

## NAGPRA decision to be made soon

Efforts to repatriate more than 3,200 human remains representing approximately 1,500 individuals as well as 251 funery objects removed from the Mokapu Peninsula over the past 75 years and currently curated at the Bishop Museum have taken a progressive step forward as the commanding general of Marine Corps Base Hawaii has decided to select an appropriate recipient from among the claimants to the remains and objects.

BGen. David F. Bice and Marine Corps

officials are working toward a prompt conclusion to the repatriation process so that the remains may be transferred to the most appropriate Native Hawaiian claimant.

The Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act was passed by Congress and signed into law by President Bush Nov. 16, 1990, to protect Native American (Native American Indian and Native Hawaiian) burial sites and repatriate those remains and objects in the possession of Federal agencies or museums which receive Federal funding.

## Electrical fire turns out lights on base

Black smoke seen by residents of Kailua recently brought both city, county and federal fire departments together to battle an electrical fire.

Dec. 7, from 9:07 to 9:55 a.m., the MCB Hawaii, Federal Fire Department, responded to a call to assist Kailua's Station #18 and Kaneohe's Station #17 during a transformer substation fire at Mokapu Drive and Iliwahi Loop, according to FFD official documents.

The fire, which temporarily knocked out power in the local area, could be contained by the other stations, but it immediately assessed the situation and

could not be properly extinguished began utilizing the foam. without the use of a foam agent, one of Moments later the fire was extin- The cause of the fire is still under inventory.

"The foam agent acts as a blanket which smothers the flames by taking away the oxygen. Water will only cool the area," said Robert Flores, FFD, MCB Hawaii, firefighter in charge at the scene.

Within minutes of the call, a fire truck from FFD Station #8 here arrived on the scene.

After making liaison with the two city and county units, Flores, along with fellow firefighters Paul Schrader, George Pedaken and Jason Montgomery,

FFD were on their way home with the satisfaction of helping their civilian counterparts.

"We (FFDs throughout the island) have a Mutual Aid Agreement with the city and county fire departments to give aid to those units requiring assistance," Flores said.

## **Enlisted monitors advise Marines about future**

A team of monitors from the Enlisted Assignment Branch (MMEA), Headquarters Marine Corps, conducted briefs here Monday and Tuesday providing Marines with necessary information to become competitive for promotion and retention.

For the first time, monitors accompanied career counselors on their Western Pacific trip, explained GySgt. Fred E. Daubenspeck, Operations Chief, Enlisted Retention Section. Though all military occupational specialties weren't represented at briefings around base, each major section was, he said.

"The monitor is the duty expert on where, as far as career progression, a Marine needs to be," Daubenspeck added.

One-on-one meetings, on the last stop of the WestPac trip, allowed Hawaii Marines to discuss assignments. "Just because a Marine wants to go somewhere," Daubenspeck explained, "doesn't mean that's the right assignment." The monitor can explain what is best for the Marines' careers to make them

more well-rounded, he added.

Another facet of the visit was the briefing and counseling sessions to help today's Marines keep up with the

"A lot of Marines are still going by what they knew ten years ago," MSgt. D. J. Powell, chief enlisted career counselor, pointed out. "Everything is changing. Right now, what the Marine Corps wants is the most competitive and qualified Marines to stay Marines. Promotions are not guaranteed," he

Briefing sessions were held for Marines at all levels and contained relevant facts.

"It gave me all the information I need if I want to go for first sergeant," said SSgt. Kenneth J. Ochoa, Base Ordnance, a career Marine. "I was looking at my master brief sheet to see if there's anything I can do to enhance my ability to get promoted," he explained.

Powell expressed the need for Marines to be pro-active in career-related matters. "Too many times we hear from Marines after the board has let out, wondering why they didn't get promot- 66XX Aviation Monitor, Headquarters Marine Corps.

ed," he said shaking his head.

