## 16th crimes result in six families losing base housing

Seven juveniles, ages 12 to 15, were detained for breaking and entering, burglary and various other property crimes committed aboard Marine Corps Base Hawaii recently.

Allegedly aided by one adult who was found in possession and thought to have purchased the property during a three month period, the seven juveniles may have stolen over \$25,000 worth of property from residents throughout the base family housing areas.

During the investigation of the crimes, a member of the MCB Hawaii Criminal Investigation Department noticed one of the juveniles in a base housing area playing with a cellular phone. Thinking that a juvenile in possession of a cellular phone was out of the ordinary, the investigator detained him and matched the phone with one that had been stolen earlier. Having been caught, the juvenile admitted taking the phone and described other crimes in which he and the other youths had taken part.

Base Order P5500.8D states that military personnel are responsible for the actions of their dependents. Therefore, the sponsors of the six families involved were ordered to appear before the base magistrate, Capt. Mike Monyak, who recommended several administrative sanctions on those responsible for the crimes and their families, to include removal from base housing. The cost of the move and relocation, to be completed within 30 days of the finding, will not be covered by the government, and the perpetrators are barred from all military facilities on the island of Oahu, except for medical and dental care, for a period of three years.

Capt. Monyak also recommended that those involved receive counseling and perform some sort of community service.

"The new commanding general will not tolerate this kind of behavior and will take a hard stand with crime on base," stated Monyak.

Pending action on the recommendations of Capt. Monyak, the cases involving the juveniles may be forwarded to the state for prosecution by the Special Assistant to the United States Attorney.

The adult who was involved could be prosecuted by the state of Hawaii or in federal district court.

### How to prevent home break-ins

The home security inspection, conducted by the Military Police Department, Crime Prevention Unit, will help to point out security defects in your quarters. Information is provided on methods available to improve security. Most of the materials needed to improve your home security may be obtained from the Family Housing Self-Help Office.

## 1st MEB to deactivate command element

The latest chapter in 93 years of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade's history will commence at the 10 a.m. command element deactivation ceremony, Friday at Dewey Square.

Although this may seem like a tumultuous change, BGen. R.F. Vercauteren, commanding general of 1st MEB and Marine Corps Base Hawaii, said the change will be smooth.

"There will be no change in operations. Basically, the only thing going away is the command element," he explained.

With the command element deactivating, the remaining units will redesignate as III Marine Expeditionary Forces, Hawaii.

Marine Aircraft Group-24 will deactivate and redesignate as First Marine Aircraft Wing Aviation Support Element, Kaneohe; Brigade Service Support Group-1 will deactivate and redesignate as Combat Service Support Group-3; and Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron-24 will deactivate and redesignate as Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kaneohe, explained BGen. Vercauteren.

These changes are part of the Marine Corps reorganization, which allows the Marine Corps to meet its global requirements in the face of a reduced force structure in the post cold war era.

"III MEF Forces Hawaii will continue to deploy from this strategic location in the mid-Pacific to meet

contingencies as the MEB has since 1953," BGen. Vercauteren said.

The III MEF forces here will continue to provide a strong, combat-ready Marine expeditionary presence in the mid-Pacific.

BGen. Vercauteren also explained that Marines here will continue to train in the same manner as they do currently.

"We are still going to PTA [Pohakaloa Training Area] twice a year. We are still going to deploy on the unit deployment program," BGen. Vercauteren added.

Additionally, those units who haven't left the island will have the opportunity to deploy. For example, there will be a 3d Marines amphibious assault detachment going to Mount Fuji, Japan, he explained. This is due to the direct link between 3d Marines and III MEF.

"Instead of going through the MEB, units will be reporting to their various division, wing or FSSG [Force Service Support Group] command," BGen. Vercauteren said.

There are other beneficial changes the general plans to implement for the individual Marine.

"My perspective as a commander is that I can personally help the individual Marine by making his quarters more livable. My focus is to improve the quality of life for sergeants and below," BGen. Vercauteren explained.

