## 1983 - Year in Transition

So much happens in a year that it's hard to recall everything. A brief look back at 1983 may help readers to recall the events, both big and small, that shaped their lives.

The men and women here started the new year by repairing the damage left from Hurrican Iwa's passing. The feeling that some old landmarks were gone, replaced with new ones, was a prevalent one.

Several of the older buildings here were damaged or destroyed by Iwa, but it wasn't heavy winds that tore down one of K-Bay's more enduring features. Bulldozers demolished the age-old temporary lodging facility, the Showboat, in July.

The old guest house had boarded countless service members and their families, but the new Temporary Lodging Facility signaled the end for the 39-year-old structure.

Combat readiness of Kaneohe leathernecks was proven time and again during the first half of 1983. The air side of the air/ground team here captured the coveted Boola Boola award, and their ground-pounding brothers took the Super Squad competition by storm.

Even the news made news as the Hawaii Marine was selected as the best commercial enterprise newspaper in the Marine Corps, then captured the prestigious Thomas Jefferson award as the best within the Defense Department.

### Revolutionary changes

## Corps prepares for future

Colonel H.J.M. Radcliffe, operations officer for the 1st Marine Brigade, returned from a five-day deployment and employment conference at Coronado, Calif. with a fresh view on the changes in store for the Marine

Corps of the future.

"Personally, I think in the next three to five years our Marine Corps is going to be radically different from what it is right now," he said. "Just in the introduction of new weapons, weapons systems and equipment, there will be some of the most revolutionary

changes our Corps has ever experienced."

The improved M-16 rifle, heavy-lift helicopters, lightweight mortars, new amphibious vehicles... the list of better equipment either already in use or soon to be, will increase the deployability and fire power of Marine units,

Radcliffe explained.

"Weapons systems in the infantry battalion alone, although we're not going into the 'Buck Rogers' business, will give a 25 percent increase in fire power. The systems we use to bring our

### Officer monitors visit Hawaii

Aviation and ground monitors from Headquarters Marine Corps are scheduled to visit Hawaii-based commands to interview air and ground officers Jan. 5 through 7.

Monitors will conduct a general presentation to all Marine officers at Camp H. M. Smith on current assignments policies on Jan. 5 from 8-8:30 a.m. at Pollock Theater. From 8 a.m. to noon they will meet with individual officers at Pollock Theater and nearby office spaces.

The following is the ground monitoring itinerary at the air station here.

An informal brief will be conducted on the lower lanai of the Officers' Club for all 1st Marine Brigade and air station officers (excluding aviation ground) at 2 p.m.

Brigade officers will be interviewed on an individual basis from 3 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 5, and from 8 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. Jan. 6 at joint education classrooms No. 1, 2 and 5.

Air station ground officers will be interviewed from 2 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 6 on an individual basis at the same location.

Interviews by the aviation monitor will be conducted by unit as follows:

Rotary wing monitor: from 2 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 5, HMM-463; 8 to 10:15 a.m. Jan. 6, HMM-265; and from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. HMM-165.

Fixed wing monitor: From 2 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 5, VMFA-212; 8 to 10:30 a.m. Jan. 6, VMFA-232; and from 10:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Jan. 6 MAG-24/H&MS-24.

The aviation ground monitor will be located at H&MS-24 to interview all brigade aviation ground officers as follows: from 2 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 5, and from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Jan. 6.

Individual interviews for air station officers will be conducted at the officers' club from 2 to 4:30 p.m. Jan. 6.

The monitors will be available on Jan. 7 (a.m. only) on a limited/appointment basis at the MCAS BOQ, to meet with officers who were unable to attend the Jan. 5-6 schedule.

# Marines pay for too much weight

HQMC, WASHINGTON, D.C. — Marines who anticipate temporary or permanent change-of-station orders are advised to consult a transportation officer of the Joint Travel Regulations Manual when determining the actual weight they are authorized for the shipment of household goods.

According to the Joint Travel Regulations Manual, the right of transportation of household goods accrues and becomes fixed on the effective date of the orders authorizing the shipment of household goods. A Marine's prescribed weight allowance is based on the

grade or rating held on that date and is not affected by pending promotions or reductions in grade or rank, i.e. selection boards, office hours, etc.

In the past, many Marines thought that their selection to a higher grade entitled them to an increase in the total weight they were authorized to ship. Bad judgement often caused disappointment when those Marines found themselves reimbursing the government for a costly mistake.

