CH-53D makes hard landing

A CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopter from Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 366 made a hard landing at the Pohakuloa Training Area on the island of Hawaii June 23.

The aircraft was transporting four crew members and 17 Marines assigned to 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment to a training area within the facility.

Seven Marines were injured in the hard landing and were transported to Hilo Hospital for treatment and all were released within 24 hours. The aircraft sustained substantial dam-

The lack of serious injuries sustained by the Marines was due largely to safety precautions taken by the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing Aviation Support Element, said Maj. Brian Barton, the ASE safety officer.

"We train to make safe pilots and air crew and our mission here is to provide sale transport at all times," Barton said. "Our goal is to have zero mishaps and our training is designed to serve that mission."

The last aircraft mishap that resulted in substantial aircraft damage occurred more than six years ago. said Barton.

1/3 practices varied skills on Big Island

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — Infantrymen from 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment hit the grassy fields and rocky earth to begin their four-day field exercise here Sunday.

The exercise was one part of the Hawaii Combined Arnis Exercise 2-99, in which different units from MCB Hawaii participated. Marines from 1/3 spent two weeks of preparation on the ranges here before the exercise began. The field exercise will transition to a live-fire exercise, which will end Saturday.

The battalion's field exercise was an important step in preparing for its unit deployment to Okinawa in October. The battalion was graded according to Marine Corps Combat Readiness Evaluation standards by evaluators from 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment during the exercise.

Not only did 1/3 Marines train for conventional warfare, but they also faced aspects of what Gen. Charles C. Krulak, commandant of the Marine Corps, calls the "three-block war." This concept evolves from humanitarian aid, to noncombalant evacuation Operations, to combat within a short amount of time and

area, often in urban or populated settings. The infantrymen had to put into practice what they were taught about handling non-combatant situations.

"These Marines are really geared for this," said 1st Sgt. Jelf Zink, fleadquarters Service Company, 1/3, first sergeant. "We've trained for a lot of different things the whole year and are building more on new stuff. The Marines have to use "control" discipline not using force when it's not warranted."

International training exercise held in Hawaii

The waters surrounding the Hawaiian Islands are currently teaming with ships from the Constellation Carrier Group as part of an international Joint Task Force Exercise hosted by Patrol Squadron 9.

Nearly 22 different military aircraft, mostly P-3's from five different countries Great Britain, Canada, Japan, Australia and the United States - are using K-Bay's flightline in a 24-hours-aday, seven-days-a-week, evolution as part of a simulated low-intensity conflict, according to Capt. F. D. Knowlton, the

"This is the final exercise in the predeployment training of the carrier battle group," said Knowlton. "Just like the Marines have a SOCEX (Special Operations Capable exercise), a carrier group has a JTFEX before they go on deployment."

The JTF incorporated several aspects of naval warfare such as anti-submarine,

air-to-air, long range strikes and search and rescue missions into a training period that began June 19 and is scheduled to conclude this week, according to Knowlton. All P-3 squadrons at K-Bay, along with MCAF, Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kancohe, are also participating.

Whereas this is K-Bay's first time hosting an event like this, it isn't the first time VP-9 has participated in a JTF, said Navy Lt. Jim Stewart, line officer with

According to Stewart, the squadron usually is part of the JTFEX in San Diego. Whether it's held in San Diego or Hawaii, however, the training is produc-

"It's good working with the battle group," said Stewart. "We're constantly trying to improve our readiness."

Stewart also said flying alongside pilots from other countries has been enjoyable. According to Stewart, the pilots are "very precise" and "extremely professional."


In Operations Desert Shield and Storm, riders had problems making it through sand because the KLR-250 lacked power.

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — There are a lot of factors to consider to be able to support a training mission like Hawaii Combined Arms Exercise 2-99, currently underway here.

From beans to bullets to bandaids, Combat Service Support Detachment 75, comprised of Marines from Combat Service Support Group 3 based at MCB Hawaii, provides for all the demands the training units here can't meet.

For much of what CSSD-75 offers, supply is the key word. Whether it's supplying Meals Ready to Eat to the units or supplying them with vehicle parts for repairs. CSSD-75 fulfills the requests it receives.

"Usually we ask for a heads up, but even if a request is made last-minute, we're able to fill it." said 1st Lt. Samuel Lee, CSSD-75 operations officer. "We're running 24-hours a day, so we're always ready if anything hap-

The detachment has to provide for many of the needs of units training during HCAE. Among the sections which comprise CSSD-75 are maintenance, motor transport. communications, supply and landing support companies, with other Marines and Sailors providing medical, dental and military police support. 

