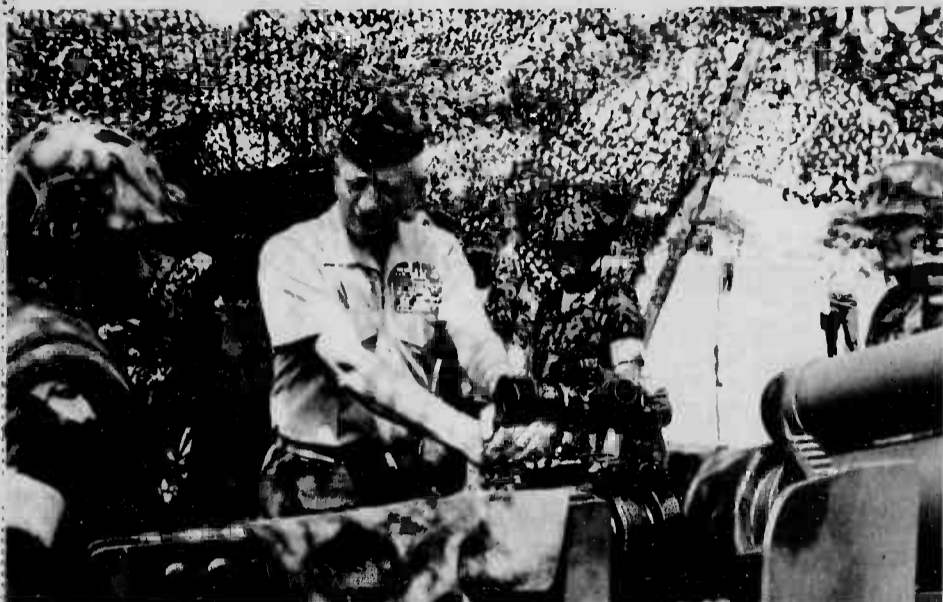
"Why Australia?"

Midshipmen

Prospective Marines see the good and the bad

Four weeks of fast-paced, informative training ended Saturday for 45 prospective Marine Corps officers.

Two platoons of midshipmen, going into their final year at the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., arrived here June 22 for their annual Marine Corps Option Cruise. Over the weeks they immersed themselves in learning what may be in store for them when they are commissioned.

"The emphasis of this cruise was to give them a complete picture of what it is like to be a junior officer in the Fleet Marine Force," commented Captain Monty Montgomery, a history instructor at the academy. Montgomery, who accompanied

the midshipmen as a liaison, added: "The air station was selected because of the air/ground combination. With both elements here, the midshipmen could get a tidy picture of what Corps life is like." This visit was the seventh for academy midshipmen.

Montgomery also said that there are no Marine-oriented classes at the academy, so the cruise was paramount in boosting knowledge of the Corps.

Upon their arrival, the "middles" were each assigned a sponsor. While one platoon observed brigade operations, the other viewed the airwing side of the house. After two weeks, they switched.

The month-long training cycle included familiarization firing of several weapons, observing Command Readiness Evaluation

Exercises, rappelling and inflatable boat and amphibian assault vehicle training.

As a highlight, 15 midshipmen became scuba qualified, and three earned their gold jump wings.

In retrospect, the midshipmen viewed the excursion as beneficial and well packaged. "They showed us the worse with the best," is how Midshipman 1st Class Philip Adams put it. Midshipman Rich Woodford said that he was touched by the healthy attitudes of Marines in the field. "When I saw those guys work under negative conditions, and still stay motivated, it really impressed me," he said.

Also overwhelmed by the infantry lifestyle was Midshipman William Jones. His comments were concise: "I'm going to become an infantry officer, come hell or high water."

His 'goose' is cooked

TRAPPED — A wild mongoose and Rick Coleman, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, don't see eye-to-eye on the present situation. Mongooses are being trapped here in an effort to aid the still bird population, and everyone is asked to stay away from the traps. Still chicks are easy prey for the lively mongoose, and so are unsuspecting fingers if someone tries to poke at a trapped animal. It isn't known how many chicks are killed each year by mongooses, Coleman said, but in 1978 about 700 of the predators were trapped and the still made significant population gains. More than 700 mongooses are expected to be trapped this year and transported by the Hawaiian Humane Society to their animal shelter in Honolulu. 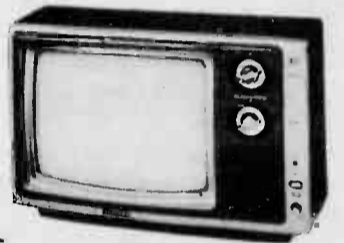

Seabees depart Diego Garcia after 11 years of construction

WASHINGTON — Eleven years of continuous major facilities construction by the Naval Construction Force on Diego Garcia ended July 15, with the departure of Naval Mobile Construction Battalion-62.

Since Seabee activities on the island began in March 1971, 60 detachments and 17 full battalion deployments have been dedicated to construction on the British Indian Ocean Territory. Nearly every active NMCB in the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets has made two or more deployments and provided at least four detachments to Diego Garcia. NMCB-1 and NMCB-40 each provided five detachments.

