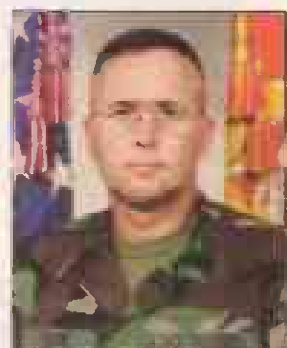

Marine foils K-Mart robbery

Funk

HONOLULU—Combat Service Support Group 3's sergeant major proved to be the hero of the day after he thwarted the getaway of a robbery suspect March 5 by literally running him down.

The stage was set when Sgt. Maj. Charles Funk was shopping with his wife Linda on her birthday at K-Mart. "I had just dropped my wife off at the front door of K-Mart and went to park the car," said Funk.

When he returned to the store, he found his wife at the customer service desk. Immediately, he sensed something was wrong.

"I noticed right away that the lady behind the counter and my wife were in an agitated state," explained Funk. "My wife said 'a guy just robbed K-Mart.'"

The two ladies described the alleged thief as wearing a white hard-hat and long-sleeve shirt, having left just seconds earlier.

With the culprit's description Funk went to the parking lot in pursuit of the suspect and did not return for close to an hour.

"I was worried and scared, but I had confidence in my husband that he would do the right thing," said Linda.

"I really didn't know what I would do if I confronted the individual," explained Funk. "My first thought was to keep him in sight and hopefully the police would show up and take care of it."

Quickly spotting the suspect at the other end of the parking lot, Funk called out for him to stop.

Realizing that he had been spotted, the alleged robber started to run, but Funk was determined not to let the suspect out of his sight.

The chase took Funk more than a mile before Funk finally caught up to the alleged thief.

"He kept turning around and putting his hand inside his shirt," explained Funk. "I sort of kept my distance because someone said he was carrying a gun."

By now several people had joined in the pursuit.

The chase took Funk and his counterparts across Salt Lake Blvd. towards the Ice Palace. Once he was behind the Ice Palace the suspect ran up a hill into a housing area.

After almost losing the pursuit of the suspect, Funk raced around a row of houses and spotted him. Again the sergeant major yelled for him to stop, and this time he did.

"You might as well stop running, just lie down on the ground and put your hands behind your back," Funk ordered the suspect.

To Funk's surprise, the suspect complied. He approached the dogged suspect cautiously and asked if he was armed.

"I couldn't understand him because he was out of breath," said Funk. "He was breathing really hard."

Funk quickly patted the suspect down and a security guard from K-Mart arrived with a pair of hand-cuffs and secured him properly. No weapon was found, but a toy gun was later recovered nearby in a paper bag that the suspect allegedly had with him during the robbery.

Shortly after being handcuffed, the suspect was taken into custody by the Honolulu Police Department and was charged with second degree robbery. Later that evening, after hours of giving statements and filling out paperwork, the Funks were finally able to go home.

Although this was not how Linda Funk planned to celebrate her 50th birthday, she said she wouldn't have expected her husband to act any other way.

When asked if she was disappointed that their plans to celebrate her birthday had changed because of the afternoon's events, Linda Funk's response was quick and adamant. "No, I knew right away what he would do... he's my hero."

Unit takes award for third time

Marine Corps Air Facility's Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting team earned extraordinary recognition during an awards presentation by the MCB Hawaii Commanding General Brig. Gen. R.E. Parker Jr. at the base flagpole March 7.

The Marines and Sailors of ARFF earned three Allen G. Ogden trophies from the Navy and Marine Corps Fire Protection Association for their diligent work in several facets of aircraft rescue and firefighting — an extremely rare feat.

They not only took the Ogden award in the "medium" facility category for the third consecutive year, but they also ran away with the overall Crash Fire Rescue Trophy, beating all other shore-based facilities in the Navy and Marine Corps such as those at Marine Corps Air Stations New River and Beaufort.

To apply for their awards, ARFF put together numerous documents of all the unit's training, community involvement, and strides and realistic goals in fire prevention and safety, said Chief Warrant Officer 2 Charles Thompson, the officer-in-charge of ARFF.

"The competition gets tougher and tougher every year," said Thompson. "What makes us unique is that we are the premier aircraft facility. We see and support just about every aircraft there is — in both military and civilian fleets. This gives us the ability to train on a wide variety of aircraft."

