BGen. Phillips takes command of Brigade Wednesday

MGen. Studds assigned to HQMC

Major General John A. Studds will relinquish command of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade to Brigadier General Richard L. Phillips in a ceremony between Hangars 103 and 104 at 2 p.m. Wednesday.

BGen. Phillips is reporting in from Headquarters Marine Corps where he served as the Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff, Command, Control, Communications and Computer, Intelligence and Interoperability. He was also the Director, Command, Control, Communications and Computer Systems Division.

BGen. Phillips received a degree in Engineering from California Polytechnic College and was commissioned a second lieutenant in 1961. He was designated a Naval Aviator in January 1963. The general has com-

manded three Marine squadrons, and served for two years as commanding officer of Marine Aircraft Group 39 at Camp Pendleton, Calif. During his MAG-39 command, he also served as commanding officer of both the 11th and 17th Marine Amphibious Units.

Following that assignment, he joined the Naval Space Command as deputy commander in May 1985. He also was acting commander for several months after the space shuttle accident.

BGen. Phillips served in Vietnam during 1966, '67, '70 and '71 both as a squadron pilot and as a ground company commander. He has served in squadrons in all three active duty Air Wings in various billets. On the ground side, he served as the G-4 (Logistics) of a Marine

brigade and with G-3 (Operations) and G-4 (Logistics) of the 3rd Marine Division.

BGen. Phillips obtained his master's degree in computer science from the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, Calif., in 1973. He has attended the Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, Carlisle, Pa.; the U.S. Air Force Officers' Computer School at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas; and the Marine Air Weapons and Tactics Course, Yuma, Ariz.

BGen. Phillips' personal decorations include: the Meritorious Service Medal; 26 awards of the Air Medal with both single mission and strike awards; Navy Commendation Medal with Combat "V"; Navy Achievement Medal with Combat "V"

The general and his wife, the former Linda Shughart have two children, Rebacca and Richard.

MGen. Studds will leave Kaneohe and head to Headquarters Marine Corps where he will become the Assistant Chief of Staff, Command,

Control, Communications and Computer, Intelligence and Interoperability.

MGen. Studds was commissioned a second lieutenant after graduating from Mount St. Mary's College, Emmitsburg, Md., in 1960.

Upon completing The Basic School at Quantico, Va., in January 1961, he joined the 2nd Marine Division at Camp Lejeune, N.C., where he was a rifle platoon leader, 81mm mortar platoon leader, and rifle company executive officer in the 1st Bn., 6th Marines. He then commanded an anti-tank company in the 2nd Anti-tank Bn.

During July 1963, he reported to the Army Quartermaster School and Quartermaster Center, Fort Lee, Va., for duty as the Marine Corps representative, Amphibious Operations Instructor, and Liaison Officer, respectively.

MGen. Studds reported to the 3rd Marine Division in the Republic of Vietnam in

August 1965, where he commanded a service company in Headquarters Bn., and then a reconnaissance company in 3rd Recon Bn.

Returning to the States in August 1966, he was assigned as the officer selection officer, Washington, D.C. In 1968, he attended the Marine Corps Command and Staff College, at Quantico, Va. Following graduation in June 1969, he remained for one year at the Education

Center as the Head, Foreign Officer Training Branch.

He returned to the 3rd Marine Division, now on Okinawa in July 1970, and served initially as operations officer and then executive officer with 2nd Bn., 9th Marines.

MGen. Studds reported to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, S.C., for a three

The Shrinking Hawaii Marine

Col. Castagnetti to retire

Camp Smith gets new commander Friday

Colonel Gene E. Castagnetti will relinquish command of Camp H.M. Smith to Col. Carl A. Shaver in a change of command ceremony at Bordelon Field at 4 p.m. Friday.

Col. Castagnetti will retire on August 1 after more than 28 years of service.

Col. Castagnetti left the Marine Corps' Officer Candidate Program as a second lieutenant in 1961.

His career began at 3rd Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division

during the Cuban Missile Crisis at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

In 1964, he pioneered the deployment of the first U.S. Marine Combat Unit to Northern Norway for a NATO Exercise.

He is a graduate of the JFK Special Warfare Center for counter-insurgency operations and military advisors, where he learned the Vietnamese language and culture and served with the Commander, U.S. Military Advisory Command Vietnam.

Following his first Vietnam tour, he was assigned to Marine Barracks, Guam and attended the Amphibious

PADS (from A-1 System (PADS), and "moving and communicating" became considerably faster.

"There was no real 'system' before," said Sgt. Darryl Launius, survey team chief at the Survey/Meteorological section of Headquarters, 1st Bn., 12th Marine Regiment. "This is the first computer we've used in field artillery strictly for survey."

