

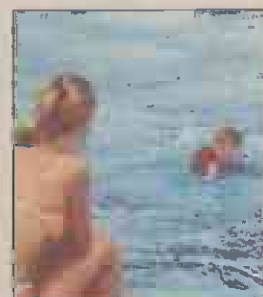

VR-51 resumes operations at Kaneohe Bay

Fleet Logistics Squadron Five One returned to Kaneohe Bay Monday.

The Navy C-20 squadron had been relocated to Hickam Air Force Base since December, while the K-Bay runway underwent repairs.

According to Petty Officer 2nd Class Sylvia Gushiken, aviation electronics

technician for VR-51, the squadron provides passenger and occasional light cargo flight service throughout the world.

The C-20s can hold up to 26 passengers and are similar in design to commercial passenger aircraft. When there's space available, military servicemembers, their families and retirees can take advantage of the flights.

"Most people want the space 'A' flight

primarily for vacation," said Gushiken, "but it also helps them get home as soon as possible for emergency leave."

While the squadron was at Hickam AFB, operations continued for VR-51, with the support of Air Force personnel.

In appreciation for the support by the Air Force, VR-51 flew some of the key supporters to K-Bay Monday for a presentation of mementos and a farewell, as

VR-51 resumed operations at K-Bay.

"We wouldn't be able to function nearly as much as we have without their support," said Lt. Cmdr. Rudy Ricciuti, VR-51 operations officer.

Air Force servicemembers said they were glad to help out.

"Our job is to support aircrew and VR-51 is no different than anyone else," said Operations Support Squadron Com-

mander, Air Force Lt. Col. Richard F. Roberts.

The squadron's return means K-Bay's Marines and Sailors can more conveniently take advantage of the free flights, since they don't have to drive across the island for flights.

MCB Hawaii turns five

Marine Corps Base Hawaii celebrates its fifth anniversary today.

The six components that make up MCB Hawaii — Kaneohe Bay, Camp H. M. Smith, Molokai Training Support Facility, Puuloa Training Facility, Manana Family Housing Area and Pearl City Warehouse Annex — were consolidated on this day in 1994.

"The consolidation was an effort to retain Marine assets on Oahu that might be taken away due to BRAC (Base Realignment and Closure)," said Aaron Martin, the base historian. "It gave the commanding general a broader range of authority and consolidated many support services, eliminating duplication."

The blending of all Marine entities in Hawaii was an effort initiated by former Marine Forces Pacific commanding general, Lt. Gen. H. C. Stackpole III to allow these components to operate more efficiently and support its tenant commands better, according to Martin.

In short, Martin said, the consolidation was just "better for business."

The former Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, was also given a new name — MCB

Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

To some servicemembers here, the consolidation was nothing more than just that — a name change, according to Martin. To others, the consolidation meant drastic changes.

Services such as what was formerly known as Morale, Welfare and Recreation and the K-Bay Installation and Logistics office saw dramatic changes in their areas of responsibility, Martin said.

The Installation and Logistics office was no longer just responsible for the former MCAS Kaneohe Bay, Martin added. They were responsible for all Marine assets in Hawaii.

In its first five years, MCB Hawaii has undergone many changes. It lost F/A-18 jet aircraft and CH-46 helicopter squadrons, the 1st Marine Expeditionary Brigade was replaced with contingents from 3rd Marine Expeditionary Force, but has welcomed the arrival of Navy squadrons from Naval Air Station Barber's Point and made itself the exclusive home of all the Marine Corps' CH-53D helicopter squadrons.

With all the changes, however, the same vision has remained constant — the vision to make MCB Hawaii the base of choice for the 21st Century.

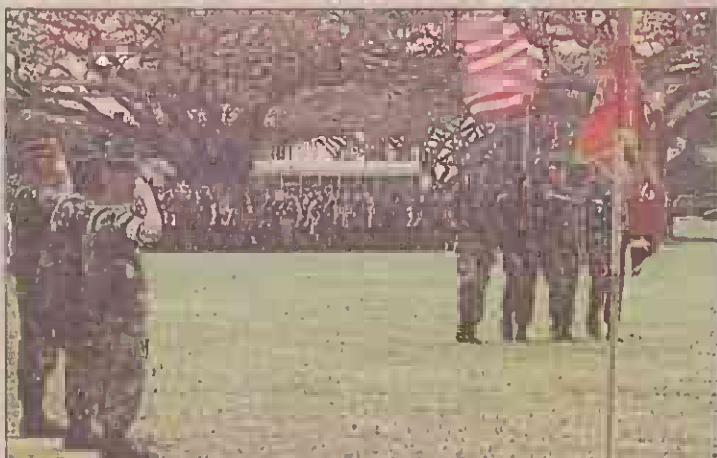

3rd Marines greets new sergeant major

The 3rd Marine Regiment posted a new sergeant major during a post and relief ceremony at Dewey Square aboard Kaneohe Bay Friday afternoon.