Servicemembers at ARFF work to ensure the safety of home-based aircraft such as Marine CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopters and Navy P-3C Orion patrol aircraft, as well as guest Marine F/A 18s and Air Force C-5 Galaxy transport aircraft.

Many individuals at ARFF also devote much of their time to community programs such as public tours of their facility, static displays, and a weekend street-to-street gift collection for the Toys for Tots program.

"This past year, we faced some extremely tough competition throughout the Navy and Marine Corps," said Lt. Col. Timothy Kolb, the MCAF commanding officer. "These awards are indicative of a true 'team effort' by all the Marines, Sailors, and civilians of MCAF, and by all those MCB Hawaii personnel who support us daily."

K-Bay squadrons deploy to India, Bangladesh

Two Marine helicopter squadrons from MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, deployed to Asia last week in support of Marine Helicopter Squadron 1, which provides helicopter support for the president of the United States.

Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 366 and Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 362, traveled to Dhaka, Bangladesh and New Delhi, India, respectively, to provide presidential support by transporting members of the press, foreign dignitaries and foreign military personnel for the month of March.

"It's not just an honor, but a complement that we were chosen to support the president and the squadron," said Lt. Col. Mark Dungan, the commanding officer for HMH-366.

After receiving word of the needed support for HMX-1, both squadrons were given nearly a week to break down their birds and pack their seabags for the deployment.

Leading the way, HMH-366 prepared their five CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopters to be loaded onto C-5 Galaxies March 6 and took off the very next day, while HMH-362 was soon to follow, with their four helicopters three days later.

"This shows how quickly a Marine unit, given the word, can deploy thousands of miles away," said Lt. Col. Mark Franklin, executive officer for HMH-366. "It stresses the expeditionary part of the Marine Corps mission."

Although the units were able to prepare for the deployment, Franklin said that many of the Marines in his squadron have never deployed outside the United

States, which made this unique for them.

"Everyone was really hyped up at the barracks last night (after the squadron got word that they would deploy)," said Cpl. Jacob Jones, the HMH-366 aviation operations noncommissioned officer.

The Marines will be tasked to ensure that the birds are functional and able to accomplish the mission with no setbacks throughout the deployment. The Marine squadrons are not the only Marines leaving for Asia.

Additional Marines from Marine Aviation Logistics Support Element Kaneohe and Combat Service Support Group 3 will also help HMX-1 with their efforts in India.

Pacific commander assesses command

WASHINGTON — U.S. military presence is vital in the Asian-Pacific region, where "flashpoints" abound, according to the nation's top military officer in the Pacific.

Navy Adm. Dennis C. Blair of U.S. Pacific Command briefed the Senate Armed Services Committee and Pentagon reporters here March 7 on regional security. He presented his assessment the day before Defense Secretary William S. Cohen departed on a 10-day trip to the region.

Long-standing tensions threaten serious conflict in Korea, the Taiwan Strait and Kashmir, the theater commander in chief said in his prepared statement to the committee. "Violent separatist movements and ethnic disputes in Burma, China, India, Indonesia, the Philippines and Sri Lanka set up vicious cycles of terrorism and repression within countries and threaten the region with refugee flows, export of terrorism, and crises between neighboring nations.

"Rapid economic development has created huge gaps in the distribution of wealth within many countries in the region," he continued. "Combined with corruption and privilege, this development has caused citizens to challenge the legitimacy of ruling political regimes and has further inflamed violence between ethnic and religious groups.

Speaking with Pentagon reporters following his Senate testimony, Blair praised the 300,000 men and women of his command.

"They're out there day in, day out, doing the hard jobs, making everybody proud of them — of a country that can produce folks like that, whether they're soldiers on the DMZ in Korea or they're airmen in Diego Garcia fixing airplanes, or all of the other service people," he said. "We need to take care of them — we who lead them, those of you who write about them, and members of Congress, who I talked to this morning, who also support them — and they'll take care of us."

The admiral detailed his perspectives on some of the region's problems. "North Korean armed forces have just finished the heaviest winter training cycle that we have seen in recent years, showing that they certainly, in the midst of this terrible economic and agricultural situation, are devoting resources to a military capability," said the admiral, who assumed command about a year ago.

