

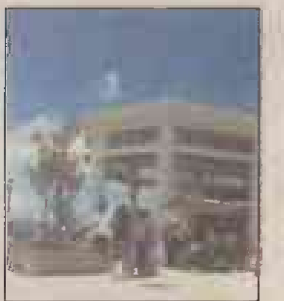

K-Bay chaplain tops in Corps

Navy Lt. Mark Hendricks, the Aviation Support Element Kaneohe Bay chaplain, was recognized as the Marine Corps Chaplain of the Year at an awards banquet in Atlanta April 13.

The 38-year-old Hendricks was selected from nearly 300 other clergymen.

"I was very surprised," said Hendricks, who was recognized mostly for his efforts while serving with 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment. "I feel very humble. I know there are so many great chaplains out there. To be singled out of all of that is humbling to me."

Once a year, the Military Chaplains Association selects the top chaplain from each of the five services to be honored.

Hendricks was nominated by Navy Cmdr. Gerald Seely, the regimental chaplain with 3rd Marines, to represent 3rd Marine Division. After being selected as 3rd Marine Division's representative, he was chosen as the Marine Forces Pacific

representative, and ultimately was chosen by Navy Capt. J. R. Lamonde, the chaplain of the Marine Corps, as the Marines' Chaplain of the Year.

"I really didn't expect to be selected," said Hendricks. "It's such a big process and I'm just

one little fish in the big pond. I was pleased but very surprised."

"Mark is very talented and has done very well in his assignments as a chaplain serving with the base chapel and with 1/3," said Seely, "and his excellent work has continued with his service with the ASE."

Hendricks said much of his ministry and work was inspired by his father, Jere, who is a pastor in Tampa, Fla. After Hendricks graduated from college, his father wrote a sort of "vision" for his son to use as a tool in his endeavors.

"He said how important it is to be a leader and take the role of leadership very seriously, because many people are looking for some voice and someone to follow," Hendricks said, recalling what his father had written for him. "He said, 'Mark, the world must be different because you have lived.'"

"Only in recent years have I learned what that

Team K-Bay, community clean bay

Kaneohe Bay residents and local community members teamed up Thursday to rid the bay around the base of more than 7,000 pounds of ecosystem-damaging debris.

Marines and Sailors from 4th Force Reconnaissance Co. and Waterfront Operations joined with the Western Pacific Fisheries Coalition, the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Base Environmental Department to combat the bay's worst ecosystem enemy — fishing nets.

"Our mission today is to remove these nets to protect the (coral) reefs and marine life," said

Navy Chief Warrant Officer 4 Bob Yoder, the officer-in-charge of Waterfront Operations here. "The nets wash (into the bay) and break off coral heads, damaging fish and animal habitats."

Although there is not much net fishing done in the bay, Yoder said abandoned nets find their way into the bay anyway.

"Fishermen's nets are either abandoned or have come loose, and the natural tide changes and currents drag them into the bay, where they catch onto coral," Yoder explained.

Waterfront Ops Sailors gave the 4th Force Marines a ride out into the bay on their 22-foot boats. From there, the Marines jumped off the boats, then locat-

ed and cut the nets away from the reefs, Yoder said.

The nets were then hauled off to the K-Bay landfill.

Ellyn Tong, the outreach coordinator for the Western Pacific Fisheries Coalition, said the nets damage the food chain, inhibiting the growth of a vital part of the ecosystem.

"The nets do not allow algae to grow because they block the sunlight, not allowing the algae to photosynthesize," Tong said.

The nets also pose dangers to those who use the bay for recreation.

"When boats run over them, they could become entangled and damage the boat's engine," Tong said.

Rocky Owens, the emergency

planning response program coordinator at Base Environmental here, said the clean up helped more than just K-Bay residents.

"We wanted to do something for Earth Day — something off-base that would benefit the community as well," Owens said.

For one 4th Force Marine, the event hit especially close to home.

"We're trying to free the reef of these nets," said Pfc. Christian Hudson, a 4th Force administrative clerk and Anahulu, Kauai native.

Being Hawaiian, Hudson said cleaning the bay, helping its wildlife and protecting the 'aina, or land is very important to him.

"This is my home — this is where I'm from."



Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society fund drive extended

The Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society's annual fund drive has been extended to May 11 throughout Hawaii.

The fund drive, which started March 8, was extended to offer servicemembers more time to contribute to N/MCRS.

Last year, the fund drive raised more than \$125,000. Although, to date, this year's numbers are slightly lower, Chief Warrant Officer 2 Kelley Tirado, the MCB Hawaii fund drive coordinator, praised MCB Hawaii's efforts.

"Everything's been going great," Tirado said. "There are a couple of units here who have exceeded their goals. The unit coordinators have done an exceptional job."

One unit coordinator, 1st Lt. Paul Fillmore, Combat Service Support Group-3 adjutant, expressed the importance of contributing to N/MCRS.

"It's a great program for Marines and Sailors to use when they're in a financial bind," Fillmore said.

