President awards Radio Bn.

Hawaii Marines aiding in Bangladesh relief

The President himself honored 1st Radio Battalion May 1 as the nation's top Tactical Signal Intelligence unit for 1990. The unit was chosen by the National Security Agency.

With this honor goes the Director's Trophy, which President Bush presented to commanding officer Lt. Col. T.A. Flaherty in Washington, D.C. Gen. A.M. Gray, Commandant of the Marine Corps, and MGew. J.A. Studds, director of intelligence at Headquarters Marine Corps, were also present at the ceremony.

Flaherty shared the award with his Marines in a battalion formation May 8.

"This award is a reflection of the entire battalion," Flaherty said as he held the trophy aloft. "Everybody contributed, and it should be noted that a lot of people in high places know about your efforts."

Flaherty reminded his Marines that the award only reflected a portion of their actions and contributions during Operations

Desert Shield/Storm. Since the award was only for 1990, anything 1st Radio Bn. accomplished in 1991 was not considered in deciding the recipient of the honor.

The Director's Trophy, first presented in 1980 by Vice Admiral Bobby Inman, then director of the NSA, is awarded annually by the NSA to recognize outstanding performance by a U.S. signal and intelligence unit.

Flaherty also pointed out that 1st Radio Bn. was awarded the Travis Trophy, a similar award, in 1966. Then-Major A.M. Gray was the battalion operations officer then, and accepted the Travis Trophy on behalf of the battalion.

1st Radio Bn. is one of only two signal and intelligence battalions in the Marine Corps. The battalion's lineage dates to 1943, when radio intelligence platoons were formed for service in the Pacific.

On July 14, 1964, 1st Radio Bn. was officially formed, and saw extensive deployment and action during the Vietnam War.

More than 200 Kaneohe-based troops are among 4,600 Marines and 3,000 sailors who arrived off the coast of Bangladesh May 15 to form the backbone of a joint U.S. military task force contributing to international relief efforts in the devastated country. Elements of both the Army and Air Force are also involved.

The bulk of the Kaneohe-based troops are with HMM-265, while others come from various logistical and support units here. They deployed Dec. 7 as part of the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade aboard U.S. Navy ships of Amphibious Group Three. The Amphibious Group was diverted to Bangladesh during its tip home from the Gulf.

New commissary awaits approval from Congress

Neither war nor sweeping budget cuts have been able to slow the Air Station's proposed new commissary project.

Only one hurdle remains on the road to a bigger and better commissary, which may be open for business within a year-and-a-half after ground-breaking.

"We've gone as far as we can go without Congressional approval," said Station Public Works Officer LCDr. Pete Mathews, who returned with his staff last week after going over contractual details with Air Force Commissary Service officials in Texas. "We're tracking along real fine," he added.

As soon as funding for construction gets the nod from Congress, which is expected soon, the Air Station will present the project to civilian contractors for an "evaluated proposal." The evaluated proposal gives contractors more generalized guidelines and latitude in the details of actual construction

than the traditional bidding process.

The Air Force's way of building commissaries is called "Turn-key Construction," and it's widely regarded as the fastest and most efficient commissary-building system in the Defense Department.

The Air Force's involvement resulted from Defense Secretary Dick Cheney's order last year to consolidate all four services' commissary systems into one. The change is hoped to streamline commissary operations service-wide and save taxpayers up to \$90 million per year.

Transition is under way, and full control of the commissaries will go to the Defense Commissary Agency by the end of this fiscal year.

When the order to consolidate was given, a moratorium was placed on all new commissary projects for the Army and Air Force until an evaluation of the needs of all services could be completed.

With a substantial surplus in funds, the Air Force had already

previously considered building commissaries for the Marine Corps, which lacks the necessary funds. The Air Force finally made the Kaneohe Bay offer last June, after Station officials had made it widely known in Washington that a new commissary was needed here.

The Air Station has long awaited a new commissary. Originally built as an engine shop in 1942, the current commissary lacks adequate cold storage and aisle space. The new commissary will be larger and will include substantial cold storage on the premises.

It will be part of the Station Community Support Center, which will include a new main exchange, chapel, Family Service Center, Child Development Center, post office, library and mail shops. It is expected to be completed between 1995-1997, and will be located in the area of the existing automotive service station.

The new commissary will be the first building block of the project.

'Flying Tigers' heading home

SUBIC BAY, Philippines—The "Flying Tigers" of Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-262 will complete 10 continuous months of deployment when they return to Kaneohe Bay next month.

The squadron deployed last August under the command of Lt. Col. F.J. Geier. After arriving at Marine Corps Air Station Futenma, Okinawa, the squadron re-deployed to Naval Air Station Cubi Point in the Philippines.

Central Luzon in the Philippines had been devastated by both flooding and earthquakes last July and August, and the Flying Tigers immediately began providing aviation support and food relief missions to the affected areas.

State tightening screws on drunk drivers

Beginning July 1, a new state law which increases the penalties for drunk drivers will go into effect. Under the Administrative License Revocation Law (ACT 188, SL 1990), people arrested for DUI who have a blood-alcohol concentration of .10 or higher, or those who refuse the blood-alcohol content test will automatically have their licenses confiscated at the time of arrest. A 30-day temporary license will be issued to allow time for administrative review of the case and a final decision by the administrative director of the courts. Revocation periods could range anywhere from three months to life.

Learnin' 'em the Law

K-Bay lawyers visit local students

As part of this year's Law Day observances, Marine lawyers here kept busy lately spreading their juris expertise to the community.

Their latest legal outing took them to Castle High School May 13-16, where they gave a legal seminar (of sorts) to four classes of seniors. Other activities have included a luncheon with other military lawyers in Hawaii and trips to local malls on and off base where they set up booths and answered questions.