Sergeant Maj. Stephen H. Mellinger was relieved as the regimental sergeant major, while Sgt. Maj. Leon L. Harris was posted as the new 3rd Marines sergeant major.

According to Lt. Col. Thomas

Gregory, the 3rd Marine Regiment executive officer, the ceremony marked a turning point for the regiment.

"This is a watershed event for the regiment," Gregory said, while addressing the ceremony attendees and Mellinger.

Harris, who comes to Hawaii from Camp Pendleton, Calif., where he served the sergeant major for Headquarters and Service Battalion, 1st Force Service Support Group, said he was

ready for his new post.

"I am overwhelmed to be here as the new 3rd Marines sergeant major," Harris said. "I will try to do my best to carry on the duties Sgt. Maj. Mellinger has left for me."

The Honolulu native enlisted in the Corps in 1971.

Harris has served throughout the world, including duty in the Republic of Vietnam; as well as in Southwest Asia.

Mellinger is scheduled to become the MCB Hawaii

sergeant major later this month, in place of outgoing MCB Hawaii sergeant major, Sgt. Maj. Royce G. Coffee.

Mellinger, a Bastrop, La. native, enlisted in the Corps in 1972, and has also served throughout the world. His assignments include duty in Beirut, Lebanon, Southwest Asia, and the Republic of Panama. He has been the 3rd Marines sergeant major since December 1995.

Former prisoners of war visit K-Bay

Kaneohe Bay Marines honored former prisoners of war with a capabilities exercise April 7.

First Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment leathernecks demonstrated their abilities by rappelling off a 45-foot tower, overcoming obstacles in the Leadership Reactionary Course, and maneuvering through the Obstacle Course, while the group of about 16 World War II and Korean War veterans and their spouses watched.

"I'm very impressed," said Shorty Estabrook, retired Army veteran and former POW, after watching the Marines go through the Leadership Reactionary Course. "They use a great deal of teamwork."

The veterans belonged to the American Ex-Prisoners of War association and visited Schofield Barracks, the

USS Arizona and Kaneohe Bay as part of their week-long tour.

Many members in the group expressed an appreciation for the opportunity to see their "old buddies" again and to familiarize themselves with modern military training and operations.

"I think this visit has been very good," said veteran Henry J. Stokes. "I always enjoy demonstrations like these."

The K-Bay Marines said they were happy to conduct the presentation as a service to those who served our country in times of war.

"This demonstration is a good way to show our appreciation for what these POWs have gone through in their service to their country," said Capt. Timothy Hiel, Weapons Co. commanding officer.

Professional reading benefits Corps

If there were a block on the new fitness report that graded us for professional reading, I bet more Marines would be reading books on the commandant's reading list.

I am a big proponent of enlisted Marines taking part in the professional reading program, and I believe it is something that all enlisted Marines should be doing willingly on a regular basis. Unfortunately, most Marines won't do it unless we, the leadership of the Corps, insist upon it.

Reading books on the commandant's reading list will make you a better Marine. It will increase your situational awareness and keep you from committing some of the same mistakes made by others on battlefields past.

Warfighting is what Marines are paid to do. Unfortunately, during times of prolonged peace, or semi-peace, we have a tendency to lose focus of that. But by actively taking part in a professional reading program, you keep your head in the game by honing your warfighting skills and keeping your warrior spirit sharp.

Leatherneck and *Marine Corps Gazette* magazines are just two of the many service publications that should be on every professional

Marine's reading list each and every month. *Leatherneck* features the Corps' history and news stories of Marines in action across the globe. *Marine Corps Gazette* focuses on operational topics related to development of battlefield tactics, equipment and weapon systems. It also promotes lively discussion on topics that are effecting our Corps like hazing and sexual harassment. Both are good publications that I highly recommend we read.

Commissioned officers read as a part of their continued military education, which begins at the Basic School. They focus on the study of tactics and war-gaming. In my opinion NCOs and staff NCOs should be doing the same.