According to Fillmore, in 1998, CSSG-3 raised approximately \$27,000 for N/MCRS, while the organization disbursed almost \$80,000 to Marines and Sailors from CSSG-3 during the year.

Fillmore said recreational fundraising events are one way to get Marines to donate.

"Having events makes it a lot more fun for Marines to contribute," said Fillmore, who coordinated "swim-a-thon" and "pie in the eye" contests, which together garnered more than \$2,500 in donations.

Tirado said it behooves Hawaii Marines and Sailors to contribute to the organization, namely because the organization gives so much to them.

"Last year, the Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society disbursed more than \$380,000 to servicemembers and families in the state of Hawaii alone," Tirado said.

New MCB Hawaii Hotline number is up and running

The MCB Hawaii hotline number for reporting fraud, waste, abuse, and equal opportunity and sexual harassment violations is up and running.

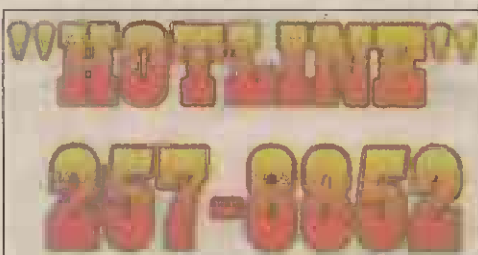
A Marine Corps Order mandates the base maintain a telephone number for reporting these practices, according to Gunnery Sgt. Russell D. Keiper, base inspector chief.

The number, 257-8852, "is designed to provide access to the (base) command, so people can report violations ... without fear of reprisal," said Lt. Col. Mark H. Bean, base inspector.

The hotline allows people to keep anonymity when reporting violations. Calls go directly to a recorder, so a caller never has to personally speak to anyone, Bean explained.

Bean also explained that the hotline is not intended to substitute for the chain of command, and occasionally a complaint may be referred to the chain of command.

And while people who voice complaints or violations through the hotline may



remain anonymous, they can leave contact information if they wish to be called back regarding the status of a telephone call, Bean said.

But "all calls are important," Keiper said. They are all immediate, and "handled the same day."

The Base Inspector's Office determines the validity of calls placed to the hotline number, then determines the appropriate course of action for any reported violation,

Bean explained.

"For instance, the Equal Opportunity Advisor would act on (reports of) equal opportunity or sexual harassment violations," Bean said.

What's important, Bean said, is that base residents and others who witness what may be an unfair practice have an avenue for reporting it.

"The (base commanding) general didn't direct that we establish the hotline just to put a check in the box, but for it to be available for people," Bean said.

"It's not a bother for us (the Base Inspector's Office) to act on a complaint — it's one of our primary duties," Bean said.

They have seen first-hand what great things a small group of dedicated people are capable of doing if given the support of the commands and their families. We have some of the most hard working, dedicated spouses in the world on our bases, and those who are in leadership positions should take the time to stop by to say thank you and offer whatever assistance we can.

Over the weekend, I watched Telesia Woods, current President of the Enlisted Wives Club, speak with pride as she introduced members of her staff. Most, if not all the volunteers were mothers, and many had small children to take care of. But all of

Corps enlists honorary Marine

MCAGCC TWENTYNINE PALMS, Calif. — It took more than one star — four to be exact — to make a wish come true for a southern California boy. But when it did, everyone agreed that even the Combat Center can become a Magic Kingdom, if only for a day.

Joel Kondrot, a 13-year-old Murietta, Calif., native suffering from a rare form of mouth and throat cancer, has always wanted to be an active duty Marine like his father once was.

"Unfortunately, I had to tell him that because of his illness, he would never be able to join the Marines or any branch of the service," said Vincent Kondrot, Joel's father. "But that didn't stop him. He continued to play war games with his friends, and has never lost the desire to be a Marine."

On April 16, the Commandant of the Marine Corps, General C.C. Krulak, made Kondrot's wish come true by authorizing Brigadier General C.L. Stanley, MCAGCC commanding general, to administer the oath of enlistment to Joel along with the title, "Honorary Marine." This is only the 12th time the title has been bestowed by a Marine Corps Commandant since 1992.

"I don't even know who to start thanking for all the work that has gone into making Joel a Marine," said Linda Kondrot, who now knows the pride mothers feel when their sons become a Marine. "Everyone has gone out of their way to make this a special day, not only for Joel, but for all of us."

Somehow — no one seems to know exactly how, which is usually the case with wishes — Joel's desires reached the office of the Debbie Chisolm Memorial Foundation of Yucca Valley,

which grants wishes for youngsters with terminal or catastrophic illnesses. The wish then hit the desk of Corky Bell, a deputy with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, who contacted the office of the Combat Center's sergeant major, who called other sergeants major aboard the base to plan a day full of Marine Corps experiences.

The day began with Brigadier General Stanley administering the oath of enlistment to Joel during the Combat Center's Friday morning Colors ceremony. The MCAGCC band, a formation of officers and staff NCOs, and a crowd of other Marines, Sailors and civilian employees were on hand to view the event, which created an atmosphere of festivity.

