HQMC, Washington, D.C.—The Commandant of the Marine Corps, Gen. Al Gray, has reviewed the investigation of the circumstances surrounding the death of LCpl. Jason J. Rother, stating that the actions of some of the individuals involved in the case reflected "a state of mind which contradicts every principle of concerned leadership on which we

MEB tests MAGTE readiness at PTA

POHAKULOA TRAIN-ING AREA, Hawaii — More than 1,500 Marines and sailors from all corners of the IST MEB came together during PTA 1-89 to form an exercise that tested their ability to conduct most types of operations required of them as an air/ground task force. Pohakuloa Training Area (PTA) is the most expansive training area available to Mirines in the Mid-Pacific. There are 57,000 acres of live-fire impact area for the

fire impact area for the gunners of 1st Bn., 12th Marines, and an additional 52,000 acres of maneuver area for the 3rd Marine

area for the 3rd Marine Regiment grunts.

An expeditionary airfield is available to handle logistic requirements of the helicopter squadrons that come out of MAG-24, rounding out the needs of the Corps' only standing air/ground fighting team.

The exercise began with a helo assault by the entire 1st Bn., 3rd Maxines. This formed the base of the exercise that required everyone from the general's staff down to the fire-team leader in the bush to come together.

"That's what we wanted. We put everything from the private with the rifle to the men with the helicopters through a tough scenario,"

DoD budget calls for two percent growth; USMC forces unchanged

Military pay raises set at 3.6% for 1990. 3.2% for 1991

The Defense Department two-year budget request for fiscal year 1990 and 1991 calls for a two percent real increase in funding and no changes in the Marine Corps force struc-

the Marine Corps force struc-ture.

The budget calls for \$305.6 billion in fiscal year 1990, of which the Murlne Corps will get \$1.2 billion. The Corps will get \$1.2 billion of the 1991 budget of \$320.9 billion.

However, the budget request

The last to be submitted by the Reagan administration—may change, both in funding amounts and in programs affected when the new president and secretary of the defense take office tomorrow.

As it stands now, the hiennial budget calls for modest pay raises for the military and civilian workers. Military pay raises are pegged at 3.6 percent in fiscal year 1990 and 3.2 percent in 1991. The corresponding pay raises requested for civilians are two percent and three percent.

A major hit was in force sustainability. The budget calls for the Marine Corps to curb munitions buys. All services had programs proposed for cancellation. Programs affected include the 155mm, the 105mm and the eight-inch projectiles.

New starts are funded at \$216.1 million in fiscal year 1990 and \$347.3 million in

fiscal year 1991.
Officials said the military construction and family

housing programs "were hit very hard." The total for the two years is \$18.2 hillion. The request would fund 2,100 The request would find 2,100 construction projects at more than 600 locations. The lion's share of the request—\$11.5 billion—is for construction. The rest of the money will go toward modern replacement facilities. A total of \$300 million is tagged to plan future construction and the balance of \$5.9 billion for operating and maintaining family housing.

maintaining family housing.

The Strategic Defense Initiative budget calls for \$5.6 billion in fiscal year 1990 and \$6.7 billion in 1991. The rest of the research and development field remained "relatively flut," according to officials. In both years, the budget asks for \$41 billion for research, development, esting and evaluation.

This was 1901's second

This was DoD's second blennial budget request. By budgeting for two years rather than one, the Defense Department hopes to achieve economical procurements, program stability and efficiencies of operation. The first program stability and efficiencies of operation. The first blennial request — covering fiscal year 1988 and 1989 — was cut by more than \$150 billion. The two-percent growth over the next two years "is an attempt to steer a sustainable and fiscally responsible course that allows the United States to maintain its current force structure and to acquire the weapon systems necessary to

ture and to acquire the weapon systems necessary to ensure our national security," said Defense officials. As proposed, the defense budget as a percentuge of the gross national product would drop. It would be 5.4 percent of the gross national product in fiscal year 1990 and 5.2 percent in 1991.

Motorcycle safety attire required of everyone

Anyone operating or riding on a motorcycle, motor accoter, or inoped on a DoD installation is required by Dol) Instruction 6065.4 to wear a DOT-approved helmet, properly attached under the chin; impact- or shatter-resistant goggles or full-face shield; and hard-soled shoes with heela. Military personnel are also required to wear the personal protective equipment when riding off-base. Use of additional equipment such as leather boots or over-the-ankle shoes, long-legged trousers, and long-sleeved shirts or jackets is strongly encouraged by the instruction.

ALMAR 278/85 requires all Marines riding off-base, whether in military or civillan attire, to wear approved helmets, eye protection and reflective vests.



Two other Marines, LCpl. Rather's squad lender Sgt. Thomas Turnell and his platon sergeant, Sgt. Chris-topher Clyde, are facing dereliction of duty and other charges at special courts-martial expected to be held at the unit's home base in Camp Lejeune, N.C., later this

A third Marine, 1stLt. Allen V. Larson, who was the officer in charge of placing LCpl. Rother and the other guides that night, has been charged with deraliction of duty and disobedience of orders. He is currently the subject of a pre-trial investigation under Article 32 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

This was the second investigation of the Rother case the first, conducted in the wo weeks after Rother's disappearance, was returned Nov. 21 with directions that a more comprehensive review of all the circumstances sur-rounding LCpl. Rother's dis-appuarance be undertaken.

Lavender, who was acting in his role as a reserve deputy in the San Bernardino County Sheriff's department. Capt. Lavender, who had participated in earlier search efforts, sought and received the county's approval to conduct the county's December search and rescue training as a conducteur training as a conduct raining as a conduct and rescue training as a con-tinuation of the search for LCpl. Rother.