Although the deactivation of the 1st MEB command element will require some changes and readjustments, one thing will remain the same - III MEF Forces Hawaii will continue to be a mid-Pacific force in readiness.

crime in your neighborhood is the neighborhood watch program. Neighborhood watch is a program of neighbors watching out for neighbors. A neighborhood watch program will get everyone in the area involved and thinking about crime prevention, and help residents feel more secure in their quarters, especially during deployments. Statistics have shown that criminals avoid areas where there is an active neighborhood watch program because it increases their chances of being caught.

If you suspect that a crime is being committed or if you see or hear a suspected prowler, call the Military Police Department at 257-7114. Do not attempt to stop the individual yourself. If you

are able to see the individual, look for identifying items such as approximate height, weight, hair color, type and color of clothes. If there is a vehicle, get as much information as you can about the vehicle. This will help the military police apprehend the suspect.

Increased home security and an active neighborhood watch will greatly enhance chances for apprehending and deterring criminals in the housing areas. They will also contribute towards the decrease of crime aboard the base.

## Marines will participate in consolidated training

General Carl E. Mundy Jr., Commandant of the Marine Corps, recently announced that the Marine Corps will take an active role in consolidated training for non-service specific military occupational specialties. As a result, more Marines will soon be classmates with members of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

The move results from an all-military services review, directed by the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, to eliminate unnecessary duplication and training redundancy by encouraging single site training, to create cost savings despite dwindling DoD resources, and to increase the training efficiency of military schools. The Marine Corps is the executive agent for the 1994 Interservice Training Review Organization, a three-year initiative which is conducting an assessment of the services' training needs.

Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., will see one of the largest influxes of Marine students. By fiscal year 1996, the Marine Corps is expected to send more than 6,600 Marines annually

to Fort Leonard Wood where they will be trained as motor vehicle operators. Additionally, more than 800 Marines will train there in the fields of civil/construction engineer and vehicle maintenance.

The Marine Corps will also consolidate its food service and corrections training at other Army and Air Force installations that have the resources to accept the additional student load.

Courses recommended for consolidation must be consistent with the readiness, responsibilities and requirements of the service. (HQMC, Washington, D.C.)

## Marine Corps announces new housing upgrades

Marines expect to rough it when they're deployed, but when they're in garrison, they and their families have a right to expect well-maintained, comfortable and contemporary living quarters.

That's the word from housing officials at Headquarters Marine Corps which has announced two programs to "houseclean" the Corps'

current inventories of aged, substandard and inadequate bachelor and family quarters.

Gen. Carl E. Mundy Jr., Commandant of the Marine Corps, approved the family and bachelor housing campaign plans in July.

As background to the challenges facing our Corps, approximately 55 percent of the unaccompanied personnel housing is more than 40 years old, while more than 60 percent of the family housing is more than 30 years old, but it's not just the age factor that concerns Marine officials like LtCol. Craig R. Wallwork, who heads up the Housing Management Section at HQMC.

While many of the family quarters can be refurbished and upgraded to provide modern comfortable living spaces, others must be replaced since repairs and upgrades are cost prohibitive.

A driving concern is that quality and unavailability of military quarters in some locations has prompted many junior Marines — single and married — to live off base, opening themselves up to financial strains as they live on the civilian economy. This is particularly true in high-cost areas like Southern California.

At this time, only 70 percent of the Corps' enlisted unaccompanied personnel housing is adequate according to inventory reports. On the married side of the issue, the Corps has a shortage of more than 2,000 homes for our families. These statistics indicate that there is still substantial ground to make up to improve the quality of life for Marines and their families. This demands immediate attention, not just as a recruiting and retention tool, but because service members and their families deserve the best this country can afford.

Finding the money to upgrade family and unaccompanied personnel housing is no easy task. With a significant portion of the Marine Corps' budget already going to cover personnel costs, there are few places to look for dollars that can be redirected to quality of life issues such as housing.

"In this era, Congress isn't going to hand us a blank check and tell us to make life as nice as possible for our Marines and their families," LtCol. Wallwork said. "At the same time, it is DoD's policy that excellent facilities and services should be provided for all military members, their families and eligible civilians. "That may sound like a 'catch-22,'

but by prioritizing our efforts we can make sizable strides in the near term while we're working on additional funding for the more expensive projects."