Prior to 1971, Diego Garcia was a jungle-covered atoll with no activity except a small meteorological station and a copra plantation. Today, it is a busy Navy support facility with a communications station, a naval air facility, a major

petroleum-oil-lubricants facility, a permanent pier and numerous other support facilities. Approximately 10 million man-days of labor and \$72 million worth of materials were used to construct more than 270 projects.

Rear Admiral W.M. Zobel, chief of Civil Engineers, described the project as "the largest peacetime construction effort ever accomplished by the Seabees," and said "our entire 11 years on Diego Garcia have shown determination, outstanding professionalism, self-sacrifice, remarkable ingenuity and an exemplary spirit of enthusiasm."

The departure of NMCB-62, the last full Seabee battalion to serve on Diego Garcia, will not end the Seabee commitment there. Detachments will continue to deploy to repair existing facilities and accomplish minor construction projects.

Units combine forces for heavy helo lifts

Marines from Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, recently demonstrated why the Marine Corps is considered America's force in readiness.

In an exercise designed to evaluate combat readiness, approximately 30 leathernecks from 1/12 along with a Helicopter Support Team, from Brigade Service Support Group, and helicopters and crews from Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 262 practiced some heavy lifting Thursday at West Field.

Two 105mm howitzers and a 14,000 pound Gamma Goat were used in the exercise. A CH-46D Sea Knight, and a CH-53D Sea Stallion provided the muscle to lift the equipment.

"The exercise gave us a chance to realize the capabilities and limitations of a helo lift," said First Lieutenant Stan Ingram, executive officer, Battery B, 1/12.

Being able to enter and exit a helicopter rapidly is crucial to Marine ground forces and requires teamwork. Ingram added, "Walking off a helo or jumping off a truck, our job's basically the same."

DoD sets standards for household goods carriers

WASHINGTON — Carriers of household and personal goods belonging to military members must now "measure up" to standards of loss and damage, and on-time pickup and delivery.

The standards are part of a carrier evaluation and reporting system begun May 1 and administered by the Military Traffic Management Command. MTMC annually monitors more than 200,000 domestic shipments transported by 1,500 department of defense approved carriers.

MTMC officials say the former three-tier rating levels of "superior," "excellent," and "standard," are no longer being used. Scoring of the carriers under the new system is based on the three elements considered most important by service members. Those are on-time pickup, on-time delivery and incidence of loss or damage.

A perfect score is 33.33 points on each of the three elements. A score of 85 or higher, based on a 100-point scale, must be maintained if carriers wish to remain eligible to

carry Department of Defense shipments. Carriers failing to meet or exceed the minimum score of 85 will be denied DoD traffic for 60 days beginning the next rating cycle. Installation transportation officers score the carriers.

This is the first time the DoD has had specific performance standards to measure both on-time pickup and delivery and loss or damage.

The cost of personal stateside property shipments for Fiscal Year 1981 was \$218 million.

The new system is more streamlined and reduces the administrative workload for transportation officers, according to MTMC, and provides a meaningful evaluation of carrier performance.

According to Major General John D. Bruen, commander, MTMC, "By comparing the levels of service on a regional, state or national level, we are in the best position to evaluate each carrier's overall performance and help them improve the quality of service."

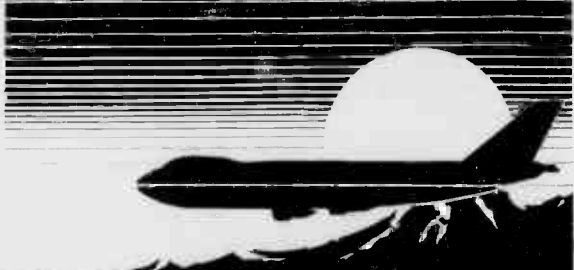

Surfing champion started along the shores of Oahu

He took the All-Service Surfing Championships in 1979, one year after joining the Corps, and hasn't relinquished the title since.

That's just one of the surfing accomplishments Sergeant Kelly Rhode has accumulated since learning to surf along the shores of Oahu.

RHODE CAME to the islands in the mid-60s when his father, a career Air Force officer, moved the family to Oahu. "I was born in D.C.," Rhode said, "and grew up all over the place."

For the youngest son of a seven-child family, adapting to new surroundings meant learning to surf. His parents, retired Colonel and Mrs. Storm Rhode, have since settled in Myrtle Beach, S.C., while their son keeps on the move with the Corps.

Traveling has enabled Rhode to surf both coasts and experience a wide variety of waves, an edge that some surfers never get. The All-Marine board-rider explained that competition surfers must be ready for all kinds of waves, because they never know what to expect. "When you win a contest, it's like Mother Nature has given you a break. Without good waves, it doesn't matter how good you are," he explained.

And Mother Nature has been good to him.