An impromptu receiving line was formed after the ceremony, and everyone in attendance congratulated Joel and his proud family. "Congratulations Devil Dog," and "Welcome to the Corps," filled the air as everyone shook hands with Joel. Some Marines even brought gifts, such as a USMC flag, and a tankers' helmet, to give to the Corps' newest and proudest member.

One Marine, a sergeant major, removed a chevron from his collar and pinned it on Joel's uniform. "Now no one will mess with you," the sergeant major told Joel, who responded with a smile.

After the flagpole ceremony, a humvee took Joel to the 1st Tank Battalion ramp where he was

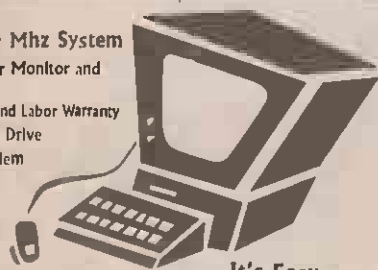

Chosin Few give lessons in history

Eight veterans from *The Chosin Few*, Aloha Chapter shared their wartime experiences with Marines from 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment during a Professional Military Education class and weapons firing opportunity at Kaneohe Bay April 21.

The Chosin Few members fired the M16A2 service rifle and M240G machine gun in the afternoon, and in the evening explained their experiences at the Chosin Reservoir during the Korean Conflict.

"It's a great honor to come out here and fire weapons," said retired Marine Buck Sgt. (E-4) Nicholas Revuelto, a member of *The Chosin Few*. "It's the opportunity of a lifetime to relive the Marine Corps again."

In addition to firing weapons, members of *The Chosin Few* learned about current

weapons like the MK19, .50 caliber machine gun and M40A1 sniper rifle at a static display presented by the enlisted Marines of 3/3.

"You get a deep respect for them (*The Chosin Few*) because they didn't have the resources we have now," said Cpl. Timothy Poole, a radio operator for H&S Co., 3/3, and one of the Marines responsible for helping set up the displays.

After the firing ceased, 3/3 sergeants and above went to a PME class at the Officers' Club, where the veterans' experiences added a personal touch to a class on Marine Corps' involvement at the Chosin Reservoir.

"They provided their own personal experiences to help personify our battle study," said Capt. Michael C. Starling, Headquarters and Service Co. commander. "They're a part of living history."

Instead of reading history books, Starling

said people who actually experienced the war provide a clearer perception of what actually happened.

"Having them come out here was the highlight of the event," said 2nd Lt. Jose Deleon, communications officer for 3/3. "They expressed their views and shared their experiences."

One memorable experience that Deleon said he remembered was how many of *The Chosin Few* members said they went straight to Korea without going to boot camp, having no training at all.

"It was inconceivable for us," said Deleon.

"We train for combat, but you don't realize the reality of such a situation until you talk to someone who has actually experienced it," said Cpl. Matt W. Lofton, training non-commissioned officer for H&S Co. who accompanied the officers and *The Chosin Few* members.

Community effort improves K-Bay watershed

Nearly 150 volunteers from the Kaneohe Bay community and surrounding area participated in the "Walk the Watershed" event at the Mokapu watershed and Nu'upia Ponds, Saturday aboard MCB Hawaii, K-Bay.

The event began at 9 a.m. with an opening ceremony, followed by a group of 6th grade students from Aikahi elementary school testing the pond's pH (acidity), light and temperature levels to determine the quality of the water.

These tests are some of the ways scientists measure the "vital signs of watershed health," said Dr. Diane Drigot, project coordinator

and senior natural resources management specialist at the K-Bay Environmental Department.

"It's fun and cool," said Dylan Lifa, Marco Anich, and Kevin Freitas, all 6th grade students from Aikahi elementary school, while testing the pH levels.

Meanwhile, near the Third Street Bridge, children and adults from Boy Scout troop 238 and Girl Scout troops 32 and 110, planted native trees and Polynesian plants along the banks.

These plants will not only beautify the land but also repair the water quality, according to Karyn Nolan, one of the Environmental Department's consultants helping with the coordination of this event.

Afterwards, Carroll Cox, a volunteer and president of EnviroWatch, a company that provides the public information on various environmental concerns, led a tour along the shore of the ponds.

He said this is a great educational benefit to the children, giving them a hands on experience with nature.

"The military must be commended on loaning the area to the children," he said. "It's bringing great importance to the kids by unlocking the gates."

Booths were also set up for people to view maps of what the ponds looked like in the past and present and how they should look in the future.

Walk the Watershed participants were also treated to coconut-leaf souvenirs woven by Hawaiian studies teachers and Kupuna (elders) program volunteers Elizabeth Pa Chai, from Mokapu Elementary, and Lehua Wetherwax, from Aikahi Elementary.

While weaving, the ladies talked to the children about Hawaiian history and language.

After a morning of water testing and planting, the volunteers put down their testing kits and shovels, to receive a warm thank you from the Environmental personnel.
