# Stand down set for TEAM MCBH 1999 strategic plan

Servicemembers and DoD civilians from Headquarters Battalion and Marine Corps Air Facility are taking time out of their schedules next week to discuss the plan that will launch Marine Corps Base Hawaii into the 21st Century.

Known as the 1999 Strategic Plan, servicemembers and staff will stand down to discuss the goals the plan highlights, which are military readiness; improved quality of life; advancement of risk management and loss prevention; and the anticipation and plan for change and growth.

"Providing education to base units is key because it informs, at the grassroots level, all those who are affected by the strategic plan," said Brig. Gen. Arnold Fields, commanding general of MCB

During the strategic plan stand down, all base units will break down by sections to discuss the goals, mission. and vision of MCB Hawaii. Facilitators will lead the discussion and supply feedback to the base strategic plan coordinator on how the base can better achieve its goals.

"The goals give this base a broad perspective on where we're trying to go," said Col. Michael Olson, deputy commander of MCB Hawaii.

Facilitators will also introduce to servicemembers and DoD civilians the guiding principles that are expected to be used in all decisions made by those apart of MCB Hawaii. These principles are spelled out in the acronym TEAM MCBH. according to Jacque Freeland, base strategic plan coordinator.

However, discussing the plan is only the beginning in implementing it, according to Brig. Gen. Fields.

"The 1999 Strategic Plan is worth no more than the paper it is written on if it is not put into effect," Brig. Gen. Fields added.

Following the initial discussion. there will be periodic staff meetings to discuss the progress of the plan and how well it is being integrated into base, according to Freeland.

"Each department will be accountable for ensuring the plan is implemented after next week's stand down because they are responsible for some part of the strategic plan," Freeland

Base departments, however, are not going to be the only ones on-line with the strategic plan.

"The success of the plan is dependent on not just base units, but also tenant commands. To accomplish the goals the plan has set out, it will require the cooperation of everyone to work more efficiently and exercise more attention to detail," said Brig. Gen.

## More Navy squadrons arrive

The Navy and Marine Corps started out as a team in 1775 and now they're teaming up aboard Kancohe Bay, as Commander Patrol and Reconnaissance Force, U.S. Pacific Fleet, finishes making its transition from Naval Air Station Barbers Point to MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay.

About 2,000 Navy personnel and Department of Defense employees from the command and former NAS squadrons are making K-Bay their new home, according to Navy Master Chief Petty Officer Leo Padilla, FORPAC. Command Master Chief for COM-PAT-RECONFORPAC.

The command's primary mission, according to Padilla, is anti-submarine warfare, although the squadrons also engage in reconnaissance and battle group support for carrier battle

The move to K-Bay means the Navy and Marine Corps will more easily work alongside each other within the Naval service, according to Navy Rear Adm. Michael L. Holmes, commander for COMPATRECON-

"The big advantage is that it enables the Marine Corps and Navy team to work and conduct our missions more efficiently and at a cheaper cost," said Rear Adm. Holmes. "We're delighted to be here and we look forward to working together ... to serve our country as we've always

Although the transition has been well coordinated and well executed, according to Rear Adm. Holmes,

## New top enlisted Marine selected

WASHINGTON — Sergeant Major Alford L. McMichael was named today as the 14th sergeant major of the Marine

A post and relief ceremony with retiring Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps Lewis G. Lee will take place June 28 at Marine Barracks Washington. He will become the first African-American to hold the post since it was established in

Sergeant Major Alford L. McMichael was born in Hot Springs. Ark. He enlisted in the Marine Corps on Aug. 27, 1970, and attended boot camp at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego:

After completing Infantry Training School and Basic Infantry Training at Camp Pendleton, Calif., McMichael was assigned to Marine Barracks, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Upon completion of this tour he transferred to 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment.

In 1974: McMichael returned to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego where he served as a drill instructor, series gunnery sergeant, and battalion drill master. His next assignment was with 1st Battalion, 7th Marines, 1st Marine Division

Transferred to the 3rd Marine Division in 1978, he served as a shore party chief with 3rd Division Support Group. In January 1979, McMichael received orders to Marine Security Guard School and, upon completion of school, was assigned to the American Embassy in Copenhagen, Denmark. In 1981, he returned to Quantico as an instructor at Marine Security Guard School.

