Cobra Gold 90, a joint-service exercise involving the armed forces of Thailand and the United States, ended June 1. The exercise, which was conducted in and around Chonburi, in Nakhon Ratchasima (Korat) and in Rayong Province, was the ninth in the Cobra Gold series.

This year's Cobra Gold included an amphibious landing and joint/combined air and land operations.

Civic Action/humanitarian projects that took place during the exercise involved combined U.S./Thai mobile dental and medical teams. The teams conducted daily clinics in several villages throughout the operational area. Approximately 8,000 U.S. military personnel participated in Cobra Gold 90 as well as 7,250 Royal Thai military personnel.

## 'Red Devils' mark 35,000 safe flight hours

The VMFA-232 "Red Devils" achieved a rare milestone during the most recent Combined Arms Exercise at MCAGCC Twentynine Palms, Calif., as they flew their 35,000th accident-free hour — a record spanning more than 10 1/2 years. During the CAX, the Red

Devils served as the fixed-wing component of Task Force 3d Marines' Aviation Combat Element (ACE), completing several types of rigorous training sorties, including close-air support, low-level navigation, low-altitude refueling, and low-altitude refueling.

The entire evolution culminated with the CAX three-

day "war" April 16-18. All sorties during the war were five-ordnance exercises consisting of MK-82 "GPBs," (general-purpose bombs), five-inch "Zuni" rockets, and 20mm rounds.

Despite the amount of hours flown and intense operational demands, the Red Devils proved that safety doesn't have to be compro-

missed to complete mission requirements. VMFA-232's F/A-18s dropped more than 20 tons of inert ordnance during the three-week evolution, in addition to flying 331 sorties and 533 total flight hours.

The squadron returned to Kaneohe Bay May 14 after the deployment.

## SOMS CO tops 5,000 flight hours

## New child care rules in effect

Sweeping changes in the standards for in-home child care provided by residents of base housing here were put into effect June 6 by Air Station Order 1750.14. This was in accordance with Marine Corps Order 1750.30B.

Throughout the nation in recent years, child care has become a burning issue. Among key concerns are affordability and quality of care provided. This issue has not gone unnoticed at Kaneohe Bay.

For parents, the order is expected to set a minimum standard for the care their children receive in such homes. For care providers, however, it will mean strict new regulations governing qualification to run such a business on base. Additionally, the order tasks various sections within the command with responsibilities regarding screening applicants, inspecting homes and governing providers of on-base, in-home child care.

"The need for regulating child care here is very important to ensure the quality of care being provided," said Mary Heckert, the coordinator of the Station's newly established Family Day Care in the Home Program. "Our main purpose is to ensure the safety of the children."

According to the order, people who currently provide child care services on base are required to register with the FDCH Program Office (located in the Family Service Center, building 456) no later than July 6. Those who plan to become providers must register before beginning child care services.

The order applies to all individuals providing child care on a regular basis to one or more unrelated children for 10 or more "child-care hours" per week (Watching two children for one hour would equal two child-care hours). Occasional babysitting services are not governed by the order.

## Two Marines sentenced for fraud, mail theft

Two Kaneohe-based Marines were sentenced to a total of eight years' confinement and dishonorable discharges resulting from their court-martial convictions on theft and fraud charges.

The conviction capped a year of proceedings and investigations by federal, civil and military authorities regarding a credit fraud scheme involving Cpls Gloria Sykes and Michael D. Reynolds, both from the MAIS-24 mailroom.

Investigation revealed that the two Marines had devised a plan in early 1989 to screen mail and intercept credit cards, which they then used to buy merchandise.

The investigation was led by the Naval Investigative Service (NIS), which received complaints from Marines who were being billed for charges they had never made. One of the fraud-

last purchases was at the Furniture Company, which attempted to inform a Marine by phone that his furniture was ready for pick-up. Sykes intercepted the call, and said she would notify the Marine.

Instead, she notified Reynolds, who then rented a U-Haul trailer and moved the goods to a storage warehouse in Kailua. Through an eyewitness account and a survey of area U-Haul dealerships, NIS uncovered Reynolds as a suspect.

NIS then arrested Sykes and Reynolds. While executing a federal search warrant, the agents found most of the stolen property at Reynolds' residence.