The Marine Corps has invested \$657 million in new unaccompanied personnel housing construction during the past 13 years, with major improvements at Camp Pendleton, Camp Lejeune, Twentynine Palms and Cherry Point. In addition, \$65 million was spent on maintenance and repair of existing unaccompanied personnel housing facilities. Still, approximately 30 percent of unaccompanied personnel housing spaces are substandard or inadequate.

The bottom line, according to the Commandant, is that "... Its (housing campaign plan) goals and objectives are ambitious and challenging, but most of all, realistic and cost effective. More importantly, failure to initiate action now will result in exponential increases in maintenance and repair costs ... Your efforts will produce results beyond those enumerated here and contribute directly to the readiness, relevance and capability of our Corps." (Fred Carr, HQMC Public Affairs)

A permissive search of suspect one's vehicle resulted in the seizure of one partially-burned hand-rolled cigarette suspected to be marijuana. Both

suspects were processed and released.

The evidence/lost and found custodian has in his possession ID cards, bank cards, watches, keys, jewelry, fishing nets, a gym bag, surfboard, bicycles and more. # This week around the world

## □ Casualty free landing at Port-au-Prince

Spearheading the American landing in Haiti and seizing Port-au-Prince airport at 9:45 a.m., Sept. 19, Company C, 2nd Battalion, 22nd Regiment of the Army's 10th Mountain Division established the U.S. military's first base of operations.

Being met with no resistance, the only individuals Charlie Company faced after debarking from their 10 UH-60 helicopters were spectators and about 100 journalists covering the event.

The soldiers were armed with various types of weapons and ordered to only take a defensive posture.

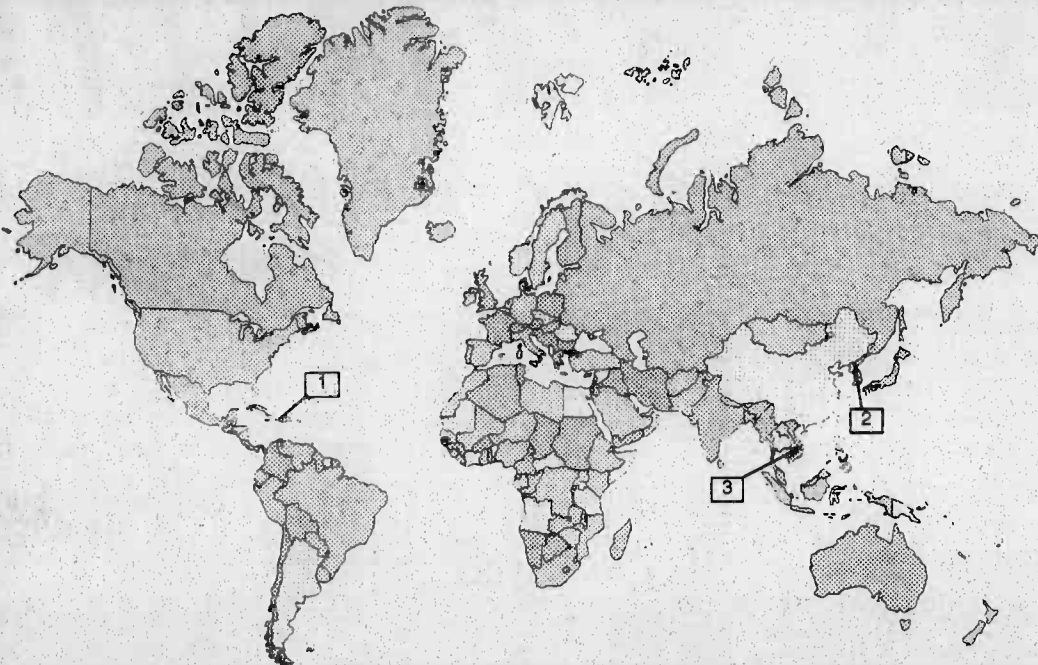
The soldiers secured the perimeter of the airport in a minimal amount of time and the only shots fired were those of photographers' cameras.

They gained control of the airport terminal by using teams to clear rooms and remove any nonessential personnel. Two men with a special forces squad were even given directions to the control tower by Haitian soldiers.