In 1983 McMichael was assigned to the University of Minnesota where he served as the Assistant Marine Officer Instructor for the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps program.

Upon completion of this assignment, he reported to Officer Candidates School, Quantico, Va., as a company first sergeant.

After completing the Staff Noncommissioned Officer Academy

Advanced Course, McMichael was assigned to Okinawa, Japan, as the first sergeant of Company C, 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion.

In 1986, he was ordered to Marine Barracks. Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico. as the barracks' first sergeant.

From August 1988 to May 1989, he served as the deputy director of the Staff Noncommissioned Officer Academy, Marine Corps Air Station El Toro, Calif., and then as its director until May 1991, when he was assigned as the sergeant major of Officer Candidates School.

Returning to Okinawa in 1994, McMichael served as the sergeant major of the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit. In July 1995, he was assigned as the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing sergeant major.

In January 1997, Sgt. Maj. McMichael was assigned to his current post as the Manpower and Reserve Affairs sergeant major, Headquarters, Marine Corps.

Sergeant Major McMichael's personal decorations include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal with gold star, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with gold star, and the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal with gold star.

## K-Bay fuel facility voted tops in Corps

The MCB Hawaii fuel facility was recognized as

the best in the Marine Corps May 16. The facility was chosen best among several other

fueling facilities from around the Corps for the cov-

eted American Petroleum Institute Award. "Every service has an API award," said Ed Camphell, the base fuel officer. "The Marine Corps

only has one award and all bases compete for it. "This award is given out to the best petroleum operation in the Marine Corps," Campbell added. "Receiving this award means we run a good operation and that we're the best in the Corps at this time."

The API judged packages submitted by individual hase fueling facilities on aspects such as safety, environmental compliance and operations, and fuel quality, Campbell said.

The API narrowed the competition down to two installations - MCB Hawaii and MCB Camp Butler,

Okinawa. Officials from the API then made trips to the two bases to witness and evaluate the two petroleum

operation facilities first hand. Campbell said after the judges made their final rounds at the installations, they saw that K-Bay's

fuel facility had the winning edge.

According to Navy Cmdr. Griffin Warren, the

MCB Hawaii supply officer, the success of the fuel division is owed to the help of several other MCB Hawaii components.

"There has been a really close partnership between the supply, fuel, safety and environmental departments here," Warren said. "The fuel division could not have done it alone, so the credit goes not only to the fuel division, but to the partnership of those several other departments.

"I attribute the success of the division to the people - Ed Campbell has a very good work force of civilians and active duty Marines and Sailors that all work together to make sure the mission (is accomplished)," Warren added.

## Sergeant Major's Corner

## Changes sometimes bring new challenges

Each summer throughout the Corps, the winds of change start to blow and many receive permanent change of station orders.

Most Marines watch contentedly as some move on and others come abourd. For some junior Marines, however, the personnel changes that come from headquarters Marine Corps create new challenges. It can become a stressful time.

The moving season can even effect the combat effectiveness of our units; especially when commanders depart and new ones arrive. When commanders move, it brings uncertainty.

Changes in personnel affect our comfort level. While change is not bad, we must realize a certain amount of stress will come

As leaders, we must recognize this stress and uncertainty. We must deal with it effectively to prevent readiness from being affect-

When the commandant and the sergeant major of the Marine Corps stopped in Hawaii for their farewell visit recently, the commandant spoke about a lot of things. He said the Marine Corps as we know it will not come to an end on June 30, 1999, with their departure. The only thing that will happen - like it has 31 times before - is the Corps' leadership will change hands from one commandant to the next.

While most are a little uncertain about the

it's not the same kind of stress felt by individual Marines who are about to get a new company commander or platoon sergeant. When Marines are use to doing things a certain way, you know what your leaders expect. All of a sudden he or she is gone and there are schedule and procedure changes.

