Rent Plus changes take effect Oct. 1.

If you are single, or are here without your dependents, live out in town and are thinking of moving, you may want to reconsider.

Starting on Oct. 1, the Rent Plus housing allowance for single servicemembers will be limited to 80 percent of the "with dependents" rate.

This change came about as a result of Rent Plus procedures being revised by the Per Diem Travel and

Transportation Allowance Committee, which established individual paygrade maximum rental ceilings for members without dependents. This change was also a result of a general review of RPHA procedures conducted in the fall of 1983.

Servicemembers who are now receiving RPHA will remain at the same rate unless they change their place of residence or until Oct. 1, 1988, whichever occurs first. The

change will affect those single servicemembers who sign a lease or mortgage ugreement on or after Oct. 1.

The change may also affect those servicemembers who are sharing dwelling expenses... so before you sign a new agreement, check with your admin office to make sure you re identified under the proper occupancy status code.

Urinalysis testing equipment improves

If you smoke marijuana every now and then, or experiment with cocaine once in a while and it hasn't been detected, it isn't because you outsmarted the drug screening system.

Recently, new, more sensitive urinalysis testing equipment was installed at five of the Navy drug screening laboratories. According to the Department of Defense, the new equipment has the capabilities of detecting lower levels of drug substances in a urine sample.

Along with this new capability, DoD has lowered its criteria for a positive reading to .000020 grams of drug substance present versus .000050 grams. Before, a urine sample reading .000048 would have received a negative test

The new equipment will also bring greater automation and faster lab service. In FY-83, 1.2 million samples were tested for drug content. With the new equipment, the screening labs are now capable of testing 1.8 million.

"Taking a urinalysis test has become routine, just like a PFT," said CWO-4 Don Galvin, Brigade Human Affairs

Although this does not necessarily mean an increase in drug users, it means that the better equipment is catching those who up to now have tested negative; and the chances of "outsmarting" the equipment have been greatly reduced.

Two wheels + alcohol = DOA

WASHINGTON, D.C. - A young sailor assigned to a ship in Norfolk, Va., decided a motorcycle would be a great way to get around. So he bought one.

One Friday night, he and a friend went for a ride on his new bike and stopped at a local bar for a few beers. Shortly after leaving the bar, the two were killed in an

Moral of the story: Drinking and riding motorcycles is DUMB. It's that simple.

Last year, 86 sailors were killed and another 1,092 were injured in motorcycle accidents. More than 70 percent of those fatalities were alcohol related. According to the Naval Safety Center, all but three of those deaths could have been avoided if the motorcycle operator had full control of his faculties and had been alert to take proper evasive maneuvers.

The combination of alcohol, speed and loss of control is a guaranteed recipe for getting yourself killed on a motor-

"You don't have to get falling-down drunk to be affected," said Jim Filek of the Naval Safety Center. Unlike driving a car, riding a motorcycle requires balance. a few drinks, you p a sense of false courage. Balance and reaction time are affected after only two beers per hour for an average-size person. The

coordination and awareness needed to ride a motorcycle safely allows no room for impairment of any kind.

In a message to all operating forces, the Chief of Naval Operations stated: "The present level of motorcycle accidents and the motorcycle accidents and the resulting high costs through loss and suffering to our people must be reduced. I am calling on all levels of command, security and safety offices, and all those who operate motorcycles to focus attention on this problem. Specifically, I want strict adherence to safety standards, enforcement of regulations, adequate operator education, and above all, education, and above all, education, and above all, responsible behavior as regards drinking and operation of motorcycles and other vehicles."

Voting this year?

WASHINGTON, D.C. — In most cases, military people exercising their right to vote must do so by absentee ballot. Following are questions about and answers to a few things voters should know.

Q. What is my legal state

of residence?

A. When it comes to voting, your legal state of residence is the state you were living in before joining the service or the state you have since claimed as your legal residence. Even if you don't maintain formal ties — such as property ownership — in that state, election officials need the address to place you in the proper voting district or

Q. When is the best time to apply for an absentee ballot?

A. If you're only requesting a ballot, election officials should receive the Federal Post Card Application at least 30 days before the election. The ballot may have to be sent earlier if you are applying for both registration and

absentee ballot. The 1984 Voting Assistance Guide contains more information on state deadlines.