Upon arrival, U.S. commander LtGen. Henry Shelton departed the airport to meet with Haiti's military ruler.

Outside the airport, crowds waved and cheered at the troops.

While military operations appeared to be going smoothly, questions arose in Washington about the deal negotiated by the delegation led by former president Jimmy



Haiti to be used in a peacekeeping role.

Once in place, U.S. forces will be joined by a 2,000-member multinational peacekeeping contingent who will train Haitian soldiers in non-lethal security procedures.

## □ IAEA demands access to North Korean installations

North Korea accused the watchdog International Atomic Energy Agency of meddling in ongoing talks between the U.S. and North Korea.

The IAEA wants to gain access to two sites said to contain evidence that North Korea reprocessed plutonium in 1989.

The official Korean Central News Agency suggested that ongoing talks aimed at wiping out the nuclear crises on the Korean Peninsula would come to a stalemate. The talks resume in Geneva, Friday.

## □ MIA issue still blocks Vietnamese relations with U.S.

In Hanoi, diplomatic relations are being held up between Washington and Hanoi on the issue of accountability of Americans missing in action during the Vietnam War, a senior U.S. official said.

He added that the MIA issue is the only obstacle blocking an exchange of ambassadors, the first step to full diplomatic relations between the two countries.

Carter to remove the military dictatorship from power.

The main questions asked were whether those in power will now play a part in Haiti's future and how much of a role will the U.S. play in fashioning a democracy for a country who has never known one.

Hoping that LtGen. Raoul Cedras and his two top aides will leave the country, President Clinton stated, "I think they should leave; I think they will leave at some point. But

that is something that still has to be worked out, and something that subsequent actions by all the actors in the Haitian drama will have to be heavily relied upon."

Carter, knowing Clinton's opinion on the fate of the Haitian strong men, said that requiring their exile would be a serious violation of human rights and that he never attempted to persuade them to leave Haiti.

Expecting a violent struggle, two U.S. warships and one Coast Guard

cutter appeared in the harbor of Port-au-Prince. Thousands of Haitian civilians gathered to see the second U.S. occupation force of the century.

"There will be difficult times ahead. There may well be injuries and casualties. We can't guarantee anything, but we're off to an exceptionally good start," said retired Gen. Colin Powell, former chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

In the next two weeks more than 15,000 U.S. troops will arrive in

# 1st MEB has been a strong force of readiness in Pacific

Throughout its history from 1901 to the present, the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade has seen war, peace and disaster; has been deactivated and reactivated; named and renamed. Having served its country and Corps with honor and distinction, the 1st MEB command element is preparing for deactivation, while its major subordinate commands are reorganizing to become III Marine Expeditionary Force, Hawaii.

The 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade, soon to be III MEF Hawaii, serves as a combat ready force in the central Pacific prepared to provide a hard hitting air/ground team. It is trained and equipped to react on a moment's notice and is the only combat unit in the world in which the air/ground team daily trains and lives together.

#### The organization

The largest tenant command on Marine Corps Base Hawaii, the 1st MEB is a fully operational Marine Air Ground Task Force which consists of a Command Element, an Aviation Combat Element (MAG-24), a Ground Combat Element (3d Marine Regiment (Rein)), and a Combat Service Support Element (BSSG-1).

The MEB supports one of three strategically important Maritime Prepositioning Force Squadrons. The MPF squadrons are heavily mechanized with tanks, self-propelled artillery and other vehicles prepositioned aboard Maritime Prepositioning Squadron vessels. The Marines and sailors of the 1st MEB form the base of MPF-3, with the additional personnel required based on Okinawa, Japan, and in southern California.

The 1st MEB's ground combat element, the 3d Marine Regiment is the second largest infantry regiment in the Marine Corps. It has three infantry battalions, an artillery battalion and a combat support company comprised of an engineer platoon, an assault amphibian vehicle platoon and a special training section.

The MEB's aviation support is provided by Marine Aircraft Group-24, which is comprised of three tactical aircraft squadrons, a support squadron and an aviation logistics squadron. MAG-24 pilots fly CH-53 and CH-46 heavy and medium-lift helicopters to provide the

air-ground combat capability for the brigade. The group also provides its own offensive and defensive air control and air traffic control.