Personalities play a big part in stress and the effects on a unit. Some commanders

> come in like gangbusters. They have 18 months to command and they want nothing more than to make the most of it. They will want things don't a certain way and at a certain time. They are putting their personal stamp of leadership on that unit.

You must recognize that this will occur and not get stressed about it. Just recognize it and deal with the change. Once everyone gets used to the new "boss," things will settle down and you will be back into a routine. The only difference will be that it's the new commander's rou-

If you are a new noncommissioned or staff NCO reporting in, realize that your Marines are observing you just as surely as you are watching them. Both sides are making first impressions. Make yours a good

If you are one of the old salts, make new Marines feel welcome, whatever their rank. and show them around. Remember, you were the rookie once. Think of those things you wish someone would have shown you. Do it for the new Marines. You'll decrease their

Use your experience, knowledge and leadership to calm everyone down. Things will calm down if you, yourself, stay calm. You will reassure your Marines by your demeanor

direction the new commandant will take as. that everything is going to be just fine.

I also recommend that you try to institute some changes gradually. Take the time to explain the changes that must happen immediately. Talk to your Marines before the change of command or before you leave and explain to them the new commander's changes will make what's already good even

That is the beauty of the Marine Corps. We never rest on our laurels: we always try to improve.

Communication up, down and sideways is the best way to decrease stress changes bring. As NCOs and staff NCOs, we should never be too busy to talk to our Marines.

For new leaders reporting in, remember the unit you are reporting into was functioning before you arrived and will continue to function after you leave. Each unit has strengths and weaknesses. Some advice I always remember when checking into a new unit is to "keep your mouth shut and eyes open." This allows one to understand what's going on. I believe that is good advice.

Don't ever badmouth the Marine you replace. You don't know their circumstances. They handled things their way; you'll handle things your way. When you run your "soup coolers," bad mouthing the old or the new person in your unit, you're being unprofessional.

Change in any organization is inevitable. By recognizing it and dealing with it you will soften the negative effects on yourself and the Marines you lead.

New people bring fresh ideas to the table. While we don't throw away everything that is old, we must be flexible enough to take advantage of new ideas and approaches. If everybody just takes it easy, we will all make it through the winds of summer in great shape.

there will still be a period of acclimation, in which the Navy personnel get used to their new locations and points of contact necessary for ongoing operations.

Patrol Squadron 9 has already settled into K-Bay. Patrol Squadron 4 deployed about six months ago from Barbers Point, but will settled aboard K-Bay upon return to Hawaii. Their relief, VP-47, is heading out from NAS Barbers Point for deployment and will settle at K-Bay upon its return.

All three squadrons have P-3C Orion fixed-wing aircraft, used to provide maritime patrol for the Pacific Ocean. A fourth squadron recently making its way aboard K-Bay, VPU-2, provides reconnaissance air support.

With the move from Barbers Point, some Sailors said they have been facing new challenges. Helicopter Anti-submarine Squadron Light 37, which employs SH-60B helicopters, also moved to K-Bay from Barbers Point in February. The squadron is part of Commander Helicopter Anti-submarine Light Wing, U.S. Pacific Fleet, headquatered at N.A.S. North Island, Calif.

Several of the Sailors are temporarily living in quarters outside of Kaneohe Bay, as they await more housing room on base to accommodate them - an evolution that is expected to take several months as the units get situated and new barracks are built, according to Padilla.

But the transition is coming together, Padilla said.

"With the reception we've gotten from everyone (at Kaneohe Bay), it's made the transition a lot easier," said Padilla, who explained that Marines have provided the Navy with a true "aloha spir-

"We'll continue working with Marine Corps Air Facility and the helicopter squadrons," said Rear Adm Holmes, "to ensure that fixed-wing and helo operations run smoothly and safe-

## **History of Marine Corps' top** enlisted position runs deep

Only thirteen Marines have held the coveted title of sergeant major of the Marine Corps.

Although the position has been attained by so few good men, it's a post surrounded with the mystique and grandeur of decades of Marine Corps history and lore the apex of success for enlisted Marines.