The United States, Japan and South Korea are making diplomatic efforts to establish ties with North Korea. America's military presence on the Korean Peninsula, Blair said, "provides a strong deterrence and serves as a foundation for the recent diplomatic moves which have made some progress in key areas."

Defense officials are also closely watching developments in South Asia. In the past year, India and Pakistan have fought a war in the Siachen Glacier, Blair said. "And tensions remain high between those two countries, both of which now have nuclear weapons." He visited India in January and said he's optimistic about establishing good working relations with India.

Indonesia has also gone through tremendous political, economic and military changes in the past year. When East Timor voted in August for independence, he said, Indonesia "behaved very, very badly, permitting, if not abetting, repression and brutality against the citizens of East Timor." The United States cut off military ties with Indonesia, but hopes to resume relations soon, he added. "But it will have to be done under the right conditions, when the time is appropriate."

At its height, about 200 U.S. troops supported an Australian-led international peacekeeping mission in East Timor. Another 200 U.S. troops provided support in Darwin, Australia. The United States also diverted Navy ships visiting in the area to provide Marine helicopters and other support ashore.

"I think this is a new pattern for cooperation that the United States participates in Asia and perhaps in the world. For my money, it's a very positive one," Blair said. "It's sort of a third gear between being in charge and running the whole thing and not participating at all."

The Philippines is now leading the U.N. mission in East Timor. About two dozen U.S. staff officers are in Dili, East Timor, supporting the U.N. staff there, Blair said. They're also coordinating periodic U.S. deployments of construction engineers, Navy Seabees, medical units, some more transportation units, other assessment and support functions.

Blair said he recently completed his first trip

to the Republic of China since becoming theater commander. He said Taiwan took center stage during his talks with Chinese officials during his visit.

"I urged restraint and moderation on the Chinese leaders with whom I talked," the admiral said. Both sides agree a peaceful resolution to the tension over Taiwan is in everyone's best interests, he added.

"They've got people working on their military preparations, but I think their overall thrust is toward a peaceful resolution," he said. "They think force is an ultimate weapon in their tool kit, but I don't see near-term sorts of preparations to use it."

Blair noted the deployment patterns of China, Taiwan and the United States are fairly normal at the moment. "There are some small variations, but none of us is preparing for major military moves there, and that's good," he said.

As to a Chinese move on the offshore island, Blair's assessment was simple: "Should China undertake military action to try to invade Taiwan, they would not be successful in taking it and holding it."

The difficulty of mounting an invasion and Taiwan's strong military posture underlie China's move toward a peaceful resolution rather than the use of military force, he said. Seventy to 100 miles of open water lie between China and Taiwan, Blair noted, and Taiwan has built up its defenses over the years.

China's forces modernized at what the admiral described as a "measured pace." "They're capable of doing a lot of damage to Taiwan with the several hundred missiles that they have, with the navy and the air force that they have," he said.

An invasion would cause economic hardship for Taiwan, he said, but also for China in terms of international reactions — and at a time when China's professed top priorities are economic and technological reform and taking care of its people.

Chinese leaders know a strike on Taiwan would destroy all the progress they've made in joining the world economy, he added, and yet they continue strengthening their forces in the region.

Pacific Command is doing "a lot of the military groundwork that lies under that sort of an arrangement," he said. "It can be a foundation for a greater peaceful development in that part of the world, and that's in this country's interest, and that's in the interest of the countries that are there."

Marines enhance amphibious capabilities

Regimental Marines advanced their amphibious capabilities at Marine Corps Training Area Bellows March 8 and 9 in a variety of Amphibious Assault Vehicle exercise.

The Marines of K Company, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, and AAV Platoon, Combat Support Company, 3rd Marine Regiment, trained in preparation for the Cooperation Afloat Readiness and Training exercise in the Western Pacific in May.

"Most of the Marines are comfortable with land operations, but now it is time to work on the amphibious portion," said Gunnery Sgt. George Young, AAV Plt. commander.

More than 140 Marines from Kilo Co. loaded up in the back of the AAVs and worked on their vehicle embarking and debarking skills, transferring from one vehicle to another at sea, and aban-

doning a simulated sinking AAV.

Before the Marines were taken out to sea, they practiced on the beach.

One of the training exercises was the "bump and run," where one AAV would get beside another that was supposedly sinking, so Marines could safely climb out of the top hatch of the sinking AAV and step over to the working AAV.

Another exercise included the procedures for abandoning a vehicle with no help from another AAV.