Reynolds pled guilty to conspiracy, mail theft, credit card fraud, and false swearing. He was sentenced by general court-martial to five years' confinement and a dishonorable discharge. Sykes pled guilty to conspiracy, mail theft and credit card fraud and was sentenced by general court-martial to three years' confinement and a dishonorable discharge.

Also involved in the investigation were the Criminal Investigation Division of the Air Station's Provost Marshal's Office, the Honolulu Police Department, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, and the United States Secret Service. They were assisted by the Joint Legal Services Center and the U.S. Attorney's Office.

According to the Air Station's NIS special agent-in-charge, Bruce Smart, there are likely more victims of ATM bank card and credit card fraud here who have not reported their cases. He said those people as well as anyone with information regarding such a case should call NIS at 257-2379.

## News In Brief

### Fort Hase Beach closed indefinitely

The Air Station commanding officer has closed Fort Hase Beach indefinitely for recreation and training use. The closure was originally due to strong odors from effluent being pumped into Kailua Bay from the Aikahi Sewage Treatment Plant. The beaches remain closed as a precautionary measure due to sharply increased counts of the bacteria "non-enterococci streptococci" collected from the waters by the beach. The effluent is being pumped into the Mokapu Outfall, which is about 500 feet east of the skeet range. The Aikahi plant has had recent mechanical problems. The Air Station's Facilities Department continues to test the waters off the beach on a daily basis.

### MCI-writer billets open

There are currently six billet openings for qualified staff NCOs at the Marine Corps Institute's Specialized Skill Training Division (SSTD). The six billets are: 0193 gunnery sergeant, needed immediately; 0369 gunnery sergeant, needed in June; 0369 gunnery sergeant, needed in January; 1349 gunnery sergeant, needed in October; 1833 gunnery sergeant, needed in December; 3043 staff sergeant, needed in December. The selection process begins with monitors who screen applicants, looking for outstanding performers with MOS

credibility and a minimum of seven years in the MOS. Instructor applicants should have a GT score of 110 or higher and ideally be serving in a billet related to the subject about which they will write. Other factors considered are higher education, formal instructor experience, and personal appearance.

Candidates chosen by the monitors are sent to Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., for further screening, including a written English test and a series of interviews.

# ASIA: Where we stand

America's U.S.-Soviet defense focus must widen to include Japan, India and China, Adm. Huntington Hardisty, commander in chief of the U.S. Pacific Command, said recently.

Adm. Hardisty said in congressional testimony that, with the exception of Europe, all the world's emerging regional powers are in or border his command. Pacific Command, a unified command, has responsibilities in an area encompassing more than half the world's land mass.

U.S. interests in the Pacific are peace, prosperity, economic security, democracy and support for human rights, he said. "The U.S. goal is to provide a security umbrella for Asia and the Pacific under which U.S. national interests can be attained...free trade and commerce can prosper." He said the goal can be reached by maintaining stability with U.S. presence, involvement and assistance; by expanding bilateral military relations; and by continuing a deterrent posture where needed, such as in Korea.

"The region is in a transition period with change as the dominant factor," Hardisty said. He pointed out

that the region is home to two-thirds of the world's population, but its importance transcends simple demographics.

"The United States and Japan together account for 40 percent of the gross world product," he said. "U.S. trade with Asia and the Pacific has exceeded our trade with Europe for the past 17 years. The Asian gross national product equals that of Europe and is growing at an average rate of three percent faster. There can be no economic revitalization for the United States independent of Asia."

The threats facing Pacific Command forces and those facing NATO are substantially different, said Hardisty. While praising the easing of tensions in Europe and strategic and conventional arms control initiatives by Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev, Hardisty urged caution in cutting military forces, budgets and security assistance to his area.

"Unlike Eastern Europe, where communist regimes are being replaced by democratic reforms, in Asia, repressive regimes and dictators have slammed the door on reform," he said. "No mutual force reduction talks are being

conducted in Korea, and warning time remains very short." He counseled against making significant reductions to the current U.S. active duty strength level of about 46,000.

South Korea is blossoming into one of the so-called tigers of the Asian economic community, second only to Japan, and poses special problems, he said. Hailing that nation's success as "an important regional development," Hardisty then said it's time for South Korea's support to reflect its increased ability to provide for its own defense. He suggested South Korea could increase its spending for aircraft maintenance, construction, labor costs, and the like.

