Flag Day

A time for nation to 'pause for the pledge'

AFIS — At 7 p.m. Eastern Daylight Time on Sunday, Americans around the world will pause to recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Some will take time out from activities with families and friends. Many in the military, well aware that national defense is not a 9-to-5 job, will take a short break from their duties.

Together, they will honor America's 51st Flag Day celebration.

The "pause for the pledge" concept was born in 1980. Five years later, President Ronald Reagan declared it an official part of Flag Day ceremonies. Members of the national Flag Day Committee are working to make the pause an integral part of every American's Flag Day activities.



This year, as America celebrates the bicentennial of its Constitution, the pause for the pledge will take on a special significance.

The pause will be led from Fort McHenry, focus of the Baltimore defense during the War of 1812.

Named for James McHenry, secretary of war under Presidents George Washington and John

Adams and a soldier-statesman signer of the U.S. Constitution, Fort McHenry symbolizes the American principles of liberty and freedom.

It was in the shadow of Fort McHenry during the Battle of Baltimore that Francis Scott Key, an American patriot, was inspired to write "The Star Spangled Banner." From a

British ship in Baltimore Harbor, Key anxiously watched Fort McHenry for some proof, some sign that liberty would prevail. At the end of the 25-hour bombardment, his proof came in the form of the American flag.

"You can imagine his joy the next morning, in the dawn's early light," said President Ronald Reagan. "He looked out and saw the

banner still flying, a little tattered and torn, but still flying proudly above the ramparts. Fort McHenry and the brave men manning it had withstood the assaults. Baltimore was saved.

"The United States, this great experiment in human freedom, as George Washington described it, would endure."

Through hard times and

setbacks, the dreams of liberty endured. They drove Washington's troops through the harsh winter of Valley Forge, inspired the drafters of a constitution that has endured 200 years and led Key to write the national anthem.

Lou Koerber, president of the National Flag Day Foundation, said the flag is a visible symbol of these dreams for all the world to see.

Those dreams will be verbalized throughout America and on military outposts around the world during the June 14 pause for the pledge.

"The pause is a stimulating, patriotic experience that transcends age, race, religion, national origin and geographic differences."

LCAC facility in 2nd stage of expansion

Camp Pendleton, Calif. Assault Craft Unit Five is now in its second stage of its Landing Craft Air Cushioned (LCAC) facility expansion, slated to be completed during the summer of 1988. With an estimated cost of \$6.1 million, the expansion will increase its LCAC fleet from six to 24.

The second construction increment consists of building a craft parking apron, a dining facility, maintenance shop, general warehouse, administration building expansion, additional fueling capabilities and a wash rack.

"The facility is being built in increments to support craft as they're received," said LtCmdr. Richard A. Rieger, executive officer of ACU-5. "There are five increments of construction and when the final one is done, we'll have 45 craft." The completed project should be

finished in 1993 with an estimated cost of \$55 million.

Along with more craft, personnel will also increase. Currently, there are 120 sailors, but that total will rise to 650 at the end of the second increment.

Also being constructed under a separate contract is

a two-lane bridge across Interstate 5, which will be for pedestrians and vehicles from Edson Range to the LCAC facility. That project should be completed by the end of this year at a cost of \$1.5 million.

"The LCAC program to date, has been very success-

ful," said Rieger. "We have one more major milestone to overcome, and that's the operational testing of the craft."

The next increment will include building another maintenance bay, more concrete area and other barracks.

A second LCAC facility is being constructed at Naval Amphibious Base, Little Creek, Va. LCACs are expected to be delivered to that site in November. Both sites will alternately receive the craft until a fleet of 90, 45 on each coast, is completed.

Portion of H-3 closes

Motorists coming to the Air Station through the Main Gate must take Kaneohe Bay Drive for the next few months, according to Albert Nishi, of the State Department of Transportation. The portion of H-3 that takes you to the Mokapu Interchange to Kaneohe/Kailua off ramp, commonly known as the "saddle back road," will be

closed.