General Al Gray, the 29th commandant of the Marine Corps, initiated the commandant's reading program in an effort to get Marines to read and broaden their knowledge of the Marine Corps. Books were selected that were appropriate to each rank. General Gray, and each commandant who has succeeded him, recognized the importance of professional reading for all Marines.

In fact, "Rifleman Dodd" is now required reading for all Marines regardless of rank. For those who still have not read it, I highly recommend it. It is a great book!

You can gain so much knowledge from reading if you discipline yourself to sit down for just a few minutes each day. One book I personally recommend to

all Marines, but specifically NCOs and staff NCOs, is a book by Al Kaltman called *Cigars, Whiskey and Winning: Leadership Lessons From General Ulysses S. Grant*.

If you are wondering why a Marine Corps sergeant major is recommending a book about leadership from an Army general from the Civil War, it's because the art of leadership is not limited to a specific time period or military service. Great leaders share many similarities. Reading *Cigars, Whiskey and Winning* I found leadership lessons that all levels of leadership and all occupational fields can benefit from.

In the book, General Grant "looked upon being given increased responsibility not as increasing his power, but as increasing his ability to get the job done."

We all can take a lesson from that quote and keep it as a reminder as we climb through the ranks. It's not important what we personally gain from a promotion (in the way of perks and privileges); it's what we can do with our new promotion to increase the warfighting capabilities of our units. Such simple lessons are what make *Cigars, Whiskey and Winning* and other

books like it such treasure chests of leadership.

The book even has an alphabetical index of lessons that range from "a bad reputation" to "you can't stop the clock." They all have applications that can be used daily by all Marines.

The bottom line is that we all should be reading. Whether you read *Rifleman Dodd*, *Cigars, Whiskey and Winning* or *Leatherneck*, read something that will make you a better Marine. Take the time to increase your military knowledge. Do it on your own time. It surely will pay off for some day in the future — possibly when you need it most — on the battlefield.

Our future is hidden in our past. Learn as much as you can about your profession, whether you are in for four years or thirty. You owe it to the Marines you have the privilege to lead.

If you are to be the best-prepared leader on the 21st century battlefield, you must participate in professional reading.