Gen. Gray stated that, "When a Murine is killed or injured while training, more than the immediate environment of the occurrence must be examined: The quality of lendership at every echelon of the organization, its overall level of training, the degrees of environment of the organization o degree of supervision over those directly involved, and

organizational SOPs (standing operating procedures) are among the matters which must be closely and carefully investigated."

While recognizing that death or injury of Marines can be reluctantly accepted as a price we might have to pay for dealing in a tough, demanding, and sometimes dengerous profession, Gen. Gray stated that he would not account "westing lives in triny states that he work not accept "wasting lives in so-called training accidents." LCpl. Rother's death "was not an 'accident," he wrote. "'Accidents' happen. His death didn't just happen, again from t just happen, rather it was the culminating event in a series of acts, each consciously committed by human beings—intelligent, experienced and highly trained Marine Corps afficers and non-commissioned officers. and non-commissioned offi-cers, It was the certain and foreseeable result of an atti-tude which I intend to see erased from our Corps."

The Commandant stressed a basic principle in training for maneuver-style warfare: the need to ensure all Marines, two echelons up and two echelons down, he thoroughly indoctrinated in the commander's intent, the mission and tasks, the scheme of the maneuver, safety restriction, and overall conduct of the exercise. If that principle had been scrupulously applied in this instance, a tragedy might have been averted. He directed that copies of the investigations. The Commandant stressed basic principle in training stance, a tragedy might have been averted. He directed that copies of the investiga-tion be sent to all generals in command of Marine Corps units or installations, for appropriate incorporation of its findings and conclusions into all their operations and training.

Gen. Grny's message to his commanders is clear: "Your Commandant has repeatedly emphasized the requirement for continuous communications up and down the chain of command. If such an omission occurs again, be assured," he wrote, "commanders at each echelon of command will be relieved and subject to disciplinary acsubject to disciplinary ac-

comm by moonlight was not enough to make their jobs difficult, the Big Island's winter chill tipped the scales in stacking up the negatives weighing against 7th Comm. The cold, wind, and rain made themselves at home throughout the entire exercise.

"It doesn't take much to motivate these Marines," said latSgt. George Hohnberger of 7th Comm. "Set them down, get them some chow and in a few minutes they'll be back up and ready to work, had weather and all."

The major part of that

work, getting antennas, wires

work, getting antennas, wires and radio comm set up for the headquarters, is usually a four-to five-hour job.

"If all the tents were set up and we knew ahead of time exactly where we're gonna be, we can wire it up in two hours, no problem," said wireman LCpl. David Muth.

Bravo Company is one of four companies which make up the 7th Comm Bn., home hased in Okiniwa. Japan. The Marine Corps has two other comm battalions: the 8th at Camp Lejeune, N.C., and the 9th at Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Bravo Company is unique in that it is the only comm company in the Marine Corps hased with a MEB. "We have all the capabilities of a battalion in one company," said Maj. Shaw.

"The little hattalion," as it

said Maj. Shaw.
"The little battalion," as it is called, is comprised of four different platoons: the Headquarters and Service platoon, which has motor transport, engineers, supply, admin, armory, operations, a three-corpaman medical section, electronic maintenance and a career planner, the Radio

platoon, which sets up single and multi channel radio links and handles satellite communications; the wire platoon, which lays wires, puts together radio circuits, switch-boards and meets the MEB headquarter's telephone and Teletype needs; and the Comm Center platoon, whose Marines determine the comm Marines determine the comm needs and sets up Teletype circuits

circuits.

The following statistics are indicative of the company's size and work volume.

• It took six M-923s and 28 HMMVs to transport its personnel and radio gear white at PTA;

while at PTA:

• There were 22 single-channel radio nets, six multi-channel links (one radio sends eight different tele-phone lines to talk between the major subordinate commands) and a Teletype and a facsimile machine.

The company also got a chance to work with the Tac-tical Satellite Communication (TSC) 96, which was operated by 10 Marines from Co. A, 7th Comm out of Okinawa

The TSC 96 is a two-van mobile communications sysmonie communications sys-tem operating on what is called the Auto Digitalized Index Network, which gives it the capability of sending message traffic around the world.



SUPERBOWL'8

Super Bowl '89 has the potential to overcome hype

For whatever reason, Super Bowls have been anything but super. In the past five years, victors have posted margins of at least 19 points. But this may be the year when the game actually lives up to its hype.

the year when the game actually lives up to its hype.

Oddsmakers have tabbed the San Francisco 49ers as six point favorites over the Cincinnati Bengals in Super Bowl XXIII Sunday at Joe Robbie Stadium in Miami, Fla. One tauchdown is a wide margain for a big game, but the Bengals are a lot better than they are being given credit for.

The six-point differential is probably due to the 49ers impressive playoff performances against the Minneson Vikings G4-9 in the semificals) and the Chicago Bears (28-3 in the NFC Champianship). Both wins were considered upaels.

But the Bengals have been a model of consistency over the season. The Cata finished the regular season with a 12-4 record—compared to the 49ers' 10-6 anark—despite playing a

lougher schedule than their NFC counterpart. Also, against com-mon opponents, the Benguls were 4-0, while the 49ers were just 2-

In the NPL, the game is won through the air. And the Bengais luve a decided edge in this dequartment. San Francisco's Joe Montana, who will be making his third Super Bowl appearance, averages just 7.51 yards per poss attempt, fourth best in the NFC.