Sergeant major of the Marine Corps is a position that commands respect and requires extreme dedication to duty.

The Marines who have held the post averaged 30 years of activeduty service. Each had their own distinct leadership style, personal and professional goals, and career accomplishments.

Most were seasoned combat veterans, but all of them were leaders who accepted the challenge of keeping traditions, leadership, and training of the enlisted force intact to preserve the Marine Corps of their day for generations

The position is more than a job; it is a lifestyle that serves as the ultimate example of what every Marine should strive to be.

While all Marines know who holds the Corps' senior enlisted post, many don't know what the job entails or how the post even came to be.

The Congressional Act of July 11, 1798, created the rank of sergeant major in the Marine Corps. On Jan. 1, 1801, Archibald Summers was appointed by the Commandant of the Marine Corps as the first Marine to hold the rank of sergeant major.

He was succeeded by Alexander Forrest in 1803, who held the rank until his death in 1832.

The rank underwent numerous changes and was even abolished at points during the following 120 years.

During that time, Marines like Dan Daly and John Quick, both Medal of Honor recipients, wore the rank of sergeant major and helped sculpt the history and wartime victories of the 20th-century Marine Corps.

It was not until 1957 that the official title of sergeant major of the Marine Corps was instituted by then - Commandant of the Marine Corps Gen. Randolph

The idea was to create an unobstructed flow of information to and from the enlisted Marines to the commandant.

A historic first in American military history, the decision was made to place the new sergeant major in the Office of the Chief of Staff to serve as the principle advisor on all issues affecting the enlisted force of the Marine

With that decision made, the search was on to find the right Marine for the job.

From 240 sergeants major on active duty at the time, the selection came from a suggestion made to the commandant by Secretary of the General Staff Col. DeWolf Schatzel.

On May 23, 1957, Sgt. Maj. Wilbur Bestwick took his post as the first Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps. Since that day, there have been only a dozen more faces and personalities that have served in the Corps' top enlisted



## 'Red Patchers' perform special tasks for Corps

They are usually the first ones at the scene and the last ones to leave. This, and the fact that they wear distinctive red patches on their otherwise regular camouflage uniforms, distinguishes Marines from Landing Support Company, Combat Service Support Group 3 from other Kaneohe Bay leathernecks.

The company is unique to not only MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, but to the Marine Corps, according to Staff Sgt. Wayne Young, training and operations chief for LSC.

"Because we're so much smaller (than other landing teams in the Marine Corps) and we have so many more commodities in our section," said Young, "we're constantly being tasked."

Kaneohe Bay Hawaii's LSC has a total of about 100 Marines, but only half of them are in Hawaii. The rest are out in support of Marines that have deployed or gone to neighboring islands of Hawaii, according to Sgt. Christopher S. Hall, training chief for LSC..

With the small number of Marines in the company, the weight of leadership shifts into the ranks of lance corporal, according to Hall. When noncommissioned officers are called away to do something, the lance corporals step up to take charge.

"We rely a lot on our junior enlisted Marines," Hall added.

For the month of March alone, the heavy equipment section of LSC worked after regular working hours for about 250 hours, according to Young. Landing Support Platoon itself reached more than 350 hours for the same month as well.

"We work past normal working hours without hesitation," said

Young said the Marines in his company are accomplishing tasks usually assigned to a battalion. Because of the small number of LSC Marines, they are sometimes taught to accomplish tasks beyond their

"We definitely get more cross-training (than other LSC Marines)," said Young,

And with this opportunity, there are great advantages, according to Cpl. Jason L. Smith, acting operations chief for LSC.

"Cross-training makes us more proficient as a company," said Smith, "because some Marines can pick up from where other Marines left off."

According to Smith, LSC provides support for the entire base, including 3rd Marine Regiment and the wing. They provide generators, landing support, water purification, bulk fuel, field laundry machines and heavy equipment including fork lifts used to transport large loads of goods.

The Marines of LSC are divided into four basic sections, or platoons, according to Smith. These include the headquarters, engineers, heavy equipment specialists, and a landing support platoon.