Q. Where can I get information on state and local issues?

A. You might consider subscribing to your hometown newspaper or relying on friends and relatives for information on state and local issues. The League of Women Voters, with regional offices throughout the country, also publishes information. Their main office is at 1730 M St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20036

Things to watch out for when filling out an FPCA:

Item 2. Voting address/residence on FPCA — Those having addresses which are rural routes or P.Q. box numbers must provide additional specific address information so that election officials can place applicants in the right voting district. FPCAs without this information could be invalidated, and the applicant might not receive a ballot

Common questions answered

Item 7(d). Don't circle item 7(d), which says "all as permitted . . ." Many states don't accept this category of request and will not mail you a ballot. To avoid this problem, file a separate FPCA for each election.

ltem 10. You must place an x" or check mark in the box describing your status. In most states, checking any box — 10(a) through (f) — will - 10(a) through (f) - entitle you to a full ballot.

Item 15. Signature, Don't forget to sign the FPCA. Unsigned FPCAs are invalid.

Item 16. Oath. Not all states require completion of the oath or notary provision. For those states that do, a commissioned officer is authorized to administer the oath and witness the signature.

Legible writing. Election officials will not process FPCAs which can't be read.

The above items are some of the common pitfalls military people face when filling out an FPCA. In all cases, you should consult the 1984 Voting

Assistance Guide for voting specifics before filling out an FPCA.





Experiencing LSD is costly

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Sailors involved with LSD (lysergic acid diethylamide) found out what harsh punishment is like.

Sixteen sailors are now serving sentences of one to 12 years at hard labor because of their involvement in an LSD drug trafficking ring. Sentences awarded during military trials included bad conduct or dishonorable discharges, forfeitures of pay and allowances and reduction to paygrade E-1.

LSD is a hallucinogen which affects perception, sensation and emotions. One of the most dangerous aspects of LSD is that the user's emotional response varies widely — from feeling several different emotions at once to swinging rapidly from one emotion to another.

Physical reactions to LSD include dilated pupils, rise in temperature and heartbeat, increased blood pressure, muscular weakness and nausea. Heavy users sometimes experience impaired memory and attention spun, mental confusion and difficulty with abstract thinking.

LSD may bring about changes in time and space perception and produce delusions and hallucinations. Sensations may seem to "cross over" — music may be seen or color heard.

In its pure form, LSD is an odorless, tasteless, colorless powder; doses are measured in powder; doses are measured in micrograms — millionths of a gram. The weight of a teaspoon of table salt is equal to 192,000 doses of 25 micrograms of LSD (enough to produce a hallucinogenic effect).

Usually taken orally, LSD may also be sniffed or injected. It is generally marketed as microdots (tiny balls of compacted powder),

window panes (small squares of a gelatin sheet), blotter acid of a genatin sneet), plotter acid (liquid soaked into pieces of blotting paper), or liquid soaked into chewing gum, sugar cubes, tablets, animal crackers or heart candies. Its marketing format gives rise to its street names: acid, dot, microdot, tabs, crackers,

sugar, etc. A coloring agent often added to the liquid is also reflected in street names: blue acid, blue mist, chocolate chips, mellow yellows, orange cubes, purple hearts, etc.

Initial effects of LSD are felt in less than one hour and generally last from two to 12 hours, with effects tapering

off gradually. Tolerance to the drug develops quickly — within three to four days and larger doses must be taken to produce the same effects. This tolerance is usually lost after a few days abstinence

Bicycles gain popularity as economical transportation

For 105 million Americans the bicycle is an alternative to driving gas-guizling cars. Over the past few years. Americans have increasingly relied on the bicycle to get around. In 1975, 500,000 Americans commuted to work by bicycle. The U.S. Department of Transporta-tion estimates that by 1985 that figure will rise to 2.5 million. Of course, the bike is still primarily used for recreational purposes, especially for physical fitness. A 1982 Nielson study of the nation's favorite leisure-time activities listed bicycling second — right behind

second — right behind swimming. With the increasing popularity of bicycling, should be an increased safety awareness. Here are some tips for operating a bike safely:

— Ride single file. Bicycling

shoulder to shoulder is not only dangerous, it's against the law. A sudden swerve by a car or fellow cyclist could be dangerous.

 Make sure you are visible at night. You can do this by ensuring your tail light or reflector can be seen from 300 feet away and your headlight can be seen from 500 feet. It is also a good idea to wear light colored clothes.

