Homecoming push continues

Story and photo by Cpl. Jason Erickson Hawall Marin Statt Wiler First came the ground-poun-ders, then the air warriors, and now combat service support troops have started making their way home.

They were met at Hangar 105
Tuesday night by what has become a familiar sight around these parts-tears of joy and hollering crowds of happy families and friends. But, for this group of 393 men and women, as with more than 4,000 other Hawaii-based Marines and sailors who've returned from the war in recent weeks, the sight was anything but familiar.

In fact, in the words of Cpl. George Elerd of Brigade Service Support Group-1. "It was the greatest thing t can ever remember seeing."

Elerd not only came home to the hugs and kisses of the wife and kids he left behind, he was also met by his 2-monthold daughter Naylia for the first time. Wife, Carole, his 5-year-old daughter, Nytashia, afond close by as Elerd held his newhorn in a long embrace. As his wife wiped tears from her eyes, Elerd said that he'd gotten pictures of his baby while he was in the desert, but those couldn't replace the feeling of holding her for the first time. It was something he said he really couldn't describe.

In their joyous moment, the Elerds seemed ohlivious to those experiencing re-unions of their own all around them. Others were still straining their eyes and necks to pick their Marine or sailor out of the crowd.

In what must have been a difficult task, people did their best to find friends and loved ones as they filed off buses, funneled into the hangar and got swallowed up by the crowd.

The nunjority of these returning Persian Gulf War veterans were with Brigade Service Support Group-1. However, they were joined by 58 Company B, the Communications Battation Marines and sailors, and 13 tothers from Headquarters, 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade.

Although a small advance arry from BSSG arrived home on an earlier flight, Tuesday night's group represents Knneohe's first large contugent of returning combat service support troops. Ground troops from the 3d Marine Regiment of returning combat service support troops. Ground troops from the 3d Marine Regiment led off the homecoming push March 9, while the first alteration of returning care

LtCol. Ernest Beinhart, 1888G executive officer, told news media that his troops had performed superbly during their deployment and explained that the group did not remain together during Operations Desert Shield/Storm. BSSG was attached to 1st Force Service Support Group from Camp Pendleton, Calif. Its assets were

used as needed by the Force in various detachments throughout the duration of the operations.

Several troops from Hawaii had played a key role in the off-load of the Maritime Preposi-tioning Ships that supplied Marine forces in Saudi Arabia at the beginning of the deploy-ment.

But their work had only begun once the ships were emptied of their store. From the time when Marine forces first moved north Marine forces first moved north to take positions in the desert, to the end of the four-day ground assault that routed the Iraqi Army, BSSG-1 Marines were right behind the Corps' ground forces, providing crucial combat service support. The conlition's ability to keep its forces in good stock with "beans and bullets," was said by Allied Forces Commander Gen. H. Norman Schwarzkopf to have been essential to victory. And even as these warriors set foot on Hawaiian soil, many of their BSSG commander continue their important work in South West And.

But Sgt. Julie Brann and her

husband SSgt. Jeffery Brand didn't seem to be thinking too much about the operation as they hugged and kissed for the first time in several months. Julie deployed to Saudi Arabia with BSSGI only weeks after her husband returned from a six-month pump to the Philippines with Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-364. One of only a handful of female Marines who returned Tuesday, Brann was all smiles to be home, as was her husband to have her back.

They said they've got a lot of time to catch up on, and they don't intend to waste any getting

Oahu sieged by rain, Air Station fares well

of heavy rain dumped upwards of \$20 million damage on Oahu, but the Air Station fared well and suffered only minor prob-

Other portions of Oahu were not so lucky. According to Honolulu Advertiser reports, 11-year-old David Levin of Kailua became the only casualty of the storm when he was sucked into a drain while playing with friends near the seventh fuirway of the Mid-Pacific Country Club, March 23.

Meanwhile, damage here was limited to leaky roofs, some minor landscaping losses and a slight mud-slide behind the Child Development Center, according to GySgt. Jordon, Station Inspector's Office.