Marines gathered their gear, jumped off the side and quickly swam as far from the sinking AAV as they could.

"Some of the Marines have never been in the back of an AAV," said Capt. John Hatala, Kilo Co. commanding officer. "This training will get them familiar with the operations they will perform on CARAT."

Training at Bellows allowed Marines to work in an environment with calm water where they could safely and

quickly get on and off an AAV, explained Hatala.

After taking the classes taught by AAV staff noncommissioned officers and practicing on the beach, the Marines geared up for an amphibious assault on the beach.

They traveled nearly 300 meters from the beach in their AAVs, turned around and assaulted the beach.

Marines charged out of AAVs, with weapons in hand; all prepared for any enemy they might encounter.

After the two-day training evolution, the Marines began to further prepare for deployment by conducting maintenance on their vehicles and weapons and working on other tactical exercises.

During CARAT, Marines are scheduled to visit places like the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Malaysia, as they showcase the talents of the U.S. Marine Corps ground combat element to foreign dignitaries.

SERGEANT MAJOR'S CORNER

Marines urged to take care of their own

Most of the time when I talk or write about the Marine Corps, I like to refer to our esprit de corps as the "soul" of the Marine Corps. For me, it is that soul, that esprit de corps, and those other intangibles of what it takes to be a Marine, that makes our Corps and the Marines who make it up so very special.

I also believe it is that soul that we, the staff noncommissioned officers of the Corps, need to speak of from time to time to re-enforce the special bond between all Marines.

This week, I would like to share with you a story that occurred a few days ago that was a perfect example of the esprit de corps and bond between Marines.

A few weeks ago, a retired Marine colonel by the name of Lyle V. Tope called my office and asked if I could assist him in a matter he was working on. Colonel Tope had retired here in Hawaii in 1971 after a career in the Marine Corps that had spanned three wars and more than 30 years. Colonel Tope, you see, was assisting a Marine with obtaining a promotion which Col. Tope thought he so richly deserved.

Now you may ask yourself what is so spectacular about a retired Marine colonel trying to get one of his men promoted. Well, if that were the end of the story, I would agree with you. But what I think makes this situation so special is the fact the promotion was earned under fire on the battlefield more

than 57 years ago. What Col. Tope was trying to do was honor what might be the last wish of a World War II combat U.S. Marine.

After the colonel and I spoke on the phone, I asked him to send me the supporting documents he had, and I would look into the matter for him. He told me that while his eyesight was failing, he felt so strongly about getting this Marine properly promoted, he would make the trip to my office and deliver the documents in person.

We made an appointment, and on the designated morning I met Col. Tope in my office. I certainly did not need anyone to introduce us because as soon as I saw the tall, stately looking gentleman in the outer office, I knew at once it had to be him. While his hair was gray and his eyesight not what it once was, he still struck an imposing figure of a Marine officer — tall, lean and weathered by years of service in peace and war.

After getting the colonel a cup of coffee, we sat down in my office and started to talk about what the colonel needed done. Marines, if you have never taken the time to speak to a World War II Marine, I highly encourage you to do so.

Listening to him in my office, I was transported back in time to a distant battlefield in the Pacific where Marines were locked in a desperate fight against a determined enemy. In those few minutes, he took us back to the morning of July 23, 1944, and the story of Pfc. James Park, USMC.

Pfc. Park was a member of the 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division on the sixth wave of the assault on the Japanese-held island of Guam.

Pinned down by intense enemy fire, midway between the beach and a tree line, his company commander, Capt. Glenn, was fatally wounded. With a withering mortar barrage decimating his fellow

Marines, it was evident they would have to move off the beach or be annihilated where they were.

With most, if not all, the officers killed or wounded, as well as most of the NCOs, one of the few remaining sergeants called out to Pfc. Park over the deafening roar of battle, "Take over, Jim, you're the lead corporal now!"

In those few seconds, as his sergeant's voice rang out over the screams of dying and wounded men, Pfc. Park was promoted to corporal, just as sure as anyone of us who has had his or her promotion warrant read in the safety of a peacetime Marine Corps.

Now with the responsibility of not only his own life but the lives of other Marines in his hands, newly-promoted Cpl. Park did what he could and somehow moved the survivors off the beach. He did his job — he did what noncommissioned officers are paid to do.

