K-Bay crash crewman honored

A Kaneohe Bay Marine was named the Navy and Marine Corps' "Crash Crewman of the Year" in a ceremony held during Department of Defense International Fire Rescue Convention Louisville, Ky., Sept. 12.

Staff Sgt. Ramon Perez Jr., assistant section leader at Aircraft, Rescue and Firefighting department, Marine Corps Air Facility, was presented the Tommy Troutner Award, which recognized him as the best crash crewman in the Department of the Navy.

Candidates for the Troutner award are nominated by ARFF departments throughout the Navy and Marine Corps. Nominees are judged on accomplishments, community service, personal goals and the progress of those goals within the crash, fire and rescue field.

"For SSgt. Perez to win this award, it's indicative of all of his accomplishments ... he's a stellar performer. Anyone who knows him can see this," said SgtMaj. Anthony Baxton, sergeant major of MCAF

"It's not surprising to see him get this recognition, because of the type of Marine he is," said Baxton.

Marines who work with the crash crewman of the year echoed the sergeant major's sentiments.

"He's very meticulous. Attention to detail - that's him," said SSgt. George Berger, section leader at Aircraft rescue and Firefighting here. "He takes other Marines and gets their standards up to his."

Perez admitted he appreciated the recognition of the Troutner Award, but the modest hard-charger insists he never really set a goal to win this

"I didn't work for it at all. When I was at Camp Pendleton, I was recommended for it," said Perez.

But when the Crash Crewman of the Year board compared his package to those of the other Marines and Sailors recommended for the Troutner Award, Perez' performance and character stood out above the

According to the Queens, N.Y., native, this and other awards are nice, but he receives even more satisfaction knowing he can have a positive impact on the Marine Corps by influencing junior Marines.

"The best part of my job is working with junior Marines just coming into the fleet," he said. "Seeing them through and eventually helping them with their problems and hearing them say 'thank you' is probably the best thing."

Corps changes travel charge contractors

NationsBank will replace American Express as the contractor for the DoD's Travel Charge Card Program Nov. 30.

The changeover will effect more than 190,000 cardholders in the Department of the Navy, according to information in a Sept. 14 administrative message.

Approximately 7,500 of those cardholders are in the Pacific Fleet.

NationsBank will mail the Visa cards to respective agency program coordinators (personnel given responsibility for accountability and security of the cards) to replace the American Express cards before Nov. 30. The APCs will then distribute the cards to individual unit cardholders, and the American Express cards will be destroyed.

The NationsBank cards will used by military and DoD personnel on official temporary additional duty travel. And like the American Express cards, they will function as a way to reserve and pay for services and incidental expenses for TAD purposes.

Security increased at Hickam's AMC

Security measures have recently increased at Hickam Air Force Base's Air Mobility Command terminal, where military personnel catch space-available military flights.

The 635th Air Mobility Support Squadron, the unit in charge of the terminal, implemented a single point for entry/exit and started X-raying luggage, checking identification and having passengers walk through metal detectors.

"Air Mobility Command has been integrating higher security measures since the Khobar Towers bombing," said to Air Force Master Sgt. Timothy Veen. 635th AMSS passenger services superin-

The single point of entry was established due to recent United States embassy bombings, according to Veen.

The new security measures affect active-duty, retired military personnel and their families who fly on a spaceavailable basis, and pre-booked funded passengers authorized by the Department of Defense.

Once personnel have been screened into the lock-in area, they can leave but then have to get screened again prior to re-entry. Lock-in area includes the AMC terminal building. car rental and exchanges within the terminal. Passengers arriving at Hickam who were screened earlier for a flight from other bases won't be screened again unless they leave the

lock-in area. The increased security "isn't to turn people away," said Veen. "It's to ensure their safety while they're with us."