He credits the speedy response of Facilities, Military Police and Inspector personnel for minimiz-ing the problems.

"We were able to react immediately," Jordon said, "We had all available people blocking off flonded roads and keeping storm drains clear of debris quickly enough to stop any heavy buildup of water. Most Air Station residents kept a low profile and stayed indoors during the heavy portions of the storm March 19, 20 and 23, which, Jordan said, also helped minimize problems.

Honolulu City Public Works Director Sam Callejo said most of the \$20 million in damages involves private property, and doesn't include damage to state goesn't include damage to state property, according to the Advertiser. Additionally, residents of three Pearl City homes had to be airlifted from their rooftops when their residences were swept away by floods into Waiawa Stream.

While weather services are reporting the storm has most likely run its course, it wouldn't be a bad idea to keep an umbrella handy



Soviet changes cause rethinking on defense

Some recent events in Enstern Europe and the Soviet Union
are giving the United States
and other Western countries a
reason to rethink their national
security strategies. But Defense
Secretary Dick Cheney recently
told the House Armed Services
Committee that other events are
causing growing concern for
stability of the region.
Several incidents have occurred in Eastern Europe during the past year that can lead
to peace and a new world order,
said Cheney. Democratic regimes have been elected; Moscow
accepted German unification in
NATO. The Soviet Union
agreed to withdraw its troops
from Czechoslovakin, Hungary
and Germany. The Soviets
reduced general purpose forces
at home, and they joined with
the international community in
supporting the United Nations
Security Council's resolutions
condemning the Iraqi aggression in the Persian Gulf.
He added, however, that troubling diplomatic, economic, political and military events need
watching. Diplomatically, he
said, the United States has
serious unresolved differences
with Moscow over the Conventional Forces in Europe agreement, and there still is no
resolution on the Strategic Arms
Reduction Talks.
Last October, the Soviet
central government rejected the
most serious economic reform
program proposed to date, and
since then has stepped further
away from economic reform
added Cheney. He contended

Soviet political reform has suffered several blows, including military pressure applied to freely elected governments in the Baltic states, a campaign attacking press freedoms and a decree establishing joint internal security police-Army patrols. "So long as the Soviets pursue this path, they will face further economic decline and continued political unrest," said Cheney. Cooperation between the United States and the Soviet Union depends on the latter's domestic reform, the secretary continued, and experience shows that U.S. relations are driven by how the Soviet Union governs itself. The United States wants Soviet reforms to succeed, he said; the failure of the reforms will prevent across-the-board cooperation.

The secretary asked: What does this mean as far as U.S. long-term defense needs are concerned? If the Soviet Union rejects reform, its military will be hurt by the same economic troubles gripping other sectors of society, Cheney believes. However, the military will continue to play an important role, with some elements, such as Soviet strategic force maderizations, continuing unshated.

Even though the Soviet military remains the largest armedioner, the threat of a short-

Even though the Soviet military remains the largest armed force on the European continent, the threat of a shortwarning, global war starting in Europe remains less likely than at any time in the last 45 years, continued Cheney. He believes the USSR will continue withdrawing its forces from Eastern Europe.

"The withdrawals from Hungary and Czechoslovakia are well on the way to completion, and despite some recent difficulties, we anticipate that withdrawal from Germany and Poland will be completed sometime thereafter," he said. "The Warsaw Pact, as an effective military organization, is dead."

Chency said U.S. strategy

The Warraw Pact, as an effective military organization, is dead."

Chency said U.S. strategy must take into account the uncertain outcome of Soviet unrest and the massive Soviet capabilities that will remain for the foreseeable future. But, he noted, the United States need no longer focus its defense strategy primarily on the threat of a Soviet-led aggression that would engulf Europe and probably much of the world.

Rather, he said, the U.S. strategy will be based on the positive trends in the Soviet Union and the Third World. The United States can structure its active and reserve forces to meet regional conflicts that threaten its interests. These threats are made more dangerous by the number of Third World countries with formidable conventional forces, ballistic missiles and weapons with chemical, biological and nuclear potential.