Department of State issues worldwide travel alert

he Department of State issued a publie announcement June 10, warning American citizens of imminent terrorist dangers when travelling abroad.

According to the announcement, it was "not in response to any one particular threat or event, but to emphasize (the Department of State's) ongoing concern for the security of Americans

First Lt. Pete Solano, the MCB Hawaii Provost Marshal's Office operations officer, said servicemembers should be especially cau-

"With the current world condition and threats against the U.S., servicemembers and their famities are particularly at risk - even more so when they're travelling." Solano said.

Primarily, terrorists target servicemembers because of the publicity it would bring their cause, but Solano said there are a few pro-active measures servicemembers could take to avoid terrorist threats.

"Although Hawaii's terrorist threat caution is listed as low to negligible, that's not to say we're not subject to terrofist activity." Solano explained.

According to a pamphlet distributed by Joint Chiefs of Staff called Antiterrorism Individual Protective Measures, there are precautionary measures people can take to protect themselves.

At airport terminals:

- . Use concealed bag tags
- · Spend as little time as possible in airports.
- · Pass through airport security checks quickly. Once through security, proceed to a lounge or other opened area away from baggage lock-If possible, sit with your back against a
 - Remain alert. Be a "people watcher."

- Do not give room numbers to strangers.
- Choose an inside hotel room.
- · Sleep away from street-side windows.
- Leave lights on when room is vacant.
- Pull curtains closed.
- Arrange knock signals.
- · Answer telephone "hello." Do not use name and rank.


- Lock before you exit.
- If confronted, have a plan of action ready.
- · Occasionally exit/enter through the rear
- · Keep your room key in your possession at all times.

At all times:

- Vary eating establishments.
- Use alternative shopping locations.
- Do not establish any sort of pattern.
- Avoid crowded areas.
- Be alert exiting bars, restaurants, etc.
- Know how to use the local telephone system and carry "telephone change."
- · Know the emergency phone numbers for police, ambulance and hospital.
- · Know the location of the U.S. Embassy and other safe locations where you can find refuge or assistance.

"Being cautious is maintaining a low profile; not letting it be outwardly known that you are a servicemember," Solano said, "We need to do everything we can to make their (terrorists) job toug er."





"Communications are extremely vital," said Sgt. Michael Cedeno, mobile section head of headquarters. Marine 3rd Regiment communications platoon. "If there's no communication we're sitting in the dark. No war has ever been won without effective communication."

Marines from 3rd Marine Regiment and Combat Service Support Detachment 75 have provided the communications for the entire exercise. As Cedeno said. lines of communication are the first things that go up when setting up a combat operations center.

"The units can't get their water, fuel, ammunition or food if they can't establish communication, said Sgt. Scott McIntire, multichannel radio supervisor with CSSD-75.





Book Review

'The Defence of Duffer's Drift' looks at battle through trial and error

small-unit commander, one who has just recently joined the officer ranks, is given orders to defend a strategic piece of land with fifty men.


He tries different defensive tactics, but whatever he tries works only a little better than the previous attempt, and he continuously fails.

This is the premise of E.D. Swinton's novel, "The Defence of Duffer's Drift," a book on the commandant's reading list. Swinton was a general in the British army, and was considered an innovator in military matters by his contemporaries. He brought his knowledge to the table when writing "Duffer's Drift," a kind of primer on smallunit battle skills.

The main character of "Duffer's Drift" is Lt. Backsight Forethought, and it becomes clear as the story progresses that it is a name that suits the man.

Lieutenant Forethought has a dream about a certain battle scenario where he and his small group of men must hold a shallow river passage, called Duffer's Drift, during the Boer War in turn-of-the-century South Africa. He reacts in what seems to be the most obviously logical manner, yet he is unsuccessful in holding the position and must surrender to the enemy to avoid his unit being totally wiped out.

With a twist of science fiction, Forethought begins the dream over, and has the opportu-


nity to correct his mistakes. He has made mental notes to take stock of the lessons he's learned from the previous mistakes and takes steps to correct them.

Like the Bill Murray movie "Groundhog Day," Forethought relives the sequence over and over until he gets it right. Forethought experiences the dream six times before his lesson is learned and he succeeds in repelling the attacking Boers.

The lessons of "Duffer's Drift" are as simple as taking cover, which Forethought small-unit ground warfare.

learned with the first dream, to avoiding dead ground that hides the enemy from one's line of fire. But each lesson is fundamentally sound, which is why the book is a popular among military professionals.