Their four days at Castle were spent teaching several aspects of law. During their first visit May 13, Marine lawyers 1stLt. Steve Austin and Capt. Idenne Kelley delved into the nature of both criminal and civil law, and some differences between them.

Capt. John Sandbothe, who recently returned from Saudi Arabia, visited the school the following day and talked about his duties and adventures as a lawyer and Marine officer in the Middle East.

Kelley and Austin returned May 15 and 16 to orchestrate a mock trial. Students were picked to represent various roles in a trial for a simulated crime involving breaking and entering, falsification of official records and vandalism. With Kelley and Austin acting as advisers, the students learned how the court system works the first day, then conducted their trial the second day.

The students' teacher, Laurie Watanabe, said they seemed to enjoy the session, and that the session enhanced the education they'd been given during earlier civics classes.

"Some of the kids took it more seriously than others, but I think they all enjoyed it," she said.

They definitely seemed to be enjoying themselves during the trial. Even those not involved in the scenario were watching closely,

perhaps to be sure they didn't miss a friend making a funny comment or a mistake.

Watanabe said professionals in a particular field do not often come in and spend a prolonged period of time with the students like this, although the school does hold an annual one-day job fair, which is usually attended by Marine recruiters.

The lawyer visit, Austin explained, wasn't designed to coax students into joining the Marine Corps, however, nor into becoming a lawyer. He said its purpose was to give them exposure to law and the Corps and promote better relations within the community.

"If they have questions about the Marine Corps aspect of our experience, we're more than happy to answer them," Austin said. "Capt. Sandbothe's session with the students was filled with those types of questions because he was talking about being in Saudi Arabia, while most of the questions we got were about law."

Champagne to take command of VMFA-235

Ceremony to be held this evening

Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235 will receive a new commander today to go along with its Secretary of Defense Maintenance Award, which it will receive May 31.

LtCol. L.M. Champagne will assume command of the "Death Angels" today during a ceremony at 6 p.m. on the flightline between hangars 103 and 104.

The departing squadron commander, Col. W.C. McMullen III, a veteran of both the Vietnam and Persian Gulf Wars, will transfer to the Plans and Programs Division of Headquarters Marine Corps. McMullen, who has commanded the squadron since May 1989, was promoted to the rank of colonel during September while leading the squadron during its nine-month deployment in support of allied forces in the Gulf.

McMullen, an infantry platoon and company commander with 3d Marines in Vietnam and recipient of the Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V," recently flew 45 combat missions against Iraqi forces in Kuwait and Iraq.

During the war, the Death Angels were among the first to strike deep into Iraq in the early morning hours of Jan. 17, and during the war flew every mission their F/A-18C Hornet fighters are capable of. VMFA-235's Hornets were also the only Marine aircraft to strike a key target near Baghdad and dropped almost two million pounds of ordnance on enemy targets in support of the liberation of Kuwait.

The Death Angels were recently selected to receive one of six Defense Department Maintenance Awards and are up for DoD's highest aviation maintenance award, the "Phoenix." Squadron Executive Officer Maj. James Hunter and Assistant Aircraft Maintenance

Officer Capt. Scott Loch will travel to the Pentagon to accept the award May 31 and bring it back to present to their new boss, LtCol. Champagne.

Champagne, a native of Houma, Louisiana, was commissioned in June 1974 after graduation from the U.S. Naval Academy. He received his aviator wings on April 16, 1976.

Following F-4 Phantom training, he reported to Kaneohe Bay and joined the Death Angels. From October 1976 through December 1979 he participated in the inception of the Unit Deployment Program.

In January 1980, he reported to Marine Fighter Attack Training Squadron-101 at MCAS Yuma, Ariz., as an instructor pilot. He attended the Naval Fighter Weapons School in 1981 and Aircraft Maintenance Officers School in 1982.

Champagne was one of the first Marine pilots selected for conversion to the Hornet. He

reported to VMFA-531 at MCAS El Toro, Calif., in 1983.

From 1984-1986, he was stationed in Australia as an exchange pilot with the Royal Australian Air Force. He served as operational and maintenance adviser while the RAAP transitioned from the Mirage III to the Hornet, during which time he flew both aircraft.

In December 1986, he returned to El Toro to VMFA-323 where he served as aircraft maintenance officer, executive officer and commanding officer.

During November 1990, Champagne was assigned to Marine Aircraft Group-24 here, where he has served as the administration officer until now. He has approximately 1,600 hours in the Hornet and a total of 3,600 flight hours.

Champagne and his wife, Cheri, have three children: Michael (9), David (5), and Julie (6 months).

The sea-going Marines and sailors there are operating in an area about 50 miles off the coast. Their efforts will involve the use of 26 Marine Corps helicopters, as well as several types of landing craft and HMMWVs.

Many other Hawaii-based military units have also been deployed. These include: Environmental Preventive Medicine Unit 6 and a Public Affairs team from Pearl Harbor; the 1363rd Audio Visual Squadron and 834th Airlift Division from Hickam Air Force Base; a Joint Special Operations Task Force from Camp Smith; Company B, 4th Bn., 25th Infantry Division and 84th Engineer Bn., 45th Support Group, from Schofield Barracks; and the Deployable Joint Task Force Augmentation Cell from USCINCPac.

Efforts are being concentrated on the main port of Chittagong, which handles about 80 percent of the country's waterborne commerce and was badly damaged by the cyclone.

According to various news reports, the Marines were greeted by thousands of starving Bangladeshis screaming "farest!" — their word for angels, when they went ashore May 16. The Marines came into the Karnafuli River on hovercrafts along with urgently needed medical supplies and personnel, HMMWVs and road-repairing equipment as the thousands of cyclone survivors surged forward to touch them.