An increase in the weight allowance, as a result of a promotion, or in the case of a

corporal, upon attainment of more than two years' service, cannot be used until the Marine receives TAD or PCS orders having an effective date on or after the effective date of promotion.

Although transportation officers are responsible for assuring that the weight estimates are made as accurately as possible,

the individual Marine will foot the cost of any excess weight.

For more information on authorized weights, articles and the transportation of household goods, refer to chapter eight and appendix "J" of the Joint Travel Regulations Manual or contact your local traffic management office.

## Adult education registration

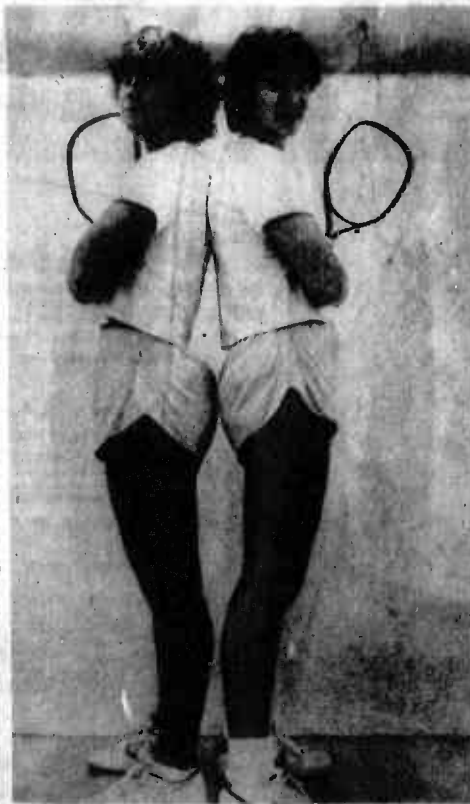
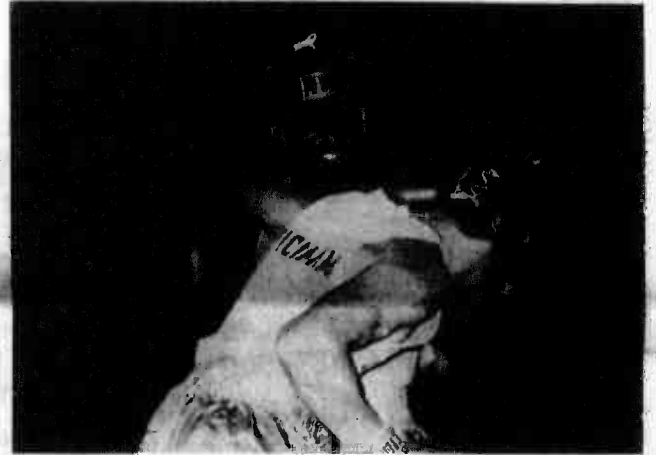
It says something for the leathernecks here that only being the best in the state will do.

# Mayor honors Marine Corps firefighters

The blaze that sparked his notoriety may have been long extinguished, but a Kaneohe-based firefighter discovered recently that the warm thanks of a community aren't so easily doled.

Sergeant Joseph Ferguson, Crash, Fire, and Rescue, along with Sgt Daniel Stagg (formerly of the rescue team but now transferred to Memphis, Tenn.), received letters of recognition from Honolulu Mayor Eileen Anderson Thursday, citing them for selfless actions during the M. Dyer and Sons warehouse fire in Aiea Oct. 8.

The Marines aided city, Navy and Air Force firemen in combating the inferno, which destroyed or threatened both military and civilian property in storage. Ferguson was recognized for his actions in a ceremony at the mayor's office, while Stagg's citation was forwarded to his new duty station.

"Sergeant, we have good people in our community," Anderson told Ferguson, "and the people of this community like to recognize those in our community whose tendency is towards outstanding performance. It has been brought to our attention that you were very much involved in helping to fight one of the worst fires of the past year."

"And so, as mayor, it's my privilege and my honor to thank you for that, and in a very, very small way, to acknowledge your contribution. It's especially gratifying to us that it came from the military, since the military is so very much a part of Hawaii. We want you to know how much we appreciate the presence of the armed services in our islands, and in a very specific and a very direct way, your contribution to our country."

Ferguson's first knowledge of the fire came from Stagg, who, after hearing of it on the radio,

went to Ferguson's house to see if he would like to journey across the mountain to help beat back the raging flames.