The goal remains to deteraggression against the United States, its allies and its interests; America invests in defense not to go to war, but to preserve peace, he said. His major elements of the new U.S. defense strategy include maintaining a mix of survivable offenses strategy include maintaining a mix of survivable offenses trategy include and deployed.





Marriage:

The qualities that make good
Marines do not always make
good marital partners. Military
separations create great hardships for families, and marriage,
in or out of the Corps, means
a lifetime of compromise.

This was the bad news passed
on by Owen Norton of the
Family Service Center here
during a recent interview. But
he was not without good news.
Effective communication can
and does do wonders to alleviate problems, he said.

Norton, a clinical social
worker with nearly 10 years
experience serving Air Station
families, explained that effective communication is crucial to
marital success, but is perhaps
the hardest thing for couples to
master.

"We know how to fight dirty

master.

"We know how to fight dirty and hurt our mates when we're angry," said Norton who is also married. "But when it comes to explaining why we're angry in the first place, and actually listening to their side of it with

an open mind, we're pretty inept."

Mimi Tracey, Norton's only assistant counselor, said Americans just aren't taught the kinds of communication skills needed to handle the situations they confront in marriage, unless they learn them through counseling, literature or workshops, all of which are available at f'amily Services.

But many people don't take advantage of this option, Tracey explained, because they think counseling is only for marriages on the brink of the deep pit of doom. Thus they often wait until it is at that point before they seek counsel.

"If people came to us as soon as they realized marriage is a complicated process, much of the problems they encounter later on wouldn't happen," Norton said. "Marital communication is a skill that has to be recog-nized, understood and nurtured

in order to take root in a relationship."

By "communication" Norton was referring to the specific process that enables couples to discuss the inevitable gripes and complaints created by intimacy in a "positive, issue-oriented and healthy" way.

During both counseling and workshops, couples are encouraged to orient their discussions of such conflicts to the issue at hand, to focus on what "really" created the problem. They're also taught to express their side, in terms of how the other's actions made them feel, rather than making accusations and assumptions of why their partner did what they did, or why it was "wrong."

"In addition to expressing your own feelings, listening is crucial to progress." Norton stressed. "Too often, we don't hear what our partners are trying to say, which hinders any ability for us to work

together for a mutually satisfying solution."

These and other skills are taught and matured through a variety of techniques. The requirement for improvement, Norton said, is a willingness to accept new ideas and an effort by both parties to improve. While this can be tough for any couple, the military family has unique characteristics that compound the difficulty.

"Open cooperative communication skills are hard enough for the average person to learn," Tracey said. "Marines have an extra hurdle to jump because these are contrary to the characteristics of a well-disciplined, strong leader."

That is to say, taking orders, giving orders and "grinning and bearing it," don't water the marital rose garden. They add fuel to the fire.

Spouses unfamiliar with the military system have hurdles of their own to negotiate, because it is so different from what they know. This time of transition

generally comes concurrent with the difficult first years of marriage that "make or break" a relationship. If they don't understand their servicemem-bers' duties and responsibilities, the need for military discipline and the customs that form the root of the Corps, Tracey said spouses are bound for a difficult path.

Frequent protracted deployment separations do little to improve the adds, Norton added. The past seven months of Operations Desert Shield and Storm were a drastic example, but even routine separations create problems.

"Six months is a long time to be apart," Tracey said.
"People grow and change." The uncertainties surrounding the war, both at home and in the desert, exaggerated many of the changes.

Norton added that as they come back together, a couple has to "re-negotiate" its rela-

tionship. "Things have changed, and they're going to have to adjust the parameters of their relationship accordingly. Get what you want and expect, out in the open and be willing to compromise."

He said compromise is the basic nature of a relationship and it's a never ending process.

"You've got to be willing to compromise. The last thing you want in a relationship is to win an argument," warns Norton. "That only means you'll lose big later."

Once people accept that the person they've married is human, with flaws of their own, and they make a commitment to compromise and communicate, Norton said, they've made the crucial first step toward a healthy and happy relationship.