This and other similar receptions led the Department of Defense to re-name the Operation from "Productive Effort" to Operation "Sea Angel."

Col. Randall West, commander of the heliborne Marines, was quoted in a recent Associated Press report as saying, "I will never forget the tears of joy in the eyes of an elderly village chief as he came to my helicopter and shook my hand through the window after we dropped off the first food and water his village had received since the storm hit."

The Joint Task Force is under the command of MGen. Henry Stackpole, Commander, III Marine Expeditionary Force, Okinawa. His headquarters element has been set up in

Dhaka, and is working with the Bangladesh government to assess damage, locate survivors and distribute food, water and medicine and to provide temporary shelter.

MGen. Stackpole was assigned to the relief effort by Adm. Charles Larson, Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Pacific Command. Adm. Larson received the

mission from the Department of Defense following tasking by President George Bush to provide "immediate relief."

The various Armed Services units being deployed include several air lift commands as well as public affairs, documentation, communications, harbor assessment, civil affairs, engineering and environmental protection teams.

Pless Hall chosen as one of the best

In the running for coveted Ney Award

1991 Ney/Hill Award, which annually recognizes one mess hall as the best in the Marine Corps.

The award, officially named the Captain Edward F. Ney and

Major General W.P.T. Hill Award, is co-sponsored by the Secretary of the Navy and the International Food Service Executives Association (IFSEA).

A three-man Ney/Hill Evaluation Team, based out of Headquarters Marine Corps, inspected Pless Hall May 13.

This year's competition will judge facilities that span from Camp Lejeune, N.C., to Iwakuni, Japan.

Although there are more than 240 mess halls in the Marine Corps, only 13 were selected to compete this year.

Administrators of the 40-year-old Pless Hall feel that the facility has a good shot at winning.

"It's true that appearance is one of the categories the Ney/Hill Evaluation Team looks at," said CWO2 Robert Severson, 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade food service officer. He added that the team also looks at food service, attitude, display and overall decor as criteria for the award.

Robert Shawn, the senior executive of the IFSEA, said the Ney/Hill Award is a highly sought-after award. Shawn, who was given a brigadier general's treatment during the evaluation tour, acted as senior member of the team. But he stressed that the final decision rests upon all members of the team.

According to Shawn, each of the other two members has an independent vote. At the end

of the evaluation tour in late June, records from all 13 dining facilities will be tabulated.

The head cook of the winning mess hall will receive a two-week scholarship at the Culinary Institution of America in New York.

The winner of the Ney/Hill Award is scheduled to be announced in early August. According to Shawn, the top food service officer and two cooks will be awarded the Silver Bowl, by the Secretary of the

Navy in New Orleans, LA.

Although standards for the Ney/Hill Award are very high, Capt. T.F. Kenny, mess hall officer, and SSgt. G. Garay, mess hall manager, contend that their Marines and civilian workers are competitive among the best.

"Day in and day out, our food service personnel spend a countless number of hours preparing food," said Kenny. "Although our 40-year-old building will be competing against newly-erected facilities, we're confident we have a good dining facility here."

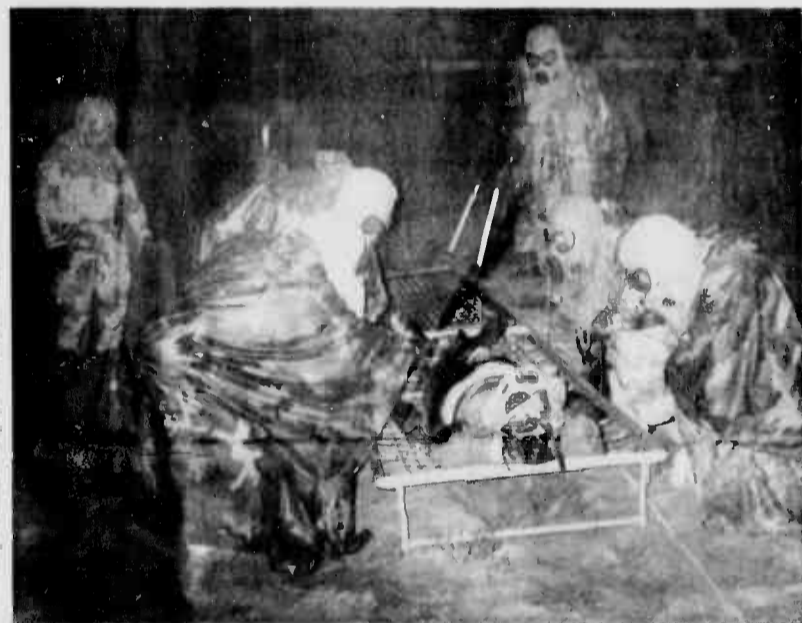

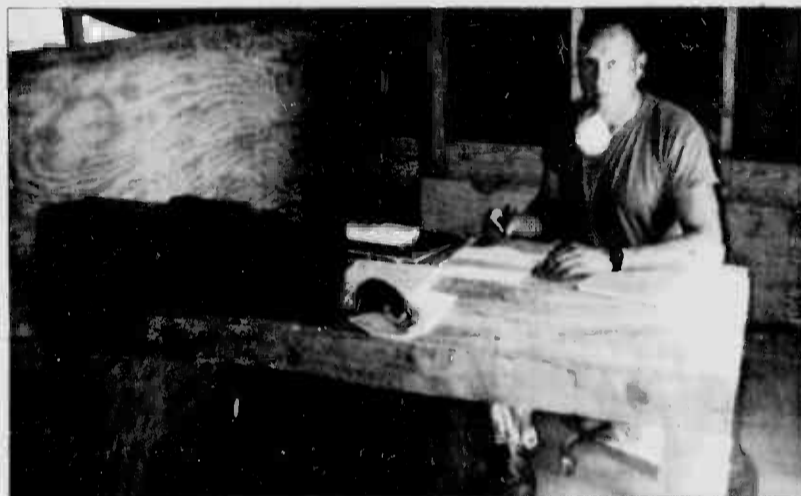

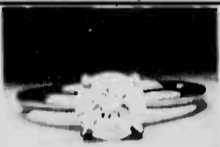

Veteran volunteer honored

For more than 19 years of helping people, Sharon Chessum has never received a paycheck.