To find out flight schedules without being locked-in, Veen said flights are broadcasted on Hickam AFB's channel 5. However, for MCB Hawaii and other personnel without Hickam television access, the flight schedules are posted on a monitor near an outside window at the

Strobel, a food service specialist with Combat Service Support Group 3, boasted a menu featuring chicken cordon bleu, pasta stuffed tomatoes, Italian whitebean salad and chocolate almond frozen torte.

"I wanted to serve something healthy, so I took a recipe and made it low-fat." Strobel said. "I baked the main dish instead of frying it and substituted the regular cheese with low-fat cheese."

Strobel was awarded a trophy, 96 hours of liberty, a certificate of commendation and a chance to work along side Daniel Delbrel, executive chef at the Sheraton Moana Surfrider for two days. Delbrel was on hand to judge the competition.

"I really look forward to working with Mr. Delbrel. It will give me a chance see what the commercial industry is like," said Strobel, who plans to become a professional

According to Steward, all of the chefs benefitted from the competition.

"It's an opportunity for young cooks to display their culinary abilities by putting their food out to Marines," said Steward. "The competitions give them a sense of pride and a chance to hone their culinary skills," said CWO-2 Douglas Bush, food service officer here.

"We need to have competitions like this," said Steward, who has been in the career field for nearly 24 years. "We need to show these Marines how much they are appreciated."

PFT route changes

A new physical fitness test run route was announced for MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, Monday.

The new route, released by MCB Hawaii G-3, affects all Marines who take the PFT aboard the base.

The course now starts near the bridge on 3rd street, adjacent to the softball field. Runners then will follow Seldon Street as it veers to the right, in front of CSSG-3 headquarters. At Harris Ave., the route turns left. Runners

will turn right on Mokapu Rd., as if they were heading out the back gate. The turnaround point is just before the Nu-upia Ekolu and Kaluapuhi ponds. Runners reverse the route and return to the starting line to finish the PFT

All Marines running a PFT are required to run on the bike trail, according to MSgt. Ruthven P. Boucaud, base training chief.

The new PFT route has been marked with red paint at the start line. the 1mile mark, the half-way point and the 2mile mark, according to Boucaud.

IOC conducts training in Hebron

HEBRON, Md. — Lieutenants from the Infantry Officer's Course, located at MCB Quantico. Va., corrducted training in a realistic environment Sept. 3 and 4 here to prepare for urban operations.

"The training sites on base do not offer the realism that a real town such as Hebron can offer," said Capt. Charles Black, an instructor at the IOC. "On Base, Marines act as role players, but the lieutenants still know they are Marines." In Hebron, the lieutenants had to deal with curious children and local residents who had no active role in the exercise, but the Marines were never sure who was or wasn't part of the exercise.

In planning the exercise, IOC first received permission from Hebron's town council. Black grew up in Hebron and still had family who lived there which helped the process. After being presented with the scenario, the council voted to allow the training. Fliers were sent to local businesses to ensure no one would be surprised when the Marines came into town to conduct their urban train. Several residents volunteered to participate in the exercise by providing storage space for rubber rifles street leading to town hall. Among and by giving information to the lieutenants when asked.

Safety was an important factor during training. The sheriff's department was involved in all planning stages. During the exercise, patrols by the sheriff's department were increased to provide safety for the town and the Marines. Four Air Force Reserve trauma nurses, a Marine civil affairs representative and a Navy lawyer were also on hand to handle any problems.

The exercise began around noon Sept. 3, when a CH-46 Sea Knight and a CH-53D Sea Stallion landed on a farm owned by Black's father just outside of town. The scenario was that a farming town in a foreign country, had been hit by typhoons and lost most of its crops.

Because some angry farmers felt the local government was not doing enough to help, the farmers were trying to destroy the political system. The Marine Corps was tasked to provide security while the United Nations handled humanitarian relief.

After landing, the Marines patrolled toward the town center to meet the mayor. They were welcomed by more than 30 town residents and media who lined the main the crowd were four Marines dressed in civilian attire who were playing the role of angered "farmers."

