# Underage Community drinkers beware

Hawaii legislature passed a bill last year outlining stricter guidelines for those under 21 who are driving after consuming any measurable amount of alcohol.

The law, which went into effect Dec. 1, states anyone under 21 who is pulled over and found to have a blood-alcohol content .02 percent or higher will be arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol, said Ken Morifuji, the director of the Substance Abuse Control Center here.

"I'm glad the state has done this," said Morifuji, who was born and raised in Hawaii. "A message needs to be sent if you have consumed any alcohol, you shouldn't get behind a steering wheel - especially to military members. We are losing too many Marines and Sailors to alcohol-related acci-

The target group for this new law on base are young Marines and Sailors, Morifuji said. Last year, there were 79 DUIs reported on base. Sixty-two of those were Marines, corporal and below.

"This is the strongest message if you are under the age of 21 and consumed even one or two 12-ounce beers, if you drive within the hour you will test .02," Morifuji said.

Penalties under this law include up to 36 hours of community service, a fine of up to \$500 and up to 180-day license suspension for a first-time offender.

"In addition to answering to local authorities, servicemembers charged with a DUI off-base will also be subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice," said Morifuji. "Most guys get 45 days confinement, 45 days restriction, loss of pay and rank for drunk driving."

Marines and Sailors remembered and honored a Marine hero at base headquarters by finding his memorabilia a new home Jan. 16.

Maj. Stephen W. Pless' medals were moved from a deteriorating, dusty display case into a brand new case built by Waterfront Operations Sailors.

"The old case was obviously in bad condition," said Chief Warrant Officer 4 Donald Harvey, the officer in charge of Waterfront Ops. "We asked SgtMaj. (Royce) Coffee (base sergeant major) if we could work on it and take it down to our workplace."

# MLK Day a time to remember: 'A Day On, Not a Day Off!'

Marines, Sailors, DoD civilians and family members spent Friday morning at a breakfast honoring the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

But it wasn't just a celebration of the man's work for humanity. The ceremony served as a reminder to participants to continue the work King began.

Army Capt. Charles E. Smith, senior chaplain at Tripler Army Medical Center, paralleled King's "journey" with that of Moses.

"He said 'Free them, according to the Constitution," Smith said, "just as Moses told the pharoahs to free God's children." God was a significant part of King's life - he was a pastor and of the service. Mamie Shaw rendered a soprano edition of "The Lord's Prayer," and the Good News Ensemble sang "What if God is Unhappy." Smith, the guest speaker, then spoke of King doing God's work. "When King was asked how he

wished to be remembered," Smith said, "he said he wanted to be remembered as a drum major for peace and justice, and that he tried to help somebody.

"He heard God's voice tell him 'Stand up for justice. Stand up for what's right," Smith contin-

One lesson of King's work, lar works." Smith said, is apparent in what he did after he won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964.

"We can learn not to let material recognition take our eyes off the prize, and in King's case," Smith said, "the prize was freedom, justice and righteousness. Some viewed King's assassination as your lot in life if you champion peace and justice. It took courage to stand for righteousness the way he did."

Smith also recalled an uncanny parallel between the 1860s and 1960s. In the 1860s came freedom from slavery, Smith said; while in the 1960s came the beginning of freedom from oppression of minorities.

Along with societal evolution, the military changed as well,

noted BGen. David F. Bice, the commanding general of MCB Hawaii.

"We must remember, as members of the military, what we all stand for," BGen. Bice said. "We stand for freedom, justice and equality, the same tenets which drove Dr. King to such spectacu-

Smith ended with a personal story of King's visit to Memphis, Smith's hometown, during the garbageworker's strike of 1968.

"I remember the police had dogs named 'Spook' and "Spade,' and these dogs were trained to attack blacks only," he said. "I remember when King came to Memphis, and was warned 'The white people up here don't play.'

"There was a riot when he came," Smith continued, "and to calm things down, he left. But he came back, because his work was unfinished. That's when he was killed."

Smith paused before going on. "When I remember, I feel the pain, but in that pain I can celebrate that God is still working to make this a new world."





CAMP DOHA, Kuwait -After three months at sea, the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit (Special Operations Capable) brought its full Marine Air/Ground Task Force power to bear in Exercise Eager Mace 98-1. The 13th MEU(SOC) finished more than 25 days of training in different parts of Kuwait.