Her reward comes not in dollar amounts, but in the number of smiles she gets from helping people in need. She's a volunteer.

Chessum, the chairman of volunteers for the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society here, says Marines, sailors and their families are part of her family, too. And when her family is in need, she's there for them.

As a result of her recent volunteer contribution during Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, Chessum was recently named the First Lady's Outstanding Adult Volunteer for the Island of Oahu. The award, which is in its 15th year of existence, distinguished Chessum from more than 50 other statewide volunteer nominees.

Chessum, also a full-time mother and wife, was commended by the Board of Managers of the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society and received a Certificate of Recognition from Hawaii's First Lady, Lynne Waihee.

During 1990, Chessum and the

other volunteers here were instrumental in loaning more than \$5,000, granting \$43,000, and giving away 267 layettes. Chessum and other volunteers with the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society here also helped nearly 2,000 people with budget counseling. According to Chessum, things picked up even more when the war started.

Chessum, realizing the potential for crisis situations during Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm, helped to

initiate an emergency contingency plan for the volunteer organization.

"In the event of an emergency, our office was set up to work 24 hours a day out of mobile offices," she said, adding that all of the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society offices were prepared to link up during the crisis.

"If, for example, a ship went down in the Gulf, we were prepared to have a skeleton crew here while other volunteers

transferred to Pearl Harbor.

Some of the services offered at the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society here are: essential vehicle repairs, food, rent and utilities assistance; funerals; and emergency transportation.

"What it all boils down to is, we're here for our Marines and sailors in time of need," Chessum said. "Even though my name is on this award, I feel that it reflects on the organization and all of the volunteers here. Without them, none of this would be possible."

Arty Marine awarded for pre-war heroism

Bowers receives Navy/Marine Corps Medal

Sgt. Keith L. Bowers has a new medal on his chest. He was awarded the Navy and Marine Corps Medal April 30 for an act of heroism last year while his battery was throwing grenades at the Pohakuloa Training Area on the Big Island.

Bowers was serving as a pit NCO January 23, 1990, when a Marine in his charge dropped his grenade and Bowers proved his mettle.

His citation from Secretary of the Navy H. Lawrence Garrett III reads in part: "...Bowers observed that a hand grenade thrown by a Marine in his charge would not clear the grenade pit or would possibly become a low air burst in close proximity to the pit. With complete disregard for his own safety and fully aware of the personal dangers involved, without hesitation, he acted by physically throwing the Marine to a safe place. Only after (he) was confident of the Marine's safety did he protect himself from the blast. By his courageous and prompt actions in the face of great personal risk, Bowers undoubtedly saved the Marine's life..."

Bowers said he didn't think it was any big deal at the time. In fact, he was back in the pit with a new customer within minutes.

The danger he'd been in did hit him the next day, though. "I was thinking about what had happened, and I suddenly become nauseous," Bowers recalled.

He remembers the events of those crucial moments very well: "I had looked away from the Marine and into the in-pact area momentarily. When I looked back I saw him dropping down and fumbling around on the ground," he explained. "He was a pretty big guy, but I grabbed him by his pants and by the top of his flack jacket and threw him out."

Bowers said as he was doing this, he saw the Marine finally get hold of the grenade and toss it out of the pit.

"I looked once on the deck to make sure it was gone then hit the deck myself," he said.

Bowers said his actions weren't deliberate, but rather automatic. "Something just clicked and I was on auto-pilot."

Bowers and the rest of 1/12 had recently returned to Kaneohe from the war when he got his award. He said he didn't anticipate any awards for himself for his actions during the war, because, as he put it, he "never saw any real action."

Enlisted spouses donate

Members of the Enlisted Spouses' Center donate a total of \$1,000 to the Armed Services YMCA, the local American Red Cross and the Staff NCO Wives Club. The Spouses Center had raised the money during the war to support its own support activities, but after a quick victory decided to donate much of the surplus funds to Station support establishments who need the money more. The Staff NCO Wives Club put the donation into their scholarship fund. ASYMCA will buy recreation equipment for its playschool and the Red Cross plans to put the money in their overall budget.

A reminder from the IRS

The Internal Revenue Service is advising Operation Desert Storm military personnel about two areas that may cause some confusion with their federal taxes. One concerns the dates for the combat pay tax exclusion, and the other concerns under-withholding from officers' combat pay.

According to Billy Brown, Director of the I.R.S. in Honolulu, Operation Desert Storm taxpayers can claim the combat pay exclusion starting in January 1991 for the months that they are in the combat zone. The combat

pay exclusion was not one of the tax relief provisions made retroactive to August 1990 by Public Law 102-2.

Brown said that some taxpayers are claiming the combat pay exclusion on their 1990 returns in error. In these situations, the IRS will make an adjustment and notify the taxpayer.

The second issue concerns the possibility of officers having too little withheld for 1991. Although officers' combat pay exclusion is limited to \$500 for each month they are in the combat zone, there is no withholding on any portion

of military compensation for those months. This could result in officers owing money when they file for 1991.