Once the town hall was secure. the platoon commander met with the mayor, Janet Schlesinger, who is also the town manager. She gave them information about the four angered farmers and it was up to the lieutenants to decide how best to handle

The Marines began to patrol the streets to gather information about the farmers, asking local residents if they had seen anything or anyone unusual. Many children tried to help the Marines by saying they had seen someone with "hair like yours"

Within a few hours, clues began to arrive about the farmers. The Marines were told to go to a specific address to search a garage for weapons. When the Marines arrived at the house, they were met by Sheriff Babe Wilson, Wilson, a full time deputy with the sheriff's department, volunteered to play the role of the town sheriff who was not always loyal to the government. The Marines found several weapons, but when they tried to have the owner of

the garage, who was another volun-

teer, arrested, the sheriff refused to

The following morning, the Marines, tired and frustrated at not being able to find the farmers. received their final tip - the farmers had been seen in an abandoned warehouse on the North side of town. The Marines moved out and surrounded the warehouse. A squad of Marines then entered the warehouse, and without further incident all the farmers inside were escorted out.

"The training achieved all of our objectives: realism, interaction with civilians and community relations," said Black. "These Marines cannot get this kind of realistic training on base.'

"These young lieutenants will take this experience with them to the fleet and to the young Marines they will command." said CWO2 David Dunfee, a Marine gunner with IOC 5-98. "When I went to Cuba with 3/2, I didn't know how to use civil affairs and other outside agencies, and we had to deal with kids and with people shooting at us."

"I hope we can do this for every class, but not always in the same town," said Black. "This kind of training helped prepare the lieutenants for possible urban operations in the future "

Delacruz, program coordinator for the Pacific Fleet's travel card program.

The cards will continue to be a charge card and not a credit card, he added. Personnel must complete their travel claims and pay the full amount charged to the card within 30 days of the closing date of the billing statement.

There will be no interest charged for the accounts, cash advance limits will still apply, traveler's checks will continue to be an option and automatic teller machine operations will remain the same, according to the message.

A new personal identification number will be issued along with the card, but cardholders will be able to change it at their discretion.

An advantage to working with NationsBank is the Electronic Account Government Ledger System it's developing. This user-friendly, browser-based system connects to department networks, is highly secure at multiple levels and is designed to support all DoD users simultaneously, according to Delacruz.

Also, APCs can use EAGLS to establish an individual online program to include submitting new card applications, making changes to cardholders' cash/charge limits, disputing cardholders' questionable charges, cancelling or transferring cards to different activities and activating/deactivating cards

The APCs will also be able to query monthly reports, delinquent accounts and billing statements or view current management policies.

Pacific Fleet personnel are schedule to be trained with the new system, according to Delacruz. They should be up to speed with information in plenty of time for NationsBank to take over in two months.

Throughout history, Hispanic Americans have played major roles in the U.S. military, fighting and giving their lives in defense of the nation.

The deeds of PFC Guy "Gabby" Gabaldon stand out in the ranks of Hispanic military achievements. Gabaldon distinguished himself as an integral during the capturie of more than 1,000 enemy soldiers during World War II.

His bravery not only earned him a Silver Star, but a movie based on his endeavors — the 1960 film "From Here to Etemity." He also appeared on the NBC television show, "This is Your Life," in 1957

Born in Los Angeles, Gabaldon was adopted and raised by a Japanese-American family, where he learned to speak Japanese fluently. During World War II, Gabaldon and his brothers joined the armed forces.

to stay focused on their educational objectives and helps stay on track toward completion of their PME with a reasonable amount of effort.

This is significant because each of these officers must also stay focused on the demands and responsibilities of their primary job assignments with the Fleet Marine Force or the base. They are furthering the professional development, to their significant credit, not as a full time student, but as an additional duty. This is no easy task, but it is now considerably more manageable than under the old non-resident program where an officer was mailed 65 pounds of books and told to call us when you're done.

The response to the program has been absolutely outstanding. A full 75% of eligible officers are enrolled in the C&SCDEP here. The final

isn't in yet for the AWSDEP, but the numbers, thus far, are comparable.

