CMC blasts lack of accountability in Rother death

HQMC, Washington, D.C.—The Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Al Gray, has reviewed the investigation of the circumstances surrounding the death of LCpl. Jason J. Rother, stating that the actions of some of the individuals involved in the case reflected "a state of mind which contradicts every principle of concerned leadership on which we

(Marines) have traditionally prided ourselves."

Rother, 19, of Minneapolis, was reported missing after a Combined Arms Exercise at MCAAGCC Twentynine Palms, Calif. He was last seen on the night of Aug. 30, 1988, when he was assigned to a post as a guide to help direct the movement of his battalion during part of the three-day live-fire exercise at

the 932-square mile base in California's Mojave desert.

Despite a series of extensive searches, Rother's remains were not found until Dec. 4. The remains were found about two miles off the base and more than 17

miles from the point where he was last seen.

The infantryman had not been reported missing for almost 40 hours after he should have been picked up. The investigation, conducted by Col. Donald K. Angel of

the Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic command, headquartered in Norfolk, Va., concluded that poor planning and direction in the placement and recovery of the Marines assigned to the detail with LCpl. Rother caused the failure to pick him up, and that a "total breakdown" in the chain of personnel accountability within LCpl.

Rother's unit led to the delay in accounting for his whereabouts.

LCpl. Rother's platoon leader and company commander have already been relieved of their duties and reprimanded for their roles in the tragedy. Based upon additional recommendations made by the investigating

MEB tests MAGTF readiness at PTA

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA. Hawaii — More than 1,500 Marines and sailors from all corners of the 1st MEB came together during PTA 1-89 to form an exercise that tested their ability to conduct most types of operations required of them as an air/ground task force.

Pohakuloa Training Area (PTA) is the most expansive training area available to Marines in the Mid-Pacific. There are 57,000 acres of live-fire impact area for the gunners of 1st Bn., 12th Marines, and an additional 52,000 acres of maneuver area for the 3rd Marine Regiment grunts.

An expeditionary airfield is available to handle logistic requirements of the helicopter squadrons that come out of MAG-24, rounding out the needs of the Corps' only standing air/ground fighting team.

The exercise began with a helo assault by the entire 1st Bn., 3rd Marines. This formed the base of the exercise that required everyone from the general's staff down to the fire-team leader in the bush to come together.

"That's what we wanted. We put everything from the private with the rifle to the men with the helicopters through a tough scenario."

DoD budget calls for two percent growth; USMC forces unchanged

Military pay raises set at 3.6% for 1990, 3.2% for 1991

The Defense Department two-year budget request for fiscal year 1990 and 1991 calls for a two percent real increase in funding and no changes in the Marine Corps force structure.

The budget calls for \$305.6 billion in fiscal year 1990, of which the Marine Corps will get \$1.2 billion. The Corps will get \$1.4 billion of the 1991 budget of \$320.9 billion.

However, the budget request — the last to be submitted by the Reagan administration — may change, both in funding amounts and in programs affected when the new president and secretary of the defense take office tomorrow.

As it stands now, the biennial budget calls for modest pay raises for the military and civilian workers. Military pay raises are pegged at 3.6 percent in fiscal year 1990 and 3.2 percent in 1991. The corresponding pay raises requested for civilians are two percent and three percent.

A major hit was in force sustainability. The budget calls for the Marine Corps to curb munitions buys. All services had programs proposed for cancellation. Programs affected include the 155mm, the 105mm and the eight-inch projectiles.

New starts are funded at \$216.1 million in fiscal year 1990 and \$347.3 million in fiscal year 1991.

Officials said the military construction and family

housing programs "were hit very hard." The total for the two years is \$18.2 billion. The request would fund 2,100 construction projects at more than 600 locations. The lion's share of the request—\$11.5 billion—is for construction. The rest of the money will go toward modern replacement facilities. A total of \$300 million is tagged to plan future construction and the balance of \$5.9 billion for operating and maintaining family housing.

The Strategic Defense Initiative budget calls for \$5.6 billion in fiscal year 1990 and \$6.7 billion in 1991. The rest of the research and development field remained "relatively flat," according to officials. In both years, the budget asks for \$41 billion for research, development, testing and evaluation.