Brown says the IRS will not impose the estimated tax penalty on underwithholding in these situations, but the tax will need to be paid when the taxpayers file their 1991 returns. Brown suggests that affected officers do one of the following: set aside money to pay any 1991 balance due; adjust their withholding by submitting a new W-4; or make estimated tax payments.

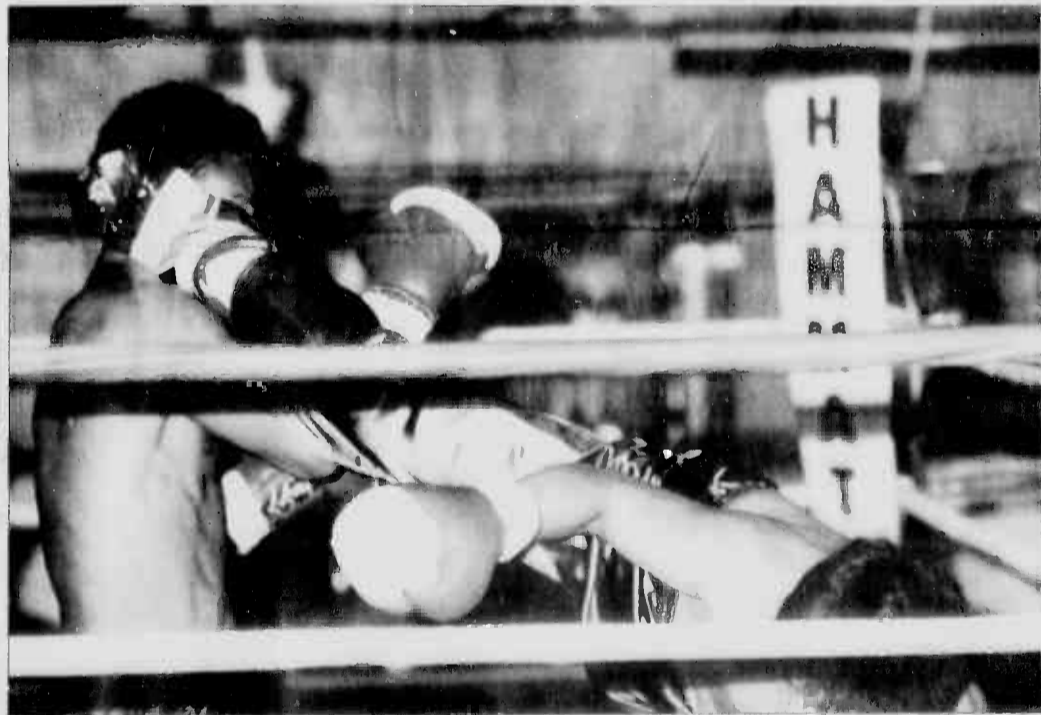

Use your head while running

As the summer months approach, thousands of Air Station personnel will flock to the streets to jog their way to a better physique. As they do, however, they are required to follow certain regulations, on and off the Air Station.

Here are some of them as stated in Air Station Order 5500.6B and 6100.5:

- Joggers will run facing traffic and remain as close to the pavement edge as possible. Exception to this rule applies when there is a bike lane, sidewalk or off-street path where joggers may safely run.

- Unit conditioning formations must run with traffic except where there is a wide bike lane, and units squad size or larger must have two road guards wearing reflective vests posted at the front and rear of the formation.

- Prohibited areas include all security areas, unless authorized, the perimeter fence line; along H-3 past the Main Gate; in the Nu'upia, Kaluapuhi and Halekou Pond areas; or in any restricted access area on the Air Station.

- Runners are encouraged

not to run during peak traffic hours, which are 6:30-7:30 a.m. and 4:50-5:30 p.m. If running at night, runners are encouraged to wear light-colored clothing.

- Chanting or cadence counting is prohibited in housing areas along Mokapu Road. This extends from the beginning of the Nu'upia Pond complex to the Mokapu Gate, except for the Assault Amphibious Vehicle access roads.

- All joggers are subject to all requirements for gaining access to the Air Station and must carry identification cards with them.

Another area of concern for runners is the west-bound Kaneohe Bay Drive, according to the Joint Safety Center. The area across from the Kailua Waste Water Treatment Plant is under construction, and the north shoulder of the road is currently blocked by barricades and cones.

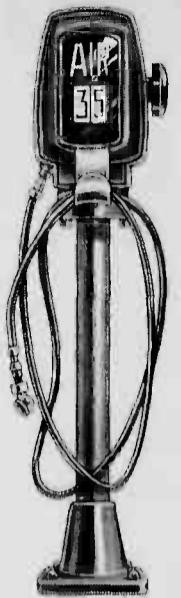
Runners traveling along the shoulder of the westbound lanes are eventually channeled by the barricades into traffic with nowhere to escape.

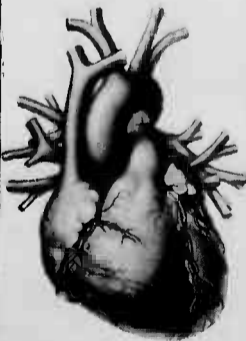

You Say You Want A Revolution? Try The Democratic Process. Support Rock the Vote.

Only 17 percent of 18-24 year olds voted in the 1988 election. Rock the Vote, a non-partisan, non-profit coalition founded by members of the record industry, wants to help change that. The organization's primary goals are to register first-time voters and to protect First Amendment rights of all citizens.

Apathy in young voters is but one reminder of how alienated these people feel at local, state and national levels. To get the voice they need, they must involve themselves in the democratic process. It's also a definitive step towards addressing unresolved conflict in young people that contributes to societal ills like drug abuse and other crime. When young people choose to become involved, our whole society benefits.

