Forty-one years ago President Franklin D. Roosevelt said Dec. 7 was a day that would "live in infamy."

The years have proven him correct.

It was a quiet Sunday morning when the first wave of Japanese aircraft came in low, cleared Kansas Tower, and attacked the sleeping air station. The attack on Oahu began at 7:45 a.m.

The final tally for the Kaneohe Naval Air Station was: 17 men dead; 67 wounded; and 33 of 36 PBYs either destroyed or severely

Kaneohe was the first place attacked on that fateful morning, and Navy Chief Ordnanceman John Finn became the first serviceman to earn the Medal of Honor in World War II.

Finn was at home when the first Finn was at home when the first wave of Zeros attacked, and he immediately headed for his hangar. When the only available machine gun, which had been originally set up for instructional purposes, became jammed, Finn took the position over, fixed the .50 caliber weapon, and returned fire.

Despite being exposed to enemy fire, having the gun's platform literally shot out from under him, and being sprayed with shrapnel, Finn kept firing at the enemy aircraft.

Since the first bomb blast on that fateful day, controversies of Pearl Harbor have raged with books, films, and documentaries exploring every angle. The one thing they all agree with, though, is that Dec. 7 will "live in infamy."

SGLI: don't get caught uncovered

Ever wonder about the type of coverage provided by Servicemen's Group Life Insurance and how to convert it to Veterans' Group Life Insurance?

According to the Government Life Insurance Manual, Marine Corps Order T1741.8, uniformed personnel in all branches of the service, including cadets and midshipment of the four service academies, are insured under SGLI unless requested to be insured for a lesser amount or elect to be uninsured. to be uninsured.

to be uninsured.

Most Marines currently pay an average of \$63 annually for \$35,000 of insurance coverage under the SGLI program, according to Personnel Services Officials at Headquarters Marine Copps.

Payments are made to the beneficiary or beneficiaries by name, or "By Law." Those who designate "By Law" should be aware that payment will be made

according to the federal law in the following order of precedence: surviving widow or widower; surviving children and the descendents of deceased children for the Marine; surviving parents of the Marine in equal shares; a duly appointed executor or administrator of the Marine's estate; and other surviving next of kin in accordance with the laws of the state of the Marine's home of record at the date of death.

Part-time coverage is provided for members of the reserve who do not quality for full-time coverage.

Premiums are deducted from member's pay or in the case of retired reserve, premiums are submitted directly to the SGLI Office.

If payment is made to the parents in equal shares, and the address of one parent is unknown, the parent whose address is known will receive 50 percent of the insurance, while the remaining payment is held pending location of the other parent.

The Government Life Insurance Manual also states that full-time coverage is provided for ready reserve and retired reserve personnel who have completed at

Members of the reserve who qualify for full-time coverage and are eligible for assignment to retired reserve may continue coverage after their tour is completed, providing the initial premium is submitted to the SGLI Office.

SGLI can be converted to a five year nonrenewable coverage called Veterans' Group Life Insurance. The policy is available to personnel released from active duty after Aug. 1, 1974 and reservists while on active or inactive duty status who suffer an

injury or disability, which causes uninsurability at standard premium rates.

Policies of active duty servicemen can be converted to the veteran's policy by submitting a premium before 120 days after the date of leaving the service. Insurance is effective on the 12st day.

Totally disabled veterans must submit proof of their disability with an application, evidence of good health, a copy of DD Form 214 or other evidence of separation, and premium before the 120th day following separation. Anyone covered under the veteran's policy is automati-cally insured under the

servicemen's policy.

A veteran's policy is not eligible
to retired reserve or ready reserve.

Rifles replace howitzers for canoncockers

Beirut, Lebanon (Delayed)

It's like a man without a country, bread without butter, or a Marine in Beirut without a John Wayne Cration can opener. A Marine artillery battery without howitzers seems useless. But don't express that opinion around Golf Battery, 3rd Battalion, Tenth Marines currently defending the northwest corner of the Marine perimeter around the Beirut International Airport.