And to be easily distinguished, these Marines always wear red patches on either side of their "cammie" trousers and one on the front

According to Young, the red patch has a long history in the Marine Corps. Since, World War II, the red patches were used to distinguish these "shore party" Marines that supported operations such as beach assaults, from Marines that were called to the front lines of battle.

Some shore party Marines were taken to the front lines without realizing their essential role in the support of amphibious landing campaigns, hence the need for the red patches, according to Young.

Landing Support Company at K-Bay continues to live up to their tradition according to Smith; they're usually the first ones to go and the last ones to come back.



## MCB Hawaii WIC branch office finds new home

The MCB Hawaii branch of the Women, Infants and Children organization has relocated its office to building. 244, near the base theater, aboard MCB Hawaii. Kaneohe Bay.

The move was triggered by the increased number of participants in the program, said Mamye Shaw, a clinical nurse with the Family Practice Clinic at the Branch Medical Clinic here.

"The WIC office has recorded a threefold increase in enrollment during a sixmonth trial period." Shaw said. "From July to December 1998, the program has gone from 250 enrollments to 800.

Shaw attributed the jump in participants to new families coming aboard base as sure of NAS Barber's Point.

"We've got lots of new Marine familtes coming aboard," Shaw said. "There are also lots of Navy families who are already enrolled in WIC who are transferring here from Barber's Point."

The purpose of the federally-funded organization is to provide food and supplements for expecting mothers, new mothers and their infants in need, Shaw

Factors such as income and family size determine whether or not servicemembers are eligible to receive benefits through the program, said Shaw.

Once a family is deemed eligible, the family can then collect vouchers from the office once per week redeemable for food

well as those transferring due to the cloitems at the base commissary and other stores.

Shaw said through the program, on average, families save \$70 to \$100 per month on food items.

"Patient reports from a survey, tell us that (enrolled families) are eating better," Shaw explained.

In June, the WIC office will be open Mondays from 8:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Beginning in July, the office will be open from 8:45 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Mondays and Wednesdays (by appointment only) to better accommodate the growing number of program participants.



## Fulford honored at dinner

President Ulysses S. Grant once arrived at a small town reception where the community's top socialites were waiting to greet him. Noticing a pair of haggard veterans watching from the side, he ignored the the biggest and the best command anycrowd of well-to-do greeters and walked straight to the veterans to ask how they were doing. Grant cared deeply for the common soldier, always putting them first. He never forgot the many who served with him as he ascended through the ranks to assume the Union Army's top command and eventually the presidency.

Gen. Carlton. W. Fulford, shared this military leaders and serving alongside his account of Grant's gratitude for ordinary soldiers with more than 100 staff noncommissioned officers who threw a dinner party for him at the Fairways All-Hands Club June 28.

Fulford said Grant's example was the hest departing advice he could give the group of senior enlisted leaders who gathered to bid their commander farewell. Fulford departs his command of more than 85,000 Marines and Sailors June 22.

Never forget those responsible for your success, advised Fulford, whose first assignment in the Corps brought him to the Republic of Vietnam where he commanded a platoon of infantrymen in combat. Since then, Fulford said, he has had a very fortunate career. He has commanded at several levels, including company, battalion, regiment, brigade and twice at a Marine Expeditionary Force.

"I've spent my entire career in the Marine Corps leading Marines, and this is where," Fulford said of Marine Forces Pacific and the vast operational responsibilities of an area that includes East Africa, South West Asia and the Pacific. "To leave this is not a pleasant experience. The next three weeks is going to be very hard."

The staff NCOs and their spouses listened as Fulford talked about two of his Marine Forces Pacific commander, Lt. favorite subjects: the history of Civil War fellow Marines.

Sergeant Mai, Robert W. Holub, Marine Forces Pacific sergeant major, told of the adventures and good times he shared alongside Fulford traveling together checking up on their Marines deployed around the globe. Holub said such gatherings at dinners and other events that bring Marines together outside the work atmosphere are extremely important to building and maintaining Marine-to-Marine bonds and friendships. Fulford described Holub as more than just his sergeant major. He called him a "friend."