The first step is to register to vote. At

least 70 million eligible citizens are not registered. Plus, one-third of the adult population moves every two years, and the confusing array of state and local registration practices nationwide are a significant barrier to voter participation.

The answer? National voter registration reform. A bill has been introduced to Congress which will simplify voter registration laws. The National Voter Registration Act of 1991 (S 250), better known as the Motor Voter Bill, assures that virtually all eligible voters may exercise their right to vote. The major provisions of this legislation are:

"Motor Voter" provides that an application, renewal or change-of-address for a driver's license or nondriver's ID must serve as an application for voter registration. This provision will reach up



to 90 percent of all eligible voters.

Agency Registration provides for voter registration application forms and assistance at government and nongovernmental agencies, particularly unemployment, welfare and vocational rehabilitation agencies. This provision, along with mail registration, is designed to reach the eligible population that is not expected to be reached through the motor-voter system.

Mail Registration provides for registration by mail for all states. Currently, 25 states and the District of

Columbia have mail registration programs.

Other elements of the legislation include uniform and nondiscriminatory address verification provisions to ensure that voter registration lists are kept up-to-date, provisions that prohibit purging for nonvoting - eligible voters may not be removed from the rolls simply for not voting; financial aid to the states to assist with the implementation of the legislation.

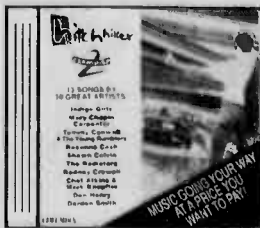

Threadgill and Berne Debut New Groups

From his early days in Mural Richard Abrams' Experimental Band and the AACM, multireedman Henry Threadgill has been delving into combining the controlled structure of composition with the open democratic play of improvisation—the American dialectic

at jazz's heart. He's got a deep feel for American music from Ives and Jelly Roll Morton through Ellington and Mingus and into the funk. But he insists that

music can't just rework its past; it must embody the spirit of its time in the shape of its idioms.

Spirit of Nuff... Nuff (Black Saint) is the first release by his latest group, septet Very Very Circus. As its whimsical title suggests, Spirit of Nuff... Nuff can be brooding and challenging and stimulating, but it's never dull. It serves up a reflective sonic panorama of life at the end of the 20th century, with its uncertainties, fears and frustrations. Threadgill sees how uncertainty can unleash a playful spirit and an exhilarating freedom. His insights about how to do that make him one of our most important musicians.

Almost Tim Berne admires Threadgill and the AACM, especially their fondness for unusual structures and some effects. In Berne's case, some of those sounds come from rock, especially the punk and noise divisions. Pace Yourself (JMT) is from his new group, Caos Totale—Italian that means just what it looks like. Despite the ironic name, Caos Totale is a highly organized ensemble that packs plenty of solo firepower. It's a funny, irreverent, thought-provoking, and engaging attempt to push the envelope.

Johnny Cash's Mystery Is As Good As It Gets

Johnny Cash's *The Mystery of Life* (Mercury) could have been released 30 years ago. He wrote six of the 10 tunes including "Wanted Man," cowritten with Bob Dylan. "The Greatest Cowboy of Them All" features Marty Stuart on guitar and Tom T. Hall duets with Cash on his "I'll Go Somewhere and Sing My Songs Again."

June Carter Cash writes in the liner notes that the album made her feel "the same emotions that I felt years ago when I first met the man in 1956." Believe it. Last year, Kelly Willis' *Well Travelled Love* (MCA) received critical acclaim but dismal sales, prompting producer Tony Brown to make her new *Bang Bang* more "radio ready." Smoother than before, *Bang Bang*'s superb song choices and Willis' strong vocals still pack a punch.

On *Maybe the Moon Will Shine* (MCA) Marsha Thornton mixes a strong, beautiful voice with a relatively unpolished sound and excellent songs. Hotshot guitarist Albert Lee and David Grisman guest.

Junior Brown's *12 Shades of Brown* is the rawest country imaginable. Released a year ago as a self-produced cassette, it took Nick Lowe's persistence and Great Britain's Demon Records to release it on CD. On "My Baby Don't Dance to

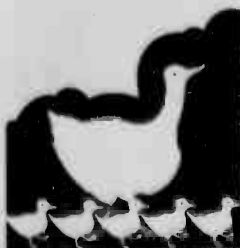

Ripe, the London Records debut from the Banderas, ranges from the reggae flavored "May This Be Your Last Sorrow" to "She Sells", a wry stab at how women are used in advertising. The album focuses on songs and melody, a refreshing turn from the track-oriented releases dominating the dance landscape.

From the East L.A. barrio to a successful TV career, Angel Ferrer's modern day Horatio Alger story now includes an album deal with Virgin Records. His self-titled album is a knockout, using a full gamut of sounds from rap to rock. The first single, "Your Love Just Ain't Right," packs a powerful house track with Latin influences. A smash.

Taking the underground by storm is a Mercury 12" from Crystal Waters titled "Gypsy Woman (She's Homeless)." Crystal is the daughter of jazz vocalist and pianist Jr. Waters and niece of Ethel Waters. Her single was produced by the Basement Boys, one of the top new production teams.

Most rappers concentrate on image and boast about their material acquisitions. But on *Life of a Kid in the Ghetto*, Ed O.G. tells of life from an ordinary street kid's point of view. Formed in Boston's tough Roxbury community, the group teamed up with the Awesome Twosome (producers Special K. and Teddy Tedd). This is a sincere, thoughtful contribution to rap.