Brigade Service Support Group-1 provides logistical support for the 1st MEB. It is comprised of Headquarters and Service Company, Maintenance Company, Motor Transport Company, Supply Company, Engineer Company, Medical Company and Dental Company.

Brigade administrative support is provided by Headquarters and Service Company, and the communications support is provided by Company B, 7th Communications Battalion.

#### Its mission

The MEB's role throughout history, at home and abroad, has been as diverse as its capabilities. In one form or another, the MEB has supported a multitude of operations ranging from hostile to humanitarian.

Humanitarian missions are the most recent example of the MEB's capabilities. In December '92 the brigade sent more than 80 Marines to Somalia to help render humanitarian support in operation Restore Hope.

Previously the MEB was put to the test in September of 1992, following the wrath of Hurricane Iniki which slammed the Hawaiian Island chain. In a joint operation of more than 3,000 military personnel, the MEB sent more than 500 Marines and sailors to the hardest hit island of Kauai to support Joint Task Force Garden Isle.

Although the MEB has proven itself during humanitarian operations, it has been its MAGTF flexibility in times of crisis on foreign lands which have won it distinction.

In support of Operation Desert Shield in early August 1990, the 1st MEB began deploying its assets to Saudi Arabia and the island emirate of Bahrain. Displaying its MAGTF flexibility it began to augment the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force and "marry-up" with its MPF equipment as it was off-loaded from its MPF ships.

Additionally in support of I MEF for Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm, some elements were attached to the 1st Marine Division, headquartered at Camp Pendleton, Calif., other support units were attached to the 1st Force Service Support Group, also based at Camp Pendleton, while other elements of

the Brigade joined the 5th Marine Expeditionary Brigade, which took part in amphibious operations south of Kuwait and the deception campaign to the north.

Throughout Desert Shield and Desert Storm the 3d Marine Regiment was the closest Marine regiment to the Kuwait border. It exchanged "harassment fire" with Iraqi forces and helped fight off the Iraqi forces trying to thrust into the border city of Khafji, when joined with the 1st Marine Division in Task Force Taro.

During the ground assault, the regiment acted as the Division's forward probing force, and infiltrated into Kuwait more than a day before the main attack began. During the attack, the regiment guarded the Division's right flank all the way to the Kuwait International Airport.

MAG-24 deployed 10 of 11 squadrons to the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing. During Operation Desert Storm, jets from MAG-24 took part in the air war, and were some of the first to strike deep into Iraq, while CH-53s and CH-46s from the MEB were attached to MAG-16 and participated in heavy-lift and supply missions from the Al Jubail Airport.

BSSG-1, following the off-load of MPSRON-3, composited with the 1st FSSG. Elements of BSSG-1 provided support deep into Kuwait, following close behind and alongside the Regiment as it advanced.

Additionally, numerous staff members of the command element served with distinction on various commands and staffs of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force within the Kuwait theater of operations. The first forces deployed in August 1990; the last forces returned in June 1991.

#### Its history

Springing up from two rifle regiments and two artillery companies, the lineage of the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade dates back to 1901 on the island of Luzon in the Philippines. At that time, called the Marine Brigade, the unit saw its first action when Brigade units took part in the march across the island of Samar in 1901-1902.

Units of the Brigade were sent to China in October 1911, during the overthrow of the Manchu Dynasty, to protect U.S. interests in Shanghai and other places, remaining on this duty until July 1912.

At the same time other units participated in a number of engagements against insurrectionists in the vicinity of Cavite and Olongapo. Units were also involved in the construction of an advance naval base at Subic Bay.

The brigade was called up in 1914 in Vera Cruz, Mexico. In 1915, the 1st Marine Brigade saw action in Haiti, the Dominican Republic and Cuba and remained in the Caribbean until its return to the United States and deactivation in 1934.

It was during the "Banana War" campaigns that the Brigade pioneered the close air support concept and dramatically placed the air/ground team in the forefront of tactical innovation. Its mission completed in 1934, the Brigade returned to Quantico, Va.

Between 1939 and 1950, the brigade was activated, redesignated and deactivated several times.