Calling the U.S.-Japanese security relationship the "linchpin of our Pacific strategy," he nonetheless acknowledged there are problems. Japan's allocation of roughly one percent of its gross national product for defense vs. more than four percent for the United States annoys some Americans; the U.S. presence on Okinawa annoys some Japanese, he said.

Both groups should take the high road, he suggested. "Our overall approach (to working our differences) must be comprehensive but meas-

ured and must not allow friction in trade or economic relations to undermine a security relationship that is vital to our long-term strategic interests."

The U.S. presence in the Philippines after 1991 hinges on signing a bilateral agreement, something not yet accomplished. Hardisty said hurdles include assistance levels, criminal jurisdiction and unhampered military operations.

"Logistically, Subic Bay gives us a large protected harbor with well-developed ship repair, supply and storage facilities. Clark Air Base has the runways, storage and material handling capability necessary to handle supply throughput for Indian Ocean operations," Hardisty said. Although no one location can replace the Philippines, he said alternatives have been examined.

Despite setbacks in Sino-American relations following the bloodshed at Beijing's Tiananmen Square last year, Hardisty believes China will continue to look to the West for the technology and expertise it needs. Economic and military modernization continues there, though at a slower pace, he noted. U.S. officials hope China will use its influence to stop hostili-

ties in Cambodia.

Thailand remains a staunch ally, he said, and plays a critical role in any counternarcotics effort in Southeast Asia. The Golden Triangle—Burma, Laos and Thailand—has historically been a major source of opium that is converted to morphine and heroin. Hardisty noted that Pacific Command's No. 1 peacetime mission is its counternarcotics effort and that his people provide reconnaissance data to the Drug Enforcement Administration for marijuana eradication efforts in Hawaii.

The world's largest democracy, India, is the region's major non-aligned power. Its armed forces rank fourth in the world in numbers, surpassed only by the Soviet Union, United States and China. Calling India's defense hardware "impressive," Hardisty argued that improved relations with India "should not be cause for concern among our other friends in the region."

Strong relationships with Australia, Korea, Japan and the Philippines make him confident about the future, but he has concerns: crisis response, force projection and conflict operations; force de-

ployment; command, control, communications and intelligence upgrades; and security assistance to allies.

"Perceptions are critical," he said. "We must ensure that we make no adjustments in our posture that would weaken the confidence of our friends in the area or draw into question our resolve to remain a power in Asia."

## Soviets remain the major threat in Asia

Glasnost and Gorbachev's military threat in Asia is still a major concern for Hawaii Marines.

Moscow has slightly reduced the size of its Pacific fleet, and withdrawn naval forces from their forward base in Vietnam's Cam Ranh Bay. Further, Moscow appears less committed to aiding its client states in North Korea and Indochina.

But according to Adm. William Pendley of the U.S. Pacific Command at Camp Smith, "Soviet capabilities...are not changing in the region...in fact, (they've been) qualitatively upgraded."

The Soviet Pacific fleet has shed about 50 old ships and submarines, but its 77 main surface combatants have been extensively upgraded. The fleet now includes two Kiev-class anti-submarine aircraft carriers (similar to the LHA), and is scheduled to receive its first full-fledged nuclear powered Tbilisi-class aircraft carrier in the mid-1990s. The fleet also includes 84 attack submarines, targeted primarily against amphibious task forces and aircraft carrier battle groups.

The Soviets have 50 army divisions in Asia (the United States, by comparison, has a total of only 32 active and reserve divisions throughout the Marine Corps and the Army). The Soviet troops in the Pacific are supported by about 15,000 tanks, 17,000 armored personnel carriers, and 13,800 artillery pieces. There is a reinforced Soviet Naval Infantry division in the Pacific Basin, as well, with the same amphibious assault mission as the U.S. Marines here.

In their air forces, the Soviets have about 1,200 aircraft in the region, including their most modern SU-27s and MiG-29s. Helicopter squadrons withdrawn from Afghanistan have been deployed to Sakhalin Island, just north of Japan. Finally, Soviet special forces units—called "Spetsnaz"—are very active in the Pacific region.



# Cobra Gold '90

## Live fire culminates joint training

RAYONG, Thailand — The serenity of a clear night in the bush was drowned out by the sounds of war as Marines conducting a live-fire exercise — part of Thai Incremental Training Program 90-2 — put their fingers to the triggers and lit up the night.