The unit is being used as a rifle company with five officers and 95 enlisted Marines serving as infantrymen despite their artillery skills. The commander of artillery skills. The commander of the American contingent of the multi-national force in this wartorn city decided his peace keeping mission did not require artillery but would be enhanced by more Marines free to man security posts. Colf Battery filled the gap and left their 155mm howitzers aboard the USS Shreveport in Beirut barbor. Beirut harbor.

"There is really very little adjustment," said Captain Terry Doran. "Setting up a permiteter is something we have to do all the time when we man the howitzers in the field." But there are some new experiences for the cannoneers turned riflemen.

"We don't normally fill sandbags," Doran explained, indicating his howitzers normally don't stay in one place long enough to need them. For others, similarities in duties outweigh differences.

"The only differences out here is you don't see the tubes (howitzers)," said Gunnery Sergeant Rudolph Shannon, the Battery Gunnery Sergeant Rudolph Shannon, the Battery Gunnery Sergeant. Shannon claims the battery Marines are as good as any infantry company he's seen.

Golf Battery Marines get all the tactical training a rifle company does. "They even know all the hand and arm signals," said Shannon. "These guys right here," he said as he looked around at a group of Marines filling sandbags with red, Lebanese soil, "I could put them up against any line company and they could hold their own. They are really motivated."

Some Marines feel lost without the howitzers. "It's like.going out the bing in the field without the bing in the fi

have a post up on the road with the Lebanese," said Mayer. "They come up and try to talk to us, but it's hard to understand them because they do not speak very good English. Most of the communication is by hand signals

communication is by hand signals or any other means possible."

For First Sergeant Albert Wilson, going to the field without the howitzers brought back familiar memories. "I'm an 03 infantryman by trade," he said. "I thought I would give artillery a try when I got selected for first sergeant. I came down to Camp Lejeune and asked the Division Sergeant Major to give me a shot at it. That was two and a half years ago."

"I do miss the old howitzers," said Lance Corporal Donald Kraus, "You know, firing it and all. It's the job I was trained for. But, I'm a Marine and I'm cupable of doing anything they want me to

of doing anything they want me to do."

For Kraus and the other Marines of Golf Battery their days in Beirut are filled with long hours of standing duty without their favorite weapons and reinforcing their campsite. That's our main purpose here," said Kraus as he watched a Marine helicopter fly across the Lebanese sky, "protection."

Intelligence Brief

A recent Soviet antitank missile is the AT-3 SAGGER. This rather small missile (815mm) has a range of 500 to 3,000 meters, and an armor penetration of 400-millimeters. The SAGGER has shown up in five different ground launch configurations: mounted on four vehicles, and a manpack version. The AT-3 is mounted on a six rail launcher on the BRDM and BRDM-2 and requires a gunner and a loader.

Picture this . . . it's 2 p.m. and Sergeant Cando is conducting his latest LEAP-EX. With any luck by 6 p.m. his projects will be finished and Betty Lovely won't be stood up again this week. As he contemplates this, in walks Captain Hardcore his OIC . . . "I need this list of materials by 7:30 a.m. tomorrow morning! Make sure you don't forget anything!" Hesitating for a moment to reflect what the supply office has told him he replies . . . "Sir, it may take time to have them purchased." Capt Hardcore, nearly losing his composure, checks himself and firmly replies . . . "If you don't have those materials by 7:30 a.m., don't come back to work!" The following morning as you might have apassed. following morning as you might have guessed, Sgt Cando presented his OIC with the list as

Many of you may be thinking the illustration above sounds a little far-fetched. For those of you who know differently, turn to your friends and relate your latest

A month has gone by since Sgt Cando's crisis took place and we pick up the story . . . Gunnery Sergeant Rolaids has just determined that his office hasn't purchased from FBN company since last year and this mystery since last year and this mystery bill can not be matched with anything purchased this year. A quick call to the company identified who placed the order and after checking with the base locator to see if this marine was aboard, GySgt Rolaids advises his OIC that an alleged unauthorized purchase was made. "So what's the big deal over \$38.15 of office supplies!", says Capt Hardcore. "Think of all the time that was saved".