Award Storm begins

| The six-week Desert Storm has passed, and the race to recognize Marines for their acts of gallantry or meritorious service has begun.
| The 14 Leathernecks of the 1 Marine Expeditionary Force Awards Section are working around the clock to provide the administrative support required

administrative support required to bestow Marines with deserved

to bestow Marines with deserved military decorations.

"We are trying to get as many awards completed in theater as possible so that Marines will not have to wait months to be recognized for their accomplishments," said GySgt. Peter J. Reed, Awards Section staff noncommissioned officer in charge.

"These Marines have worked bard and deserve to take their awards home to their command and friends."

Because each case is judged

and friends."

Because each case is judged on its own merit, there are many steps that must be taken before the award can be presented. The individual's unit commander initiates the award by submitting

to the Awards Section the name of the Marine along with the recommended award and a summary of his actions that make him deserving.

The Awards Section is responsible for preparing the award recommendation into a proper format.

"This requires us to proofread and correct the submissions before we make the file copies for the awards board," said Reed. "A majority of the submissions are either too long or too short and we must make them so that they read just right."

An awards board, comprised of six field-grade officers, along with the I MEF Sergeant Major, SgtMaj. Spenser (when dealing with an enlisted Marine's record) read the submissions. They then decide if it is worthy of the recommended award or if it should be up or down-graded. This decision is then presented as a recommendation to LtGen. Walter E. Boomer, I MEF commanding general.

LtGen. Boomer is the awarding authority for the Bronze Star

Medal and those of lesser distinction. A recommendation is made by him in instances involving the Navy and Marine Corps Medal and those of greater distinction before they proceed to their respective awarding authorities.

In each case a citation and certificate is drafted for the necessary endorsements. This requires vast amounts of reading and typing for the Awards Section, according to Cpl. Karl Eisneacher, an administrative clerk stationed here. "We have been working more than 15 hours each day, but we know it's worth every minute to the Marines to whom these awards are presented," he added.

Although more than 300.

Although more than 300 medals have already been bestowed upon deserving Marines, 1stl.t. Jennifer L. Blafr, Awards Section officer in charge, was quick to add that the Marine Corps' standards have not decreased.

"These awards have been earned through extraordinary acts," said Blair.





Warious problems will sometimes cause military family
members to return home to the
mainland before their sponsor's
tour of duty is over.
The early return of dependents from their sponsors' tours
to their home of record is
authorized and financially covered by the government for
cases involving marital problems, financial difficulties,
medical rensons and other
unusual circumstances.
It is not authorized for
dependents who wish to attend
a college on the mainland, or
for those who want to return
to the continental United States
solely to wait until their spon-

sor returns from a deployment or war time.

A request for a dependent's early return begins at the Transportation Management Office. Proof of the problems which would warrant an early return are required.

For instance, requests based upon marital difficulties must have a chaplain's statement attached. If a request is based on financial difficulties, a financial statement must be attached. Requests based on medical reasons must have statements from attending physicians attached. If a request is based upon marital difficulties, the parties will be sent to a chaplain for an interview. After the interview.

Early returns

view, the chaplain will write a letter to either approve or disapprove the request.

If approved, the letter is submitted to the company office. The company office then submits the request through the chain of command for approval. Once it is approved by the command, it is sent to the personnel office. Orders are cut at that level.

The shipment of the dependent's household goods is based

upon the weight limit entitlement of the sponsors next Permanent Change of Station orders.

For example, Joe Marine is entitled to have 7000 pounds shipped. He ships his dependent's household goods early, which weigh 4,000 pounds, to their home of record.

When he eventually gets PCS orders and is ready to ship his

remaining household goods, he will only be entitled to ship 3,000 pounds. If he has more than that weight amount to ship, he will be liable for the expenses of shipping the excess.

If he then wants to ship his dependents from their home of record to his new duty station, he will have to pay for the shipment himself. Joe Marine's other option would be to wait until he gets another set of PCS orders, at which time he'll be entitled to another full shipment of household goods.