In the distance, small explosions could be heard as 60mm mortars spit out rounds. Tracer rounds from M-60 machine guns, M-16A2s and SAWS streaked toward their targets. Then, what looked like a shooting star burst to life, and lit up the area. Moments later, flashes in the distance, and then explosions, rocked the night.

Fire from small units and mortars was sporadic until two green flares floating in the sky indicated a change of tempo. The signal for the final protective fire was passed and the 140 U.S. Marines from Company I, 3d Bn, 3d Marines, coupled with as many Royal Thai Marines, cut loose.

During the five-minute barrage, more than 20,000 rounds of live ammunition

They were spewed down-range. In addition, dozens of white phosphorous, high-explosive and illuminating mortar rounds, complimented by numerous shoulder-launched

assault rockets, were launched.

The night fire capped off a week of live firing, part of which included firing SMAWs and AT4s — weapons these

Marines don't normally get their hands on.

## Marines assist Thais in community upgrades

CAMP SAMAESAN, Thailand — Marines often volunteer their time to lend a helping hand. The Marines at Cobra Gold 90 were no different.

Seventy-five Marines from various units including 3d Bn, 3d Marines, traded their time-off in Thailand for paint brushes as they spent a full day sanding, scraping and painting the Banglamung Boys' Home near Pattaya Beach.

Larry Ferguson, project officer of the Rotary Club of Jomtien-Pattaya, informed Lt. James L. Danner, chaplain for 9th Marines, that the home's school needed painting.

"When we come to a foreign country, we try to identify projects, such as the Boys' Home, that need our help," said Danner.

Through special funds designated for humanitarian projects, the volunteers purchased the necessary

materials. They tackled the six-room schoolhouse with enthusiasm, and by the end of the day, a freshly painted building stood as a testimonial.

"I like helping kids," said Lt. Christopher C. Stutzer, Weapons Co., 3/3. "This gave me an opportunity to see the real people. Going to Pattaya Beach (the local liberty and resort town), you don't see the real Thailand. Being able to help these kids means a lot. Plus, it helps let people know the Marines can help."

After the school was painted, more than 200 youngsters from the home joined the Marines in a barbecue dinner.

"It was great," said Lt. Michael A. Evans, of Weapons, 3/3. "Seeing the smiles on the kids' faces was worth millions. As a Marine it made me feel even better knowing I helped these kids."

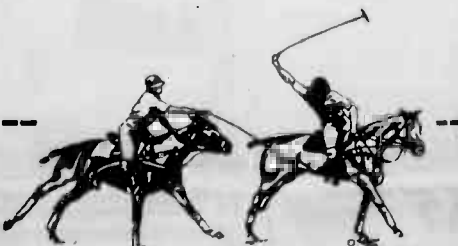

# Above and beyond: K-Bay Marines honored for all-around service

Two Marines who have done just about everything there is to do in the Corps were recently awarded for their non-military contributions as well as their career accomplishments.

Maj. Paul Smith, commanding officer of Maintenance Co., BSSG-1, and 1stSgt. Pete Thornton, first sergeant of Headquarters and Service Co., 1st Radio Bn., were recognized as the Career Officer and Enlisted Marines of the Year by the Honolulu Council of the Navy League May 24 at the Kahala Hilton.

The Honolulu Council is the largest Navy League council in the world with 3,800 members, and gives out annual awards to Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard servicemembers.

Harold Estes, Honolulu Council president, said the Council looks for what the Marines have done in the Corps along with their community involvement when selecting for the awards. "Say a Marine just does his job — no more, no less," he said. "He or she

will get promoted from time to time, but the Marine who stands out is the one who goes 'above and beyond the call of duty.'"

### Maj. Paul Smith

Smith's career began in 1968, when he was an infantry private in Vietnam. He earned his stripes on the battlefield, where, as a lance corporal, he was awarded the Silver Star. Later, as a corporal and fire-team leader, he earned a Bronze Star with combat "V." He rotated out of Vietnam as a sergeant with two Purple Hearts.

1stSgt. Rex Hoffmeister, first sergeant of Maintenance Co., has known Smith for about a year. During a discussion of their Vietnam days, Smith and Hoffmeister discovered they had been in a firefight together in 1969.

"My company, Golf 2/7, was in a horseshoe-shaped area called Happy Valley. We were getting hit hard by the NVA, and didn't have any fire support from artillery or air; we were basically on our own. So in came India 3/5 (Smith's company), and they started pulling us out." "All I remember was think-

ing how glad I was it was then down there and not us," recalled Smith.