The construction is expected to last until September if the weather permits.

Those who use the Main Gate should leave for work a few minutes earlier since the traffic flow on Kaneohe Bay Drive will be heavier; or use the Mokapu Rd. Gate.

Attention: military vehicle drivers

Military vehicle operators should get familiar with new regulations governing the use of garrison and tactical vehicles off the Air Station because of the H-3 closing.

The regulation, which is in effect now, applies to 1st MAB and Air Station vehicles. Use of H-3 and the portion of Kaneohe Bay Drive that runs from Aikahi Park Shopping Center (Mokapu Blvd) to the junction of Mokapu Saddle Road,

is off-limits from 5:30 a.m., until 10 p.m. daily, until further notice.

All military vehicles, garrison and tactical, must use the Mokapu Gate during these hours. The use of the off-limits portion of H-3 and Kaneohe Bay Drive is authorized between 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., when the Mokapu Gate is closed.

"Pegasus Marines take care of their own, by inbreeding safety into the squadron and about preservation of assets," said Pender. "By taking pride in what they do, using safe, sound procedures on the ground as well as in flight, we will be able to continue our record of safe flight."

Camp Smith Motor Transport merges with GSA

Colonel Gene E. Castagnetti, Camp H.M. Smith commander, signed a Consolidation Memorandum of Understanding to consolidate the Camp's motor transport fleet with the General Services Administration's Interagency Fleet Management System.

The consolidation will reduce the amount of

resources used in providing vehicles and maintenance support here by \$316,000 a year. "When we go to GSA," said Major J.H. Warren, S-4 officer, "this will free 12 Marines. GSA will provide the vehicles."

The merging of motor transport and GSA is a part of an Efficiency Review Program initiative, which is under a Department of Defense Program.

New pay schedule

September 1 will be the beginning of a new pay day schedule for military personnel.

The change is directed by the FY-87 DoD Appropriations Act, and will shift the current end-of-the-month pay day to the first day of the month after the entitlements are earned. Mid-month pay days will not be affected.

Beginning in September, the normal pay and allowances earned from the Sept. 15 pay day to the end of the month, will be paid on Oct. 1 instead of Sept. 30.

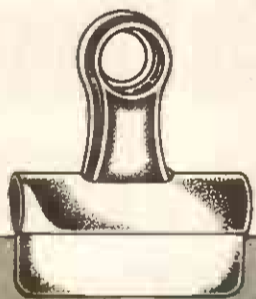
Pay days that fall on a weekend or federal holiday will be paid on the last working day prior to the scheduled pay day, as it is being done now. However, pay days will not be held more than three days before their normally scheduled date.

DoD decal information

When arriving on Hawaii, or buying a new car, a new DoD sticker must be obtained. The following information tells you how to apply for one.

To drive your motor vehicle on the Air Station, you must obtain a DoD Identification section of the installation to which you are assigned.

When registering with the Military Police here you will need Motor vehicle registration; a valid driver's license; proof of no-fault insurance; a military ID card; and a current safety inspection.

Corps' best shooters compete in All-Marine matches

MCB Camp Lejeune, N.C. — Armed with M-14 service rifles and .45 caliber pistols, 217 Marines from around the globe took aim to see who the best of the best was during the All-Marine Rifle and Pistol Matches held last month, here.

Weather conditions were outstanding as far as shooting goes, despite the nervous tension. With 54 percent more shooters than 1986, the 153 rifle competitors and 136 pistol shooters from Western, Eastern, Far East and Pacific regional divisions and Marksmanship Training Unit, Quantico, mixed their good, but inexperienced shooters, with experienced ones for another well-rounded week of competition.