The focus of Eager Mace was to improve bilateral interoperability between Kuwait and U.S. forces and to refine complementary warfighting capabilities for coalition warfare. It gave the 13th MEU(SOC) an opportunity to exercise all of its weapons systems in a live fire environment. This was the largest exercise the 13th MEU(SOC) will participate in during its six-month deploy-

After coming ashore Dec. 2, Marines and Sailors of the 13th MEU(SOC) took up positions at Camp Doha, Ali Al Salem Air Base, Udairi Training Range and other areas near the Iraqi border.

The majority of the exercise was conducted less than 20 miles from the Iraqi border at the Udairi Training Range. The base camp at the range was constructed over remnants of an old U.S. Army camp with engineers from Battalion Landing Team 1/1 and MEU Service Support Group-13 transforming the site into a virtual city that sustained more than 1,400 Marines and Sailors for the duration of the



I saw several units running along the same quiet roads, none of which sang cadence. Marines running without cadence would seem completely out of place had I not heard of all the phone calls from "family members" complaining about previous units running by their homes chanting.

I continued my run out of housing, past McDonalds and down Mokapu. When I ran past the 3d Marine Regiment area, I looked to the left and what did I see? A squad of Marines running through barracks chanting as

loud as they could. "Wake 'em up!! Get out of the rack!!"

The Marines were all singing, and they sounded like a formation of Marines running should sound like.

Then I thought, "Why is it all right to wake up Marines with early-morning motivation, but get within a quarter mile of housing and mum's the

Don't Marines need sleep as much as family members? Apparently not. Or maybe Marines should already be up at 5:30 a.m.? What about the Marines who work odd shifts and sleep during the day? What do they do?

They don't go crying to their first sergeant and say, "You have to tell them to stop. I'm not getting my full eight hours of sleep."

No. They suck it up.

I'm not proposing we stop singing cadence everywhere on base. I think family members need to suck it up and stop complaining about Marines doing Marine things on a Marine base.

Singing cadence is motivating. Maybe I'm a little too motivated, but when I wake up to the sound of "my Marine Corps Color is gold," I'm proud to be where I'm at. I think of how great it is to be part of the Marine Corps and all it stands for. I don't make a few phone calls to shut people up.

With the recent visit of Gen. Krulak and other dignitaries, I've been hearing a lot about family members being part of the Marine Corps team

- not just a part, but an impor-

tant part.

I'm wondering if these people who make the complaints understand the impact they can have.

I know when I'm running in formation and have to stop singing

because of late-sleeping residents, my motivation falters. Now I'm just running with a group of people. The esprit de corps isn't the same.

I'm sure I'm not the only one who feels it, and for some, I'm sure it skews their image of the Marine Corps. It may be a minor thing, but it can have rippling effects.

# Reservists take Sea Stallions to West Coast facility

every 60 days in order to rack up the approximate 500 training hours needed to become certified in their job. Training usually lasts about one year and costs about \$14,350 per hour for each student.

"Eventually these airmen will be on a six-man crew consisting of two pilots, two engineers, and two loadmasters," said Villagomez.

# Hawaii police crack down on DoD decal placement


Decals mounted over vehicle identification numbers pose problems for drivers.

Police officers around Oahu have begun cracking down on DoD personnel who aren't placing DoD decals in the top center of their windshields.

Centering the decal in the top of the windshield is a Hawaii state law. Several military personnel have been failed at safety checks and others have been ordered to have it changed by officers in town because it's not in the correct location, according to Sgt. Scott E. Elick, the staff noncommissioned officer in charge of the Military Police Department's Pass House here.

"If the military member has the decal in the left lower corner, officers have difficulty reading the vehicle identification number while issuing citations or reporting abandoned vehicles," said Elick. "And the officers are restricted from removing them because they are government property."

The Military Police Department here has requested to the state to have the law concerning placement of the DoD vehicle modified to allow placement of the decal in the lower left corner of a vehicle's windshield, but not blocking the vehicle identi-

"I think it's good that military personnel are supposed to put the decals in the top," said Cpl. Michael R. Brown, a patrolman with MPD who spends a lot of time waving through vehicles progress of MPD's request.

Seven base realignment and closure construction projects are well underway and two more are to be awarded as MCB Hawaii gets an approximate \$72 million addition.

The projects, which began July 10. are preparing the base for relocation of seven aircraft squadrons and approximately 2,200 active-duty and civilian personnel from the closure of Naval Air Station Barbers Point.

"We will begin moving our personnel in as soon as construction is complete," said Jim Plasse, the BRAC officer for NAS Barbers Point. There will be no change in the size of our squadrons, just realignment to another location."

The base is taking on six P-3 Orion and one H-60 Sea Hawk squadrons.

"There are no definite dates set for construction completion. Contract dates were set, however, delays in the projects due to unexpected interruptions may push the dates back.