After being promoted to staff sergeant in 1974, Smith made a lateral move into the communications-electronics field. In 1976, he was selected for warrant officer, with primary duties in radar maintenance.

In 1979, Smith was commissioned a first lieutenant,

serving as a limited duty officer in the radar field.

1stLt. Edward Steinhauser, executive officer at Maintenance Co., BSSG-1, has known Smith since 1981, and his career has patterned Smith's, rising up through the enlisted, warrant officer and commissioned officer ranks.

"He's taught me to work hard at everything," said Steinhauser. "I consider him the perfect role model. You can do anything you want if you set your mind to it, and Major Smith is a perfect example of that."

"The experience he can relate is incredible," said Hoffmeister. "We need a helluva lot more like him."

In addition to his military accomplishments, Smith was recognized by the Honolulu Council for his community involvement — mainly his personal volunteer work.

He has worked with the Kaneohe Senior Citizens Hui, the Shriner's Hospital, Salvation Army, Sojourners, and the Koolau Masonic Lodge.

1stSgt. Pete Thornton  
Thornton entered the Corps Feb. 15, 1970, and went to

boot camp at Parris Island, S.C. After completing training as a loadmaster at Naval Air Station Millington, Tenn., he reported for duty with VMGR-252 at MCAS Cherry Point, N.C., in November 1970.

In 1973, Thornton left Cherry Point as sergeant and a seasoned C-130 load master

after deployments to Thailand and a season with the Blue Angels.

After four years in Miami, three at the military entrance processing station (MEPS) and one as a member of the Inspector and Instructor staff, he reported to 1st Bn., 3d Marines here, where he was promoted to his current rank.

In 1988, Thornton moved over to 1st Radio Bn., serving as the first sergeant for Co. B and then at his present billet.

Thornton shows no desire to retire, saying he'll get out "when it stops being fun." "Some guys spend 20 years in the Corps and do everything perfect," he said, "but when they get into the civilian world, they have trouble adjusting. I like to think of myself as well-rounded."

That's just how Capt. Richard Park, Headquarters and Service Co. commander, described Thornton.

"He's well established at Pearl Harbor (where Thornton lives)," said Park. "I get calls all the time from parents there who need him for something. We try and