In 1941, the Brigade deployed to Iceland; then to Guam in 1944 where it participated in the seizure of Guam

and the Philippines. As the war ended and forces were withdrawn from the Pacific, the Brigade again retired its colors. This retirement was short lived, for in 1946, the Brigade deployed to the Caribbean, then in July 1950 the 1st Marine Provisional Brigade was quickly reformed and sent to fight in Korea. It was the first unit sent from the states and was immediately committed to the defense of the Pusan Perimeter. In the words of a British observer, "The 1st Marine Brigade was well trained and physically toughened, the NCOs were hard ... and the men reacted."

Also in the early 1950s, the U.S. Marine Corps recognized the Mokapu Peninsula as an ideal site for a Provisional Marine Air-Ground Task Force. In early 1953, the Brigade was reactivated and commissioned to begin operating at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay. Renamed the 1st Marine Brigade in 1956, it was the only brigade in the Marine Corps to combine both air and ground units at one location.

During 1965, with the intensification of involvement in the Vietnam War, units of the Brigade were deployed to Okinawa and then to Vietnam. Upon arrival in the war-torn country, the units were de-

tached from the Brigade to reinforce other units.

August 30, 1985, the 1st Marine Brigade was redesignated as the 1st Marine Amphibious Brigade, and assigned a new mission: to conduct planning for operations in conjunction with the Maritime Prepositioning Ships program. February 5, 1988, the MAB was again redesignated as the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade.

Nearing the end of its long journey, the deactivation ceremony for the MEB command element will take place at 10 a.m., Sep. 23 at Dewey Square. Following the deactivation, the major subordinate commands which comprise the MEB will reorganize and come under the direct operational control of III MEF. Additionally the activation of HMH-366, a Marine heavy helicopter squadron will take place this month. Following the MEB command element's deactivation, the new organization will remain essentially intact as Marine Aircraft Group-24 deactivates and redesignates as Aviation Support Element Kaneohe, Brigade Service Support Group-1 deactivates and redesignates as 3d Marine Regiment remains undeployed to Okinawa and all three major commands redesignate as III Marine Expeditionary Forces, Hawaii.

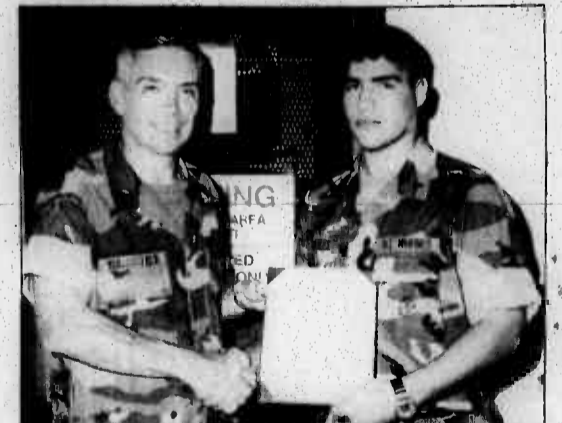

**Camaraderie and concern for others remind Marine of heritage**

Upon joining the Marine Corps, Marines join a family. But this family is different because into it everybody brings their own culture and traditions.

The Marine Corps family is made up of numerous ethnic groups, and ethnic observances help educate everyone on exactly who we are.

Hispanic Heritage Month is celebrated Sept. 15 through Oct. 15. As of September 1993, there were 14,216 Hispanic members serving in the Marine Corps.

MSgt. Carlos Perez is one of these Marines. Like many, he said he joined the Marine Corps to serve his country. Perez enlisted in December 1972 when many of his friends were returning from Vietnam. He felt it was his duty to serve as they had.

After bootcamp, Perez was sent to Audiovisual Technician School Lowery Air Force Base, Aurora, Colorado.

"Originally I had planned only to join for two years. I thought I would go to war, come back and get out," said Perez, who is the noncommissioned officer in charge

of the Training and Audiovisual Support Center at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Camp H.M. Smith. "But instead I started going to school."

Perez was not a high school graduate, so he began to work on his high school diploma. School motivated him and he found something else inspired him to continue.

"In the Marine Corps, I encountered unit camaraderie and people taking care of each other," said the Chicago native. "I always looked forward to being the next higher rank so that I could take care of my troops."