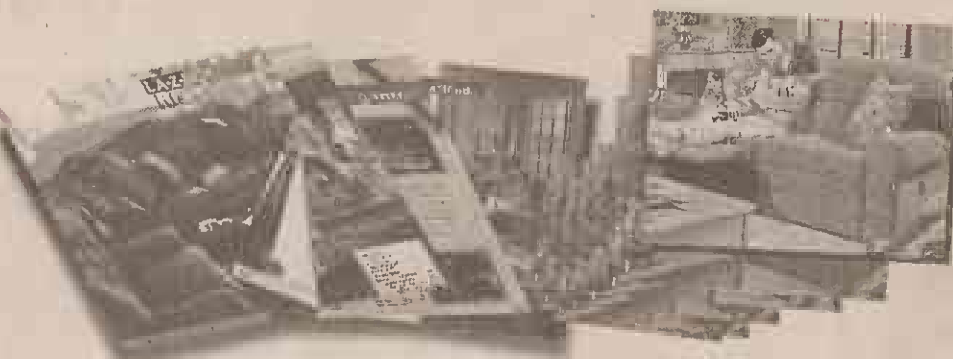

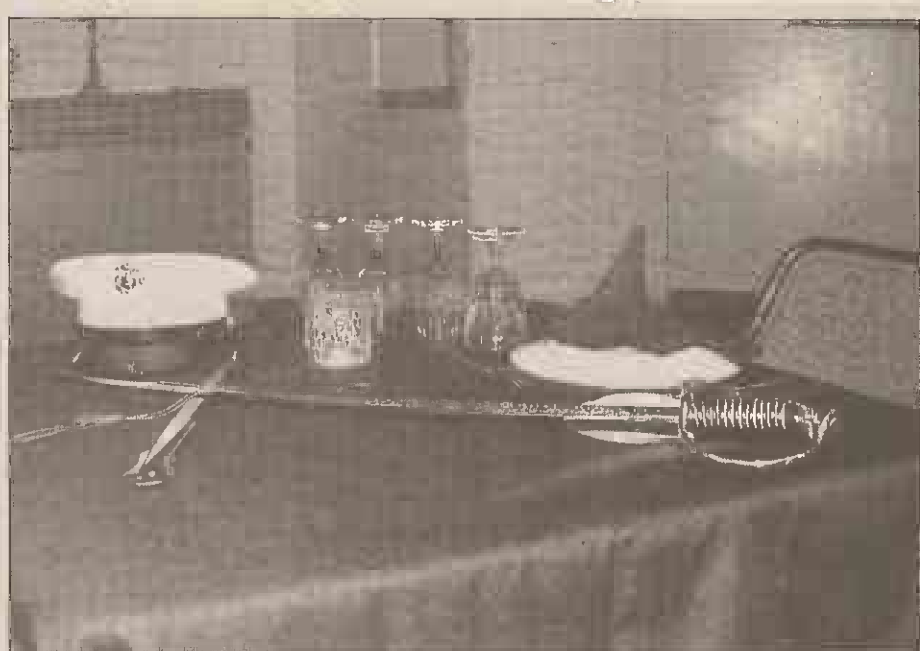

Mess Nights preserve tradition, camaraderie in Corps

Nobody said joining the Marine Corps was a rose garden. By the same token, nobody ever said it was a dinner party either.

However, for all the adversities they may encounter and hardships they may endure, Marines do know how to throw a good party.

Aside from the Marine Corps' birthday celebration each Nov. 10, one of the favorite dinner parties Marines partake in is Mess Night, a formal dinner designed to promote esprit de corps.

According to the Marine Corps Institute's Military Studies Course, Mess Nights originated in the 1920's, after (then) Capt. Lemuel Sheperd, who eventually became Commandant of the Marine Corps, was invited to attend the Mess of the Second Battalion, Scots Guards, while he was stationed in Shanghai, China.

He was so impressed by what he saw, he and his commanding officer soon instituted their own Mess Night. The Marine Corps soon accepted the tradition as one of its own, and the rest is history.

"It's a time of gathering for Marines to enjoy an elegant dinner, good humor and

camaraderie," said Sgt. Maj. Royce Coffee, the MCB Hawaii sergeant major who was the Guest of Honor Friday at a Dining In at the Fairways Club on Kaneohe Bay.

The Mess Nights of today are much like those of yesterday, according to Gunnery Sgt. Robert Phillips, instructor at the MCB Hawaii Staff NCO Academy. They come in two forms — the traditional Mess Night and a Dining In. The biggest difference between the two is a Mess Night is for Marines only, but at a Dining In, Marines are allowed to bring a guest, such as a spouse. Both consist of a president of the Mess, a vice president, the guest of honor and the members of the Mess.

The president is a master of ceremonies, of sorts, and is traditionally the senior staff noncommissioned officer or NCO. The president is responsible for coordinating all activities, and is responsible for the conduct of the members of the Mess, according to the MCI course.

But the vice president, generally a junior staff NCO or NCO, assists the president. He is affectionately called "Mr. Vice," and traditionally does all the "leg work" for the president, Phillips explained.

"Mister Vice sets the tone for a Mess Night," Phillips said.

The vice president personally delivers invitations, handles the funds, actually coordinates all the events, including ceremonial traditions, such as the traditional prayer and toasts, according to Phillips.

The guest of honor is an invited senior officer, enlisted person from another command or civilian. All the other Marines in attendance are the members of the Mess.

The prescribed uniform for a Mess Night or Dining In is traditionally the Blue Dress A or B uniform, or formal evening wear for civilian guests.

Along with rules governing dress, there are other rules the members of the Mess must follow while attending the Mess. Marines and guests should eat slowly and politely, and use proper etiquette, according to Phillips.

Members of the Mess are expected to "drink out of the correct glasses and use correct utensils," Phillips said.

A member should sit up straight, never put his elbows on the table and keep his napkin in his lap. A member should also take time from eating for conversation.

Though the Mess Night has been part of the Marine Corps' history for less than 80 years, it has grown to be one of the Marine Corps' most enjoyable and memorable experiences, according to Marines in attendance Saturday.

As for whether Marines prefer a Mess Night to a Dining In, some say a Mess Night is more fun, but a Dining In is more relaxing.

"A Mess Night is just for Marines, but it's pleasant to have a Dining In," said 1st Sgt. Jeffrey Zink, the company first sergeant of B Co., 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment. "You can't always have a Mess Night. Sometimes it's good to bring the spouses out to a dining in to let them learn a little about our traditions."

"I was warned before I went about what things I could and couldn't do," said Millicence Evans, the wife of Staff Sgt. Melvin Evans, the assistant staff NCO in-charge of the separations and temporary lodging allowance section at the K-Bay Finance Office.