This was DoD's second biennial budget request. By budgeting for two years rather than one, the Defense Department hopes to achieve economical procurements, program stability and efficiencies of operation. The first biennial request — covering fiscal year 1988 and 1989 — was cut by more than \$150 billion. The two-percent growth over the next two years "is an attempt to steer a sustainable and fiscally responsible course that allows the United States to maintain its current force structure and to acquire the weapon systems necessary to ensure our national security," said Defense officials.

As proposed, the defense budget as a percentage of the gross national product would drop. It would be 5.4 percent of the gross national product in fiscal year 1990 and 5.2 percent in 1991.

Motorcycle safety attire required of everyone

Anyone operating or riding on a motorcycle, motor scooter, or moped on a DoD installation is required by DoD Instruction 8065.4 to wear a DOT-approved helmet, properly attached under the chin; impact- or shatter-resistant goggles or full-face shield; and hard-soled shoes with heels.

Military personnel are also required to wear the personal protective equipment when riding off-base. Use of additional equipment such as leather boots or over-the-ankle shoes, long-legged trousers, and long-sleeved shirts or jackets is strongly encouraged by the instruction.

ALMAR 278/85 requires all Marines riding off-base, whether in military or civilian attire, to wear approved helmets, eye protection and reflective vests.

Hickam AFB messing restricted

Due to the large number of people using the Hickam AFB Dining Facility during the noon meal, the facility has had difficulty feeding Hickam personnel within its allotted time. As a result, use of the facility has been restricted to those working at Hickam.

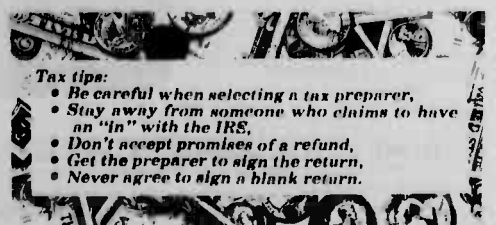

LtCol. Loomis takes command of HMM-364 Friday

LtCol. Dunstan to become MAG-24 logistics officer

LtCol. Clarence T. Dunstan will relinquish command of HMM-364 to LtCol. Gary Loomis here Friday at 2 p.m., between hangars 102 and 103.

LtCol. Loomis joined the Platoon Leaders Class program in January 1963, and was commissioned a second lieutenant in January 1967. He was designated a Naval Aviator in May 1967, after completing the Marine Corps Aviation Cadet Program. After Flight School, he was transferred to MCAS Tustin, Calif., where he served as '364's CMCC officer. For the next year, LtCol. Loomis served in Vietnam as a pilot.

After Vietnam, he was ordered to MCAS New River, N.C., where he served a six-year term as a legal and NATOPS officer.

In January 1973, he returned overseas and reported to MCAS Futenma, Okinawa, Japan, where he served as a group motor transport officer. Upon completing this assignment, he served as a UH-1 Flight Instructor at NAS Pensacola, Fla.

While there, LtCol. Loomis was selected for the College Degree Completion Program with the University of West Florida. After earning his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Communication Arts, the Purple Heart recipient joined 2nd Marine Division at Camp Lejeune, N.C. and served as the air officer for the 2nd Marine Regiment.

While in North Carolina, he also served at New River and Camp Lejeune. In New River, he assumed duties as an operations officer and was later assigned as a Marine

amphibious unit air officer. At Camp Lejeune, LtCol. Loomis served as an air officer and was later assigned as executive officer of Marine Expeditionary Unit Service Support Group-28 during their exercises in Honduras, Norway, and Wisconsin.

LtCol. Loomis reported to Camp Smith in September 1986, where he served as head of the Manpower

Branch for the chief of staff at PMFPac until assuming his current duties here as the logistics officer at MAG-24. His personal decorations also include the Air Medal and Navy Commendation Medal.

Upon graduating from the University of Montana in 1967, LtCol. Dunstan joined the Marine Corps. After being commissioned, he reported to U.S. Army Flight

School at Fort Walters, Texas, and then to Hunter Army Airfield, Ga., where he completed flight training in February, 1969.

LtCol. Dunstan continued his flight training with HML-267 at Camp Pendleton, Calif. He received his Naval Aviator wings in June of 1969.