Don't hitch a ride on another vehicle. Holding on to the back of a truck while riding is asking for trouble. Assudden turn by the truck could send a hitching rider flying. Always use your own power to operate a bievel. operate a bicycle.

— Be wary of parked cars.
Watch out for car doors opening suddenly and vehicles pulling out into

traffic.

— Use hand signals.

— know when Letting drivers know when you are going to stop or turn

you are going to stop or turn gives them an opportunity to adjust to your actions.

— Don't carry other riders.

An extra rider hampers bicycle operations and obstructs the operator's vision. Packages can do the same same.

Ride with the traffic Always keep to the right and never ride against the flow of traffic. Remember to keep a safe distance between you and other vehicles.

— Move into traffic with



The Military Police Department will be cracking down on motorcycle operators who do not use the safety equipment required by DoD and Air Station regulations According to Air Station Order P5500.6B, operators and passengers of a motorcycle must wear a helmet, protective sheilds or goggles and boots or closed toe shoes



Motorcycle regulations receive emphasis

An approved helmet, according to DoD Instruction 1000.16, is one that complies with the requirements of the state the motorcycle will be operated in. If the state does not have a belinet regulation, the belinets will meet the American National Standards Institute, Standard Z90.1 Eye protective shields or goggles must be of

nonshatterable material. Safety glasses will not be allowed as a substitute for the safety shield or goggles. A windshield or fairing may be used provided it extends four inches above the driver's eye level and is of

nonshatterable material.

According to the Air Station order terms shoes may be worn in place of boots or closed toe sloces, but shower shoes, sandals or other similar items will not be worn.

All persons who operate a motorcycle without the proper safety equipment will not be allowed on the Air Station according to MSgt Robert D. Rebar, Military Police Operations Chief. "People who are stopped will be instructed to get off of their motorcycles and walk them to where they can obtain the proper safety equipment," said

Personnel stopped for not having the proper safety equipment will also receive a traffic citation and a court date. Civilians and dependents will receive a Pederal Magistrates citation and be sent to traffic court in Honolulu. Active duty military will receive a military citation and will be required to go to Station traffic court. Protect your life and your privilege to operate a motorcycle. Never ride without a helmet, protective shield for morales and boots or closed two boos.

Dairy products included in diet improve health

WASHINGTON, Getting into physical shape for the summer is important to most people, and since fitness is enhanced by good nutrition, milk is one dairy product that provides health by the glassful.

Called "the most nearly perfect food," milk is an outstanding source of nutrients carbohydrates. fats, minerals, proteins and vitamins—needed for energy, growth and replacement of worn-out tissue.

Children who drink milk grow faster than children who eat the same kind of foods, but don't drink milk. Many doctors and nutrition experts recommend that children and teenagers drink three 8-ounce glasses of milk a day and adults at least one glass.


For people attempting to reduce cholesterol in their bloodstream, doctors suggest substituting skim milk for whole milk, Skim milk contains no cholesterol.

But milk is not the only nutritious dairy product. Other dairy products include cheese, butter, ice cream and yogurt.

Cheese has much of milk's food value but in a concentrated form. For example, 8 ounces of American cheese provide as much protein and calcium as six 8 ounces glasses of milk.

Yogurt has the same nutritional elements as milk and contains bacteria beneficial to intestinal digestion. Because unflavored yogurt is low in calories, it's especially popular for low-calorie diets.

Once you've gotten into shape for summer, follow the basic rules of good nutrition and don't forget to include healthful dairy products in your diet — you'll help yourself stay fit throughout the year.





contract at the time of your commissioning or enlistment to active-duty service. Home of record determines travel and transporation allowances upon separation from the service; it's usually not your current home address or residence, regardless of where you live or how long you've lived there.

According to the Naval Military Personnel Command, changing your home of record can only take place at time of commissioning, reinstatement, appointment, reappointment, enlistment, enlistment, induction or orders to active duty. Your record can't be changed during a regular tour of active duty or enlistment.

duty or enlistment.

Changing your legal domicile or residency is another matter. Residence is a factual place of abode; you establish it by living in a particular location. A person changes residence simply by moving from one place to another.

Domicile is defined as the place where you've established your permanent home and where you intend to return whenever you're absent. For example, if a service member who works in Maryland and lives in Virginia intends to return to California, then California is considered domicile.

More effort is involved in changing your domicile than your residence.