With his own family now, Perez continues to honor Hispanic traditions.

"I'm bringing up my children the same way I was brought up," he said.

But sometimes this is difficult when far away from our roots, he explained. The distance from familiar Hispanic close-knit communities gives Perez added reason to hold on to traditions as well as teach others about the Hispanic culture.

He schools others by holding Hispanic dances and teaching traditional Folklorico Mexican dancing.

He first began holding classes while stationed in Okinawa, Japan. He said he does it not only so people can enjoy what's part of Hispanic culture but also so they can teach their children.

"This is something in which the whole family can get involved," he explained.

"Yes, you will miss it (Hispanic culture), but if you look around there's always somebody doing something that will bring you closer to home. There are a lot of other people who are doing the same thing I'm doing."

Perez plans to retire after serving 26 years. But although he is getting out of the Marine Corps, he does not plan to leave the Marine Corps family.

"I want to open a Mexican restaurant in Cherry Point, N.C. I also plan to continue to teach Folklorico Mexican dancing," he said.

Perez explained that although it is important for Marines to know where they come from, it is just as important to remember who they are... United States Marines. And although Marines may come from every part of the world, in the Marine Corps they are united.

## Files and directives clerk makes daily task of making others smile

According to her coworkers and others who interact with her on a daily basis, the term "cheerful" best describes Emilye Carvalho, the civil service files and directives clerk for Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

She's worked with the Marines here for more than 24 years. Along with her husband Lawrence, a landscaper and their children Michael, 24, and Adrianna, 14, she lives in nearby Kaneohe.

Carvalho, a Hawaii-native, first entered the civil service with a part-time job at Ft. Shafter in Honolulu. Shortly afterwards, she applied for and was accepted in a full-time position at the Marine Corps Air Station.

"When I first came to Kaneohe in 1971, I was a keypunch operator for what used to be

Headquarters and Service Squadron," she said. "About eight years ago, I transferred to my present location here in the files and directives office," she added.

Carvalho is responsible for organizing the files and ordering the directives for MCB Hawaii. She also maintains all official correspondence. She has seen many changes in her office, alone, during the last eight years.

"Before, to order a publication for someone, it required many forms and a long wait. But now, I can order directly through the computer terminal at my desk," Carvalho said.

"I usually receive from five to 20 requests a day for manuals and publications, and I always try to make sure that the people who come in to see me for the requests enjoy their time here," she added.

I consider it very important

that people enjoy themselves while they are working with me," said Carvalho.

"Emilye is a person who will cheer a person up just so they can have a smile for the day," said 1stLt. Maureen Murphy, MCB Hawaii adjutant and Carvalho's officer in charge.

"When she sees something that needs to be done, she doesn't hold back; she'll charge out and ensure it's done right," Murphy added.

Having celebrated her 45th birthday, Sunday, Carvalho shared some personal advice that might help people in their dealings with others.

"A person shouldn't be friendly just because they are expected to be, but because they want to be," said Carvalho, suggesting that a friendly disposition goes a long way. "If a person leaves my office with a smile or a laugh, I feel good."

The Hawaii Marine Wrestlers returned from the Army's Invitational Tournament with three gold and a silver medal for their efforts, Saturday.

Ken Green took the gold in the 125 pound weight class, Eric Genzer in the 136.5 pound weight class and Ted Petersen in the 205 pound weight class. Kosal Va earned the silver medal at 149.5 pound weight class. The four earned their medals wrestling up to three five-minute matches.

Green claimed his gold medal with a pinfall over the Army's Kevin Brumit with 1:37 left in their five-minute match. Genzer earned his gold medal earlier in the day when he defeated his Army opponent by a 7-6 decision.

Petersen squared off against soldier Chuck Edgington of the Army in the last match of the night. It turned out to be a heart-stopper. With the scored tied 4-4, and with time running out, Petersen scored a one-point takedown with seven seconds left to break the tie and propel him onto the championship dais.

Va achieved a three-point takedown at the start of his match, but the Army's Darryl Bozeat recovered to gain a 13-3 technical fall to end the match (a technical fall is equivalent to amateur softball's ten-rule mercy rule).