After serving in Vietnam for a year as an aviation supply officer and an assistant logistics officer, LtCol. Dunstan joined HMM-163 at MCAS Tustin.

During his tour at Tustin, he served as a legal officer, basic training officer, logistics officer, and as an instructor at the low-altitude instrument school.

In July 1975, LtCol. Dunstan was assigned to the Naval Air Training Command at Meridian, Miss., where he received fixed-wing training. In June 1976, he returned to Tustin and joined

HMT-301 as the pilot training officer and the assistant maintenance officer. In September 1980, LtCol. Dunstan joined Headquarters & Headquarters Squadron (H&HS) at Tustin as the admin/personnel officer and aviation safety officer until he assumed command of H&HS in June 1982.

LtCol. Dunstan reported to Commander-in-chief Pacific in March 1983, where he worked in the Southeast Asia Policy Branch, Plans, and Policy Directorate. In July 1986, he joined MAG-24 as the IG coordinator until his present assignment as commanding officer of HMM-364 commenced in January of 1987.

He will be reassigned as the logistics officer for MAG-24.

His personal awards include the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal with the numeral 50, and the Joint Service Commendation Medal.

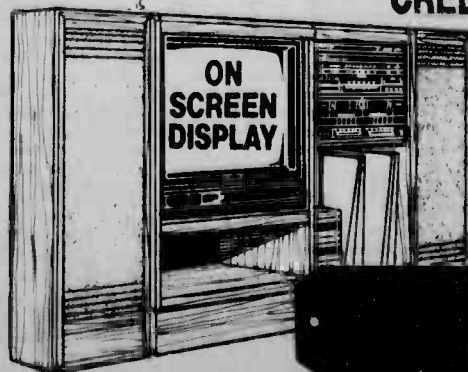

officer and approved by the Commandant, the Commanding General of the 2nd Marine Division has been directed to review the report and take appropriate action with respect to the battalion commander and the battalion executive officer of LCpl. Rother's at 3rd Bn, 2nd Marines, 2nd Marine Division.

Two other Marines, LCpl. Rother's squad leader Sgt. Thomas Turnell and his platoon sergeant, Sgt. Christopher Clyde, are facing dereliction of duty and other charges at special court-martial expected to be held at the unit's home base in Camp Lejeune, N.C., later this month.

A third Marine, 1stLt. Allen V. Larson, who was the officer in charge of platoon LCpl. Rother and the other guides that night, has been charged with dereliction of duty and disobedience of orders. He is currently the subject of a pre-trial investigation under Article 32 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

This was the second investigation of the Rother case. The first, conducted in the two weeks after Rother's disappearance, was returned Nov. 21 with directions that a more comprehensive review of all the circumstances surrounding LCpl. Rother's disappearance be undertaken.

LCpl. Rother's remains were discovered Dec. 4 by a search team organized by Capt. Bryan N. Lavender, who was acting in his role as a reserve deputy in the San Bernardino County Sheriff's department. Capt. Lavender, who had participated in earlier search efforts, sought and received the county's approval to conduct the county's December search and rescue training as a continuation of the search for LCpl. Rother.

Gen. Gray stated that, "When a Marine is killed or injured while training, more than the immediate environment of the occurrence must be examined: The quality of leadership at every echelon of the organization, its overall level of training, the degree of supervision over those directly involved, and

organizational SOPs (standard operating procedures) are among the matters which must be closely and carefully investigated."

While recognizing that death or injury of Marines can be reluctantly accepted as a price we might have to pay for dealing in a tough, demanding, and sometimes dangerous profession, Gen. Gray stated that he would not accept "wasting lives in so-called training accidents." LCpl. Rother's death "was not an 'accident,'" he wrote. "Accidents happen. His death didn't just happen, rather it was the culminating event in a series of acts, each consciously committed by human beings—intelligent, experienced and highly trained Marine Corps officers and non-commissioned officers. It was the certain and foreseeable result of an attitude which I intend to see erased from our Corps."

The Commandant stressed a basic principle in training for maneuver-style warfare: the need to ensure all Marines, two echelons up and two echelons down, be thoroughly indoctrinated in the commander's intent, the mission and tasks, the scheme of the maneuver, safety restriction, and overall conduct of the exercise. If that principle had been scrupulously applied in this instance, a tragedy might have been averted. He directed that copies of the investigation be sent to all generals in command of Marine Corps units or installations, for appropriate incorporation of its findings and conclusions into all their operations and training.

