# Squadron flies 40,000 accident free hours

Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron Light 37 landed an SH-60B helicopter safely July 13 to successfully complete 40,000 hours free of class A accidents.

# Hawaii COLA decreases

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii --Servicemembers here may soon feel the effects of an upcoming cost-of-living allowance decrease on their monthly budgets.

Beginning Aug. 1, the COLA index for Oahu will be reduced from 116 to 112, and the new rates will be reflected in Aug. 13 paychecks.

So what does this mean for servicemembers on the island? For example, an O-3 with more than 10 years of service and three family members would lose about \$94 a month beginning Aug. 13. An E-6 with more than 10 years of service and three family members would lose about \$72 a month, under the

Following the 1999 Military COLA Survey for Hawaii, the Office of the Secretary of Defense Per Diem, Travel, and Transportation and Allowance Committee determined that the index should decrease, and notified Headquarters, U.S. Commander in

The committee provided advanced notice to allow servicemembers time to adjust their personal budgets, according to Eddie Fowler, personnel policy ana-

"When considering these adjustments, it is important to understand the intent of COLA," Fowler said. "COLA is designed to equate members' buying power overseas with the buying power of (mainland United States) based peers,"

To determine COLA indexes the committee conducts two overseas continental U.S. surveys - the living pattern survey and the retail price survey. The living pattern survey collects data from individuals about their shopping habits. such as places and amounts purchased. The retail price survey collects prices for about 160 items and services from the places identified in the other survey. The price survey compares items overseas and on the mainland, such as milk, cereal, fruits/vegetables, meat, canned goods, gasoline, car insurance, and

## Servicemembers help at BayFest

Several Marines and Sailors dedicated their time at the 1999 Ocean Concepts BayFest by helping out with the festivities both on the fair grounds and around MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, to promote community enjoyment and entertainment, while providing a secure and safe environment.

In addition to the Naval servicemembers helping out with the fair, Marines of Radio Reconnaissance Platoon, 1st Radio Battalion, and Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 363, treated a captive audience to a live demonstration of their insertion and extraction capabilities Saturday afternoon.

The experience showcased nearly every type of manner in which Marines could be dropped into their objective and retrieved. This ranged from parachuting into a pre-determined drop zone, to a "helo cast," where a CH-53D hovers about 15 feet above sea level and the Radio Recon Marines drop a zodiac boat, along with their team, into the water.

The demo hopefully helped foster a better understanding of military operations from local residents, said Sgt. Lorrin Bush, a paraloft chief with Radio Recon Platoon.

"I'd say about 85 percent of the civilians out there don't even know that we SPIE," said Bush, of the special patrol insertion and extraction portion of the demo in which Marines were airlifted by helicopter, tethered only by a rope under the aircraft.

"Most people think we just carry guns and tear (stuff) up," Bush continued. "Hopefully this will show the civilian community near the base what we do and that we're not out there

### First Radio Battalion Marines train as opposition force

Marines from Headquarters and Service Company. 1st Radio Battalion, stepped aside from their supporting role last week to team up with A Co., Radio Battalion, and train as a forefront oppo-

sition.

The training was the first of three one-week phases that H&S Co. will undergo as they prepare to put their learned skills and knowledge to work in the final phase of the battalion exercise. Field Excercise 2-99.

"It's not something you get to experience often," said Lance Cpl. Floyd Holley, a basic electrician for 1st Radio

This kind of training is important. "so that we can understand all aspects

of Marine Corps responsibilities," training at the Indoor Simulated added Lance Cpl. Mario Amaro, a signals analyst for 1st Radio Bn.

"We try to get as many people trained as possible," said 1st Sgt. Curtis A. Beauchamb, the H&S Company first sergeant, who added that corpsmen have been included in the training.

He also emphasized that the main focus of the training evolution is on the sergeants and their junior Marines.

"I am a firm believer on small unit leaders," said Beachamb. Throughout the course of training, sergeants ensured that their Marines were properly trained in several areas of infantry.

The companies separated into five platoons and took turns training at different stations each day for the first five-day phase. The stations included: Marksmanship Trainer, Combined Arms Staff Training, Medical Evacuation training with the Army, heavy-weapons familiarization, and Battle Skills Training.