The early return of dependents is a one time deal. Once dependents have returned home, any return back to the spon-

sor's duty station is not finan-cially covered by the military. The sponsor or dependent would have to pay all expenses.

Also, once dependents arrive-home, they are authorized up to 90 days of free storage for household goods. After 90 days, the individual has to pay stor-

Finally, be forewarned our experiences with Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm have shown that early returns should be initiated only in situations where there are no other options. They should be very carefully considered before taking action.

• A driver was parked at the Marine Corps Exchange was released by MPs to the Honolulu Police for an outstanding assault warrant. The driver was stopped by MPs because his vehicle was parked in the red zone at the exchange.

There is an increased problem with illegal parking in spaces reserved for the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade Commanding General and the Air Station Commanding Officer, according to the Military Polic Department. Air Station order P5500.6c, states "violators parking in spaces assigned to the 1st MEB CG, Station CO, other COs, sergeants major, other senior officers, Medal of Honor winner and hundicapped persons at the MCX, Commissary, SNCO and Officers Club, will have their driving privileges automatically suspended for one week for the first offense, six months for the second offense and permanent suspension for the third offense. 

Safety, Marine Corps: Strange bedfellows?

Safety is always a challenging business. When you start talking about safety and Marines, "challenging" might be a bit of an understatement.

On the surface, safety and the Marine Corps seem like strange bedfellows - sort of like having a bulldog for protection, but pulling his teeth so he doesn't hurt himself. There is a stigma surrounding the word "safety" that just doesn't seem to fit Marines.

If you really wanted to be safe, you probably wouldn't charge a machine gun west, regardless of who told you to do it. You certainly would not have volunteered to go to Southwest Asia to fight a madman. There are safer ways to earn a living.

But that's just on the surface, Safety does, in fact, fit Marines, just like a good scabbard fits a good sword.

The scabbard helps to keep you from accidentally hurting yourself or someone else. It also helps keep the sword edge sharp for the next time you need it.

Safety is a lot like a scabbard. It works when you use it. It preserves assets for when you need them, and it keeps you from hurting yourself.

Unfortunately, there is a stigma surrounding safety in the Marine Corps, and it's absolutely wrong. Safety is not an obstacle to mission accomplishment.

ment.

A safety officer's job is not to impede operations, recreation or anything else. His job is shiply to advise the communder of the risk involved with a safety of the community of the risk involved with the community of the safety of t

mander of the risk involved with various courses of action.

Safety in the Marine Corps, as well as in your personal life, is nothing more than looking ahead to the consequences of your actiums and making conscious, responsible decisions.

Look before you leap. If you have to jump off a three-story

building, go for the high grass, not the parking lot.

For the leaders of Marines the process is a little (but not much) more completed. It is incumbent on us to not only make the correct decisions concerning the welfare of our Marines, but to instill that decision-making process in our subordinates.

decision-making process in our subordinates.

We actively recruit and train young men and women to do what has to be done to complete our mission, up to and including charging machine gan nests, if necessary. We hone sharp edges. We're also obligated to provide the scabbards.

The Marine Corps Ground Safety Program is aimed at preserving assets, both people and things.

As the safety officer for Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, I read

a lot of mishap reports every week. A few reflect the fact that we train hard. Many more are a result of just not thinking about the results of one's persons.

week. A few reflect the fact that we train hard. Many more are a result of just not thinking about the results of one's actions.

Most of the serious mishaps involve one, or a combination of two or three things: wheeled vehicles, alcohol or attitude. That's not surprising. Across the Unites States last year, 47,000 people lost their lives in traffic accidents, and half of those accidents involved alcohol. Attitude is the wild card we can do something about.

We have purposely creates strong-willed, aggressive, high-spirited young men and women: sharp edges. We can also infuse them with an attitude that promotes conscious, responsible decision-making.

Safety, the double-edged

scabbard, is an attitude that at once helps our young Marines from hurting themselves and protects our most valuable Marine Corps asset.

Marine Corps asset.