"Whenever there's a fire, they need assistance," Ferguson said. "If anybody can help get the job done, then he should do it. When we heard that the fire department was calling in military firefighters, we knew that we should offer assistance."

"A firefighter never hopes for a fire," he continued, "but when it happens, the adrenalin starts

flowing, and there's nothing you can do but fight the fire."

The 24-year-old New Jersey native was amazed at the intensity of the blaze despite having 7½ years of Marine Corps fire fighting experience, including approximately 15 major fires.

"It seemed hopeless," Ferguson related. "We had to break the storage crates open, but when we broke them open, there was fire inside. We had to wait for forklifts to move the crates out."

"Everything was wet," he

continued. "There was water all over the place, and fire was everywhere."

Honolulu Fire Chief Melvin Nonaka regards the M. Dyer and Sons fire as one of the worst in recent memory. "In terms of dollars, it's one of the greatest fire losses," he said. "In terms of fire fighting, it was one of the more difficult because of the lack of water hydrants. It was fortunate that three-fourths of the warehouse had a sprinkler system, or else the damage would

have been even greater." Total damage is estimated at \$2.4 million.

The two leatherneck volunteers spent approximately 5½ hours battling the blaze — from sunset until 11:30 p.m. "It was the biggest fire I've ever been to," Ferguson attested. "I've been to about 13 jet crashes, a military parachute loft fire in Cherry Point, N.C., and a small warehouse fire in Cherry

Point. But this was the worst of all."

Ferguson sees a marked difference between structural fires and aircraft fires, with which he is most familiar. "We're trained for aircraft fires. You never know when a roof will collapse or when a floor will give way. You just have

# Marine Corps of the future

supporting arms to the infantry battalion will also improve, with better logistics, capable of bringing what's required to the front in a battlefield.

"Marines have always thrived on competition. The good are going to stay good. Those who want to stay are going to have to be good, and those who are coming in are going to have to be better than their forebearers."

"This is the best time, certainly during my time in the Corps, for individuals to come into the Marine Corps. There's a greater challenge for them, with latitude to be true professionals and expand their personal as well as professional skills. Short of war, there's never been another time when our country has needed the Marine Corps more, to come to the fore."

"All of us (in the Corps now) are going to have to do a little more studying to understand the new weapons systems, and their employment. By next year, we're going to have new .50-caliber and 10mm machine guns. The true professional is going to take that as a challenge. They'll have to develop new tactics to use these weapons effectively."

"The challenges of leadership haven't changed much since the Corps started. The leadership principles and traits that we've

preached for years are still valid, and will continue to be so. To be effective, a leader has to know his job, because if he doesn't, he can't do the equally important thing — look after his troops. And the third thing is to use the time that's available. That's important for a leader to understand today, because we've got a lot of smart Marines around here, in all ranks.

"We're raising a new generation of professionals. The young Marine of today wants a challenge and it's out there. When I say we're getting a 25 percent increase in fire power for the infantry, that's an increase in weaponry, not people. "Next to new weaponry, the biggest change in store for the brigade will be the implementation of the unit deployment program. Marines will spend six months out, then 12 months in, which means they can expect only two 'jumps' during their three-year tour here," he said.

The unit going out on deployment will fly to Okinawa and replace the unit that's been out for six months. The next day the aircraft will return with the unit that's been out for six months.

The real savings is in time — the changeover will take two or three days instead of two months,

Radcliffe said. The concept is expected to be implemented in 1985.

Quality of life overseas is also being upgraded, with more and better housing for enlisted leathernecks and their families, he said. "In comparing the Marine of yesterday, today and tomorrow... he's going to have a challenge somewhat different tomorrow

than it is today, but he will be able to respond to it as well as the Marine yesterday was able to respond to the challenge then," Radcliffe concluded.

# Journalists sought for 'Hawaii Marine'



Those who believe the "pen is mightier than the sword" and those who enjoy using the sword should consider a lateral move to the public affairs field.

Marine journalists are covering the Marine Corps story in Beirut, Lebanon. And Marine correspondents covered the Marine Corps story on the island of Grenada, where Marines and soldiers, as part of a multinational force, secured the island.

Besides cameras, pens, notepads, and recording equipment, Marine journalists also carry their packs, 7.82 gear and weapons as any basic Marine would.

When the action happens, public affairs practitioners are there to gather, prepare and disseminate news concerning the Marine Corps to print and broadcast media.