He led his men in combat with no fanfare, no paper work and no promotion warrant. There were no formalities that morning in Guam 57 years ago — just men locked in combat in a life or death struggle against a determined enemy.

Later that same afternoon, shrapnel from a mortar burst shattered Cpl. Park's right leg between the knee and hip, and for him, the battle for Guam had come to an end. He was evacuated to the USS Jackson and subsequently transferred to the hospital ship USS Solace. There, it was necessary to amputate his leg.

Many years later, when Col. Tope went to visit Mr. Park, he asked him if there was anything that he could do for him. Mr. Park's only request to the colonel was to have his promotion to corporal made official. With so many of the officers and NCOs killed during the battle, the paperwork which would have made him a permanent corporal was lost. At the time of his discharge, the rank of private first

class, not corporal, was on his discharge papers, which had bothered him to this day. Well, Marines, it also bothered Col. Tope.

This is where the soul of the Corps, our esprit de corps, what makes being a Marine so very special, comes into play and shines ever so very brightly. Colonel Tope took on the mission to get a Marine a promotion he so richly deserved, many years after the fact.

Why? Because that's what Marines do. Marine leaders take care of their people. It is expected — it is the Corps.

I thanked the colonel for stopping by and now I have taken the case and am working with Sergeant Major of the Marine Corps Sgt. Maj. Alford McMichaels to try to take care of this matter.

But the point of the story is, regardless of the outcome Headquarters, Marine Corps decides on, this promotion demonstrates that "Marines take care of their own." Not sometimes, not when it is convenient, not when you can get something out of it for yourself, but always. That's what Marines do.

That's what makes us different — it is what I try to remind you about each week. Being a Marine is more than just a job to earn money toward a college education. It is more than just a way to earn money to support a family. It is a bond of brotherhood, of warriors, of men and women that put their fellow man ahead of themselves.

It is what has kept me in its ranks for more than 29 years, and what I hope you think about each time it comes for you to decide to re-enlist or get out. It is the soul of our Corps.

I hope we are able to help Col. Tope and "Cpl." Park out, as it is the right thing to do. It is the Marine thing to do. I will keep you posted on the results.

K-Bay squadron returns from mainland exercises

Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 363's main body returned home last week after two months of combined arms exercises at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center Twentynine Palms, Calif.

Half of the squadron's Marines returned to MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, while the other half continued on to Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, Ariz. to assist at the Weapons Tactics Instructor's Course.

The squadron's "Red Lions" participated in CAX as part of the squadron's biennial training to expose the Marines to other aircraft and ground units.

"It's good for the young guys," said Sgt. Ivan Colon, a crew chief with HMH-363. "They've really never experienced that stuff."

The training was helpful for more than just the younger Marines, said Capt. Steve L. Cantrell, the operations officer and a CH-53D Sea Stallion helicopter pilot.

"The training is incredible," he said. "It brings the air guys and the ground guys

together in a large exercise."

The new experiences for many Marines didn't end with close exercises amongst other air and ground units.

The elements also created unique complications, Cantrell said.

"It's a challenging environment for the pilots," he said, as he explained the terrain. "(Landing) is much more difficult on the desert surface."

Pilots also dealt with the added challenges of darker nights, because of no surrounding town lights, and very jagged and uneven terrain, Cantrell said.

The squadron additionally stepped up its operational tempo during the exercises, keeping a pace similar to combat situations.

"We surged tremendously for CAX," Cantrell said.

"This was the opportunity for us to hone our skills, working around the clock," Cantrell added.

Throughout the exercises, Marines worked 12 hours a day, seven days a week.

All the work hours showed in the squadron's performance.

"The Red Lions performed superbly," he said. "It really changed what (the other units) thought Hawaii Marines were like."

Each squadron was tasked with a certain amount of flying time. Cantrell said HMH-363 not only accomplished their assigned missions, but they also "picked up where other squadrons" fell short.

The squadron was able to raise their combat readiness percentage by 10% with all the practice they received.

With a final score of 90%, based on how often a squadron performs challenging flights, HMH-363 matched what a similar squadron needs to be part of a Marine expeditionary unit, he said.

The squadron also qualified six Marines as aerial gunners, by which they demonstrated their proficiency with a .50 caliber machine gun while in flight, said Cpl. Bethany O'Neal, the squadron's training noncommissioned officer.