Gen. Gray's message to his commanders is clear: "Your Commandant has repeatedly emphasized the requirement for continuous communications up and down the chain of command. If such an omission occurs again, be assured," he wrote, "commanders at each echelon of command will be relieved and subject to disciplinary action."

At the direction of the Commandant of the Marine Corps, copies of the completed investigation were provided to LCpl. Rother's parents.

said Maj. Lane Nell, operations officer for the MEB. "That's what it takes on the battlefield, and that's what we have to do in training."

For the first major exercise of the New Year, the MEB staff went to great lengths to write an operation order that would tax each unit, not only in independent operations, but working with other units as well. From assembling the required assets needed to transport the 440-man infantry battalion in one large-scale attack to supplying them through the Combat Service Support Detachment, coordination was the key to a home run.

"We set out to work hard at every level, and work together at different levels," said Maj. Neil. "The MEB staff works with the regiment, the regiment is coordinating with the MAG, and so on up and down the line."

It was, however, Marines of 1/3 who served as the primary ground element. They faced off against the Tactical Exercise Evaluation Control Group's (TEECG) fictitious enemy—the aggressors from 2nd Bn, 3rd Marines. Controlled by the MEB and regimental staffs, 1/3 ran raids, night attacks and a non-combatant evacuation operation.

The artillerymen of 1/12

not only provided fire support for the exercise, but also took advantage of the wide open ranges to conduct battery-level operations. The expanse of ground gave them the opportunity for firing that is not possible on Oahu.

As the only standing air/ground task force in the Corps, the 1ST MEB had the opportunity to take advantage of the air assets it possesses.

Battalion PTA assault 'a rare evolution'

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA (PTA), Hawaii—The 1ST MEB demonstrated the unique prowess it possesses when 1st Bn, 3rd Marines conducted a battalion-sized helicopter assault here Jan. 11.

Four hundred forty Marines from Alpha, Bravo and Charlie rifle companies as well as the command element, boarded CH-46 and -53 helicopters at MCAS Kaneohe Bay and were flown to a staging area on Kaho'olawe, mid-way between Oahu and their objective (PTA), where the assault took place.

With 10 helicopters per company, the assault was made possible due to the close workings of the Corps' only standing Air/Ground Task Force.

"This is definitely a core

evolution," said Lt. Col. Ronald Stevens, commanding officer of 1/3. "It was made possible because of the air assets dedicated to the MEB."

At the staging area on Kaho'olawe, last minute preparations for the rifle companies were made. As the sun came up Jan. 11, the Marines boarded the birds and took off toward their assigned objectives. A 45-minute flight brought them over the coast of the Big Island, where the helicopters dispersed and headed to the landing zones. Heading up the highlands to an area called Pau Kee Kee, they sat down and discharged their cargo of assaulting infantrymen.

Charlie Company met almost immediate resistance from the aggressors of 2/3 as the Marines struggled through the thin air, taking

the high ground overlooking the battlefield.

"You never know how heavy a pack is until you start running up a hill with it," said LCpl. John Santangallo, a squad automatic weapon (SAW) man of 3rd Platoon, Charlie Co. "Look

over on the side of that hill and you can see the enemy. Let me get this gun set up and blow them away," he added while still on the move.

LCpl. Santangallo and the rest of the company moved

7th Comm. helps MEB keep in touch

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA (PTA), Hawaii—What would be more vexing to a commanding general in war than if he and his staff had no way to communicate strategies, warnings, or emergencies to troops in the field?

The thought of waging war without timely communication is unthinkable. That's why—when the 1ST MEB headed for PTA 1-89 Jan. 8, it brought along 143 Marines from Co. B, 7th Communications Bn., so they could hone their communications skills under realistic tactical circumstances.

When the company set up its antennas atop Pau Kee Kee overlooking 1ST MEB headquarters, it was to be a busy training evolution steeped in the "Oorah grunt-stuff."

And they were ready for it, according to Maj. Judith Shaw, 7th Comm's commanding officer. She sent the entire company through the brigade's Defense Tactics Course last year.