There are only a few Marines here in Hawaii who have authority to obligate government funds. They are purchasing officers, contract specialists or ordering officers specifically assigned in writing by your commanding officer. Every year millions of dollars are obligated on thousands of purchasing documents in support of your respective missions

Think of the time, money and man-hours saved by placing and order like Sgt Cando did right?

Wrong! Ratification of an wrong: Antication of an unauthorized commitment of government funds is vested exclusively in the Commandant of the Marine Corps, Code I.BO-2. Any person who has obligated the government to an unauthorized commitment of funds has, in fact, committed an illeval act. committed an illegal act, punishable under the UCMJ for the military and for the civilians, civil court action or dismissal from their jobs can be enforced.

Astounded? You should be! When you ask your purchasing personnel to "take care of it" you're asking them to take part in your illegal act. After compiling facts surrounding your "purchase", determinations of price reasonableness, availability of items through normal channels, and steps taken to preclude future and steps taken to preclude future recurrences, the entire package is forwarded to HQMC via your commanding officer and commanding general.

The repercussions associated with unauthorized commitments are shocking. Wastes in terms of man-hours lost, potential disciplinary actions and most embarrassing, the delays in payment to the vendor, are just the beginning.

Clear communication and objective planning will help to prevent "illegal" acts. For information regarding emergency supply support or purchasing procedures, contact your supply



Crooked lines that form wrinkles in her face tell the story of the passing of years. The blank stare of her eyes tell another story—one of loneliness.

As she sits in her wheelchair, lost in private thoughts, a man in uniform approaches. He's a Marine, ready to share his day with those who are, at times, forgotten.

Pohai Nani has a swimming pool but many of the residents don't use it, according to Boileau. "With us there, they might try to get into the water and really have some fun," he said.

The Marines who go to the home try to offer the people there a diversion from their daily routines and they feel that volunteering and they feel that volunteering their time and energy is for a good cause. "I went to their Halloween party and escorted Albertine Loomis," said Chris Tashijan, "She's around 90 years old and an author who's written a few books about Hawaii. We really enjoyed ourselves and from talking to her, I learned a lot about Hawaiian history." Hawalian history.

Rainy season dampens resupply efforts of Beirut Marines

BEIRUT, Lebanon (Delayed) BEIRUT, Lehanon (Delayed) — With the rainy season quickly closing in on the Marines in Beirut, it has hampered the resupply efforts of the Marine Service Support Group of the 24th Marine Amphibious Unit. The weather has brought with trough seas that has temporarily put the causeway out of business and shifted the bulk of the resupply effort to the air. With more effort to the air. With more hellcopters bringing supplies into Landing Zone Red, it has become the center of activity.

The 10-man Helicopter Support Team, with a little help from the 3rd Battalion, Eight Marines' air officer Captain Robert McCormick, has had little trouble in keeping the flow of supplies moving through the LZ to the MAU units.

"This is the only other point where they (24th MAU) can be resupplied because the water is pretty rough," said Staff Sergeant Zebedee Studamire, of Tacoma, Wash., NCOIC of the HST.

The LZ is located in the northwest corner of the airport on the taxiway.

The operation is primarily limited to loading and off loading helicopters, but they cand handle fixed wing alreraft.

Working from a small elevated platform 6x4 feet wide, Lance Corporal Doug Hanson, of Penbody, Mass., has control over all aircraft in the LZ. "I'm the LZ director," said the 19-year-old Hanson. "I control fixing wing as well as helicopters in the zone," which stretch up the taxiway to Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron 263 parking area.