"The projects currently underway are all part of one contract called the BRAC Consolidation Projects," said Navy Lt. Lance Elding, the assistant officer-in-charge of construction

here. "The contract date for these is Sept. 30."

These projects include construction of Naval Operations Training, Tactical Support, Hazardous Materials/Waste, Aviation Supply Aviation Intermediate Maintenance Department Facilities

and upgrading three hangars. "We have another project that was started in March," said Elding. "They are expected to be finished by January 1999."

These projects include a new 23-acre apron to hold 20 P-3 Orion planes and upgrading aircraft wash and rinse facilities, according to Elding.

Two other projects expected to be awarded to contractors soon include ordnance facilities near the Hale Koa Beach facilities and utility upgrades in the 1st Street area. This will

mainly consist of improving sewer and electrical lines.

These projects are expected to be completed by January 1999 as well.

"This whole deal is good for Navy and the Marine Corps," said Elding. "It adds strength to the overall capabilities of this base. The more operations commitments it has, the less chance we have of getting closed down due to downsizing."





# 'Mighty Mo' to return

EARL HARBOR - Just as the USS Arizona Memorial here has a subtle but powerful meaning for visitors, the scheduled arrival of the USS Missouri, May 8, will make a different but equally powerful impact.

The Arizona Memorial signifies the beginning of World War II for the United States, while aboard the USS Missouri Sept. 2, 1945, the unconditional surrender of Japan was signed, bringing an end to the

"The completion of the preliminary concept and design for the memorial is a major milestone in the vision to create and establish a fitting memorial to the people and historic events reflecting our nation's

legacy of duty, honor, strength, resolve and sacrifice," said Edwin Carter, the chairman of the Missouri Memorial Association. "We are extremely pleased with this master plan because it transforms the USS. Missouri into a museum without undermining the integrity and dignity of the battleship."

The memorial's theme will be "A New Era in the Pacific," and covers the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, 1941, to the Japanese surrender onboard the Missouri and will be presented through historical and educational themes, banners and other design techniques, according to Carter.

"Without being in the actual surrender ceremony, I had the best view of the sequence of events which transpired that day," said Henry A. Walker, who was a lieutenant junior grade serving as a communications officer on the USS Missouri during the surrender. "Everyone else was at attention and in their quarters during the ceremony and being a communications officer, I took a headset to the upper level and leaned over the the shielding to watch.'

Pearl Harbor is the proper retirement home for the USS Missouri, Walker said, and regarding the question of whether would it detract from the USS Arizona Memorial, he feels the memorials will complement each other.

"I have been on the USS Arizona Memorial countless times and I feel it is a sad and somber occasion where all you can think about is all the men who are down inside of her," Walker said. "I could envision looking up and seeing the USS Missouri moored in all her grand splendor, a magnificent ship, being very uplifting and very fitting."

Even though the USS Missouri is scheduled to arrive in May, it will not be moved to its permanent site for another three years. Instead the "Mighty Mo" will be berthed at piers F-2 and 3. After three years it will be moored at the most seaward end of Battleship Row, where the USS California was on Dec. 7, 1941.


"It's a good start," Teasdell agreed, "but we're trying to make it to the championship, so we need to get a few bugs out."



# Movie Review

# Looking for Good Will Hunting

nyone who thinks
"Generation X" is solely a generation of slackers and malcontents needs to see "Good Will Hunting." Written by 20-somethings and co-stars Ben Affleck and Matt Damon, this story of a troubled young genius is one of the smartest films I've seen in a very long time.

The story revolves around Damon's title character, a mathematical whiz with a photographic memory who works as a janitor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Will appears to be content to hang out with his blue-collar buddies, drinking and fighting his life (and considerable talent) away. That all starts to change when another math wizard, this one a teacher at MIT, recognizes his considerable talent and endeavors to help the troubled 20-year old.

I was very pleased with the realistic and compassionate way Affleck and Damon's script revealed bits and pieces of Will's character. They are in no hurry to reveal Will's considerable internal conflicts rather, they let the story develop a life of its own. I've seen too many movies which force the story along — "Good Will Hunting" is not one of them.

Another thing this film has going for it is a very strong cast. Stellan Skaarsgard (anybody besides me see "Wind?") is the MIT math teacher who sees something of himself in Will. You alternately admire and despise him as his motivations become suspect.

Robin Williams turns in yet another Oscar-contending performance as an analyst called upon to try and get through to Will and help him realize his potential. His own troubled life comes into play as he tries to help Will salvage his. The interaction between Williams and Damon is one of the most gritty, touching, and heart-

warming aspects of the film.

