# 'Threatcon' lifted, but I.D. checks continue

Threat Condition (Threatcon) Alpha measures for access to the Air Station have been lifted, however, identification checks will continue during selected hours of the day, and for inbound and outbound traffic from 10.p.m. to 5 a.m., according to LtCol. J.D. Wintersteen, Provost Marshal Officer, here.

"At this time, local circumstances do not justify the security measures we would use for higher threat conditions," said Wintersteen.

Threatcon Alpha is a general warning of possible terrorist activity as recognized by military intelligence sources.

The original measures were prompted by the rise of terrorist incidents in the United States and around the globe.

There were 1,096 terrorist incidents reported in the U.S. alone between 1979 and 1984. Kidnappings, barricade-hostage taking, armed attacks, hijackings, bombings, arson and other incidents are all common tactics used by terrorists throughout the world.

Though Threatcon Alpha was lifted, Marines and their families should still be on guard. The following measures should be taken to reduce terrorist threats.

Everyone should take an

active role in countering terrorism. Be suspicious and inquisitive of strangers.

Be conscious of unidentified cars on or near the installation, abandoned packages or suitcases, or any other unusual activity.

All vacant buildings, rooms and storage areas should be kept locked. Everyone should check areas near their work and homes to ensure the safety of fellow workers, friends and relatives.

The inside and outside of all buildings should be checked for suspicious activities or packages at the end of each work day and at regular and frequent intervals.

All home deliveries should be checked carefully for foul play. Terrorist do not care who they hurt or kill, as long as the action makes an impact and gains the attention of and influences a particular audience.

Threat conditions are used to reduce the risk of military personnel and their families from falling victim to terrorist activities. The best way to reduce the risk of being the target for terrorists is to plan, to be aware and to become familiar with methods of prevention.

# 1/3, HMM-364 tested by MCCRES

Amphibious assault vehicles landed their bulky frames on the beach at Bellows Air Force Station. Their bellies released Marines who quickly charged toward an enemy force. Less than a kilometer away, helicopters unloaded Marines who began advancing towards the same enemy force. In less than an hour after their "operation" had begun, the Marines had overcome the enemy and seized their objective.

Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-364 and 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment had just completed the first phase of their Marine **Corps Combat Readiness** Evaluation System (MCCRES) conducted Dec. 8, at Bellows AFS. Throughout the week of Dec. 7-11, the Marines put their combat skills to the test, not only at Bellows, but at Makua Valley on the northern shore of Oahu, and at the Marine

Corps Training Facility on Molakai.

The MCCRES is an evaluation designed to give unit commanders insight on the effectiveness of their unit.

"The MCCRES is not a report card," said Maj. Peter Freeman, director of Brigade Schools. "It's a training tool that evaluates readiness and is usually administered prior to a deployment."

MCCRES evaluators looked at several key areas during the exercise. "We look at '364's heliborne and 1/ 3's amphibious operations," said Freeman. "Communications, supply considerations, fire support use and intelligence were also important factors."

Freeman stressed that "continuing action" by Marines is one of the MCCRES areas that receives the most scrutiny by graders. "Continuing action by Marines is an area which covers clean weapons, hygiene, camouflage and concealment and the security they maintained," he said. "These are important factors that can set the tone for the entire operation."

For their MCCRES, the Marines of HMM-364 and 1/ 3 were given a scenerio that would allow them to use all of the assets they would employ during an actual operation.

The scenario involved a ficticious nation named Blue - a former U.S. territory consisting of seven islands. Blue was granted its independence from the U.S. in 1969 and since that time had become a staunch ally to the U.S. prior to achieving its independence, Blue's status as a U.S. territory dated from the middle part of the 19th century when Americans colonized the island chain. The U.S. has extensive military presence in Blue.

Dissension and turbulence were sewn in Blue prior to it gaining its independence as a country, due to long-See MCCRES/A-6

# Jungle boots authorized for wear

It's been a few weeks since Marines were given the nod to purchase "jungle boots" through military clothing stores.

In the past, jungle boots could only be worn when issued by an individual's unit from organizational property. The boots have now been approved as an optional clothing item for purchase by individual Marines by ALMAR 265-87.

According to MGySgt. Carl Pyron, operations chief for the Marine Corps Exchange here, jungle boots will not be available in the Uniform Shop until February or March. The jungle boots come in 100 various sizes and widths, according to Mary Ann Seely, general supply specialist and clothing officer at HQMC. Limited space will prevent exchanges from stocking all 100 sizes.

"Once the boots arrive here, they will be available in sizes to fit the 'average' Marine," Pyron said. "If the Exchange does not have the size needed to fit an individual, the boots can be special ordered."

Part of the reason HQMC authorized the wearing of jungle boots by all Marines is due to defects in the new 'speed-lacing' combat boots. On many boots, rivet caps have come out and others were manufactured with no adhesive attached to the heels.

Instead of recalling the boots, the Defense Personnel Support Center (DPSC) in Philadelphia has developed procedures to reimburse the Exchange or contract a local cobbler to repair the boots. To this date, the Exchange here is waiting for repair supplies to give to local cobblers to fix the defective boots. "Once the supplies are received we will be able to contract a cobbler to fix the defective boots," Pyron said.

"Wherever the holidays find you — at sea, or on near or distant shores — may you find warmth, cheer, and a moment's respite from your noble avails.