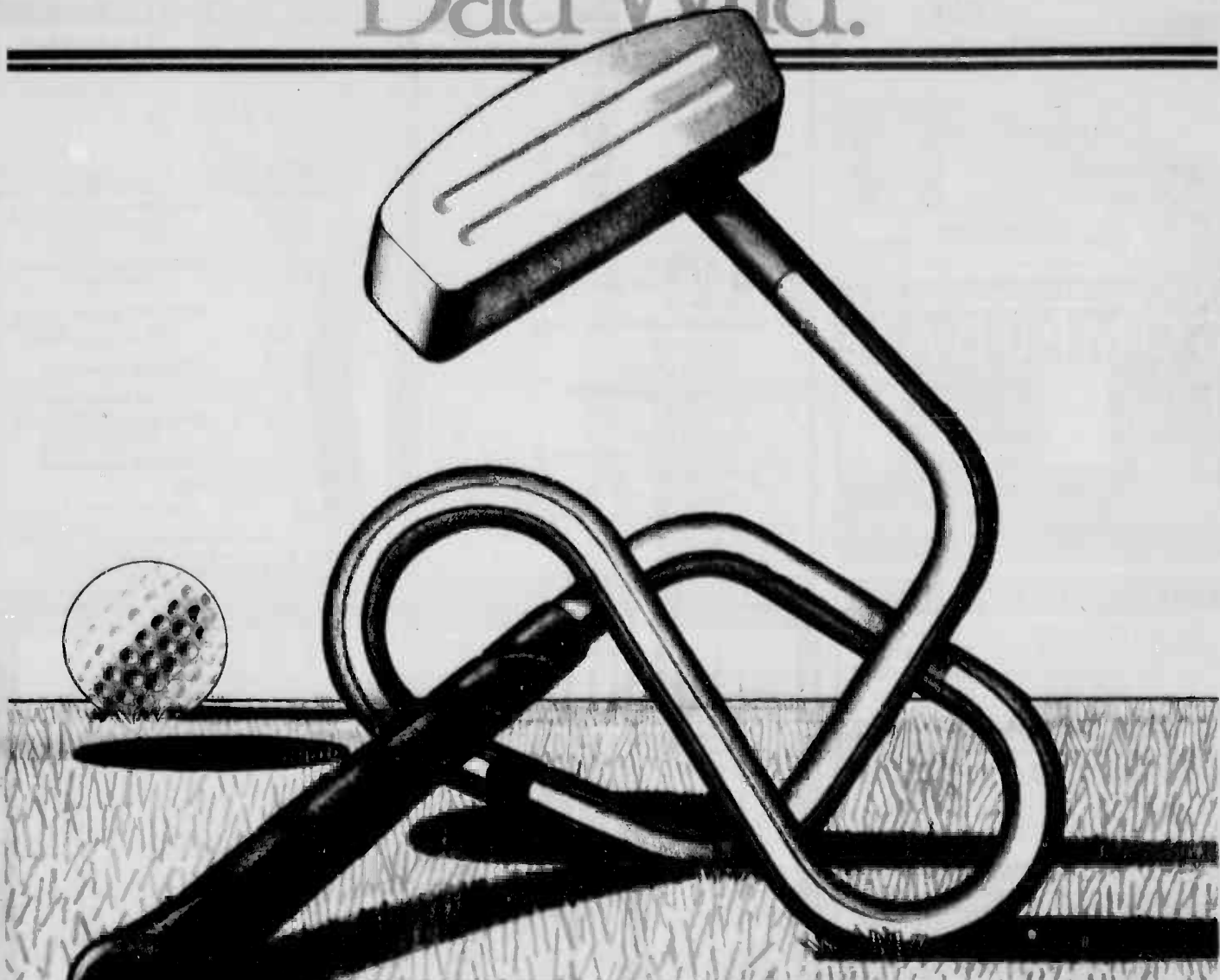

Initial certification (outlined in box) is on a three month conditional basis. During that three months, the home of the provider can be inspected at any time by FDCH Program staff to check the environment and quality of care. After three consecutive passed inspections, a

provider is then issued "Full Certification," which must be renewed after one year. Periodic inspections can be held at any time, however.

The order limits the number of children being cared for in single family quarters

### New child care rules

- 1) Be at least 18 years old.
- 2) Be fluent and literate in English.
- 3) Be in good mental and physical health. (determined through screening by the Naval Medical Clinic, Military Police Department, Joint Drug and Alcohol Center, Family Service Center, and Kaneohe Area Family Housing Office.
- 4) Be covered by a mandatory liability coverage policy provided for \$150 a year through Morale, Welfare and Recreation.
- 5) Be knowledgeable on child development, hygiene, safety and nutrition. (As taught during approximately 30 hours of mandatory orientation classes.)
- 6) Pass fire, safety and health inspections in the home used for care.
- 7) Be equipped with a fire evacuation plan, a list of emergency numbers and a fire extinguisher.
- 8) Have proof of current TB inoculation for spouse of care provider.

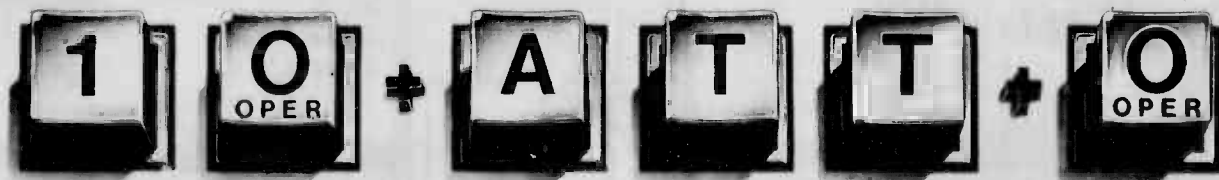

**CHILD CARE**/from A-7 to six, including dependent children of the care provider. Also, only two children under the age of 24 months can be cared for by any one family day care home.

Heckert said that providers must also arrange for another certified care giver to provide back-up support in case of emergencies. "Children cannot be left unattended and can only be released to parents, guardians and those designated in writing by parents or guardians," she said, adding that smoking is prohibited in the presence of children, and cribs and playpens must be washed on a daily basis.

"Providers are required to plan activities for the children, including outdoor play in a fenced-in area," Heckert

said. "This is also something coordinators will be looking for when they visit the homes to inspect."