Minnie Driver, this year's hottest young female actor, actually gets to speak with her

native English accent in this film (those of you who saw "Grosse Point Blank" will know she can turn that accent on and off seemingly at whim) as she turns in an emotionally-charged performance as a Harvard pre-med student who catches Will's eye.

Ben Affleck, who starred in the Gen X favorite "Chasing Amy," turns in a surprisingly mature performance as Chuck, Will's lifelong best friend. His character is smartly written, and even more smartly delivered (as well it should be — he co-wrote the story).

Lastly, Matt Damon, who impressed me in '97's "The Rainmaker," turns in the finest performance of his young career. As you follow Will through the bars of South Boston, into trouble with the law and then the office of ther-

apist Williams, you get to know him a little at a time—and the more you know Will, the more you find yourself pulling for him. His emotional highs and lows find you alternately cheering or aching with him. Damon's portrayal of Will is so smart, in fact, that each of us can find a bit of ourselves in Will, so when we cheer for him, we're cheering ourselves as well.

"Good Will Hunting" is a fine film, one of the best I've seen in quite some time, and I certainly hope it gets some recognition. Oscar nods, especially for Best Original Screenplay and Best Supporting Actor (Williams) would be more than appropriate. This film also gives me a sense of optimism about this new generation of filmmakers if Affleck and Damon can turn out such a powerful film, there's hope for Hollywood yet.



# Aerobics: a high-stepping alternative for health

hen most people think of physical training, they might think of the daily seven and a three-mile run.

However, sticking to a consistent aerobics plan offered by the base gym may break the mold of normal PT and

keep most anyone fit and trim.

"Aerobics improves cardiovascular conditioning and is a good way to burn calories," said fitness coordinator Lynn Sanchez. "It increases energy levels and reduces stress levels. It is great exercise, fun, energetic. Everyone has a different goal for exercise, but aerobics has benefits for all types."

Aerobics is a good way to help build one's physical fitness test score, according to David Haight, a Semper Fit aerobics instructor here.

"The cardiovascular and endurance-building advantages of aerobics, when done in conjunction with running, will cut time off the run score," Haight said. "The strength conditioning helps decrease body-fat percentage and helps build your pull-up score."

One who can testify to the benefits of aerobics is HM1 David Jones, a corpsman with Headquarters Company 3d Marine Regiment.

"I'll tell you what aerobics has done for me," said Jones, who has been an aerobics student here four years. "It's taken several minutes.off my Navy and Marine Corps PFT runs. Over four years I've built up muscle and stayed about 18 pounds trimmer."

Haight advised people interested in starting aerobic training to take different kinds of classes when they begin and decide if aerobics is for them.

"Try the low impact, the high/low impact, the step, the power and the conditioning courses, and monitor your progress for a month," Haight said. "Thirty minutes of high/low impact, I would say, is equal to a four mile

"I think one of the awesome things about aerobics," Haight added, "is it gives people a variety of exercises to do, which keeps it fun."

Any active duty Marines and family members are eligible to take the classes and the base gym offers various times to fit into busy schedules.

Fees for individual classes are 50 cents for active duty and \$2.50 for dependents with military identification. A monthly plan is also available — \$10 for active duty and \$25 for dependents.

Instructor selection is based on an individual's knowledge of safety and choreography of high-impact, step and power aerobics, according to Sanchez.



# Pro Bowl plays by a different set of rules

Some NFL rules are modified for the Pro Bowl contest. Here's a few of the rule changes in effect for the all-star game.

• Offenses are not allowed to put receivers in motion prior to the snap of the ball and must use a tight end.

• Three receivers cannot line up on the same side of the field.

• Intentional grounding will not be called when a quarterback throws the ball toward the line of

scrimmage to avoid a sack.

• Defenses must use a 4-3 alignment.

• Defensive backs playing man-to-man cannot use bump-and-run coverage except when the ball is inside the 5-yard line.

• Blitzing by outside linebackers is allowed only in short yardage and goal line situations.

 Six players are permitted to rush a punter and seven a kicker on field goal and PAT attempts.

# AFC wins '97 thriller

The AFC used a recipe of big-play offense, opportunistic defense and a dash of luck in winning the 1997 Pro Bowl, 26-23. in overtime.

After a relatively uneventful first half, the teams produced one of the most entertaining games in recent years.

Both squads traded touchdowns in the third quarter before Cincinnati cornerback Ashley Ambrose returned an interception for a score and a 16-15 lead for the AFC. The NFC responded with Minnesota's Cris Carter hauling in a 53-yard scoring pass

The Jaguar quarterback miraculously escaped the grasp of Minnesota's John Randle and launched a 43-yard bomb to New England tight end Ben Coates. Three plays later, Indianapolis kicker Cary Blanchard connected from 37 yards out to give the AFC the victo-

ry.
The teams combined to rack up a Pro Bowlrecord 962 yards in offense.