# **Legally Speaking**

# Home businesses allowed in gov't housing

Under a recent change to Navy and Marine Corps regulations, the Air Station commander now has the authority to permit military family members to conduct limited commercial activities from their government quarters aboard the Air Station.

#### **Types of** activities

The order permits those types of commercial activities traditionally operated out of a home and which are in good taste and conducive to a good community atmosphere, such as the making and selling of handicrafts. babysitting services, sewing and tailoring, and the sale of merchandise not normally available through commercial outlets, such as Avon, Mary Kay, Tupperware, Amway, and other personalized product lines.

The order also permits the making of minor modifications to government quarters in order to conduct the commercial activity, although these modifications may be made only after receiving permission from the Air Station commanding officer. The quarters must also be returned to their original condition when the family vacates.

# Important guidelines

This permission is subject to some very important guidelines, however. First of all, any request to conduct a commercial activity must be made in writing to the Com-



manding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, HI, 96863-5501. This request must detail the type and scope of the business which is intended to be conducted: method of advertising and solicitation intended to be used; location of the quarters where it will be conducted; nature and extent of any proposed modifications to the quarters; and status of any licenses, permits, or other forms of authorization which federal, state, or local law require.

Upon receipt of the request, the commanding officer will make his decision based on the nature of the business activity, the potential liabilities for the government, prospective advertising practices, and the impact of the activity on community appearance, tranquility, and safety. The commanding officer's approval or disapproval will be sent to the requester in writing, and any authority to operate a commercial activity is based upon compliance with the guidelines set forth in the letter of approval.

#### Possible privilege loss

Once authority is granted, the member must be careful to avoid several danger areas which could lead to loss of this privilege. First of all, the commercial activity is not permitted to compete with the Marine Corps Exchange or other officially authorized commercial activities. Second, the Department of Defense Standards of Conduct expressly prohibit the solicitation of sales by persons of superior rank to subordinates. Family members conducting a business on-Station are required to abide by this same prohibition. For example, a colonel's wife

should not solicit business from the wife of a corporal. Finally, advertising must be conducted according to the highest standards of busimess ethics, and the regulations expressly prohibit exterior signs, displays, or other advertising at the quarters.

This change in regulations is a big jump forward in permitting family members to operate a commercial activity aboard the station. Strict compliance with the guidelines stated above will open whole new areas of financial opportunity for family members.



# **Non-combatant Evacuation tests Marine's flexibility**

The "hard-chargers" of Company A, 1/3 and HMM-364, conducted a simulated Noncombatant Evacuation Operation (NEO) as a part of their Marine Corps Combat Readiness Evaluation System (MCCRES) test.

The operation, which took place on the island of Molokai, involved a U.S. consulate in a small third-world country experiencing political insurgency.

The Marines' mission was to evacuate the U.S. citizens and other neutral persons involved with consulate affairs. Playing the part of these U.S. citizens and neutral people were Marines from several units on the Air Station. As soon as the Marines were helo-lifted in by the "Purple Foxes" of HMM 364, they set up a perimeter of defense and began to organize, screen, search and take care of any medical emergencies that needed attention before escorting the evacuees to the helicopters.

"The actors were realistic and they each played their part very well," said Major R.D. Neal, executive officer for 1/3.

"Overall, the Marines did a good job. The main purpose of this particular evolution is that the Marines conducting the NEO have to be flexible and adjust to the situation. Something like this could happen anytime on a moments notice — the Marines from an amphibious unit have to be prepared," Neal concluded.

standing cultural variances among the country's population. The original inhabitants of Blue, known as Siennians, had strong feelings of resentment towards the western colonist known as Bluebloods.

Eventually, the Siennians formed a group called the Siennian Peoples Army (SPA). The SPA created a military arm called the Siennian Peoples Guerrillas (SPG).

These groups targeted attacks towards military and government officials. Recently a bomb exploded in a nightclub killing 12 U.S. servicemen. As a result of these attacks the president of Blue formally requested U.S. military assistance to combat SPA/SPG and regain control of his country.

The Marines of HMM-364 and 1/3 were sent in to answer Blue's call with an amphibious and air assault at Bellows. After that objective was seized, they headed north to Dillingham Air Force Base where they established their headquarters. Among the various missions the Marines were tasked with throughout the simulated operation, was an evacuation of U.S. citizens from an American consulate on Molokai.

The exercise culminated with an attempt by HMM-364 and 1/3 to seize Makua Valley from the remainder of the rebel elements.

The '364 pilots swept low into the valley, to attempt to unload 1/3 Marines. Only two platoons had been unloaded when a swarm of "Smokey Sams," simulated surface to air missiles, rose to meet the landing party. The helos were forced to go back to their departure point. The Marines, not dropped off with the bulk of 1/3, were dropped off in another location and marched 14 kilometers around Kaena Point to link up with their original forces.

The fighting was fierce, and the Marines even called in simulated naval gunfire to help them claim the valley.

In the end, the Marines were victorious. They had tested their mettle throughout the rugged terrain of Oahu and the Molokai.

"My Marines were very motivated and challenged by the MCCRES," said LtCol. Coulter Tillet, commanding officer, 1/3. "It also took us to training areas we hadn't been to before, and that added a degree of realism."

Tillet said the MCCRES gave him a good indication of his units strengths and weaknesses. "It's a great training tool. Now, we've identified areas we can improve upon," he said.





The Marines scored 28 points to put them ahead of Army with 25 points. The Navy followed with 7 points, trailed by Air Force with no points.