According to Sgt. Jerry Koehler, an Indoor Simulated Marksmanship Trainer operator for 1st Radio Bn., the trainer provided Marines with an array of weapons such as the Shoulder-Launched Multipurpose Assault Weapon, MK19, Squad Automatic Weapon, 870M shotgun, 9mm pistol. M-16A2 service rifle, and .50 caliber machine gun, all of which "kick, handle, and react the same as the real

weapon," said Kochler. During Combined Arms Staff training, Marines covered classes in callingfor-fire and conducted practices in a simulation trainer that provided a model of a remote, mountainous desert.

Marines headed out to the landing zone at the Boondocker to learn about the reporting and recovery of casualties, basic field sanitation, basic first aid, and also practiced several different earries for transporting casualties. For one particular period of instruction, Marines learned how to use gear such as poles and "cammic" blouses to transport simulated casualties.

One Marine enjoyed guiding the Army UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter from the 45th Air Support Group as it came down on the landing zone to pick up simulated casualties.

"It was an experience just being able to tell the pilot where to come in," said Lance Cpl. Matthew Rutkowski, a crypto-technician for 1st Radio Battalion. "It was great combat training to see how to (transport) Marines."

And for the weapons familiarization section, many Marines got reacquainted with the MK19 and the .50 caliber machine gun as they set them up and took them apart.

"It's a good learning experience for non-infantry Marines," said Rutkowski. "We had a refresher course on the weapons all Marines should know. We've all seen them before and there's a good chance we'll see them again."

The last section for the first phase included Battle Skills Training, in which Marines were taught the basics of infantry by instructors from the Regimental School. Marines practiced camouflaging themselves and their equipment, prepared individual combat equipment for tactical operations, participated in a security patrol, and performed individual movements and rear area security.

"We're trying to teach them skills they need to defend themselves—a refresher course on basic infantry skills," said Sgt. Jamie Tresidder, a squad leader instructor.

For the second phase, the platoons are focusing on the "pre-deployment workup," including embarkation procedures and the staging for employment on Sunday. They will put all their knowledge to use in the field during the third phase.

And according to Marines from H&S Co., this training is essential for them to undergo, even though their main job is to work in support of other

"Every Marine is a basic rifleman," said Holley. "We never know when we might be called upon beyond our nor-

These two men are saving thousands of dollars for our Marine Corps and untold thousands of lives by making sure a piece of equipment is battle-ready for their Marines to train on. ## VP-47 sends crew to Malaysia

Navy Patrol Squadron 47 recently sent Combat Aircrew 11 to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia for a 10-day joint training exercise with the Malaysian Navy and Air Force and parts of the U.S. Naval fleet.

The visit, which is part of the Combined Afloat Readiness and Training exercises, is the first of many planned international trips the squadron has scheduled during the course of their West Pacific deployment.

Combat Aircrew 11 flew with the host squadron, Malaysian Air Force Squadron 16, and demonstrated the numerous capabilities the Navy's P-3 Orion possesses for tactical and maritime operations.

The first day was devoted to a symposium in which each squadron briefed the others about the various capabilities of their respective airplanes and tactics. Navy Lts. Chris Moorehead and Will McCarthy lectured about search and rescue operations, anti-submarine and surface warfare and overall mission planning for the P-3.

The crew's first flight was a familiarization flight with several Malaysian Air Force pilots. The passengers were very impressed, and at times overwhelmed, with the P-3's enormous dimensions and complex systems. The Malaysian squadron flies Beechcraft B2000T Super King Airs, which are very similar to what P-3 pilots finish up their advanced flight

"Seeing the King Airs brought back a lot of fond memories from flight school. That plane was always fun to fly," said Lt. Cmdr. Tony Chatham, Combat Aircrew 11's patrol plane commander.

The next several flights were centered on joint operations with the Malaysian Navy and U.S. Naval ships and aircraft in the Straits of Malacca. Combat Aircrew 11 flew various missions from range clearing flights so that the ships could sallely practice weapons firing, to offensive mining, and to anti-submarine warfare flights for tactical proficiency.

Each flight proved that when working as a team. American Naval forces afloat are capable of succeeding at any challenge that might arise in today's turbulent world.



trying to blow their roofs off.

The demonstration also helped military spouses see what exactly their husbands are talking about when they come home from work, said Bush's wife Susan, who watched her husband from the Marina pier with their three daughters.