# **History favors** Pack in game vs. Broncos

uper Bowl XXXII can best be summed up as a tale of two franchises.

For the Green Bay Packers, NFL championship games have marked the best of times. For the Denver Broncos, the league's premier event has been nothing but the worst of times.

The Packers' history book contains images of Vince Lombardi, Bart Starr and Brett Favre holding the Super Bowl trophy above their heads in triumph. Bronco faithful recall past title games with Dan Reeves, Craig Morton and John Elway hanging their heads in despair.

Green Bay returns to the Big Game Sunday in hopes of defending its world title and adding a fourth Lombardi Trophy to its growing collection. Denver makes its first Super Bowl appearance in nine years and will try to avoid becoming the first franchise to

lose five title games. Green Bay is 3-0 in Super Bowls, the latest victory coming last year against New England, 35-21. Denver is 0-4, having lost its games by a combined score of 163-50.

Many of the oddsmakers predict a Green Bay blowout, with the Packers opening as two touchdown favorites.

But the game isn't played on paper or in a Las Vegas betting parlor. The Broncos have enough weapons to play with the defend-ing champs, but whether they have the game plan and the fortune to halt the AFC's 13-year drought in the Super Bowl may be the key to the contest.


The following is a closer look at Sunday's matchups.

The quarterbacks: Brett Favre vs. John Elway

Two of the league's best players enter the game at opposite ends of the career spectrum.

At 28, Favre appears to be reaching his peak. His mobility, arm strength and vision appear to have him destined for a Hall of Fame career. Elway has also



turned in a sterling 15-year career, but Favre has something the Bronco signal-caller craves: a Super Bowl ring.

Elway still possess one of the strongest arms in the league and football fans would be hard-pressed to find a smarter quarterback around. But at age 37, Elway may be looking at his final shot at the NFL's ultimate prize.

The running backs: Dorsey Levens vs. Terrell Davis

Unlike previous Denver teams that got whacked in the Super Bowl, these Broncos have a legitimate big-time back in Davis. The sixth-round draft choice back in 1995 finished second in the NFL in rushing this season with 1,750 yards. He battled injuries down the stretch and his health will be a key.

Injured Green Bay back Edgar

Injured Green Bay back Edgar Bennett may suffer from Wally Pipp syndrome next season. Like the Yankee first baseman who was replaced by Lou Gehrig, Bennett may have a hard time getting his job back after Levens posted a 1,435yard season. Levens is a big back with nimble feet who can go the distance.

Green Bay offensive line vs. Denver front seven

The Packer offense starts

with a line that averages 302 pounds from tackle to tackle. Ross Verba and Earl Dotson line up at the tackle spots for Green Bay and will need to keep Alfred Williams and Neil Smith out of Favre's face.

Favre dropped back to pass 538 times during the regular season and went to the ground just 25 times. For Denver's defense to succeed, the Broncos must introduce Favre to the Qualcomm Stadium turf.

Keeping Elway clean will be a key to the Broncos fortunes Sunday. The Broncos' line must contain Reggie White, the greatest sack man in the history of the game.

But the battle to watch may be in the middle, where Denver's David Dias-Infante, Brian Habib and Tom Nalen must root the Packers' Gilbert Brown and Santana Dotson out of the middle to open holes for Davis. If Denver

Green Bay receivers vs.
Denver secondary

The Packers' offense thrived through the air this season, with wide receivers Antonio Freeman and Robert Brooks seeing a lot of action. Both have speed to go deep, as well as turn a short slant into a 60-yard touchdown.

The Denver secondary gave up 167 passing yards per game this season and features free safety Steve Atwater, who's still one of the game's hardest hitters. Veteran cornerback Ray Crocket is solid, and Darrien Gordon, who was picked on by opposing

offenses earlier this season, improved greatly down the stretch.

Green Bay secondary vs. Denver receivers

This year's Broncos are more balanced than in the past. But with Elway, Denver can still throw the ball with the best.

Wide receiver Rod Smith is Denver's deep threat, but tight end Shannon Sharpe is Elway's favorite target, hauling in 72 balls for 1,107 yards. Ed McCaffery won't run away from anybody, but look for him when Denver needs a clutch catch.

Green Bay strong safety LeRoy Butler led the team in interceptions with five. He's also a solid enforcer against the run, but if he cheats by moving toward the line to stop Davis, it may open the passing lanes for Elway.