Hanson is not an air traffic controller. That job belongs to two Navy men in the tower. They control the aircraft until it moves into the LZ, then Hanson takes

Working with Hanson is Lance Corporal Paul Fergeson, 26 of Charleston, S.C. Fergeson is the 1.2 spotter. After Hanson Instructs the pilot where to taxi his aircraft, Fergeson moves out and assists the pilot with hand and nem signals as he taxis to that

With forklifts and lots of elbow grease the rest of the HST moves in to unload the helicopter.

This HST has an added responsibility. "In this situation

here," said McCormick, "we also have the HST working on the passenger manifest because of the number of Marines and sailors moving back and forth to the ships.

Although McCormick is not the officer in charge of HST, he has been a big help to them. "What I have been doing is helping them set up," he said. "There are a lot of things that need to be coordinated between the security of the second that the second the second that th between the squadron, the tower, the ships and the HST. I kind of filled in that gap of liaison for the

The blagest problem from the HST is traffic flow because this is an international alroot. With the LZ setup on the taxiway, commercial afrlines must taxi around the Marines, down the runway, then turn around and take off.

"This is one of the sharpest group of people I've seen loading and off loading cargo," said McCornick. "They are especially proficient in hook up and unhous of external cargo."

Although the rainy season has slowed the resupply of the 24th MAU, the HST has kept the cargo moving into the LZ.

Marines earn money with refueling idea

MCAS ELTORO, SANTA ANA, Calif., — A bit of sleuth, a little legwork and a lot of motivation, have netted two ELToro sergeants \$620.14 each. Most important, the

\$620.14 each. Most important, the effort produced a good idea that could possibly save thousands of dollars on Marine aircraft refueling units worldwide.

It all started when Sergeants Scott Allen and Scott Townsend teamed up to solve a problem with nozzles used in the Helicopter Expedient Refueling System.

Allen, now assigned to MCAS El Toro's refueling section, was Supply noncommissioned officer for the Tactical Airfield Fuel Dispensing System (TAFDS) when the unit's embarkation section wanted to turn in a set of defective refueling nozzles. The defective refueling nozzles. The nozzles were new and cost about \$1,700 each. "That seemed like a real waste,"

Allen said.
The major problem with the nozzles, was that they leaked excessively under pressure. According to Allen, this creates an unsafe atmosphere for refueling aircraft, as well as exposing refuelers to possible eye burns and skin irritation.

Luckily for the two Marines, the naufacturer of the defective nozzles is located in nearby Costa Mesa. Allen donned his best uniform and headed out to the

firm to try to correct the wrong.

Easier said than done, he soon found out. Allen accused the firm of making faulty equipment. The company in turn conducted an investigation into the problem and soon found out it wasn't at

fault.
The Costa Mesa firm, according to Allen, had sold the nozzles to a company in North Carolina for about \$600 each. That company then made some modifications to the original equipment and sold them hack to the Marine Corps for about three times their original cost.

"We obviously needed to eliminate the middleman," Allen concluded. "The engineers at the Costa Mesa firm showed us a model of a sealed annodized nozzle that could withstand about

300 pounds of pressure."

The price of the better nozzle that was assured to work properly was just \$500 each.

Allen and Townsend document-ed their findings and recommendations in a form submitted to the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing's Incentive Awards Program Committee.

document noted that TAFDS has a current requirement for 40 refueling nozzles. That requirement was filled about

a year-and-a-half ago.

Of these 40, 20 have since gone bad and have been sent to the Defense Property Disposal Office.

Of the 20 TAFDS still has on had, only four are operational. "This equates to loss of more than \$53,000 in defective parts," the document projected out.

\$53,000 in defective parts," the document pointed out.
Further, Allen and Townsend also discovered the nozzles don't have to he disposed of. "For about \$200 each, we can buy kits to repair them." Allen said.
Allen added that the defective curve nozzles had a life expectancy of about a year, and no real advantage over the straight nozzle produced by the Costa Mesa firm. Townsend and Allen's research indicates an annual cost research indicates an annual cost of \$148,200 if the sealed annodized nozzles they discovered were


adopted. That amounts to an annual savings of about \$375,000.