"It's a necessity, especially in combat," O'Neal said.

The rest of the squadron is scheduled to return in mid-April.

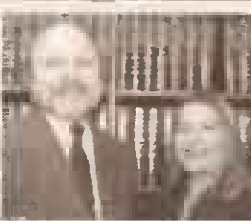

Camp Smith, K-Bay Marines hone warrior training skills

Three platoons of Headquarters and Service Battalion Marines and Sailors left their Marine Forces Pacific offices at Camp H.M. Smith and headed out to the training areas of Schofield Barracks last week for the study and practical application of basic infantry skills.

The week-long exercise was part of semi-annual training that Marines and Sailors from MCB Hawaii, Camp H.M. Smith and Kaneohe Bay undergo to retain the basic warrior skills they learned in boot camp and Marine Combat Training.

"This (training) is so the Marines don't get away from being basic riflemen," said Gunnery Sgt. Terry Dennis, company gunnery sergeant for Headquarters Co., Headquarters and Service Bn., MarForPac, and experienced infantry unit leader. "If we have to deploy somewhere, we can count on them to hold their position."

Marines studied patrolling, land navigation, first aid and weapon systems such as the M249 Squad Automatic Weapon, M203 40mm grenade launcher and 9mm pistol.

Third Marine Regiment, Combat Service Support Group-3 and Aviation Support Element, Kaneohe, assisted in the training.

The Marines put their knowledge to the test during day and night patrols, live-fire exercises and a 24-hour

simulated war, in which each of the platoons battled one another.

"They're doing the same thing we do," said Cpl. Brian Norris, an infantry Marine from 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, temporarily assigned to the military police unit at Camp Smith.

These Marines could easily be called upon to help assist the infantry units in a combat situation, said Cpl. Damon Boucher, a trombone player in Marine Forces Pacific Band.

Refreshing their knowledge and keeping them up to date on troop movements and tactics was the purpose of the exercise, said Capt. Thomas Wood, operations officer for Headquarters and Service Company.

The improvement in infantry knowledge became evident as early as the middle of the exercise by their improvement in basic infantry skills, Dennis said.

"You don't really learn the stuff until you get hands on instruction," Boucher said. "I could barely remember how to load a (squad automatic weapon)."

The training, coupled with classes, was better than trying to brush up on these skills by reading manuals for many of the Marines, said Cpl. Celeste Wagner, a lifeguard with Marine Corps Community Services, Camp Smith.

"Most of us sit behind a desk all day and don't get this type of training," Wagner said. "I'm getting a greater respect for the Marines who do this every day."

K-Bay Marines, Sailors treat elementary students to visit

Up in the morning with the rising sun ... 32 Marines from MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, visited Lanikai Elementary School March 8 during a special Adopt-a-School function.

Although most of the Marines came from the Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting section of Marine Corps Air Facility, the Adopt-a-School sponsor of Lanikai, units such as Weapons Company, 2nd Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment; Headquarters Battalion, Kaneohe Bay; and Communications Platoon, 1st Radio Battalion, also contributed to the drug awareness/fitness program featured that day.

"What we're trying to do is instill a positive image to the children," said Gunnery Sgt. Kimberly Bush, the crash chief for ARFF. "This is to let the kids and the com-

munity know that Lanikai is our school too and we stand behind them through the good and the bad."

According to Bush, the Marine volunteers wanted to spend time and have fun with the children after their school recently faced a few negative incidents such as the theft of their computers and a drug bust in the area.

When asking for support from the other units, Bush said everyone was willing to help out.

"They were more than supportive," said Bush. "This wouldn't have happened without teamwork and there was no hesitation from anyone."

Volunteers from ARFF took the children on one-mile runs to the sound of Marine cadences around the nearby Kailua Beach Park, and Marines from 2/3 and 1st Radio Battalion provided static displays of four

humvees and other Marine tools of the trade.

"I think the children enjoyed it a lot," said Staff Sgt. Jerome Little, the platoon sergeant for Weapons Co. 2/3. "Most of them haven't seen military vehicles."

"It's good to get out into the community and show what we do," added Lance Cpl. Steve Garrison, a tube-launched, optically tracked, wire-guided missile gunner for Weapons Co., 2/3.

Sparky, the fire safety dog, from ARFF also made his appearance with two K-Bay firefighting trucks. The military police also provided the children with a drug dog and bomb detection demonstration.