Qualifications include the ability to type 20 words per minute

and skills in spelling, grammar and English composition equivalent to high school graduate level. Applicants must also have a General Technical score of at least 110.

Applicants, male or female, must pass a screening test by the public affairs officer or, in his or a print or broadcast reporter or in commanding officer.

Formal schooling and/or on-the-job training is provided to

Marines entering the field. Entry-level jobs include assignments as a print or broadcast reporter or in community relations.

The Joint Public Affairs Office here is looking for creative Marines who wish to display their talents as public affairs practitioners.

The air station also received recognition as the best small Marine Corps installation in natural resource conservation, and was nominated for the Secretary of Defense natural Resources Conservation Award.

Winning awards wasn't the only reason Kaneohe-based leathernecks trained long and hard in 1983, and they didn't rest on their laurels. The summer found Kaneohe Marines steaming off the coast of Lebanon. The Beirut Airport, a landmark to Marines in the late 1950s, became a familiar one to the leathernecks of the '80s.

It also became the scene of the Corps' worst disaster since the Pacific campaigns of World War II when a terrorist bomb blast killed 241 Marines and sailors there.

Hawaii Marines didn't see direct action in Lebanon, or in Grenada when a joint force took control of that Caribbean island, rescued American students there and restored order. But local leathernecks didn't stand still. Throughout the year, Hawaii Marines were on the move.

The 1st Marine Brigade received a new commanding general July 22 when Brigadier General Orlo K. Steele assumed the helm from BrigGen Jacob W. Moore, who is now a major general.

The Fleet Marine Force also came under a new commander earlier in the year when Lieutenant General John K. Davis accepted his fourth star to become the assistant commandant of the Marine Corps beside General Paul X. Kelley.

Gen Davis' departure opened the way for LtGen C.G. Cooper to take charge of the Fleet Marine Force, Pacific. Cooper brought with him an emphasis on the Band of Brothers, a concept that's been with him since his combat days in Korea.

Gen Robert H. Barrow toured the air station April 11, before he retired in June.

These events impacted the Marines here, but other changes also affected them. Prices were lowered at the Commissary, and a 5 percent surcharge replaced the old system of marking prices above cost. The Main Exchange put the finishing touches to its new look, and Baskin-Robbins began selling 31 flavors of ice cream there.

And as the year comes to an end, the station's newest landmark is under construction. The new Consolidated Package Store is being built across the street from the TLF, with completion set for July.

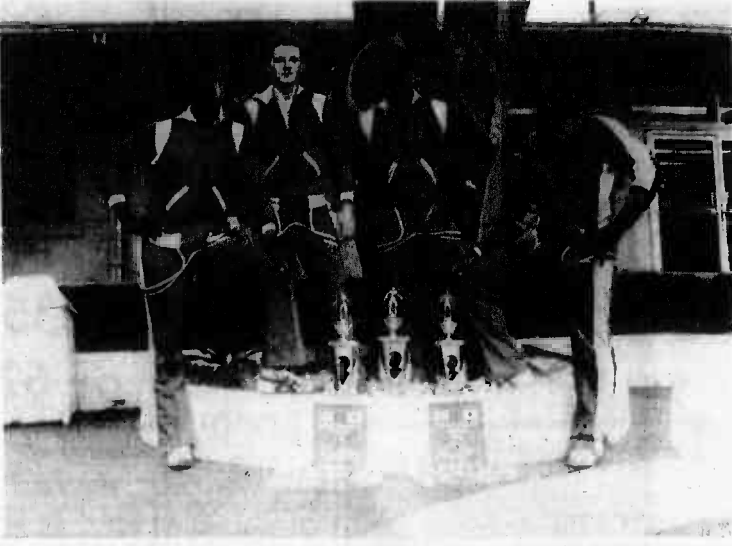



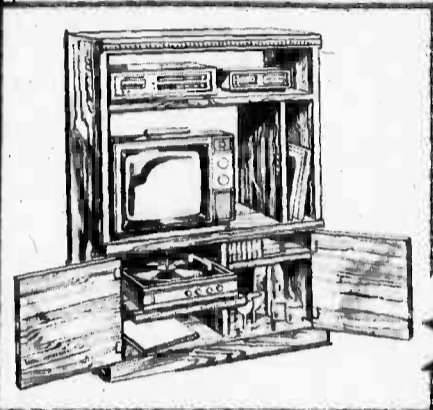