One trip as commander and sergeant major took them to the bombed remains of the U.S. Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya.

Fulford described meeting with a Marine corporal on duty there. He said it was the most memorable moment of his command.

"There was a young corporal who had just returned home from (an extended deployment)," Fulford said. "He was home less than thirty days when he was sent to gnard the embassy in Kenya." Fulford told how the young Marine had a great opportunity to complain and tell about how he wasn't given enough time with his family before being deployed again so quickly.

"He didn't do any of that," Fulford said. Instead, the corporal proudly explained his responsibilities and talked about ways he could do his job better. Marines like that, Fulford said, are "truly what commitment, honor and courage are all about. That young Marine epitomizes the thousands of Marines we have throughout the Pacific and it means a great deal to me," Fulford said.

Fulford also credited Marine spouses. He said their contributions play an important part in making the Corps strong. "You are the strength that allows us to do the things that we do so well," Fulford said as his wife Mary Ann looked on.

Fulford is scheduled to hand over his command to Lt. Gen. Frank Libutti who comes to Hawaii after serving as III Marine Expeditionary Force commander in Okinawa, Japan. Fulford's next assignment is Director of the Joint Staff at the Pentagon.







# Marine promoted by video


CAMP H. M. SMITH, Hawaii Reaching through more than 4,500 miles of communication circuitry, 2nd Lt. Robert P. Lynch helped pin a fresh set of staff sergeant chevrons on his sister's collar. Not literally, but the live event conducted here June 1 via video teleconference proved technology has finally caught up with the promotion process. It also helped strengthen an already strong hand between two very proud Marines who happen to be brother and sister.

Staff Sgt. Carrie A. Lynch's promotion was unique. She serves here with Marine Forces Pacific as a Marine Air-Ground Task Force planning assistant. Her brother, an infantry officer with 3rd Battalion. 2nd Marine Regiment, is stationed at Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Although promotions between related Marines are common, when a three-slar general gives up his video teleconference system for such a ceremony it quickly becomes a special event.

The briefing room where the promotion took place was packed with observers eager to watch the high-tech family promotion. Mom was even there on speaker phone listening as her son promoted her daughter.

The command has done a few promotions by video teleconference, but none like this said Atsuya Miyagi, a computer engineer at MarForPac who helped Staff Sgt. Lynch coordinate and prepare the VTC system for her promotion. "We are keeping the Marine Corps on the cutting edge of technology." Miyagi said. noting that the MarForPac's recent

advances with computer technology such as VTC would not be possible without the support of senior Marine leaders.

Miyagi said the VTC technology, which enabled Staff Sgt. Lynch's brother to participate in the long-distance promotion, involved sending data through enhanced communication lines that function like phone lines.

Staff Sgt. Lynch said she was her brother's first salute and his first promotion.

"I think be's kind of nervous because he's never promoted anyone before," said Staff Sgt. Lynch. Her brother was commissioned May 8, 1998, and was the first in her immediate family to complete a four-year college degree.

"You are my hero," Staff Sgt. Lynch told her brother via VTC during the ceremony after the younger Lynch called the rooms in North Carolina and Hawaii to attention and read her promotion warrant.

"My older sister has been a positive role model for me my whole life." 2nd Lt. Lynch said. "I was going to enlist, but she told me to go to college and go into the Marine Corps as an officer. And now I have a staff NCO I can turn to share my problems with.

"I had fourteen privates waiting to be promoted, but I told them they have to wait because I have to promote my sister first," 2nd Lt. Lynch said. "She still continues to influence my development in the Marine Corps. We talk two to three times a week."

Staff Sgt. Lynch described the brother-sister relationship as close, but competitive. Staff Sgt. Lynch served in operations Desert Storm and Restore Hope. She said her brother is now hungry to deploy and gain experiences in the Corps like she has.

"She was always out doing something, not just sitting in an office," 2nd Lt. Lynch said. "I wanted to do that, too."