The Incentive Awards Committee has found merit in the suggestion of the two Leathernecks, and recently awarded each of them \$620.14.

More money could be coming soon. "That amount was awarded locally," noted Sgt Sonja Cheatham Harbin, awards program coordinator. "They could still receive as much as \$2000, to be split between them, note their idea has been reviewed by Elect idea has been reviewed by Fleet Marine Force Pacific command and Headquarters Marine Corps."



Treasury Department sets new interest rates for Savings Bonds

The Department of the Treasury announced a new interest computation system for Series EE Savings Bonds (and nost Series E Bonds and U.S. Steings Notes) Nov. 1,1982. The major provisions of the change are outlined as follows:

works ket-based interest Every six months, the Treasury Department compiles the average market interest rate on all factory marketable securities that are five years from their maturity during the previous half year. The rate on new Series EE Savings Bonds for the following six months is 85 percent of that market average. At the end of five years, the 10 semiangual averages are added, averaged, and the average is compounded on a semiannual basis to determine a tend's five year yield. 100 them. bond's five-year yield. EE Bonds held longer than five years have additional semi-annual market averages computed in and

companded.

Minmum guaranteed yield

The minimum yield on new EE Bonds held five years or longer is 7.5 percent per annum, compounded semi-annually.

Bonds eligible for marketbased interest

All Series EE Bonds issued on or after Nov. 1, 1982, are eligible to receive market-based interest if held five or more years. In addition, outstanding Series E and Elf Bonds and Savings Notes that are still outstanding and carning interest on and after Nov. 1, 1987, will earn market-based interest effective Nov. 1, 1982.

Bonds not eligible

• Series E Bonds issued from May 1941 through October 1947 will reach final maturity, and stop earning interest, before Nov. 1, 1987, and are not eligible for market-based interest. They

· Series E and EE Bonds and • Series E and EE Bonds and Savings Notes held less than five years after Nov. 1, 1982. New EE Bonds earn interest on a fixed, graduated scale (beginning at 5.5 percent after one year) if held less than five years. Older BB Bonds and all Series E Bonds and Savings Notes retain their guaranteed yields as a minimum to the end of their current initial or to the end of their current initial or extended maturity periods.

• All Series II and HH Bonds. These Bonds will continue to pay a fixed yield.

Bond owners and bond buyers are now guaranteed to receive 85 percent of the average return on five-year Treasury marketable securities, if they hold their bonds at least five years after Nov. 1, 1982 (or 7.5 percent, whichever is more). This will keep their interest return competitive during periods of changing market conditions. There will be no change in the ways Savings Bonds can be purchased (payroll savings at companies, Bond-A-Month or over-the-counter at banks), or in the way bonds are redeemed.



Historical place

Commandant's house grows with age

It was March 31, 1801 that newly naugurated President Thomas Jefferson rode out with Lieutenant Colonel Commandant William Burrows, the second commandant (1798-1804), to fix on a site for the Marine Barracks within leasy marching distance of the Christian easy marching distance of the Capitol

Building."
Four days later, on April 4, the National Four days later, on April 4, the National Intelligence ran a notice offering "a premium of 100 dollars . . . to any person who will exhibit the best plan of Barracks for the Marines, sufficient to hold 500 men, with their officers, and a house for the Commandant." George Hadfield, an Italian-born Englishman, won the prize and must be presumed to have been the architect although the original plans have not yet been found.

The site for the Marine Barracks was fixed at Square 927 in Southeast Washington, bound by G and I streets, and 8th and 9th streets. Work on the quarters went slowly and it was not until 1806 that the finished dwelling was occupied by Lt Colonel Franklin Wharton, the third commandant (1804-1818), and his large family.