It is a challenge, but good leadership can and does affect positive behavior on others, on and off duty, around the clock, alone or with friends, on the firing line or behind the wheel Leadership affects attitude toward safety, particualry when it comes to alcohol and wheeled vehicles, saves lives and preserves assets.

We are now facing an extremely unique situation. Wrapping up successful combat operations in South West Asin, our Marines and sailors are returning home after an extended period of forced abstinence.

A grateful nation is celebrated.

A grateful nation is celebrating. Emutions are high. There will be a lot of people going a lot of places with a lot of reasons to celebrate. Arming our troops with the right safety

attitude is not only the right thing to do as Marine leaders, it's the best thing we can do for them personnally.

So, as we welcome home our returning heroes, men and women who have proven their metal, their edge, let's do everything we can to preserve that edge and protect the heroes. From a safety standpoint, our job might be easier if we were dealing with the mission ans personality of the average librarian, but we're not.

We are dealing with American Marines and sailors, many of whom are just returning from winning a war. Safety, like lendership is always a challenge, but it's a challenge we have to master.

Good, old-fashioned "look before you leap" safety, and the United States Marine Corps. They fit, just like a good sword and a good scababrd. We just have to use it.

She stated, "Not only have I lost 30 pounds but my cholesterol has dropped from 232 to 143. I have two closets full of clothes which have not fit me in two yrars that I can now wear." In a sepa-ate report, a telephone interview revealed that a Wilmington, North Carolina pharmacist lost 14 pounds in 15 days on the product and was never hungry.

Granted, she was disappointed that she'd have to postpone her community service for another day, but what's one day after six months of preparation?

The Gold Award is merely the symbol of what she and fellow Senior Girl Scout, Liberty McCarty, will reel in for their efforts. The real reward? Both agreed that tackling a difficult task after several months of hard work gave them a very good feeling of accomplishment,

not to mention rising to the top of the Scout world that has been a part of their lives for so many

a part of their lives for so many years.

A 15-year-old sophomore at Kalaheo High School, Geier said she'll be glad in a couple weeks, when it's all over. That's it. She mide it to the top and now she can devote more time to whatever it is today's teenagers are devoting their time to.

McCarty, also 15, but a freshman at Kalaheo, is looking forward to getting it over with as well. After nine years in the scouts, and more importantly, after dozens of bidges and the work they entailed, she's ready to relax and just enjoy the camping trips and friendships that go along with being a Scont. She said she'll continue the community service she performed for her Gold Award project, though, because she likes tutoring elementary school students.

It's the same reason she enjoys

It's the same reason she enjoys being a Senior Scout. Now that she's a "well-decorated young woman in uniform," she's a role model for nearly 175 younger scouts in the 15 troops of the Mokapu Division of the Honolulu-based Girl Scouts Council of the Pacific. Only 16 of those girls, from 9th-12th grade, share the status of Senior Scout with McCarty and Geier.

The majority of the troops are filled with either Brownie Scouts (1st-3rd grade) or Juniors (4th-6th grade). In fact, these two levels comprise 11 of the 15 troops.

Kindergarten-age

"Daiseys" comprise the two youngest troops, while one group of Seniors and one group of 7th and 8th-graders (Cadets) form the remaining two troops.

With a relatively small group of Mokapu Girl Scouts overall, many of their activities are combined, such as a recent camping trip on the North Shore that involved all five levels. At the same time, however, each of the troops has its own activities.

The Persian Gulf War consumed much of their attention in the past six months. Girl Scout Chairwoman Diane McCarty said banner making, yellow ribbon campaigns and other support activities helped not only the war effort, hut many of the girls with deployed parents deal with their emotions in a positive way.

"By channeling their efforts in a positive direction, we helped the girls relieve at least some of the anxiety that accompanied the war," McCarty added. Now that the war is over and parents are coming home, things are getting back to normal and the Girl Scouts are moving back into their own world. Actually, they're getting back into five "worlds."

McCarty explained that activities are divided into the five areas they call worlds, because within each there are "a world of varied activities."