Winner of the McDougall Trophy, awarded to the highest scoring shooter in the rifle competition, was CWO-3 Theodore Wilson, with a score of 1166-32Xs. He also took the gold Lauchheimer Trophy for attaining the highest aggregate score in both rifle and pistol. The silver Lauchheimer winner was Far East Division's Sgt. M.A. Reed, who scored a 1696-38Xs. The bronze went to Maj. J.S. O'Connell, MTU-Quantico, with a 1687-37Xs.

Retired Marine Col. Walter Walsh, the first Marine to become "Triple Distinguished" in rifle, pistol and international competition, presented the Walsh Trophy to MSgt. R. Rodriguez, MTU-

Quantico, who shot a 566-16Xs.

In team competition, the Far East totaled 3447-68Xs out of a possible 3,600 to win

the Interdivision Rifle Team Trophy. The Eastern Division scored 1097-22Xs of 1,200 possible points to win the Interdivision Pistol

Trophy. The 3d Marine Aircraft Wing team set a new record of 1131, breaking their 1985 record of 1121 in the Fleet Marine Force Combat Infantry Trophy match. The competition includes six shooters, with guidance from the team captain and coach, who fire at eight targets simulating a rifle squad in combat.

"The competition has had some changes over the years, but the purpose is the same," according to CWO-4 Sam Driggers, OIC of the Marine Corps Rifle Team at Quantico. "The Marines who train here become marksmanship instructors, and are able to take their knowledge back to their unit and work toward building the best qualified marksmen throughout the Corps. It all goes back to the Marine Corps ideal that 'every Marine is a rifleman,'" said Driggers.

Hawaii's Pacific Division shooters who placed during the matches are:

Individual Rifle Awards — Sgt. T.D. Bartlett, Distinguished Certificate, 27th place; and SSgt. W. Bonilla, Distinguished Certificate, 28th place.

Individual Pistol

Awards — SSgt. A.A. Rivera, Distinguished Certificate, 6th place; 1st Lt. S.W. Belke, Distinguished Certificate, 10th place; SSgt. D.A. Smith, 3d Silver Medal, Distinguished Badge, 21st place; and Cpl. S.A. Pickett, Distinguished Certificate, 25th place.

June is Youth Suicide Prevention Month

Be on the lookout for the warning signs



It may seem surprising, but there are more suicides in spring than in the gloomy winter months. Perhaps that's why June is Youth Suicide Prevention Month.

Suicide is the second cause of death among college students, and the third for youths between age 14 and 25. Accidents, many of which experts believe are disguised suicides, are the leading cause.

Every day, 1,000 Americans attempt suicide. Every year, more than 6,500 young Americans succeed.

Unfortunately, young people are impressionable, and the suicide of one teen-ager can lead a second troubled teen to copy the desperate act.

But suicides can be prevented. According to information provided by the Military Family Resource Center, nearly 80 percent of those who commit suicide give some warning of their intentions. Furthermore, most suicidal people are that way for only

a brief period in their lives. If given the proper assistance and support at that time, they will probably never be suicidal again.

According to the experts, factors that increase the risk of suicide are:

1. Depression, indicated by changes in appetite and/or sleep patterns, loss of interest in pleasurable activities, lethargy or agitation, feelings of guilt or worthlessness and withdrawal from family and friends;
2. Previous suicide attempts;
3. Loss of a friend through suicide;
4. Drug or alcohol abuse; and
5. Alcoholics in the family.

Military suicide experts say that a suicide attempt is highly likely if someone with one or more of the risk factors for suicide shows any of the following warning signs:

1. Talking about suicide;
2. Giving away possessions, making a will and "getting his life in order" — this could include attempts to make restitution for past misdeeds;
3. Obsession with death, listening to a lot of sad music or reading sad poetry — the person may do art work or write letters on the subject of death;
4. Making specific plans to commit suicide and getting access to lethal means.

Not everyone shows such obvious signs, so the experts advise you to take all threats seriously and trust your suspicions.