HE WAS RATED second in the East Coast Surfing Association Championships in 1977. Joining the Corps prevented him from competing in 1978 but placed him in California, where he was rated fourth in the 1979 West Coast Surfing Association Championships.

The 5-foot-10-inch, 160-pound leatherneck's competitive drive hasn't slowed since returning to Hawaii as a computer programmer with the Automated Services Center at Camp Smith. He has swept the Master's and Longboard divisions at the Hawaii All-Service Surfing Championships two years in a row and is an Ohana O'ke Kai team member (Hawaii All-Star team), which placed first in the 1981 All-Service Surfing Association.

Rhode is proud of being selected as a Makaha Surf Team member which, he says, is the No. 1 amateur surf team in Hawaii.

RHODE'S TEAM SPIRIT is evident in the way he speaks about the surfing teams he belongs to. That, coupled with his ability and skill, landed him one of the most important catches in amateur sports — a sponsor.

Surfing Hawaii sponsors Rhode in many of the contests he enters, such as the Queen's Surf Meet, where he recently placed sixth overall in a field of 600.

Sixth place is familiar to Rhode, who claimed that same position at home with three older brothers and two older sisters. His younger sister kept him from sporting the title of "baby of the family."

THE MILITARY way of life isn't new to Rhode either, despite his late (just shy of his 28th birthday) entry into the Corps. His father retired from the Air Force, his oldest brother Storm is a lieutenant colonel in that branch and his sister Barbara Stiles is married to an Air Force major.

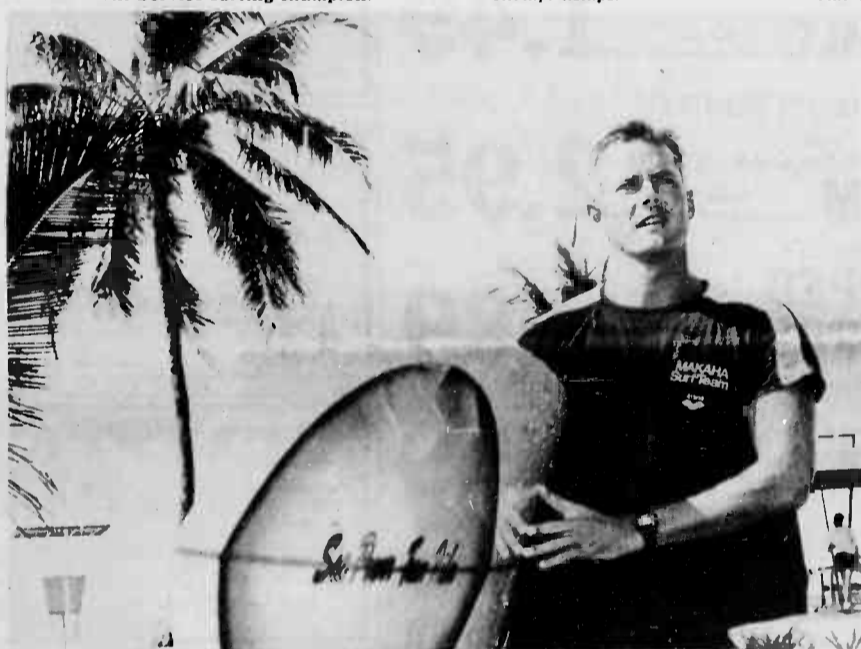
Mike, the second eldest, spent three years in the Army's Special Forces and Scott stayed with Marine reconnaissance for about 12 years before joining the Hawaii National Guard. Dusty Severn, his eldest sister, is married to a major in the Army. His youngest sister, Debbie King, is the only one left without a direct military tie. She is an artist in Mobile, Ala.

Although Rhode shares the family tradition of a military affiliation, he's the only one who's abstained from matrimony.

Traditions and accomplishments may melt together this year when Rhode goes to the interservice surfing championships. He just might make a tradition out of being on top of the waves.

Add garlic, sugar, salt, pepper and the 2 cups of tomato juice. Cover and refrigerate. (Stop here if preparing ahead of serving.)

When ready to serve, taste and add additional seasonings, if necessary. If mixture is too thick, stir in additional tomato juice. Stir in sour cream until blended and smooth.

Kepukai has returned to Hawaii after a short tour of duty in California, where he managed one of the Armadillo Pizza shops.

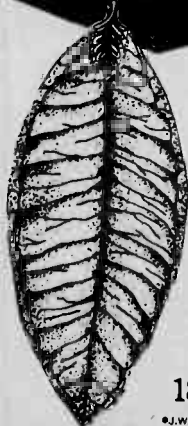
A gourmet chef with certificates from three cooking schools, the friendly 24-year-old first learned his profession in

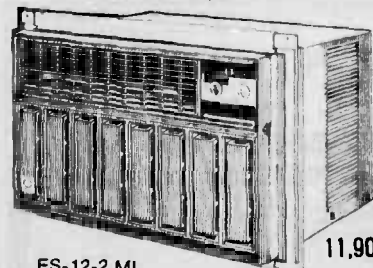