Marines should attend the MMEA briefings and contact their career counselors 18 to 20 months prior to entering the eligibility zone, according to Powell. Toll-free numbers are listed in ALMAR 2-92/95, for Marines world-wide. From Hawaii, he said, Marines may call 1-800-833-2320.

"We only have the numbers to re-enlist a little over four thousand first-term Marines each year," Daubenspeck said, stressing the importance of attending and staying up-to-date on career matters. "We have an end-of-active service population of 20,000. So, only about one-fifth of all Marines eligible get to reenlist," he said.

## Gunner's course enhances Marine artillery gunnery skills; also teaches about billet responsibilities

CENTER, Twentynine Palms, Calif. - Because of the importance of artillery on the modern battlefield and the need for professional, skilled Marines to operate the "big guns," the Gunners' Course here was initiated to make basically-trained artillerymen more proficient.

After completing their formal school at Fort Sill, Okla., artillery Marines are capable of functioning within the nine-man crews needed to operate today's high-powered M198 medium towed howitzers. Marines selected for the course are chosen based on their performance with their gun crews and their potential for becoming section chiefs.

"The purpose of this course is to teach Marines how to be section chiefs," said 39-year old Birmingham, Ala., native MSgt. Charles Gaston, 3d Battalion, 11th Marines field artillery chief. "The Marines here are the best of their crews."

The week-long course is normally taught at Camp Pendleton, where all but one of 11th Marines' battalions are stationed. 3d Battalion is stationed here, and because of the amount of training activity involved with Combined Arms Exercises, is quite possibly the busiest.

"The gunners' school is at Camp Pendleton, but because of the time the Marines here spend in the field, we thought it would be important to make these Marines proficient," said 27-year old Gunners' Course instructor and Woodlake, Calif., native SSgt. Ricky A. Waddell. "Out of the four battalions in the regiment,

> We used to teach all the positions on the gun," Waddell said. "Now what we try to do is instruct the gunner and assistant-gunner positions. The gunner is the next most experienced Marine on a crew and actually gives the command to fire. The A-gunner lays the sights and is next in line behind the gunner and section chief. Teaching these billets is important because if

be able to take over the crew and hit the target, so the classes now involve target acquisition and round placement."

Marines learn sighting techniques using everything from a lensatic compass to a unique piece of equipment that joins a howitzer sight, and a small smoke round launcher with a tripod. The 14.5 trainer," as it's called, allows quick sight adjustments because of its small size and maneuverability.

"We can put more Marines through a practical appli-

cation exercise with the trainer than with the howitzer," Gaston said. "The gunner can actually see the direction of the tube and it simulates firing with a small smoke round."

"The Gunners' Course recognizes the top performers," said 41-year old Detroiter LtCol. John E. Kruse, battalion commander, 3/11. "It shows the Marines we expect them to be leaders although they may not have had formal schooling since Fort Sill. They need to be proficient and because we always fire live, we can't have a bad day." (LCpl. C.J. Young)

#### Code talkers receive memorial 50 years after war

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION, Yuma, Ariz. - Because of their performance during World War II, Navajo code talkers have been afforded legendary status in the annals of military history.

"Were it not for the Navajos, we would never have taken Iwo Jima," claimed Maj. Howard Connor, signals officer, 5th Marine Division, after the invasion of Iwo Jima. Those words were echoed by Col. Bill Hansen, commanding officer, MCAS Yuma, as he spoke to a crowd of thousands gathered in Flagstaff on Veterans Day to dedicate a memorial to the Navajo Code Talkers of WW II. During WWII, more than 25,000 Native Americans served in the U.S. armed forces in every region and on every front. Among the best known were the Navajo Code Talkers, who served

in the Marine Corps during the Pacific Campaign. 32 Navajos were originally enlisted for service with the top secret mission of developing a code system which could not be broken by the Japanese.