The Marines only brought a dozen wrestlers to the tournament; the other half of the wrestling team being unavailable due to their upcoming departure for deployment to the Pohakuloa Training Area on the Big Island of Hawaii on Sunday.

"The Marines on the team know

that operations take precedence over these local tournaments," said Mark Smith, coach of the Hawaii Marine wrestling team. "Our team isn't comprised of Marines temporarily assigned to the gym, just so they can wrestle for the base team full-time. They choose to dedicate some of their spare time from their regular duties for the sport they enjoy," he added.

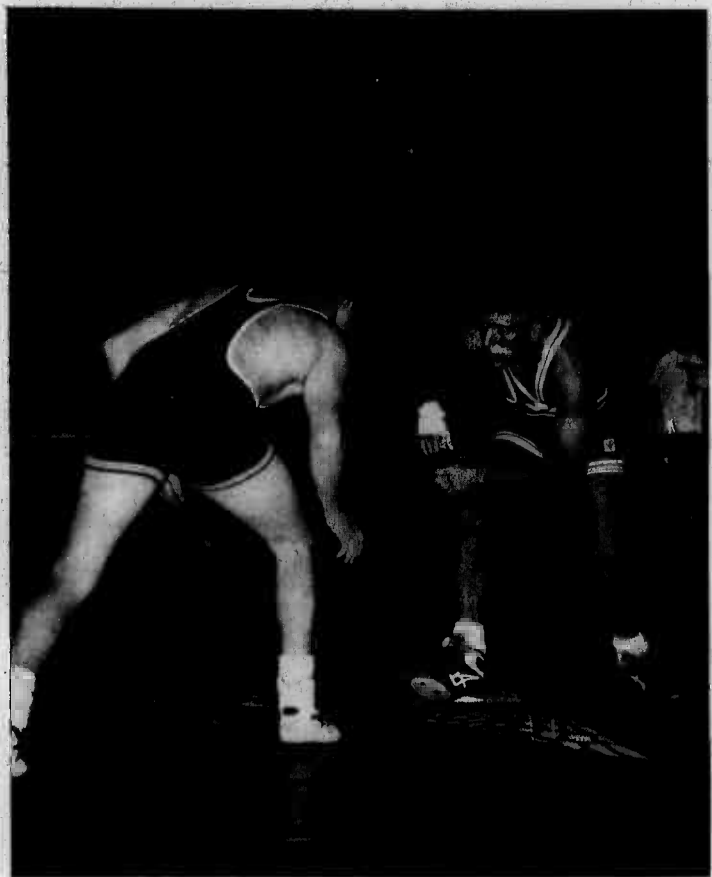
In contrast, the Army team offers an incentive to the soldiers who qualify for its base team. "I have 60 soldiers trying out for Schofield's base team," said Army coach Tim Bryant. "The soldiers that make the base team are assigned to the gym for six months where they wrestle from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. each working day," he said.

"Army Division support has been very important to us; it allows us to wrestle as well as maintain our military standards," said Bryant. "I take my hat off to the Marines for bringing as many wrestlers as they could today," he added.

Although the Army team had three weeks preparation vice the Marines' five nights, the Marines defeated nine of the 19 Army opponents they faced. Additionally, the Marines won two out of the three matches with the Navy team from Pearl Harbor. The Marines did not register any matches against the Air Force's single entrant to the tournament.

Among the wrestlers who placed fourth in their weight classes were Tyson Buemi at 149.5 lbs, Robert Gojani at 163 lbs. and Jack Frazier at 193 lbs.

"Even though some of us have been away from wrestling for a long while, I feel the team will improve and do real well later in the season," said William Riley, a Marine who had not seriously wrestled for

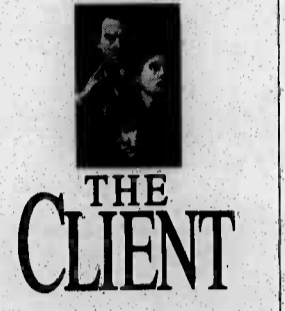

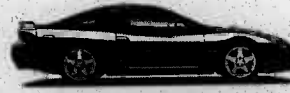