"Before, we were just conventional surveyors. Let's say we had a five-man T/O team and did a traverse and covered one mile. It could take two to nine hours, depending on the line of sight, how far we could see, etc. With the PADS, I go to a survey control point and draw all the data I need, I punch all that information into the PADS, and then I drive. All I need to do is stop and tell the PADS I want to know where I am."

The system is manufactured by the Guidance and Control Systems branch of Litton Industries. It determines the vehicle's position by using two north-seeking gyroscopes to determine the direction of travel, and three accelerometers to determine rate of travel. It is sealed in a shock-absorbing fluid. Four independent isolators protect it from shock, and a variety of sensors help the operators take care of the system.

"If it senses a shock because you're driving too fast, it'll tell you to slow down," said Sgt. Launius. "It's really user-friendly."

The 13 Marines in the Survey section operate two PADS units and one conventional survey team. They are often in the field, supporting infantry units with artillery, helping the air elements place their radar and traveling with the headquarters element.

The surveyors are usually called out early to do their surveys before the main body arrives, for safety reasons. When the PADS is up and everything is working smoothly, they finish their work before the rest of the Marines arrive, though in combat, they would survey as the need would arise. At times, the fact that the majority of the survey Marines' business is finished by the time the other units arrive on an exercise, the assumption arises that survey is an easy job.

But going to Kaho'olawe and finding a hub in the ground that no one has seen since the early 1970's can take a little while, as can be the case in the Mojave Desert. 1/12's PADS have routinely done these types of things.

"To find a brass hub in cement (a survey control point) in the desert that's three inches in diameter and can be under a foot and a

half of sand — it's hard. You'd never find it using conventional means. With the PADS, I can use the current data display and actually track down the location to within a meter.

"It decreased our time spent doing the work by over 50 percent," said CWO-2 A.J. Campagna, officer in charge of the section. "It allowed us to keep up with fast-moving combat scenarios. When it first came out, I was skeptical. A lot of surveyors didn't believe it could do it, but it did."

With the system, a battery commander can pull up and designate where he wants his gun positions, while one of the battalion's two PADS teams — operating out of a HMMWV, a jeep, or a helicopter — gives the commander a reference point for accurate location and a reference point for direction.

With these coordinates, the commander can get two things he needs in order to direct fire: an accurate position and a common direction.

"And that's the critical part," Sgt. Launius said. "An error in azimuth hurts, because the further it shoots, the further off it is. The howitzer can't see what it's aiming at, so it's relying solely on our surveyed azimuth when it aims down range."

If the azimuth given is off by one mil (1/18 degree), a round fired by the howitzer at 30,000 meters will miss its target by 300 meters. The effective casualty radius is approximately 50 meters.

"That's why the azimuth is so critical," said Sgt. Launius. "And that's the big thing about the PADS — the azimuth is always good-to-go."

As a believer in PADS, Sgt. Launius makes it a point to try to make believers out of others. But he is careful to balance his praise of the system with the old "you're only as strong as your weakest man" rule. He always keeps in mind the presence of two of the most dangerous creatures of modern warfare: reliance on the mysterious "new system," and the obligatory "duty expert."

"When you train your people," he said, "you train everyone in your section to be able to do everyone else's job. So, if one man goes down, you're not going to lose your proficiency. What you don't want is a situation where that computer goes down and nobody can do anything. Even a 5.56mm round in the right place could put the system down hard."

"The system is not fool-proof; no computer is," Sgt. Launius said. "The only fear I have is that ... people will start forgetting the manual ways (conventional survey)."

"It's (conventional survey) a very perishable skill," said CWO Campagna. "If you don't practice it, you'll lose it."

The PADS was put to the test at the most recent Combined Arms Exercise the MEB took part in at MCAGCC Twentynine

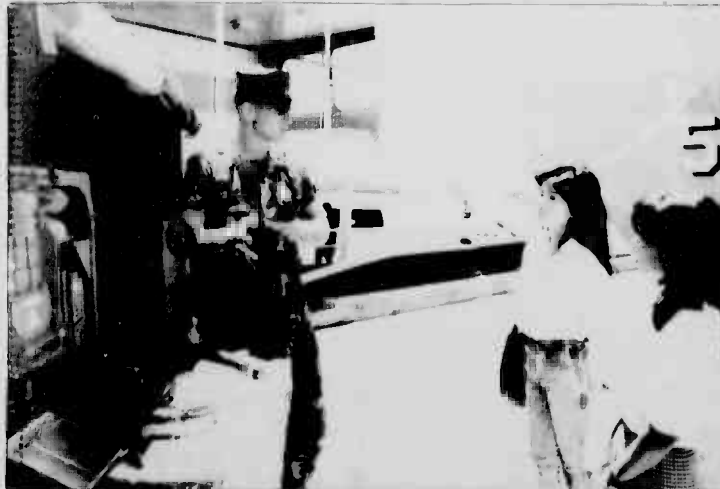

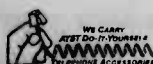

Thirteen 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade Marines were over-run by thousands of civilians when they made a landing on the island of Maui Friday.