LASER Sinatra's TV Specials, Clapton's On Laserdisc

If you like Sinatra and who doesn't, you'll love the two collections of his six television specials from 1965 through 1974. Frank Sinatra: The Reprise Collection I & II (Warner Reprise/79.95 each). Nearly every classic Sinatra tune is on these discs, some performed more than once. Ella Fitzgerald and Gene Kelly make guest appearances. The program titled *Sinatra*

finds him taking self-deprecating potshots at his films with clips to illustrate. The discs are digital and have wonderful sound, with chapter stops for every song and medley. The video portion leaves something to be desired, but then the technology wasn't the same 20 years ago.

Roger Waters finally found the ultimate place to present his psychotic rock opera *The Wall*—the site of the former Berlin Wall. The result—Roger Waters—*The Wall* (PolyGram)—is a mixed bag. Waters staged the show like the Who's recent *Tommy* shows, with celebrities like Cyndi Lauper, Marianne Faithfull and Van Morrison, to name a few. The casting works only as a curiosity, since *The Wall*, in concept, is one man's odyssey. The video looks like a SLP VHS dub, but the audio is sharp and thunderous.

The Cream of Eric Clapton (PolyGram/\$29.95) is all clips, no commentary and better for it. There are highlights from Clapton's illustrious career, including terrific early b&w videos of the Yardbirds and Cream. The disc is chapter-encoded for each song (although incorrectly), with surprisingly good audio and video.



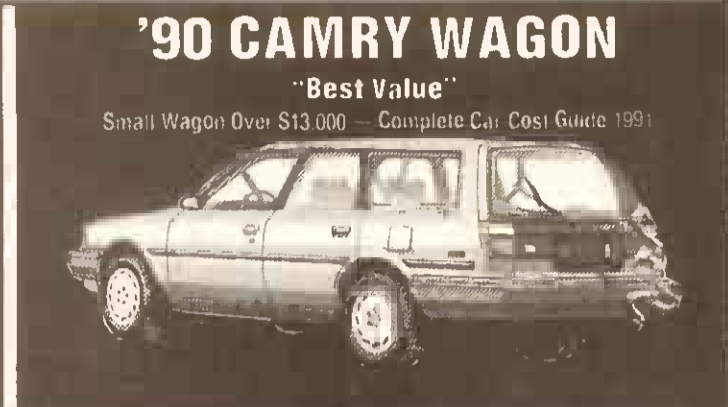

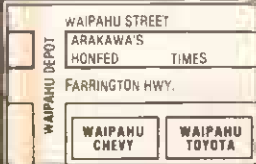

Legally Speaking

Marines and sailors who purchased homes on Oahu a few years ago stand to make a substantial profit when they sell them. In fact, the profit will sometimes exceed their military pay earned during their tour on Oahu.

Unfortunately, there is a down side to this rosy financial picture. That sizeable profit is subject to state and federal taxes at the same rate as ordinary income. A large portion of the seller's portion can be consumed by income taxes.

Fortunately for homeowners, there are legitimate procedures to defer taxes or exclude gains on the sale of principal residences. This article outlines the tax consequences for the sale of principal residences. However, it is not meant as a substitute for competent, one-on-one tax advice. The details of specific situations can create different results.

The primary method for postponing taxes is through a rollover of the gain made from the sale.

• If the taxpayer purchases a new residence 10 years before the sale date to two years after, the gain on the sale of the old residence is subtracted from the cost of the new home for tax purposes. This amount is considered the gain.

Active duty military personnel have up to four years to purchase replacement homes. Under certain conditions, service members serving outside the United States have up to eight years to purchase a replacement home. However, the suspension period for overseas service terminates one year after returning to the United States.

The residence must be the taxpayer's main home -- the place he lives. Residences that have been converted to rental property aren't considered principal residence unless the taxpayer: Intends to return to the residence; didn't offer to sell the residence; and didn't rent it for an extended period. Also, a rental property can be considered a principal residence if economic conditions forced a taxpayer to rent it before selling it.

Home sale taxes

To defer the entire gain, the cost of the new residence must exceed the adjusted sale price of the old residence. This is of particular concern to service members transferring or retiring to an area with lower housing costs.

The adjusted sales price is the amount of the selling price remaining after selling and fix-up expenses are deducted. Selling expenses include real estate commissions, title certifications and insurance, legal fees, escrow fees, and state and local transfer taxes. Fix-up costs are expenses for work performed to repair and decorate the home to help sell it and are incurred within 90 days of the sales contract.

The seller must opt to treat these costs as either selling or moving expenses, but not both.

The cost of the replacement home includes: Cash paid and debt incurred; the cost of improvements or construction made during the replacement period; and expenses related to the purchase, such as title insurance, legal fees and transfer expenses.

Gains on sales of homes must be reported on tax returns using IRS Form 2119 even if the gain is deferred. A loss on the sale of a personal residence is considered a non-deductible living expense and need not be reported. Losses on the sale of rental property are allowed, but are beyond the scope of this article.

• The second method for reducing the tax consequences on the sale of residences applies to taxpayers who are 55 years old or older. They can elect to

exclude up to \$125,000 of the gain from the sale of a principal residence that they have occupied for three of the five years preceding the sale.

This is a one-time exclusion. Property owned jointly by husband and wife is subject to special rules. Both spouses must agree to the exclusion, but only one spouse must meet the age, holding and use requirements with respect to the property.

High home prices and substantial appreciation in values caused the state of Hawaii to pass special legislation last year. This new law required buyers to withhold nine percent of the sales price and to pay this as a tax withholding to the Hawaii Department of Taxation.

This new law provided for only two exceptions. If the seller was a Hawaii resident or the transfer was entitled to non-recognition of gain or loss under law or treaty, then the buyer was not required to withhold the nine percent. This new law was obviously intended to create an enforcement mechanism to prevent real estate transactions by foreigners from escap-

ing state taxation.