The code talkers devised a list of 274 original words in Navajo which would be used in transmitting critical American messages on the battlefield. All Navajos served with rifle companies and committed the code to memory. Many became decorated heroes in the South Pacific and some continued to serve through Korea and even Vietnam. More than 400 Navajos became code talkers for the Marine Corps during WWII.

"We were just trying to serve our country," said Carl. N. Gorman, one of the original code talkers. "We didn't think it would be right to just stay home while others were giving their lives."

50 years after the end of WWII, the monument was finally put into place at Northern Arizona University, in the heart of the Navajo region. The sculpture, which is the bust of Gorman, was created by his son, Native American artist R.C.

Albert Hale, president of the Navajo Nation, addressed the crowd gathered on the crisp fall day, speaking of the honor and loyalty the Navajos have continually shown, throughout their history.

"It is with great pride I call myself a Navajo," Hale said. "The Navajo Marines with us today, and those who are not, have made the ultimate sacrifices for the Navajo Nation and the United States." (1stLt. John Connors).

## TQL program should be integrated in daily leadership

ome people here think Total Quality Leadership is a cumbersome new program which will take vears to implement, while others argue TQL is basic Marine Corps leadership, crafted in a different

Whatever our personal views are, philosophical arguments are feckless; it's time to roll up our shirt sleeves and get TQL to work.

Implementing TQL seems tough because of the investment in time and training required before process improvement can begin. This will always appear so until leaders infuse TQL into daily operations instead of viewing it as a separate program. Solid improvements are possible by using some of its basic tenets in the processes we control today. This year's fiscal closeout is just such a process where the right combination of people, dedication and TQL principles were integrated for success.

The accounting section controls the process of documenting and accounting for funds. They assisted fund

administrators throughout the command by researching documents, tracking valid obligations, and coordinating with external customers. Everybody documented their part of the process to define functional lines, confirm the division of duties, and identify inefficiencies in the system, while executing normal closeout procedures. The idea was to fold process improvement into the normal duties performed.

The budget section, which executes transactions in accordance with the commander's financial priorities, tracked all the funds which entered and left the command and monitored the funds in more than 45 different accounts. The biggest cost for MCB Hawaii is civilian labor, with 500 employees and \$20 million. During the last two weeks of the year, payroll tracked labor costs to the penny by manually keying timecards. The budget section built quality into the process with individual dedication, not redundant inspections.

Total Quality Leadership professes that empowering employees to find better ways to do business is an incredible tool in process improvement. Our best ideas for process improvement came from the stakeand a lack of communication that increased our error rate. When the supervisors charged the workers with improving the processes, and they felt they owned the department, creativity and innovation abounded. We focused this year on how we actually did business as well as what we accomplished. Results are important, but if an organization focuses on process improvement through empowering employees, performance will follow.

We learned how our mission supports the strategic plan for MCB Hawaii. In August, the commanding general prioritized his funding deficiencies based on his strategic goals of enhancing military readiness, increasing risk management and loss prevention, improving the quality of life, and improving the infrastructure. Year-end funding supported these priorities with money applied to facilities repair, communcation upgrades, environmental funding, messhall improvements, and barracks furniture purchases. The command started the year with \$33.79 million and realized a 63 percent increase to finish with \$54.95 million. In September alone, MCB

holders who found redundancies in record-keeping Hawaii quickly spent over \$8 million because we understood the commander's vision and our mission supported it.

> Even though MCB Hawaii finished with a fund obligation of 99.95 percent, this year's closeout wasn't about money, obligations, or authorizations; it was about people working hard to improve a process. During closeout the staff identified more than 30 actions we can implement throughout next year to improve. What did we learn in addition to these

 An organization must incorporate TQL process improvement into daily work instead of viewing it as a separate program.

 Workers must experience a paradigm shift; view what we do as a continually changing process instead of individual events, each with a start and finish.


•What we do as a department should directly support the MCB Hawaii mission.

Is TQL the old style of leadership restated, or a new way of doing business? We'll leave that question for the philosophers at the club on Friday. As for us, actions speak louder than words.