They also suggest that if you believe someone is suicidal, try to get him to talk — then listen. Don't be afraid to confront the person. Start by asking if he is depressed, but lead up to asking if he's thinking of suicide.

Let her know you care about her — people who are thinking about suicide usually feel unloved. Let her know the situation is not as desperate as she might think, but avoid guilt-inducing comments such as, "You're so much better off than most."

Until you feel sure the crisis period is over, avoid leaving a suicidal person alone.

Get professional help. For military people, there are a number of sources. If the problem is immediate, the hospital emergency room is the best source. Also, suicide hotlines or 24-hour "help-lines" are available in many areas. Otherwise, such resources as the family service or family support center, mental health service, the alcohol and drug counseling center, the chaplain and social work services can provide help.

We the People

The Amendments to the Constitution

Editor's Note: The text of the Constitution is printed below in regular type, retaining the original spelling and capitalization. Comments by Harold W. Chase on its provisions are printed in boldface type.

The Articles of Confederation provided for their own amendment only by the unanimous consent on the 13-state legislature. The Constitution, however, was to take effect only being ratified by conventions in only nine states. In the legal sense, this was an act of revolution.

Amendments to the Constitution of the United States

Amendment I

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Amendment II

A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

Amendment III

No Soldier shall, in time of peace be quartered in any house, without the consent of the Owner, nor in time of war, but in a manner to be prescribed by law.

Amendment IV

The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.

Amendment V

No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offence to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without

due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Amendment VI

In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the Assistance of Counsel for his defence.

Amendment VII

In Suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved, and no fact tried by a jury, shall be otherwise reexamined in any Court of the United States, than according to the rules of the common law.

Amendment VIII

Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted.

Amendment IX

The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.

Amendment X

The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

The first ten amendments, which make up the so-called Bill of Rights, were designed to calm the fears of the mild opponents of the Constitution in its original form. The amendments were proposed to the state legislatures by the first Congress that assembled under the Constitution in 1789 and were ratified in 1791. Some of the framers had argued that the Bill of Rights was not necessary since the national government did not in any case have the power to do what was expressly forbidden in the proposed amendments.

Amendment XI

The Judicial power of the United States shall not be construed to extend to any suit in law or equity, commenced or prosecuted against one of the United States by Citizens



person to sue a state in a federal court by appealing a decision in a state court.

Amendment XII

The Electors shall meet in their respective states and vote by ballot for President and Vice-President, one of whom at least, shall not be an inhabitant of the same state with themselves, they shall name in their ballots the person voted for as President, and in distinct ballots the person voted for as Vice-President, and they shall make distinct lists of all persons voted for as President, and of all persons voted for as Vice-President, and of the number of votes for each, which lists they shall sign and certify, and transmit sealed to the seat of the government of the United States, directed to the President of the Senate; — The President of the Senate shall, in the presence of the Senate and House of Representatives, open all the certificates and the votes shall then be counted; — the person having the greatest number of votes for President, shall be the President, if such number be a majority of the whole number of Electors appointed; and if no person have such majority, then from the persons having the highest numbers not exceeding three on the list of those voted for as President, the House of Representatives shall choose immediately, by ballot, the President. But in choosing the President, the votes shall be taken by states, the representation from each state having one vote; a quorum for this purpose shall consist of a member or members from two-thirds of the states, and a majority of all the states shall be necessary to a choice. And if the House of Representatives shall not choose a President whenever the right of choice shall devolve upon them, before the fourth day of March next following, then the Vice-President shall act as President, as in the case of the death or other constitutional disability of the President. — The person having the greatest number of votes as Vice-President, shall be the Vice-President, if such number be a majority of the whole number of Electors appointed, and if no person have a majority, then from the two highest numbers on the list, the Senate shall choose the Vice-President; a quorum for the purpose shall consist of two-thirds of the whole number of Senators, and a majority of the whole number shall be necessary to a choice. But no person constitutionally ineligible to the office of President shall be eligible to that of Vice-President of the United States.