The novel's idea is well-conceived and makes for interesting and educational reading. It has been used by commanders of various countries since its first publication in 1907, according to the novel's foreword, but is useful to anyone involved with



K-Bay explosives specialists aid with Vietnam recovery effort

Two MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay explosive ordnance disposal specialists returned from a six-week Vietnam War remains recovery effort

Gunnery Sgt. Mike Rawlings and Staff Sgt. Adam Price, both assigned to Combat Service Support Group 3, returned to Hawaii after participating in a recovery operation in which a team of specialists, comprised mostly of Hawaii-based military personnel, was to recover remains from the war in Southeast Asia.

"Basically, our job was to locate, identify and clear unexploded ordnance to clear the way for the excavation." Price said.

The two Marines augmented a Joint Task

Force - Full Accounting and US Army Central Identification Laboratory-Hawaii recovery team in the Quang Nam Province southwest of Da

Their recovery site was the location of a May 10, 1968 ground battle atop a small hill named Ngok Tavak, where friendly forces occupied a former French dirt-berm fort. A force of three Australians, eight Army Special Forces, 44 Marines, and 190 Chinese Nungs and South Vietnamese civilian irregular defense forces, were attacked and overrun by a battalion-sized force of North Vietnamese Army regulars. More than 100 defenders were able to escape through a napalm corridor, but 18 Americans stayed behind, either in the status of killed in action/body not recovered, or

missing and unaccounted-for.

Although both Rawlings and Price had served excavation efforts in Vietnam and Laos three times. Rawlings said this particular site was more interesting.

"This was the first time that we had a site at which there were multiple servicemembers." Rawlings said.

Price said the experience paid off for him.

"It was very rewarding for us," Price said. "Just to say we were able to bring back a fellow servicemember was great."



Windward Civilian / Military **Council to celebrate 20 years**

The Windward Civilian Military Council will celebrate its 20th year serving MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay. July 20, at the Officers

According to current Windward "Civ-Mil" Council chairman and charter member. DorothyRose Babineau, the council was "born" under less than fortunate circum=

"There was a Marine officer killed in Kailua in 1979, and the base commanding officer at the time was going to make Kailua and Kaneohe off limits to Marines as a result of the incident." Babinean said.

Ted Gibson, a charrer member of the council. said the decision by the base CO didn't ser well with some community members

"We wanted a chance to show the Marines that we weren't that bad," Gibson said.

The council was designed to establish a communication link between the base and the surrounding community, to mitigate occurances between the two entities.

"We felt if there was a close liaison between the community and the Marines and there were things festering between them, we could break it up, before anything happened." Gibson said.

"We wanted the civilians to realize that the military was part of the community as well," Babineau added.

The first meeting in 1979 seated 11 people eight community leaders and three military liaisons. Now, the council hears monthly reports from more than 30 community leaders and military liaisons.

Since its first meeting convened, the council has done many things to benefit both the military and surrounding community.

The council has arranged for The Bus to come aboard the installation to lessen the number of servicemembers hitch hiking and endangering themselves. They have also established a program for Marine volunteers to perform their daily physical training at Kailua

Beach Park, intended to bring assault to female runners to a halt, said Gibson, who is also responsible for a program that offers Marines the opportunity to have Christmas and Thanksgiving dinners in various homes throughout Kailua.

Babineau said the reason the council is still up and running 20 years later is because it

The meetings are very interesting. The information exchanged is very beneficial to both the community and the military." Babineau said.

One military liaison to the council echoed Babineau's sentiments.

"I think the council is great for building community relations and 'keeping the peace' between the military and the surrounding community," said Sgt. Jon Jerome, the MCB Hawaii kennel master with the Military Police Department here, and MCB Hawaii enlisted representative to the council. "Ir allows us to live harmoniously.

Jerome also said the council benefits both the military as well as the civilian community.

The council benefits the military because any problem involving military personnel is addressed by a neutral party. (thereby mitigating any further problems)." said Jerome.

The council allows civilian community members to have a direct impact on concerns without having to take the problem through military 'red tape'." Jerome explained.
What drove these two founding members of

the council was their love and understanding of military life. Gibson served in the Army Air Corps during World War II, and Babineau was a volunteer military nurse in her native home of Singapore during WWII as well.

I love Marines." Babineau said. "I was getting very irritated by hearing people yelling about the military and the land they're (community members) on, when the military is the reason they're still here.

"I guess it was just a feeling I had that people shouldn't be attacked just because they are in the military," Babineau added.



According to Steve Kalnasy, the Marine Corps Community Services varsity




> sports coordinator, several players praised the tonmament organization and hope to