The original house was of simple Georgian Federalist, design, and

The original house was of simple Georgian-Federalist design and contained four rooms on each floor. On the first floor, a vestibule led to a main hall, the dining room to the left, and a small parlor to the right. Beyond the main hall were two large drawing rooms. The second floor was divided into four bedrooms. Storage and perhaps servants' quarters were in the attic. Meals were

prepared in the basement. The north side of the house and entrance faced on G Street. The south side opened onto the garden and beyond the garden, then as now, was the broad green expanse of the

In the 1830s substantial additions were made to the house including its first bathroom. In 1891 the attic was converted into a third floor by the construction of the present mansard roof. Further modifications were made in the years that followed, most importantly in 1934 when additions gave the house its present balanced appearance.

THE COMMANDANT'S House was one of the few such buildings not burned by the British when they sacked the Capital in 1814. This ommission by the British has given rise to several legends as to why the house was spared. One version is that Admiral Cockburn and General Ross, commanding the attackers, spared it to use as their own headquarters, then neglected to apply the torch upon their hurried withdrawal. Another contends that the stand of the Marines at the Battle of Bladensburg so impressed Gen Ross that he ordered the house and barracks spared as a gesture of soldierly respect. Whatever the reason, the house now has good claim to being the oldest now has good claim to being the oldest public building in continuous use in the nation's Capitol.

Of the Marine Barracks as it was in the 19th century, the only original building still standing is the Commandant's

House, the remainder of the Barracks having been rebuilt between 1900 and 1907. Solidly constructed, the house, in the words of Major General George Barnett, 12th commandant (1914-1920) "should stand almost forever." It was Barnett who began the tradition of displaying portraits of past commandants in the house. He obtained the painted likeness of his predecessors and since that time succeeding commandants, on leaving succeeding commandants, on leaving office, have contributed portraits of themselves to the house. With regard to other furnishings, personal tastes and prevailing styles have generally determined the interior decor of the house. Frequently commandants have left behind them items to mark their tenure. Other items have also been acquired from time to time from their heirs. Conspicious among these is the high glass-doored secretary bookcase of Brevet Brigadier General Archibald Henderson, the fifth commandant (1820-1859).

BOTH THE BARRACKS site and the Commandant's House were designated as "National Historical Places" by the U.S. Department of the Interior in March 1973. In 1976 they were redesignated as National Historic Landmarks by the

Warm in cordiality tempered with many vintage years, the house at the Home of the Corps serves as a link with the past for leaders who must command the present and plan for the future.



Silent Drill Team lots of precision, no verbal commands

The spectacular 10-minute precision drill routine of the U.S. Marine Silent Drill Team demonstrates the discipline and bearing associated with members of the Corps, in a variety of public appearances.

The 24-man team from Company A, often represents the Marine Corps in joint armed forces full honors ceremonies for visiting dignitaries of State, usually appearing at the White House in this

Performing in conjunction with the Marine Corps Color Guard and the U.S. Marine Drum and Bugle Corps, this unit has delighted hundreds of thousands of has defigited numerous of thousands of spectators all across the United States and overseas. A unique feature of their drill is the rifle inspection in which the inspector, standing six feet from the line

of armed troops, executes a series of spins and tosses of the 10-pound M-1 rifle

New team members normally obtain a working knowledge of the drill routine in 12 hours of instruction. After the initial raining, approximately 25 hours of practice per week are required for two to three months before the new Marine reaches the desired level of proficiency.

During the summer months, the Silent

Drill Team is seen each Friday in the Evening Parades held at the Barracks, and performs each Tuesday in the Sunset Parade held at the Marine Corps War Memorial (Iwo Jima Monument) in Arlington, Va.


Marine Barracks — home of Corps' Battle Color

Marine Barracks, Washington, by virtues of its position as the "Oldest Post of the Corps," is entrusted with the of the Corps," is entrusted with the custody of the Battle Color of the United

custody of the Battle Color of the United States Marine Corps.