According to guidelines published by the Girl Scouts of the USA, there are worlds for outdoor activities, arts, future

Badge earning is an integral part of being a Scout. At the younger levels, the projects are simplified so they can be accomplished quickly and without a great deal of effort. As the girls grow older, the projects grow more complicated and require much more work.

Women's History Month

Woman Marines prove they're equally capable as they work side-by-side male counterparts

It all began during World War
I, when 305 women sile-pped out
of the civilian world and into
the Marine Corps, to serve
hriefly as stenographers, bookkeepers, clerks and orderlies as
male Marines went off to war.
These women were known as
"Marinettes." After the Great
War, they packed-up their
uniforms and returned to the
civilian sector.

war, they packed the trivilian sector.

At the onset of World War II, these highly-skilled women once again answered the Marine Corps' call, this time as full-fledged Marines. But as their length of service grew in the Corps, so did their role. Today, women Marines serve in nearly all of the same noncombat occupations as their male counterparts.

People look up to Sgt. Kathleen Hunsen for lots of reasons, but probably the most obvious is because she spends most of her time atop HII-46 (Search and Rescue) Aircraft, repairing them.

The five-foot-two East Chicago.

The five-foot-two East Chicago native said that earlier in her II-year career, she always found herself competing against men.

"When I came in back in '79, it was as though I had to prove myself to the male Murines." she said. "In my first Military Occupational Skill, I was a motor transport mechanic and I guess some of the Marines felt threatened. I couldn't manhandle a truck tire as quick as some men could, hut my size or my sex never stopped me from completing my job."

Although Hansen became one of the top mechanics in her shop, she had her sights set on aviation.

After nine years of being a motor transportation mechanic

After nine years of being a motor transportation mechanic, Hansen decided to make a lateral move. While she realized that the transition would be tough, she was determined to make her new career a successful one.

make her new career a successful one.

"The first impression I had of Sgt. Hansen was a squared-away, motivated Marine," said SSgt. Thomas Moore, SOMS's Air Frames chief. "The fact that she is a woman wasn't a factor. It was the fact that she was coming from another MOS and knew it would take a lot of hard work to learn her new job."

Although she has been an

of hard work to learn her new job."

Although she has been an aviation structure mechanic just shy of a year, Hansen has proven herself, according to Moore.

"On a scale of one to 10, she's an eight," said Moore.

"She's definitely an asset."

Back in 1985 when Sgt. Pamels Flint (then a private first class), told her parents and friends she had been assigned as an ammunition technician out of Marine Corps boot camp, no one believed her.

In fact, Flint could hardly

believe it herself. Because she elected to join the Marine Corps under the open contract pro-gram, she didn't learn of her

gram, she didn't learn of her new job until days before graduation.
"My parents immediately thought I was in danger of being blown up," said Flint. "I wanted the legal field and I have to

the legal field and I have to admit, this was a far cry from what I was hoping to get. But I didn't complain or try to get out of it. I figured it would be a challenge."

Six years later, Flint is assigned to the Air Station Ordnance here, and says she feels priviledged to not work in a cramped office behind a desk. On any given day, she can be seen hours before sun-up issu-

ing out thousands of rounds of ammunition to units here for their yearly rifle range qualifications.

According to Flint, she issues and receives ammunition ranging from 22 caliber to 1,000 pound bombs.

Being one of two women in her shop, Flint attributed her respect from peers to hard work.

"I never wanted or asked for any type of special treatment. I knew I had to prove myself as a Marine," she said.

"When I first met Sgt. Flint, she was a lance corporal in an ammunition company at Camp Pendleton, Calif.," said Sgt. Vernon Vinson, magazine

noncommissioned officer in charge of Station Ordnance. "Although she wasn't the first woman Marine I've known in this field, she was the most knowledgeable."

"Years ago, before joining the Marine Corps, I filled out a questionnaire that asked if women should be allowed in the military. I said no, absolutely

"Nine years later, and having worked with women in the Marine Corps, my eyes have been opened. Women are just as capable of earning the title Marine as men are.

"This is not a man's Marine Corps," he added, "It's a Marine's Marine Corps."