"The Marines bring a lot of enthusiasm," said the Lanikai School principal Donna Estomago. "I just love it because they bring the whole community together. It just makes for a solid experience that pulls the school together."

Marines take on Okinawa endurance course

JUNGLE WARFARE TRAINING CENTER, Okinawa, Japan — The squad crawled quietly to the edge of the foul-smelling, murky water, climbing in one-by-one while keeping their heads and weapons above water. As the squad moved downstream, thick, white smoke belled around the Marines, impairing their vision.

Suddenly through the smoke, a small, submerged tunnel appeared. The squad leader gave the command to go through the tunnel. One-by-one, Marines disappeared under the water, then popped out on the other side of the tunnel covered in mud. Cold, tired and muddy, the Marines charged on.

This scene set the stage as more than 200 Marines and Sailors from 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines, here as part of the Unit Deployment Program from Marine Corps Base Hawaii, tested what they had learned about rough terrain and jungle warfare on the Endurance Course Feb. 26.

The Marines from 1/3 spent three hours rappelling, swimming and low-crawling their way through the course, which was designed to better prepare them for combat in a jungle environment.

"This was a great opportunity for us to apply what we have already learned," said Lance Cpl. Todd M. McDaniels, a Charlie Co., 1/3 infantryman.

Throughout the course, 1/3 Marines had to negotiate such obstacles as the two- and three-strand rope bridges, pit 'n pond, and hasty rappel. The course began with a quick march in the rain to a hill used for hasty rappelling.

"Just like they say, ... 'If it ain't raining, we ain't training,'" said Lance Cpl. Daniel Trevino, an Alpha Co., 1/3 infantryman. "A little rain and some cold weather never hurt anybody."

Once at the hill, 1/3 Marines slung their weapons, put on their black leather gloves, grabbed the rope, and proceeded down the steep decline.

At the bottom, they ditched their ropes and made their way up a hill to the start of the three-strand ropebridge. Upon arriving at the bridge the Marines made their safety harnesses. With the help of an instructor, they attached themselves to a safety rope and made their way across.

After getting across the three-strand bridge, the Marines made their way back across on the two-strand bridge.

Shedding their safety equipment, they hasty rappelled down the face of another hill to the middle of a river. They then jumped in and proceeded downstream to a tunnel that led them to an embankment.

After climbing out of the water, the Marines caught their breath while studying the contents of a window box.

They had to recall the objects at the end of the pit 'n pond obstacle.

"We do this part of the obstacle so we can see how good the Marines are at remembering things for an extended period of time," said Lance Cpl. Aaron K. McQuerry, the Jungle Warfare Training Center maintenance chief.

Though exhausted, wet and cold, the Marines proceeded forward to the pit 'n pond obstacle.

Here the Marines crawled through a submerged tunnel to practice moving through water and trenches with the assistance of their fellow Marines.

After the pit 'n pond, the heaviest Marines in the squads were carried on field-expedient stretchers to the end of the course.

Once the training was over, the Marines, as well as all their gear, were hosed off.

"The amount of rain made the course a bit more muddy and slick than usual for these Marines," said McQuerry. "But despite the weather, the Marines did considerably well."