The Battle Color, bearing 47 streamers commemorating the military campaigns in which Marines have participated, is carried by the Color Guard of the Marine Corps. This Color Guard of the Marine Corps. This Color Guard, made up of select Marines from Marine Barracks Company A, is commanded by the Color Sergeant of the Marine Corps, who bears the National Color.

IN ADDITION TO the Color Sergeant of the Marine Corps, the Color Guard consists of a bearer for the Battle Color

and two riflemen. When the President of the United States is in attendence at affairs of State, a Marine from this Color Guard bears the Presidential color. Only this one battle standard bears the

compaigns and expeditions in which the Corps has participated. Other Marine units carry the battle color with their specific unit designations, bearing streamers representing the actions of that individual units. individual unit.

individual unit.

The 47 streamers on the Battle Color are decorated with Palms, Oak Leaf Clusters and Stars, representing more than 400 awards and campaigns. They reflect the pride, professionalism and esprit de corps of the United States Marines and are evidence of the historically significant role Marines have played in defending and maintaining the nation's peace and socurity since 1775.

The Battle Color is scarlet, with bright gold fringe and trimmings, bearing a

Ine Battle Color is scarlet, with bright gold fringe and trimmings, bearing a large Marine Corps emblem. The streamers are attached to the pike, or lance just below the top of the color staff. Below the Color, 47 engraved silver bands ring the staff, augmenting the streamers by noting each battle, campaign and expedition.

THE BATTLE COLOR dates back to Jan. 18, 1939, when it officially replaced a blue battle standard first used in France by the famed Fifth and Sixth Marine Regiments during World War I.

The Marine Corps Battle Color is displayed at all official Marine Corps ceremonies in Washington, D.C., and appears often in the nation's capital in government and non-military cere-

government and non-military cere-monies. The Battle Color has also appeared on television and throughout the nation and overseas, often in conjunction with the U.S. Marine Drum and Bugle Corps and the Silent Drill Team.

Barracks Marines perform variety of duties

Established in 1801, Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., is the oldest post of the Marine Corps and has been the residence of the Commandant of the Marine Corps since 1805. The selection of the site for the since 1805. The selection of the site for the Barracks was a matter of personal interest to President Thomas Jefferson, who rode through Washington with Lieutenant Colonel Commandant Burrows in search of a suitable location. The site now occupied was approved since it was situated near the Navy Yard and was within easy marching distance to the Capitol.

The early 19th century Barracks was arranged in a quadrangle as it is today, and the usage of the buildings was similar. The areas on the south and-east side of the quadrangle were used for offices, maintenance facilities and living quarters. The Commandant's House at the north end of the Barracks was completed

north end of the Barracks was completed in 1805, and is the only original building still standing it is said to be the oldest public building in continuous use in the nation's capitol. The rest of the Barracks was rebuilt between 1900 and 1907. Both the Barracks and the Commandant's House have been designated as National Historical Landmarks by the Department

THE TRAINING OF new officers and THE TRAINING OF new officers and recruits was started at the Barracks soon after it was established and continued throughout the 19th century. Until 1901, it was also the location of Marine Corps Headquarters. Marines from the Barracks participated in the defense of Washington in the War of 1812, and served in the Indian Wars of 1836-37, the War with Mexico, the Civil War and The Spanish-American War.

American War. The Marine Barracks has also been the

home of the Untied States Marine Band, "The President's Own," since 1801. Shortly after its formation, the band was Shortly after its formation, the band was requested to play for President John Adams at the Executive Mansion. This White House engagement began a tradition which became so established that today the names Marine Band and President's Own are synonymous. It was at the Barracks that John Philip Sousa, during the time he was leader of the Marine Band from 1880 to 1892, wrote many of his immortal marches. many of his immortal marches.