"I think it's important for these Marines to be up on the infantry-type skills as well as being proficient in their MOSs," said Maj. Shaw. "I set a goal to put the whole company through, and we did that last summer. So this is really the first time they've got to put what they've

learned to use in a large exercise.

The acquired skills came in handy at PTA. The 7th Comm Marines were tasked with manning half the fighting holes on the defensive perimeter encircling the MEB headquarters.

When the Marines got the word that a 10-man enemy force planned to infiltrate the camp and attack the commanding general, they had to be on constant alert.

If displacements, enemy raids, and setting up comm by moonlight was not enough to make their jobs difficult, the Big Island's winter chill tipped the scales in stacking up the negatives weighing against 7th Comm.

The cold, wind, and rain made themselves at home throughout the entire exercise.

"It doesn't take much to motivate these Marines," said 1st Sgt. George Hohnberger of 7th Comm. "Set them down, get them some chow and in a few minutes they'll be back up and ready to work, bad weather and all."

The major part of that

work, getting antennas, wires and radio comm set up for the headquarters, is usually a four- to five-hour job.

"If all the tents were set up and we knew ahead of time exactly where we're gonna be, we can wire it up in two hours, no problem," said wireman LCpl. David Muth.

Bravo Company is one of four companies which make up the 7th Comm Bn., home based in Okinawa, Japan. The Marine Corps has two other comm battalions: the 8th at Camp Lejeune, N.C. and the 9th at Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Bravo Company is unique in that it is the only comm company in the Marine Corps based with a MEB. "We have all the capabilities of a battalion in one company," said Maj. Shaw.

"The little battalion," as it is called, is comprised of four different platoons: the Headquarters and Service platoon, which has motor transport, engineers, supply, admin, armory, operations, a three-corpman medical section, electronic maintenance and a career planner; the Radio

platoon, which sets up single and multi-channel radio links and handles satellite communications; the wire platoon, which lays wires, puts together radio circuits, switchboards and meets the MEB headquarter's telephone and Teletype needs; and the Comm Center platoon, whose Marines determine the comm needs and sets up Teletype circuits.

The following statistics are indicative of the company's size and work volume.

- It took six M-923s and 28 HMMVs to transport its personnel and radio gear while at PTA.

- There were 22 single-channel radio nets, six multi-channel links (one radio sends eight different telephone lines to talk between the major subordinate commands) and a Teletype and a facsimile machine.

The company also got a chance to work with the Tactical Satellite Communication (TSC) 96, which was operated by 10 Marines from Co. A, 7th Comm out of Okinawa.

The TSC 96 is a two-van mobile communications system operating on what is called the Auto Digitalized Index Network, which gives it the capability of sending message traffic around the world.

The Marines returned to the Air Station Tuesday afternoon.

On the Blotter

Alcohol Incidents

• Four Marines were apprehended by MPs for consuming alcohol in an unauthorized area. The Marines were observed drinking beer in the parking lot of barracks 230. During processing, MPs learned that one of the Marines was under the legal age for consuming alcohol and was subsequently charged with that offense.

• A Marine was apprehended for drunk and disorderly conduct. MPs received an anonymous report of a possible fight in progress at one of the beach cottages. The cutter stated that the Marine had been involved in a fight and had to be re-

strained. The cutter said the fight had been broken up prior to the call. MPs arrived at the beach cottage and found the Marine in an intoxicated state with minor swelling around his right eye. The Marine refused medical attention and was allowed to leave with an NCO present at the beach cottage.

• A Marine was apprehended by the Military Police Department at Fort Detussay for failure to obey an order, disorderly conduct, resisting arrest, escape, and underage drinking. The Marine was initially apprehended after MPs observed him acting in a disorderly manner at the liberty bus stop. During processing, MPs learned that the Marine was under the legal age to consume alcohol.

At one point the Marine kicked open the door of the holding area and fled, but MPs quickly recaptured him.

• A Marine was arrested by the Honolulu Police Department for DWI, lack of auto insurance, and fleeing the scene. The Marine was stopped for an unspecified earlier incident on the Kamehameha Highway in Lilipuna and the HPD officer detected an odor of alcohol on his breath. The Marine submitted an Intoxilyzer test which resulted in a reading of 20 percent blood alcohol content. During processing, officers discovered that the Marine had no current insurance for his vehicle.