To change your state of domicile, you must prove your intent to become a bonafide domiciliary of another state. You can't just choose a state; you must demonstrate that you intend the new state to be your permanent home, and that you intend to return there after you're discharged. Your new domicile is established by making ties to a new state. You may want to hold a valid driver's license from that state, register to vote, own property and open a bank account in the new state.

Before changing your domicile, remember that domicile not only determines your liability for income tax,

personal property taxes and voting, but may also affect the following important rights and duties:

—Where your will would be probated, who may act as executor under your will, and

who may serve as guardian of your minor children.

As a military member, you can reside in the state where you're stationed without being subject to its income tax and vehicle registration laws. However, your spouse can't spouses must conform to regulations and policies of the host state. For instance, if your spouse gains employment, income earned is taxed by the host state. And if you earn income other than your military salary, that income is subject to taxation by the host state as well.

Since voting and taxation are so closely interrelated, service members are advised to seek legal advice before changing registration from one state to another. You might subject yourself to higher taxes in the state in which you reside than those of your state of domicile.



Moments later, the whistle blew signifying the end of the game and Rag Bag prevailed,


game and Rag Bag prevailed, 20-14.

During 1983, in Hawaii alone, 261 children under the age of 4 were killed or injured

in motor vehicle accidents.

The facts are endless leaving everyone who is made aware of them alarmed, but wiser. As a result, all states, (excluding Wyoming), have passed laws requiring infants and young children to be restrained in safety tested car

Hawaiian law states that children. 3 years old and under, must be secured in a

child restraint seat. Children between the ages of 3 and 4, must be seat-belted securely. Non-compliance with this law

Non-compliance with this law can result in a court fine of up to \$100 for the first offense. "Child restraints provide more protection than the standard vehicle safety belt," said Toni Snellback, of the Motor Vehicle Safety Office;

Hawaii Marine

DOT. Snellback recommends that parents try before they buy, as common mistakes made in the purchase and use of the restraint can take away from its effectiveness.

There are approximately 50. child restraints currently on the market that are approved by the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Office, but that does not mean that they will

properly fit your child and your car.
There are seats specifically

designed for an infant or a toddler, and also those that can be converted from infant to toddler size as the child grows. In addition, some child restraints are too large for a compact size vehicle.

"Parents must also be educated in the proper use of the restraint," explained Snellback. Some common mistakes made when using the seat are improper positioning in the motor vehicle, failure to attach it securely to the vehicle's cushion and failure to secure the child safely in the restraint.

Public information programs for seat usage are available through the Highway Safety Office, local hospitals and lending closets.

At the Air Station, the Marine Corps Exchange carries the convertible child restraint which costs between \$40 and \$50, depending on the model. Families who are

Dos and Don'ts Political activities of servicemembers

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Although election day remains little more than a month away, the daily news is \$\frac{1}{2} \text{ from an amount lates}\$ full of items on candidates.

full of items on candidates.

Military people (and all federal employees) are encouraged to vote and privately support the candidates of their choice. However, legal restrictions stemming from DOD Direction of the candidates. ive 1344.10 prohibit members of the Armed Forces from participating in some types of political activity. The purpose of the directive is to strike a balance between the individual member's rights to political expression and the need to keep the Armed Forces officially neutral on issues of partisan politics.

Partisan politics encon-pass more than just the major parties. For instance, support of an "independent" candiof an "independent" candidate is still considered partisan politics.

To be non-partisan, the issue or candidate must not be associated with any organ-ized group or set of ideals. For example, a non-partisan issue was the campaign to extend the right to vote to citizens 18 years of age or older, which became effective under the 26th Amendment.

DoD Directive 1344.10 efines activities in which active-duty members may or

may not become involved. Here are some guidelines for

military members:

— You may express opinions on candidates and issues, but only as a private citizen. You may put a bumper sticker on your car, but not a large sign or banner. You may sign petitions which the sticker on your car, but not a large sign or banner. You may sign petitions which do not obligate you to partisan activity. You may write letters to the editor which do not promote a partisan political

You may attend partisan rallies as a spectator but not in uniform. You may not make speeches at any partisan gathering.

— You may make an

individual monetary contribu-tion to the candidate of your choice through a political organization, but do not donate through other members of the Armed Forces or through a federal employee. You may not solicit contributions from others.

You may not participate the management of partisan campaigns or conventions. You may not work — for instance, as a clerk or telephone solicitor — in the office of a partisan committee or candidate.

You may not be a candidate for partisan office, or a non-partisan candidate for an office requiring full-