The CCE will convene three C&SC seminars of 16-17 officers. Each will convene once per week on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 6 p.m. and will be led by a member of the adjunct faculty staff. 





Caring starts deep in marrow donor's bones

The opportunity to save stranger's life was a chance Petty Officer 3rd Class Scott Carter could



not let pass, especially when the situation hit so close to home.

Carter, a corpsman with Combat Service Support Group 3 here, was asked to give a 7-yearold boy stricken with leukemia, one of the more common types of more than 60 life-threatening diseases that require marrow transfusions, a chance to live.

"Leukemia causes the body to produce white blood cells which are not developed enough to fight infection," said Petty Officer 1st Class Deborah Doggett, a laboratory technician with Branch Medical Center here.

"I think it's really great that I get the chance to save a boy's life," Carter said. "There's no guarantee that the procedure will be successful, I know, but he has a much better chance to live with my help than if there was no donor."

Carter's name was on a registry of potential bone marrow donors, volunteers who have their blood drawn at bone marrow drives like the one held here at the Windward Enlisted Club Wednesday and today. He gave blood samples while at corpsmanschool, but he has more personal reasons for his motivation to help.

"I had a niece who had aplastic anemia (a disease that completely shuts down bone marrow) when she was 13-years-old," Carter said, remembering his relative. "My brother's daughter didn't get a donor in time. I knew that if my marrow matched the boy's I would

Carter said he jumped at the chance to help a child in a similar situation. Carter said he was enthusiastic about going through the series of tests to determine if his marrow is compatible with that of the needy patient.

Carter flew to Georgetown Medical University for his final physical exam leading up to the scheduled operation date of Oct. 9.

The procedure leaves very little chance of danger for the donor, according who Doggett. who says the worst that may happen is infection at the needle insertion points, which can be cleared up by antibiotics.

"I'll probably have an aching soreness after the surgery," Carter said, "But most patients are up (and able to move around) the

"The slight fear I may have is of the unknown, since I've never done anything like this before."

"But the pros far outweigh the cons," Doggett said, finishing Carter's thoughts.

Carter and Doggett urge people to get registered for the bone marrow donor program whenever drives are held. The lab technicians at the marrow drive take two vials of blood, which are sent to the Naval Medical Research Institute for classifying the type of bone marrow the potential donor has.

Since bone marrow characteristics are hereditary, ethnic background is an important factor in determining whether a donor matches a marrow patient. Ethnic minorities including African-Americans, Hispanic-Americans, Native American and Asian-Americans have a more difficult time finding donors, as there are a shortage of volunteers on the bone marrow registry.

People interested in registering to be bone marrow donors can contact the local donor registry to set an appointment.

"You never know when you'll be presented with the opportunity to save a stranger's life," Carter said. "A lot of people never get the

on't tell anyone, but I love to surf. Make no mistake, no one will ever confuse me with the famous "surfer girl" about whom at least two songs have been written. For one thing, I'm no expert. I fit firmly in the novice category. Secondly, I don't fit the "girl" requirement, and haven't since attaining the age of major-

ity 27 years ago. When my husband retired and we moved here a year ago, he began surfing again for the first time in 25 years. I may have remarked casually that I wished I knew how to surf. To me, the remark meant just that: I wished I somehow magically already knew how to surf. Never one to underestimate my own limitations, I figured that the time had

long passed for learning. Surprise! My birthday present from my husband was two weeks of surfing lessons at the best school on the island. Feeling like an utter idiot, and knowing that I would probably kill myself, or worse yet, be laughed at by a bunch of adolescent instructors, off I

Needless to say, my fears were all in vain. The people at the surf school were wonderful. They were thorough in their preparation before going out, and even more helpful once we were in the water. I stood up on the first wave I tried, and haven't looked back since.