"She has great credibility and has had some super experiences in the Marine Corps," said Col. Sheryl E. Murray, who pinned on one of Staff Sgt. Lynch's chevrons and serves as MarForPac's safety officer and command inspector. Staff Sgt. Lynch's other chevron was pinned on by her longtime friend Staff Sgt. Kimberly Boyer, who she met during Desert Storm.


Murray, who commanded a battalion of recruits in 1990 at Parris Island, S.C., when Staff Sgt. Lynch was enduring the rigors of boot camp, said the ceremony was one of the most remarkable promotions she's ever witnessed.

"Everybody in the room felt the same way I did . . . that this was really a very special event," Murray said. "To hear this second lieutenant talking so very proudly of his older sister, it just made me feel very good. You could see it on everybody's faces. This is really only the beginning for this new staff noncommissioned officer."







## Seminar June anniversary of Belleau Wood battle

Teufelhunde. Devil dogs.

The names are synonymous with Marines, and they were earned by the heroic deeds of the 5th and 6th Marine Regiments, comprising the 4th Marine Brigade, during their bloody World War I battles against the German forces at Belleau Wood.

United States forces, including the 4th Brigade, faced off against the German aggressors 81 years ago this month, at Belleau Wood, near Chateau-Thierry, France, for 20 days beginning June 6, 1918. The 4th Brigade's efforts during that battle exalted the Marine Corps in the eyes of both their German adversaries and French allies, as well as the folks back home in the States.

The fighting certainly took its toll on the American troops. German machine gun nests mowed down U.S. Marines and soldiers who advanced on the Wood, which had been a pristine wildlife reserve before the fighting began. In the 20 days of fighting, Marines lost more than 1,000 men, with more than 4,500 injured.

The Marine Corps was involved in the war in part because Marine commandant Maj. Gen. George Barnett insisted that the Corps was a "force in readiness," and wanted the rest of the country to know it. There were already leathernecks around

the world serving aboard ships, and the Corps was eager to prove its capabilities in ground combat.

The Corps was quickly able to raise its personnel strength to field regiment-sized forces to send to Europe, attracting recruits with catchy slogans such as "First to Fight."

A few phrases that still inspire Marines today originated during the fight for Belleau Wood. First Sgt. Dan Daly, who had earned two Medals of Honor for his acts of bravery in previous conflicts, is said to have asked of his Marines, "Come on, you sons-of-bitches! Do you want to live forever?!"

After a French officer suggested that the Marines pull back to dig trenches, Capt. Lloyd Williams, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, is said to have cried, "Retreat, hell! We just got here."

And then, of course, there is the term "devil dog," which is the translation of the German word "teufelhunde." The German soldiers are said to have named the Marines in Belleau Wood this because of their fierce war cries and their intense, persistent fighting spirit.

Two of the Medals of Honor awarded to Marines during World War I were earned during Belleau Wood, including the posthumous recognition of Gunnery Sgt. Fred Stockham, who saved a 17-year-old private by giving up his gas mask to the young Marine during a mustard gas attack by the Germans.

The 5th and 6th Regiments earned the French Croix de Guerre (War Cross) and Fourragere for their roles in World War I battles including Belleau Wood, and Marines in those units still wear the battle decoration.

Also in Marine Corps history for June: The establishment of a Marine post at Port Royal, South Carolina on June 26, 1891. Many Marines recognize the post by its current name, Marine Corps Recruit Depot Parris Island.

The post was a Union naval base during the Civil War. In 1915, then-commandant Maj. Gen. William Biddle established a recruit training depot at Parris Island. Before then the post was used as a Naval disciplinary barracks.

The 6,000 acre training area on 10 square miles of South Carolina swamp-

land is, familiarly associated with its humid weather and treacherous sand



"I love working with kids and answering their questions," said Lance Cpl. Tracey Whyne, a helicopter mechanic with the Red Lions.

"This is a good experience for the children," said Lance Cpl. Raymond Kosmarin, an avionics technician with the squadron. "It's better for the younger kids because they get a hands-on interaction with the equipment."