The Marines were not making an assault on the island. They were there to set up a display showing the tourists and locals alike what the Marines had to offer for

their country's defense.

 Palms, Calif. In addition to artillery survey, the PADS was used successfully guiding tanks into position at night without roads. It exceeded recommended operating time limits by running non-stop for as long as 24 hours in dusty, 100-degree conditions in the land navigation mode.

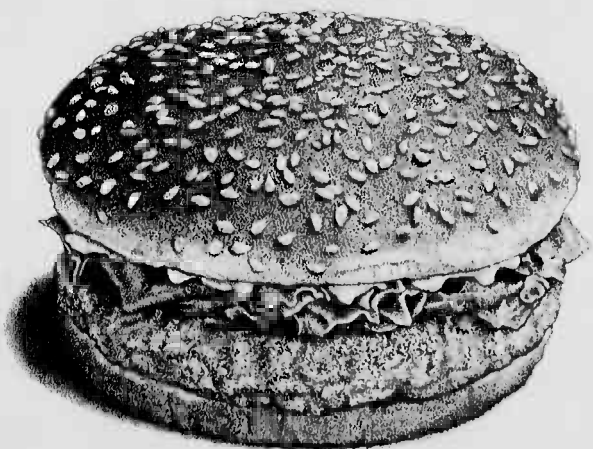

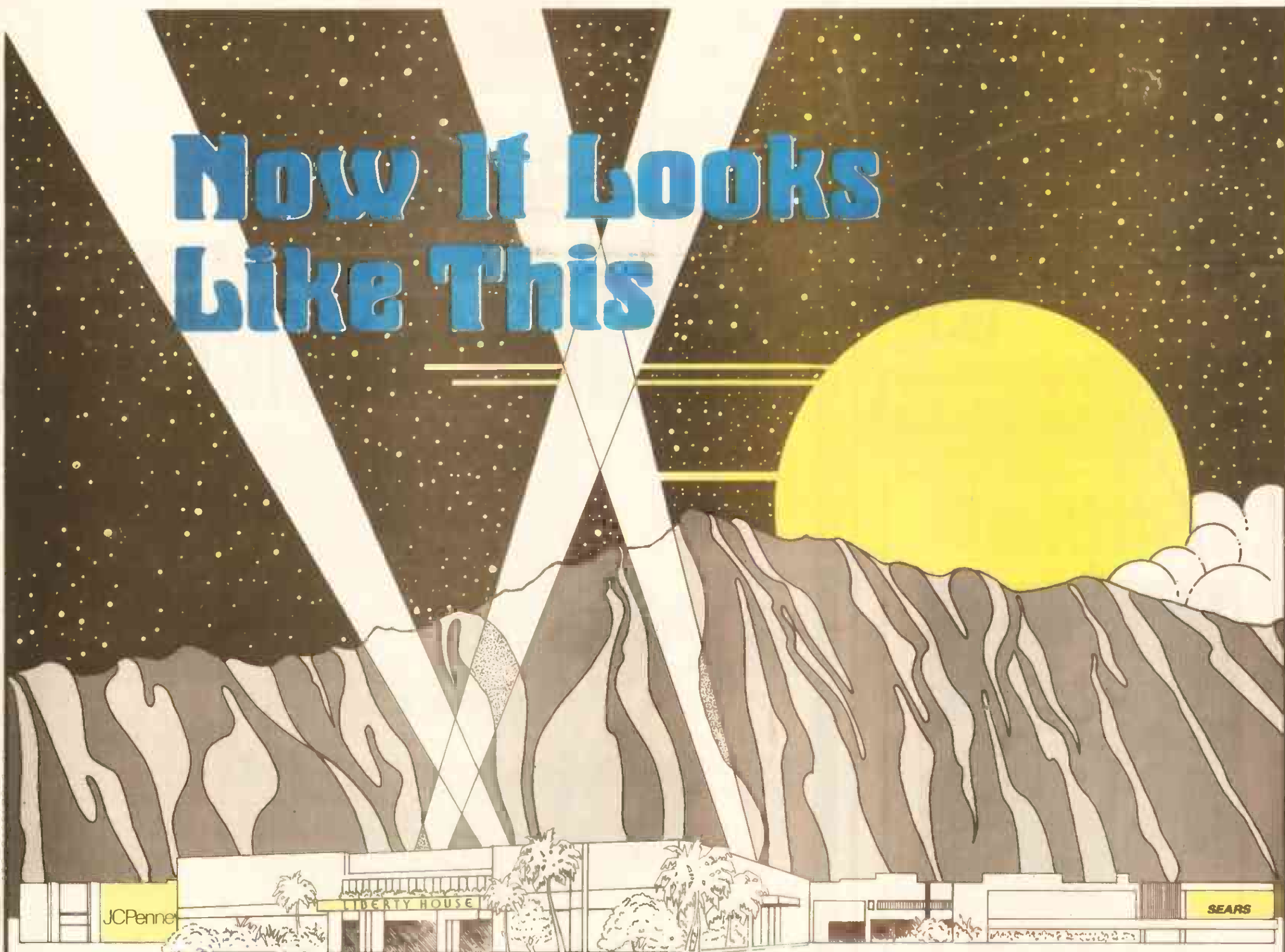

Legally Speaking

Foreign nationals' travel to and from United States soil is very strictly controlled. The days of America's open door/open arms policy are long gone. Our nation will no longer tolerate the unchecked flow of aliens into our country. The recent problems with the influx of illegal aliens and the amnesty program as a result are perfect examples of the control sought over immigrants to the United States.

The United States Department of Justice enforces the body of laws and the administrative procedures that govern aliens in our country.

The Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) is the hands-on enforcement agency. Dealing with the INS takes you into a realm of very specialized laws, procedures and forms similar to a tangled web of laws, and procedures and forms generated by the Internal Revenue Service.

Marriages to Foreign Nationals

The American servicemember with a foreign-born spouse or foreign-born children becomes intimately aware of the complicated and demanding nature of the INS and its laws and documents. A typical scenario involves a

IMMIGRATION

servicemember overseas who asks a foreign national to marry.

From that moment on, his or her life will never quite be the same. The INS will become a very real and ever-present part of the couple's life. Getting permission from the area military commander is the first order of business. Getting the fiance to the U.S. is the second. The most expedient way to accomplish this task is the utilization of the fiance visa attained through the U.S. consulate

in the country of the intended spouse. Children of the fiance can also be brought over at the same time and can be documented through the same forms. The servicemember is the party who must initiate this process by requesting the appropriate forms from INS. The forms must be carefully filled out and mailed to the fiance. The fiance's home country will issue the passport. Once the fiance gets to the U.S., there is a 90-day period in which the marriage must be accom-

plished. Then, the new spouse must apply for the conditional permanent residency card. This is also known as the green card.