Unfortunately, the law worked a hardship on military personnel by not allowing them to rollover their gain into a new residence on the mainland. It also tied-up a significant portion of the net sales proceeds at the time the service member needed funds to move and purchase another home.

The latest session of the Hawaii legislature resulted in partial relief for military home sellers in Hawaii. The new legislation is retroactive to Jan. 1, 1991, the effective date of last year's legislation imposing the withholding provisions.

Withholding of a portion of the sales price of homes owned by military personnel stationed on Hawaii is no longer required. Service members are also permitted to rollover their gain into another residence.

Military members selling a home on Hawaii are cautioned that the change in state law does not exempt them from payment of Hawaii state income tax on any gain. It merely authorizes a postponement through the rollover.

failed a field sobriety test, and an intoxilyzer test showed his BAC at .12 percent.

Other incidents

• A Marine was arrested by Pearl Harbor MPs for fraudu-

lent use of a license plate. The Marine was illegally parked. MPs checked records, and found the license plate was registered to a different vehicle.

• A Marine was apprehended by MPs for assault. He had

assaulted a sailor in the Enlisted Club parking lot. The sailor had abrasions on his elbows, knees and forehead. The Marine left the club before MPs arrived but was later found at the barracks.

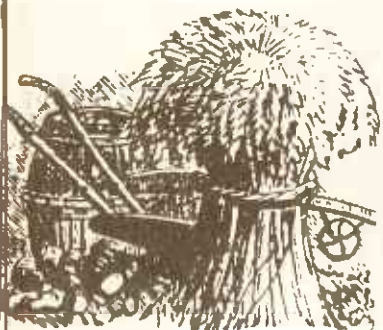

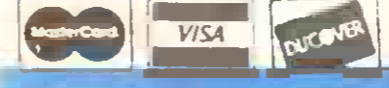

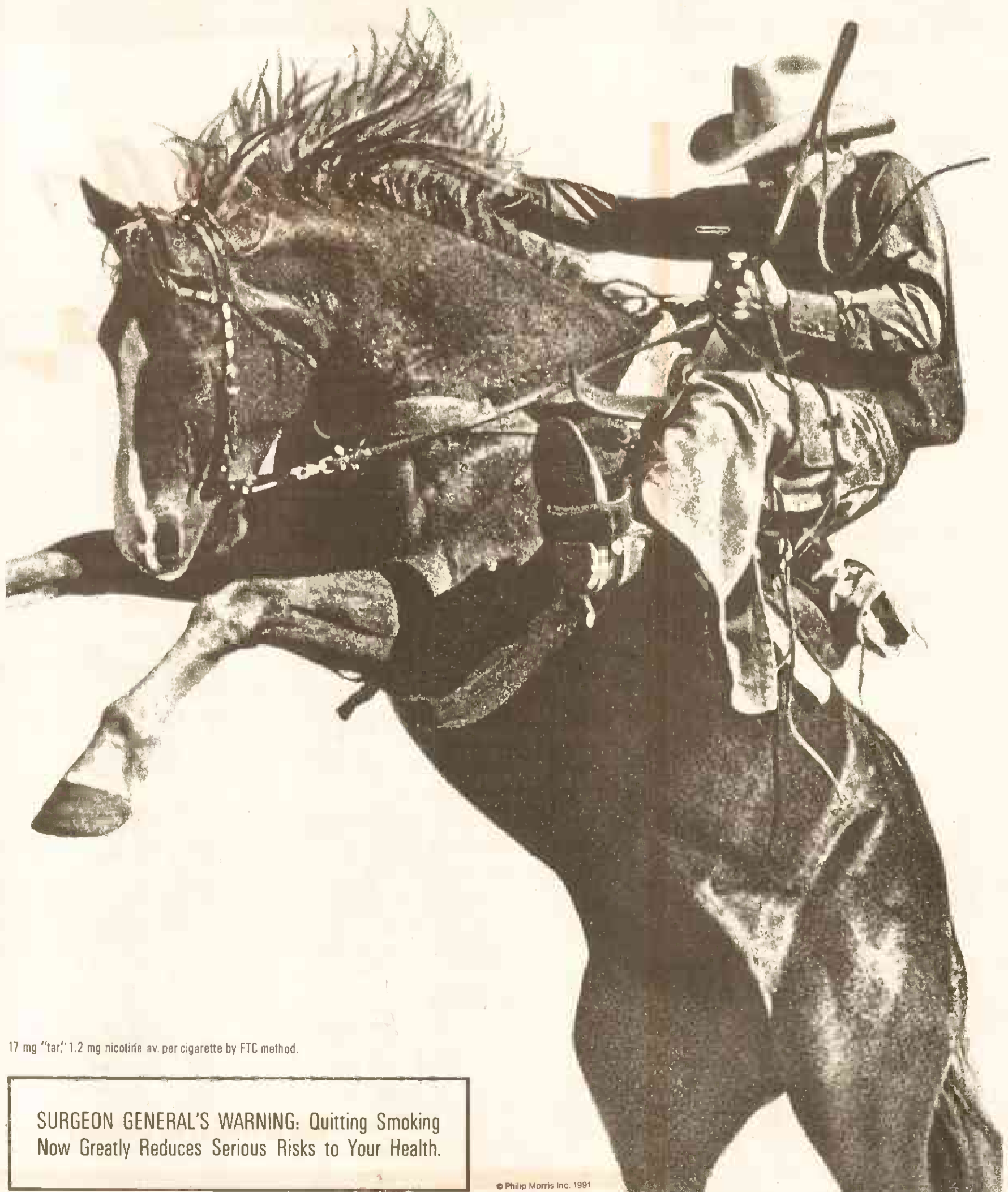