## CCU offers chance to save first termer's career

Servicemembers who stray from the straight path, now have a chance to keep from ruining their career options by accepting this disciplinary action.

For servicemembers on their first enlistment who have made mistakes that could jeopardize their continued service, the Correctional Custody Unit offers a second chance.

Located at Ford Island in Pearl Harbor, the unit's program, for lance corporals and below, was developed to give those deserving a second chance the opportunity to have a successful career in the military.

"It's important for commands to get them in to the program as soon as possible," said Navy Lt. Cmdr. James Michaelis, commanding officer, Naval Brig, Ford Island.

"Usually when a young kid comes into the service and develops some disciplinary problems, it's because he falls in with a bad crowd. But if you can get their attention early in their career, you can get them back on track."

A Marine has to be awarded the opportunity to go to CCU by a field-grade officer or higher during non-judicial punishment at battalion office hours."

The unit, which re-opened due to command policy change, boasts a 77 percent success rate for individuals who complete the program and do not become repeat offenders.

"It took us approximately 60 days to train the necessary staff set up the facility from the time we got our orders to open the unit," said Michaelis.

The facility, capable of handling 50 awardees at one time, currently holds seven male servicemembers. Female servicemembers are ineligi-

ble for the program due to lack of female staff, according to the 42-year-old Michaelis.

Awardees can be sent to the facility from seven to 30 days, but according to Michaelis seven days is not enough time for the program to work.

"Any thing less than 30 days is counter-productive. There are two days of in-processing and two days of out-processing," explained Michaelis, of New Castle, Wyo. "If the person is sent for only seven days, they can't learn anything."

The most common error people make is thinking CCU is the same thing as the brig, Michaelis said.

The only similarity they share is the same building, and the only time awardees of CCU and the detainees and confinees of the brig see each other is during in- and out-processing and chow, since they all eat at the same dining facility, said Michaelis.

Positive reinforcement is a large factor of the rehabilitation process. Staff members note the awardees' behavior and motivational level on a daily work and training report, which is used to record their progress. Staying positive can translate into a five-day early release.

If awardees refuse to adhere to requirements given to them, their records will reflect it, which can cause individuals to be sent back to their commands for alternate disciplinary action.

"Servicemembers are sent here on Temporarily Assigned Duty orders and if they choose not to participate in the program, they are sent back to their command and more than likely they end up on the other side of the building (the brig)," said Michaelis.

The program is designed like basic training — each awardee's day is structured and thoroughly supervised, and personnel assigned to the CCU staff are developed professionally. Along with correctional training, they attend an additional two weeks of instruction in motivational training.

Awardees spend their days completing a variety of tasks, such as working parties, military correspondence courses and preparing uniforms for inspection. The main tool for their rehabilitation is various group and individual counseling sessions, according to Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Sean Martin, CCU counselor.

"Each awardee receives individual

We discuss goals and what they plan on achieving when they get back to their commands," explained Martin.

Martin.

As a part of the program's followup procedure, Martin remains in
contact with the individuals up to
six months after they return to

their command.

Since April 1995, more than 70 servicemembers have successfully completed the program.

The counselors' dedication to awardees is evident from the schedule they keep. Counselors are awake at 4 a.m. and don't leave until well after the awardees are sent to the rack.

"One of the most rewarding parts of the program is seeing these individuals succeed by being promoted and receiving some sort of command or service award," said Martin, a 28-year-old native of Hawaii.

The Ford Island CCU, and its counterparts at other installations, is a minimum-security facility. There are no bars on the windows, and in the evening the awardees are given free-time, which gives them the opportunity to watch the news or a movie on TV and write letters.

"The program benefits us all. If we can get an awardee to finish his contract honorably, we taxpayers are getting our money's worth." explained Michaelis.