If providers do not comply with the provisions of the order, their right to care for children on base could be revoked. If non-compliance continues, these people could also be evicted from base housing, according to the order.

"Some people are going to think of these new regulations as unfair, but the object isn't to make life difficult for care providers; it's to guarantee a minimum standard level for in-home, on-base child care," Heckert said.

Questions concerning the new regulation should be directed to the Family Day Care Home Program at 254-1541.

FIRE/from A-3 out it was loud. "I felt like the side of my face was coming off," he said.

The Marines also conducted a live-fire assault. Each company rehearsed its attack once with a walk-through, then drew rounds for the real thing.

"This range is great for us to train on, because it doesn't have as many restrictions as some of the ranges we train on in Hawaii and Okinawa," said 1st Lt. Michael J. Donovan, Co. 1 executive officer. "Overall, I think we got a lot out of this. It gives us a chance to test our field skills."

Donovan explained that the company is not permitted to combine assault weapons, mortars and riflemen at the

same time on most other ranges.

Sgt. John Saunders, a 2d Platoon squad leader, said he wants his Marines to train with live rounds. "I believe it gives them more confidence in their combat abilities," he said. "With blanks, you tend not to concentrate on putting rounds on the target."

"Marines have to develop in their heads a heightened awareness of how combat can be," said 2nd Lt. James Harris, 2d Platoon commander.

In addition to the training benefits, the three-week TTP exercise allowed Marines of the two nations to share knowledge of tactics and equipment.

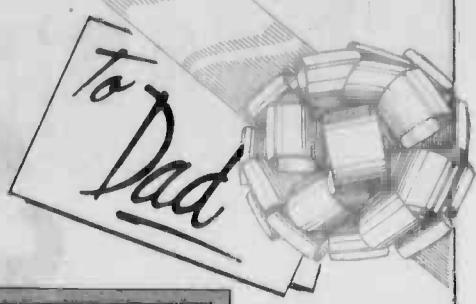

momentum going to out-play his hungry opponent. The match ended 6-3, 6-0 in Marks' favor.

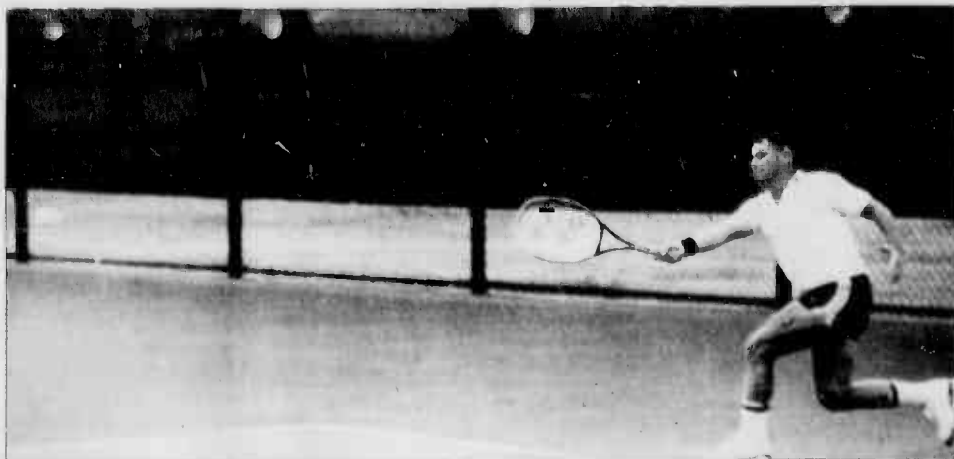
"He didn't have his mind on the game," said Marks of the match. "I know he's a lot better than he played."

# On the Blotter

## Military Police Department

### Alcohol-related Incidents

The Marine refused to take a field sobriety test, but submitted to an intoxilyzer test, which revealed a blood-alcohol level of .18 percent. The Marine's Station driving privileges have been suspended.

A civilian was detained by MPs for DWI after trying to

enter the Air Station through the Mokapu Gate. Upon contact with the civilian, MPs smelled alcohol on his breath. He submitted to an intoxilyzer test, which revealed a blood-alcohol content of .18 percent. A search of his vehicle resulted in the seizure of drug paraphernalia. The civilian was released, but later tried again to enter the Air Station to retrieve his vehicle. When told he could not drive his vehicle, the civilian became combative and was detained for drunk and disorderly conduct.