The Marines now stationed at the Barracks perform a variety of duties, which include their participation in official ceremonies of state, appearing in the Evening Parades and Marine Corps War Memorial ceremonies, providing special security details for the President of the United States and visiting dignitaries. special security details for the President of the United States and visiting dignitaries of state, and operating the Marine Corps correspondence school — The Marine Corps Institute. The institute, founded in 1920 by Major General John A. Lejeune, provides military oriented correspon-dence courses for Marines stationed around the world.

THE BARRACKS MARINES probably best known for their public parades, which began in 1934 with the advent of the Sunset Parade, conducted every Friday afternoon during the spring and summer months. The Sunset Parade remained, essentially, a family affair for Marines and their quests until 1957, when Marines and their guests until 1957, when the paradetime was changed to 9 p.m. and floodlights were introduced. The resultant Priday Evening Parade has attracted the steadily increasing interest of "official" Washington, area residents, and each summer's heavy influx of tourists.





10,000 runners to start Honolulu's 10th annual race Sunday

HONOLULU — Defending champion Ion Anderson leads a record field of 10,000 runners HONOLULU

expected to start in the 10th Hombulu Marathan on Sunday. With 10,000 starters, the race would rank second only to the New York Marathon in number of

entrants.
Patti Lyons Catalano, first woman finisher in Honolula for the last four years in a row, is anable to start this year due to an ankle injury. She holds the women's record for the 26-mile, 385-yard event, of 2 hours, 33 minutes, 23 seconds minutes, 21 seconds.

Anderson, 33-year-old runner

from Eugene, Ora., won the 1981 Honolulu race in 2:16:5-1, only 41 seconds more than the record set by Dean Matthews in 1979. Anderson also was winner of the 1973 Boston Marathon.

All previous men's and women's All pravious men's and women's champions with the exception of Cataliano and Jeff Wells are entered in this 10th more marathon. Other former men winners are Dunean Macdonald (1973, 1976, 1980), Jack Foster (1975), Jeff Galloway (1970). Don Kurdong (1978) and Matthews (1979). Former women winners entered are June Chao (1973). Cimty Dulrymple (1974, 1977), Jacqueline Hansen (1975) and Kim Merritt (1979).

Pros and cons of carbo loading

With the Honolulu marathon only a With the Honolulu marathon only in few days away, there is heightened interest in special aids to performance. Among these is oarhohydrate loading, a method of increasing the storage of muscle and liver glycogen, a fuel used by the body in endurance exercise. Ann H. Ditzler, R.D. M.S. of the Windurgel Nutrition R.D. M.S., of the Windward Nutrition Clinic, Kaihia, recommends that athletes be aware of the pros and cons

of carbohydrate loading.

She explains that carbohydrate loading has been shown to increase body stores of glycogen. This method includes a regimen beginning six days before an event. The athlete engages in exercise sufficient to deplete the glycogen stores. A 15 to 20 mile run is necessary. Then the athlete reduces the carbohydrate (starches and

sugars) in his/her diet to 60 to 100-grams per day to deplete the glycogen. This low carbohydrate diet may be continued for 3-4 days maximum. During the low carbohydrate diet the athlete should continue moderate training. Then 2-3 days before the event, the marathoner switches to a high carbohydrate diet. Perhaps 80 percent of intake could be consumed. percent of intake could be consumed us carbohydrate.

A negative aspect of the carbohydrate loading is an additional accumulation of water. However, this additional water is released and aids in temperature regulation. If approached with caution, the carbohydrate loading diet can be of henefit to those interested in

prolonging endurance. It should be noted that the ideal pre-event meal should be readily digested, and supply energy and fluid requirements. Therefore, a liquid meal high in carbohydrate and low in fat and protein should be taken rather than solid food. For optimum results this should be taken two to three hours.

solid food. For optimum results this should be taken two to three hours before the event.

In addition, the carbohydrate loading regimen may be potentially hazardous to individuals with a predisposition to health problems. Also, during the glycogen depletion phase the body may be more susceptible to infection or injury decreasing the athlete's ability to continue hard training.