According to the Marine Corps Separations Manual, anyone completing a successful tour of CCU is capable of receiving an honorable discharge with the proper proficiency and conduct marks upon separation, said Maj. Paul Pugliese, a 33-year-old Staten Island, N.Y. native, and a prosecutor for the Base Legal Office, MCB Hawaii.

Not very many people get a second chance at anything in life, but the staff at CCU make it possible for those who make a simple mistake to learn from it and complete their obligated honorable service.

## Former Marine recounts prison term and lessons learned

Iwakuni, Japan - For most people, and a half years in Okinawa's brig, for- sonal hygiene kit. the horror of going to prison is unimaginable; an experience reserved only for people who have committed their separation from society.

However, for Pvt. Angel L. Torresseise, a former Headquarters. and Headquarters Squadron motor transport operator here, that fear became reality July 18, 1993.

Following an evening of drinking, Torresseise took his roommate's knife and stabbed two of his friends over an argument the three Marines had.

"I don't remember much about that evening, however, I do remember waking up confused and a little frightened in the brig here," recalled Torresseise, a native of Puerto Rico.

However, it was only the beginning of his nightmare. Because neither of the Marines died, he was not charged with murder. However, he was sent to the brig here to await trial for his crimes.

After spending seven months in the brig here, Torresseise went to trial. He was convicted of two counts of aggravated assault and three lesser

feiture of all pay and allowances, and a bad-conduct discharge.

"By that time, the sentence didn't crimes significant enough to warrant have a lot of impact on me, because I had already spent so much time in jail," Torresseise said. However, the following year in Okinawa's brig was more difficult than expected.

> Because of the severity of the charges against him, Torresseise spent his first day in maximum custody. Soon, he was moved to medium control, where he spent three months.

> "We weren't allowed to have anything. I couldn't have a watch, portable cassette player, or anything like that," he said.

> Torresseise spent his days in a cell, alone, with minimal communication with other prisoners. Although he was authorized an occassional phone call, the calls, like all mail going in and out of the prison, were monitored.

prison," Torresseise said.

Months later, Torresseise was moved to minimum level, called "installation custody." There, he was allowed a few

Torresseise clearly remembers the time he spent at all security levels. "The worst part was the walls — they made you a little crazy. Sometimes you feel lonely, and think you have nobody and no life," he recalled.

"On the outside, you can walk around and talk to people, but on the inside, you're unable to talk, you're only around walls and you begin to feel like you're a part of them," he added.

Torresseise was released from the Okinawa brig after a 12-month stay because of good conduct time. But even when it was time for his release, he didn't feel normal. Everything he went through changed his life.

Torresseise returned to Puerto Rico Feb. 9, with new ambitions to study political science. However, he had one final message to pass to Marines throughout the Corps.

"People don't realize how much they "There's no such thing as privacy in a can lose; how much time, how much mind, how many feelings, and how much suffering losing those things brings. Trying to act macho and doing crazy things won't get you anywhere.'



encouraged them not to be afraid to take the ball away. The whine of turbine engines called some volunteers away from dribbling a basketball, and pushed others to more discussions of various topics.

As the whooping rotor blades lifted the Marines into the sky, students lined the basketball court's fence and classroom's windows to wave goodbye to their new friends who came to them with kindness and words




#### Parade of lights

## Think before driving this holiday season

In case you haven't heard, the state of Hawaii recently adopted the .08% Blood Alcohol Concentration. What is .08% BAC? A .08% BAC state statute makes it illegal to drive, or be in control of a motor vehicle, with a blood alcohol concentration of .08% or above.

The act of driving at or above .08% BAC constitutes a violation of the law in and of itself, regardless of whether the person exhibits signs of intoxication . - such as slurred speech and irregular driving - or not. Since the statute specifies it is illegal to drive under that condition per se, this type of law is known as an "illegal per se law." Most industrialized nations, such as Canada, Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand and the Scandinavian countries, have set illegal BACs of .08% or lower. As of March 1995, 11 states have an "illegal per se" law at the .08% BAC level. Thirty-seven states and the District of Columbia have illegal per se laws at .10% BAC; two states and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico have no "illegal per se" law.