The Evans attended the Dining In here Saturday.

"It was my first one (Dining In) and I

enjoyed it," said Millicence Evans.

"It's just a good time to come out, be with your comrades and enjoy the evening," said Staff Sgt. Evans.

According to Evans, one of the more enjoyable parts of the evening is the practice of "fining" members of the Mess who do certain things wrong, like putting their elbows on the table, leaving the Mess to take a bathroom break or dressing out of uniform.

Fines go according to rank and severity of the "crime," and are either collected to raise money for the unit or used to pay the bar tab when Marines join each other for drinks after the Mess.

Finally, whether it be a Mess Night or Dining In, both are viewed as an intricate part of Marine Corps' history. From the first Mess Night to those of today, they exemplify the brotherhood, esprit de corps and lineage that Marines hold dear.

"It (Mess Night) preserves tradition and camaraderie among Marines," said Gunnery Sgt. William Salter, a percussionist and fund administrator with the Marine Forces Pacific Band. "It helps the Marine Corps remain the way it is."

K-Bay Marine accepted for MECEP

The Marine Corps Enlisted Commissioning Program looks for applicants who can set examples and improve themselves. Both of these traits can be found in a finance technician at Kaneohe Bay.

Sergeant Eric J. Henzler, who is currently the commanding general's driver and has served at the K-Bay Finance Office, is planning to leave Hawaii this summer to pursue a college degree through MECEP and get commissioned as an officer by 2002.

MECEP allows enlisted Marines to achieve an officer career by sending them to college to obtain a bachelor's degree.

The 25-year-old Downers Grove, Ill. native, started his Marine Corps career six years ago. Henzler said his first MECEP application was turned down because he had no college credits.

According to All Marine message 172/98, "academic self-improvement" is one of the requirements for getting accepted into MECEP.

In order to improve his chances for selection into MECEP the second time he applied, Henzler said he began to take every opportunity he had to receive college credits. In one year he obtained 37 credits, and

the second time he applied for MECEP he was accepted.

"You have to keep applying until you are no longer eligible," said Henzler. "Don't let a turned down application get you down."

Henzler said that some of the other requirements for MECEP are community involvement and off-duty education.

Now Henzler plans on continuing his college education at the University of Illinois, Chicago, in August, as a finance major.

"It's a good business school," said Henzler, referring to why he picked the school.

Full active duty pay and allowances are still received by Marines in MECEP but they have to pay for tuition, books and other academic fees, according to the ALMAR.

He plans on using the Illinois Veteran Scholarship fund to pay for tuition, books and other fees.

"In becoming an officer," Henzler said, "I believe will widen my sphere of influence on the Marines I lead."

He will also be the first person in his family to be an officer. Henzler said all his other family members who served in the military were enlisted.

Henzler said that his specific goals as an officer are not too certain, because his job as an officer will be determined by the needs of the Marine Corps.

However, being able to accomplish any mission is one of the goals Henzler mentioned. He also said he wants to "set the example for Marines and put them in a position to excel."

Henzler had two pieces of advice for Marines looking to apply for MECEP.

"You need to apply early and take advantage of tuition assistance," he said. "You have to put yourself on the road to success."

Travel claims are on the way

Money is on its way for Marines whose recent travel claims were delayed as a result of computer difficulties.

The Kaneohe Bay Finance Office encountered a few problems recently as a result of an upgrade in their Integrated Automated Travel Systems, which prevented them from processing travel claims from March 24 to April 2.

According to Staff Sgt. Christian Ramstorf, the travel auditor for the Base Finance Office, about 300 Marines from MCB Hawaii have been affected by this software transition.

"We've got the problem pretty much solved," said Ramstorf, "and soon we'll be back up to speed. It was just a matter of getting everything coordinated together."

"Any time you're dealing with a new system, you can expect a few minor difficulties," said Sgt. Desiree R. DelPrete, the operations non-commissioned officer at the Kaneohe Bay Finance Office.

One problem involved the transfer of information from K-Bay to Defense Finance and Accounting Service at Ford Island, where all the fiscal responsibilities are handled, according to DelPrete.

The new system couldn't send the information at first, but now it only takes a few minutes, as compared to 20 to 30 minutes on the older version of the system.

"Through trial and error, we were able to find a way to send the information to DFAS more expeditiously," said DelPrete.

After making a travel claim, Ramstorf said Marines can soon expect to receive their money in their banks within 48 hours.