# Education

I have recently held some education benefit classes for units in 3d Marines, and I realize that I have been ignoring a critical population of Marines and sailors here. The population I'm talking about are those who continually deploy.

Most of the Marines attending my most recent benefits classes were not aware of the number and quality of correspondence programs that are available to them. Here are just a few examples:

First, we have the DAN-TES (Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Educational Support) correspondence course catalog. DAN-TES has centralized the correspon-

dence offerings of 39 major universities. The universities accepted by DAN-TES are not only important educational institutions, but are strategically selected so that every section of the nation has a participating school. For example, in the Southern U.S., there is the University of South Carolina, University of Alabama, Texas Tech., etc. In the Midwest, there is Penn State, Ohio University, etc., and in the West, there is U.C. Berkeley, the University of Washington, and Washington State, among others.

The only real drawback to this is that these schools just offer courses, not degrees. Their purpose is to fill gaps in your degree requirements.

The most important aspect of the DAN-TES correspondence program is the External Degree Program. This is a group of 38 different colleges that offer complete degree programs via correspondence. The names are a little different because they are primarily small colleges, but they are not the "matchbook" variety. They are all accredited universities.

The benefits of this type of program is that all the courses can be taken through correspondence and you can attend the same university wherever you go. Plus, the courses you take have a direction and a definite final goal. That is important.

I have spoken to several Marines who have more than

enough college courses to receive their bachelor's degree, but they do not have enough courses from any one university for that school to issue a degree. Using this program allows you to keep everything within one school.

So what the DAN-TES correspondence programs offer you is a means of continuing your education regardless of your deployment status or your military duties. If you are attending one of our local colleges and get orders to deploy, you can still take individual courses that will fit in the degree profile of the college you are attending. If, on the other hand, you are in a continually deploying unit and can't attend a local school, the External Degrees

Program is for you.

Enrollment in either of these programs is relatively painless. Both are acceptable for the purposes of Tuition Assistance. Individual courses can be enrolled in by coming to the Joint Education Center and completing a couple of forms. The only stipulation we make is that when the forms are completed, you give us a check made payable to the university for your portion of Tuition Assistance.

For the External Degree Program, we recommend that you write to the college and get some additional information on their program. Once decided on a program, enrollment is like the other courses.

As you can see, the programs put the attainment of a college education within the reach of anyone on active duty. They also provide the same opportunities for dependents, although we can't provide Tuition Assistance for them.

On a new subject, I would like to congratulate a few of our Marine students on being named to the Dean's List at Hawaii Pacific College. To be named to the list, a student must have completed at least 12 semester hours with a GPA of 3.5 or above. They are:

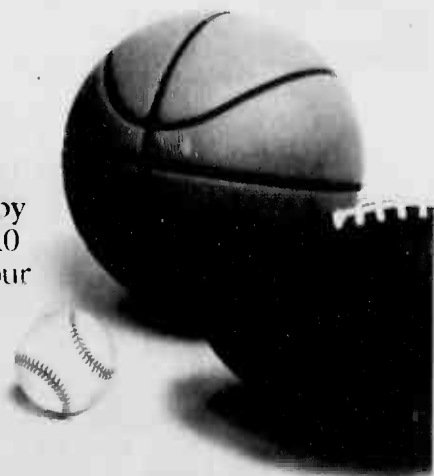

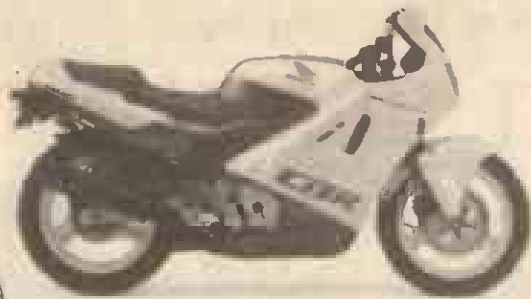

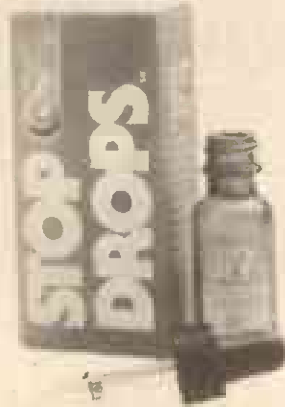