• Three Marines are under investigation for travel fraud. All three of the Marines have

submitted suspected fraudulent travel claims for travel in conjunction with permanent changes of station.

Other Events on the Blotter

• A Marine and his wife were involved in an aggravated assault and spouse abuse in Pearl Harbor housing. While the two were involved in an argument, the Marine allegedly pushed his wife to the ground. Investigation revealed that during the course of the argument, the wife obtained a kitchen knife and cut the Marine on his arm and back. The Marine refused medical attention.

• A Marine was apprehended for wrongful appropriation of private property.

The Marine rented a 1986 Suzuki from the MCX and failed to return it on the agreed date. MPs escorted the Marine to the MCX where he returned the vehicle and signed a promissory note to pay the amount owed.

• A Marine was apprehended for leaving the scene of an accident. The Marine hit an unattended vehicle in the parking lot of the MCX with a vehicle he was driving and immediately fled, failing to make his identity known. The Marine was identified after further investigation.

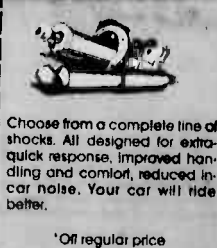

SUPER BOWL '89

Super Bowl '89 has the potential to overcome hype

For whatever reason, Super Bowls have been anything but super. In the past five years, victors have posted margins of at least 19 points. But this may be the year when the game actually lives up to its hype.

Odds-makers have tabbed the San Francisco 49ers as six-point favorites over the Cincinnati Bengals in Super Bowl XXIII Sunday at Joe Robbie Stadium in Miami, Fla. One touchdown is a wide margin for a big game, but the Bengals are a lot better than they are being given credit for.

The six-point differential is probably due to the 49ers' impressive playoff performances against the Minnesota Vikings (34-9 in the semifinals) and the Chicago Bears (28-3 in the NFC Championship). Both wins were considered upsets.

But the Bengals have been a model of consistency over the season. The Cats finished the regular season with a 12-4 record — compared to the 49ers' 10-6 mark — despite playing a

tougher schedule than their NFC counterpart. Also, against common opponents, the Bengals were 4-0, while the 49ers were just 2-2.

In the NFL, the game is won through the air. And the Bengals have a decided edge in this department. San Francisco's Joe Montana, who will be making his third Super Bowl appearance, averages just 7.51 yards per pass attempt, fourth best in the NFL. The 49ers, it appears, prefer the short yardage pass, as running back Roger Craig led the team in receptions with 76. Pro Bowl-bound wide out Jerry Rice had only 64 receptions, but for 1,406 yards.

Bengals' signal caller Boomer Esiason, though, was much more efficient. He led the NFL with 9.21 yards per attempt and tied for the AFC lead with 28 touchdown passes. His favorite targets are wide receivers Eddie Brown and Tim McWorter.

On the ground, both teams appear to be equal. Both led their respective conferences in rushing yards per game. But the Bengals, overall, were again more effi-

cient, averaging a league-high 6.1 yards per offensive play. The 49ers were tied for the NFC lead with 5.5. Also, though Craig was second in the NFC with 1,502 yards rushing, he averaged just 4.8 yards per crack — decent, but not close to Cincinnati's Ickey Woods, who hanged for 5.3 per carry.

Defensively, the matchups look even. The 49ers are led by their Pro Bowl contingency — nose tackle Mike Carter, outside linebacker Charles Haley, safety Ronnie Lott and cornerback Tim McKeever. Haley was seventh in the NFC with 11½ sacks, while McKeever led the team with seven interceptions. Lott, the perennial pick-off artist, had five.

The Bengals defensive front is anchored by nose tackle Tim Krumrie and end Jim Skow, who is tied for third in the AFC with 9½ sacks. Cornerback Eric Thomas and safety David Fulcher will have the task of containing the 49ers' deep threat.

The 19th Pro Bowl, the all-star classic for the National Football League, will be held at 3 p.m. Jan. 29 at Aloha Stadium.

Forty-one players from the American Football Conference and 41 from the National Football League were selected by their peers. Players, though, cannot vote for their own teammates.