Here is an example of how the law works: usually, a law enforcement officer observes a driving violation and has an "articulable suspicion" the driver is impaired. The officer then stops the vehicle and follows procedures to determine if

there is "probable cause" an offense has been committed. This may involve use of a passive breath sensor and other sobriety tests. If the officer determines there is probable cause, the driver may then be asked to submit to chemical tests in order to determine BAC. If the tests show a BAC of .08% or more, or if the person refuses to take the tests, then he or she is arrested for DUI/DWI and convicted by a court of law if found guilty. A slightly different procedure applies in states with administrative license revocation laws. Such laws also define what administrative, rather than judicial, penalty will be imposed.

Why is .08% BAC necessary? Several recent studies conclude virtually all drinkers have some impairment in critical driving tasks with a blood alcohol of .08% BAC. Other research shows the higher the BAC, especially above .08%, the greater the risk of involvement in a motor vehicle crash. These studies provide a clear prevention-based argument for lower BAC standards.

By lowering the illegal per se level to .08% BAC, states expand the universe of "arrestable" drivers and create a stronger deterrence for impaired driving by setting tougher standards. The .08% BAC "illegal per se" laws also increase the probability of conviction, because the definition of "impaired" is much more specific and easier to prove than it is under other DUI/DWI laws.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration is conducting an analysis of five states that have had .08 BAC legislation since at least 1990. Preliminary results show significant decreases in alcohol-related fatalities in four of the five states on nine different measures. There is also evidence .08% was at least partially responsible for a 12 percent reduction in alcoholrelated fatalities experienced during the year after .08% went into effect in California. There is evidence, from analysis of Maine's fatal crashes, a 19 percent decline in fatal nighttime crashes occurred in the three years after .08% went into effect, compared to only a 3 percent decline for the same period in the control states of New Hampshire and Vermont.

In the United States, someone dies in an alcohol-related crash every 30 minutes. Every two minutes, someone is injured. Resolve to be responsible this holiday season. Take a stand against impaired driving. Plan ahead, take a cab, designate a non-drinking driver, call friends for rides or drink at home.

If you are planning on having a holiday party, plan on being a responsible host. Offer your guests a choice of drinks, not just alcohol. Serve various types of juices, non-alcoholic punches and cocktails, tea, coffee and soft drinks.

Be creative! The following are some suggestions to get you started:

Citrus Collins

Fill 10-12 oz. glass with ice cubes

2 oz. orange juice 1 oz. lemon juice simple syrup. 1 oz.

Fill with club soda. Garnish with an orange

slice or a cherry. Mai Tai

1/2 cup pineapple juice 1/4 cup orange juice club soda 1/4 cup 1 tblp. cream of coconut 1 tbsp. grenadine syvup

# Past is remembered with blessings for those killed at K-Bay

Members of the Military Police Department held colors at the flagpole across from building 215 here Thursday morning, to honor those killed during the Dec. 7, 1941 Japanese attack on Naval Air Station, Kaneohe Bay.

In remembrance of the 18 sailors and one civilian who died defending what is now Marine Corps Base Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, the flag was lowered to half mast. Color guard members then laid a wreath at the Klipper Memorial as members of the military community looked on.

Later in the day, World Federation Japan Religious 21st Century Committee members conducted graveside memorial services at the monument to Japanese pilot Lt. Fusata Iida and the Klipper Memorial. Iida was shot down over the air station, and his plane crashed at the site where the memorial now rests, near Kansas Tower.

These ceremonies, conducted for the past 14 years, not only honored Japanese killed Dec. 7, but also Americans.

Shinto, Catholic, and Buddhist priests performed rituals unique to each religion. At each site, fruit was left, rice was sprinkled and sake was poured as offerings for souls of the deceased.