For those interested in the ground side of infantry life, Marines from 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, displayed a wide variety of equipment they use from day-to-day, including 81mm mortars, scout sniper weapons, communication radios and several other weapons "indigenous to an infantry battalion." said Staff Sgt. Anthony Militano, a platoon sergeant for L Co., 3/3.

People within the local communities see servicemembers when they leave base to go out in town, but many don't understand exactly who they are and what they do until they attend demonstrations like the ones at BayFest, said to Lance Cpl. Jermaine Peake, a fireteam leader for L Co., 3/3.

"When they come out here and see what we do," said Peake, "they see us in a whole different light."

"I think it's important, especially in Hawaii, to show the locals some of the gear we work with and the jobs we do," added Lance Cpl. Jeremy Boulware, a rifleman for L Co., 3/3.

Some of the vehicles on display included humvees from 3/3 with mounted weapons,

an assault amphibious vehicle from Marine Regiment, and a fire rescue vehicle from Marine Corps Air Facility.

"It's important for (others) to know where their money going," said Militano. "If we want the public to support our Marine Corps, we need to let them into a piece of our world."

There were also several aircraft on display from both Marine and Navy

squadrons at K-Bay, including a CH-53D from Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 362, an SH-60B helicopter from Helicopter Anti-Submarine Light Squadron 37 and a P-3C Orion from Patrol Squadron 4.

With the recent welcoming of the three Navy patrol squadrons from Barbers Point Naval Air Station, VP-4's display served to inform K-Bay residents of their mission; primarily anti-submarine warfare, and also to show the lixed-wing aircraft they use.



## Armorers keep weapons in top condition

Marines are trained to be able to accurately engage targets with their weapons, whether they are firing 9mm pistols or Dragon

wire-guided anti-tank missiles. But Marines are not able to perform their duties to their utmost abilities if their weapons malfunction.

Base armorers have the challenging and important task of ensuring that Marines' weapons are ready to fire at a moment's notice and take care of malfunctions.

"The most important thing to a Marine is his rifle," said Sgt. Cedrick Dendy, ordnance chief for 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment.

"People rely on us to issue them good weapons," said Cpl. Gamel Ali, small-arms repairman with HQ Bn. "We're here for them, to give them the best weapon we can.

Each unit has different needs that must be met to ensure the operational levels of that unit are optimum. Infantry companies have a wide range of weapons that must be cleaned and repaired, and base support units have to keep rifles and pistols in top condition for the proficiency

"Cleaning and repairing weapons is an ongoing process," Dendy said. "The weapons don't break because of negligence; they break because Marines are working hard. If a Marine comes back with a broken weapon, that Marine will have a bruise on his body to match the broken weapon."

For infantry units, the tough treatment of the weapons is inevitable by the nature of "grunt" exercises. Many weapons return to the armory in need of a "Band Aid" to fix what ailments they got in the

"It takes a huge team effort," for the armory to continue to issue good weapons, Dendy said. "Every single person has a different talent. If I didn't have all elements here I'd drown,"

After a weapon is fired it's important that it is cleaned thoroughly to ensure that it fires at a later date. Many base armories have recently added solvent tanks that offer convenience for Marines by requiring less time for cleaning weapons. The tanks are also environmentally safe.

"It takes typically eight man hours to get the weapon back to acceptable cleanliness (with conventional methods)," said Dendy. "But with the solvent tank it only takes three and a half hours to get

Tips for cleaning rifles include focusing on the chamber area and bolt carrier group of the upper receiver and using a lot of elbow grease, according to Ali. It's also best to use just a light coat of CLP to clean the weapons, he said, so that excess dirt and dust don't cling to the weapon.

The cleanliness of the rifle helps out the next Marine in line to use that specific weapon, and each Marine shooter can easily put pride into knowing that their diligence in cleaning the rifle helped out another Marine.

"In the armory, Marines are 'low-vis,' so they feel like people don't recognize their talents," Dendy said. "I don't believe that's true, though, because it shows when the weapons make it through training operations intact. I know for me, being the go-to guy for the battalion staff is a great reward.

# MALSEK fully integrates Navy

Earlier this year, Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kaneohe, began integrating Navy personnel from Naval Air Station Barbers Point as part of the station's closure.