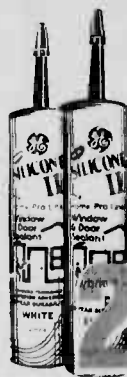

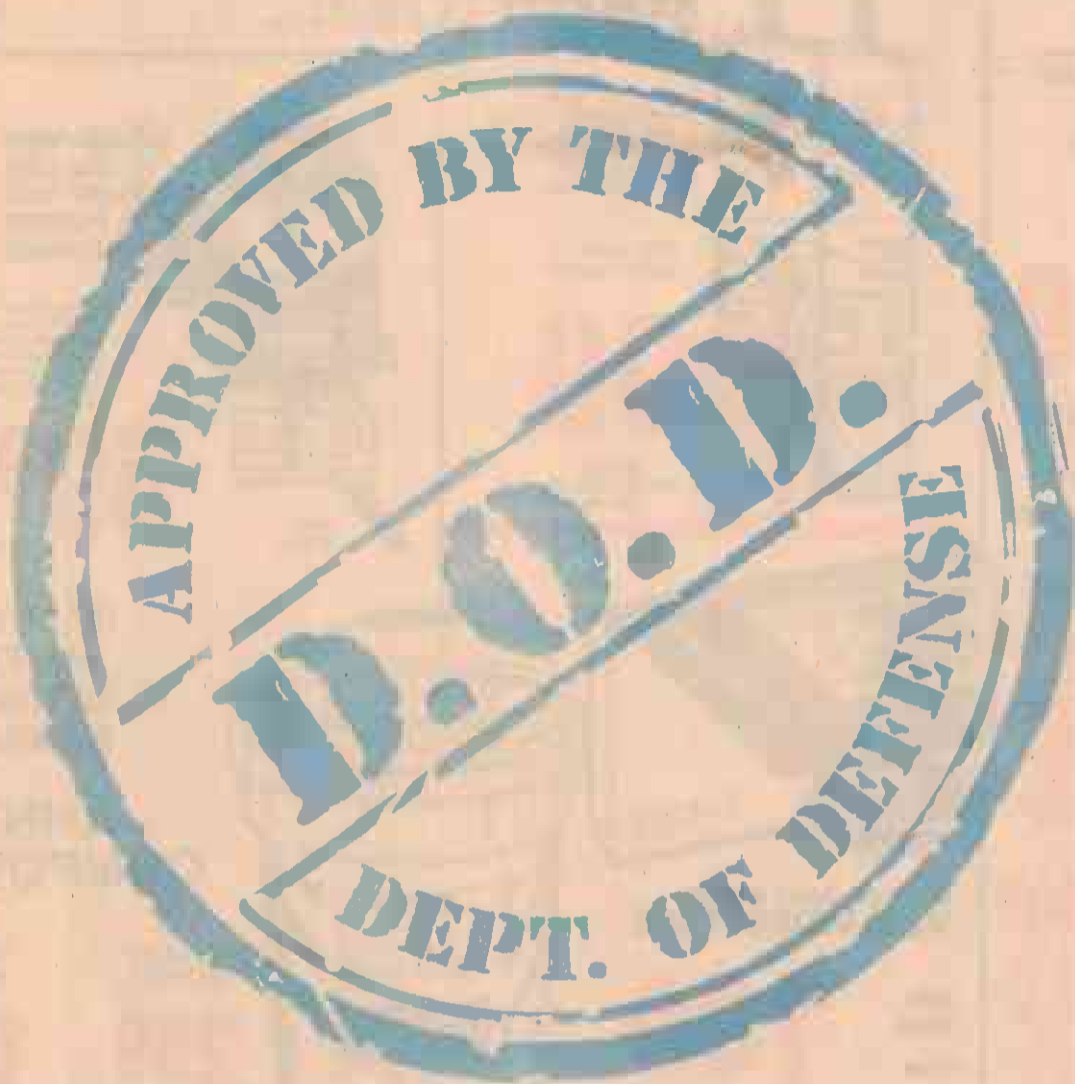

The Great Aloha Run is coming!

The fifth annual Great Aloha Run starts at 6:45 a.m. Feb. 20, President's Day, at Aloha Tower in Honolulu. At least 6,000-8,000 active duty military runners are expected to join more than 20,000 civilian runners as they cover 8.2 miles of Honolulu pavement.