Two years after the conditional card is issued, the couple will apply for a waiver of the conditional status and the foreign-born spouse will become a permanent resident alien and capable of becoming a naturalized citizen after the passage of the statutory period will lead to an INS inquiry with a view to deportation of the alien spouse.

INS information in Hawaii

There is an INS office in nearly every large city in the United States. The offices

are typically overworked and very difficult to get information from. In Honolulu, the office which will be of assistance with questions is located at 595 Ala Moana Blvd., downtown. The number to call for a recorded message that answers most questions is 541-1377 and after hours or on the weekends is 541-2540. There is a number that is specifically dedicated to requesting forms once you know what form you need. That number is 541-1379. Help with immigration problems can be obtained from the Legal Assistance Office at the Legal Assistance Center during walk-in hours.

• Three Marines were apprehended by the Fort DeRussy Military Police for open container, being in an off-limits area, resisting apprehension, and underage drinking. The Marines were observed in an off-limits area consuming alcohol. When approached by the MPs, two of the Marines attempted to flee, but were chased and apprehended. During processing, two of the Marines were

found to be under the legal age to consume alcohol.

• A Marine stationed here was apprehended by MPs at MCAS Yuma, Arizona, for falsifying an official document and the fraudulent use of a DoD decal. The Marine was stopped at the Main Gate, MCAS Yuma, Ariz., for operating his vehicle with an expired DoD decal. During processing, it was discovered that the birth dates on his

drivers license and Armed Forces ID card did not match. It was later learned that the Marine had given false information for his ID card.

• A Marine was involved in a verbal argument with his wife when he began choking and striking her. The Marine was apprehended for breach of peace and assault and transported to the MP Dept. The Marine was later released to his unit.

• A Marine was apprehended for falsifying an official document. The Marine was stopped at the Mokapu gate for operating his vehicle with an expired safety decal. An ID check revealed that the Marine had altered the date on his Armed Forces ID card.

• Two Marines were apprehended for fraud and uttering worthless checks. Their unit reported that the two

Marines and their spouses were sharing an apartment in Kailua, and were collecting separate VHA funds for the same apartment. One of the Marines had negotiated \$660.50 in worthless checks to the MCX, and the Pearl Harbor Navy Exchange. The other Marine had also negotiated \$550 in worthless checks to the AAFES, and also owes his landlord \$5,000 for worthless checks and damage to the apartment.