After several months together as a unified team consisting of Sailors and Marines working side by side, the coupling of these two "cultures" has proven itself a successful union, explained the unit's executive officer and top entisted personnel.

"The Marines here have been fantastic at welcoming us," said Navy Lt. Cmdr. Linda Weiland, the executive officer of MALSEK. "it's been an excellent opportunity to also learn another area of function."

Weiland said that although the Marines and Sailors come from two different backgrounds and have their own sets of customs. courtesies and traditions, the Navy/Marine Corps team is flourishing at MALSEK.

"The support we offer the squadrons has not been (negatively) affected," said Master Gunnery Sgt. Mario Lopez, the CH-53D class desk supervisor and acting MALSEK sergeant major. Lopez added that the Navy

squadrons are particularly happy with the support they've received.

Of course, integration hasn't been perfect. Lopez said. There has been some kinks.

One of which pertains to the differences between how Navy and Marines Corps administration and personnel sections operate, Lopez said.

"For example, Marines keep all their SRBs (service record books) at their units," said Navy Senior Chief Petty Officer Clair Gorsha, a quality assurance supervisor with MALSEK, and acting MALSEK master'

Navy personnel here, on the other hand, keep their SRBs in one centralized location at Personnel Service Detachment, Pearl Harbor.

The example of just one aspect of how things are done differently administratively is a challenge to correct, but it hasn't affected MALSEK's overall mission.

"We work side-by-side with one goal," said Gorsha. "Admin is just one of the things we're still working on."

"Everything's fine at the point we're at now, but there are things we need to work on. It's just a matter of fine-tuning," Lopez said. The new MALSEK is currently comprised

"We don't see an individual Sailor or individual Marine," she stated. "It's a troop."







## Process simplifies earning credits

A process that allows servicemembers to transfer their military training into college credits has recently become easier at MCB Hawaii's Joint Education Center.

The means of getting a DD-295, the document that shows what military schools and courses can be converted into college credits, has been ridded of time-consuming explanations and paperwork and is now a quick, convenient way to possibly earn free college hours, according to Cpl. Kristine Hoben, an education assistant at the education center.

"This is a service to (military servicemembers) to benefit their future," said Hoben-"This is a much faster way to get this information for Marines and Sailors.'

Before the system was automated, a servicemember was required to attend a class that covered how to look in the different manuals published by the American Council for Education and fill out lengthy documents. In addition, it took weeks for the documents to come back completed after they were mailed, said Hoben.

Under the new system, however, the servicemember fills out no paper work, isn't required to sit through a class and can get

results back in a matter of minutes, according es equate to college credits. Also, the respecto Loretta Cornett-Huff, the education officer at the education center.

"It's just a wonderful chronicle of details of the classes recognized by the education council (ACE)," said Cornett-Huff.

Now, all servicemembers have to do is call the center at 257-1232 for a DD-295 appointment, said Hoben. Marines, when they go in for their appointment, should take a copy of their Marine Corps Institute correspondence courses print-out. This document notes what courses a Marine has completed. They should also bring a copy of Page 8 from their service record books.

Sailors should take in their print-out for their Naval Education Training Manual correspondence courses and a copy of Page 4 from their SRBs, said. Hoben.

An education assistant then puts the servicemember's information into the computer and, once the results are computed, explains to the servicemember which aspects of their military training can be transferred as college credits and why, Hoben said.

Hoben and Cornett-Huff said that students should be aware that, because some military courses are too military-specific; not all courstive schools have discretion over which credits to accept.

"This process is more efficient and less time consuming, and that should encourage more people to do it." said Petty Officer 1st Class Nolen Kell, an aviation electrician with Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element, Kaneohe, and prospective college student who used the DD-295 process to earn credits towards his associate's degree.

"I've been in 15 years and that's a lot of schools," said Kell. "I never did it before now because it took so long."

Kell said, under the old system, education representative just handed servicemembers the manuals and simply told them to "do it." Now, however, the process is more customerfriendly and pleasant.

The education center schedules DD-295 visits by appointment only at K-Bay. A JEC representative is also available at Camp Smith for Marines on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. Appointments at Camp Smith are held on a walk-in basis, but Cornett-Huff asks that before coming in, call the JEC representative at 477-0412, to ensure he or she is available at that time.