So, in case you would like to learn how to surf, but have been putting it off for one of the following common reasons, let's go over them together:

You don't know how to swim. This is really dangerous. Please, please learn immediately. Even if you're deathly afraid of water, and you've taken two hundred lessons and still can't dog paddle, try again until you learn.

2. Your knee, arm, or some other area doesn't work well enough because of prior sports injuries. It's a drag, isn't it? Sometimes I'm surprised that body parts don't fall off as I walk down the street. Try surfing and see before you decide that you're too banged up to do it. I have two shoulders, and a knee that barely work, and can stand up, turn, etc. Surfing is not nearly as knee intensive as skiing

3. You're not athletic/not in shape. I'm not either, I quit gym class my sophomore year in high school, as soon as it became an elective. Have a complete medical check-up before you start surfing, just as you would before starting any other new sport.

4. You're too old. In case you are one of our dozen or so readers who is older than I, all kinds of older men and women surf, particularly in Hawaii. A 73-year-old woman in our apartment complex goes out every morning.

5. You don't like salt water. Some people take awhile to get used to it. I didn't like it either when I first left Kansas. I thought it smelled funny, and it stung my eyes and nose. The only cure for this one is to spend more time in and around the ocean.


6. You like salt water but not surf. I used to hate surf. As far as I was concerned it was put on the earth to keep me from getting to my snorkel or dive spot as quickly and effortlessly as I would like. Once you learn how to board surf, it is much easier to get through it. The waves bother you less, even when you're not surfing.

7. It's too expensive. It's free. Compare it to another "free" sport; runnning. A new board costs about \$400-\$600, a used board \$75-\$200, and either lasts anywhere from one day to eternity. My colleague who runs 60-80 miles a week buys new running shoes for around \$80 every three months. In the long run a board is cheaper. Don't surf the big waves, and ask the lifeguards at your chosen surf spot where the rocks are. Your board should last for a long time.

8. You don't have a good sense of balance. This is one thing I do have. Chances are, if you're a woman with a medium-sized or larger bottom, you have better balance than you think you have. Your center of gravity is low, and you can get away with less than perfect technique. Men can make up for their higher center of gravity with their greater strength.



ACRED FALLS NATIONAL PARK, Hawaii — A muddy path, littered with large rocks and protruding tree roots, weaves through the jungle terrain. As it lines the edge of 20-foot drops and crosses a running river, the path seems to stretch forever.

But despite two-and-a-halfmiles of rugged terrain, dozens of people push forward, striving to experience the wonderland at the path's end -

Sacred Falls. "This place is amazing," said Frank Tatum, a visitor from Omaha, Neb. "When I think of paradise, this is what it

looks like. "When I heard about it, I just had to experience it for myself," said Julie Vigdal, a visitor who tagged along with Tatum. "If you can put this place in words, more power to cliff, tumble approximately 100 feet from a small crevice in the back of Sacred Falls National Park's Kaliuwa'a Valley. They are Sacred Falls because the valley is filled with several

Hawaiian legends. One legend that pertains to the falls specifically is how the ancient Hawaiians believed the pool beneath the falls was bottomless, according to "Ancient Sites of Oahu" by Van James. They felt it merged with another realm where evil spirits

The falls, nestled in a mossy lived. The spirits were continuously trying to surface, however, they were blocked by the plunging force of the waterfall.

Along with history, the valley is filled with luscious greenery, scenic rest areas and plenty of fun for people who enjoy hiking.


People planning to journey up the Sacred Falls trek should wear comfortable hiking shoes and attire. They should bring plenty of water and plan to

make a day of the event. It is less than an hour's Highway from MCB Hawaii to get to the park entrance and more than two hours roundtrip to travel to the falls and back. according to Tatum.

"You have to be safe up here," said Vigdal. "There are lot of places where a mistake could get you hurt."

"Even though it's a rough hike, and you get a little muddy," said Tatum, "seeing the falls at the end of the road make it all worthwhile.


point lead over the Messhall team. "MCAF definitely earned the right to be here and compete," said HMH-362 golfer Scott McFadden. "They pushed us until