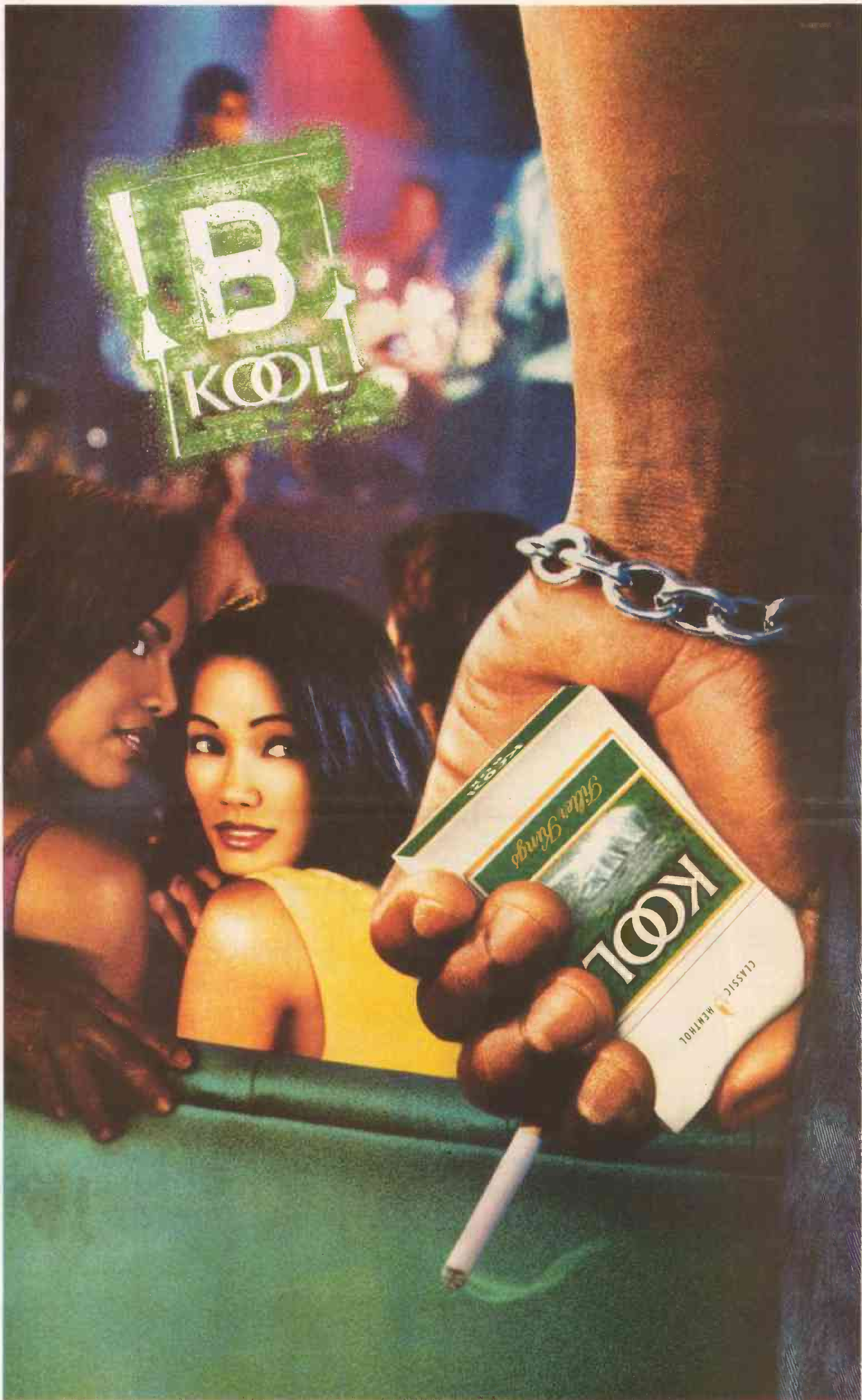

K-Bay holds Youth Fitness competition

Student-athletes from Hawaii high schools put out maximum effort during the Marine Corps Youth Physical Fitness competition Friday morning at Pop Warner Field aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, while Marines and Sailors served as officials for the event.

The servicemembers counted repetitions and kept time for the five athletic events that comprised the competition, in which more than 250 students took part.

The physical fitness event, in its 29th year in Hawaii, involved team and individual athletic events in each of five areas: sit-ups, push-ups, pull-ups, broad jump and shuttle run.

Fifteen high schools from four islands brought their six-person teams to the competition.

The event, as well as physical training in general, promotes healthy, drug and alcohol-free lifestyles for youth, said retired Cmdr. John Hutchison, the naval science instructor at Campbell High School and the event coordinator.

"This physical fitness event gives kids a healthy focus on good life habits," Hutchison said.

"Also, the spirit of competition helps kids focus on excellence. They don't get sidetracked by adverse things in school," Hutchison explained.

After funding and support for the event through the Department of Education waned about four years ago, the Naval JROTC unit at Campbell High adopted administrative control of the Youth Physical Fitness event, Hutchison said, with the continued support of MCB Hawaii.

"As long as I've been here the event has always been held aboard MCB Hawaii," said Hutchison, who has led the Campbell High JROTC program for seven years. "We've figured out how to keep it running smoothly with the good support we've gotten from the Marine Corps. It has been good exposure for the kids to see the Marines as role models."

Marines and Sailors who took part in the event were more than willing to give of themselves to make the activity a success.

"It was a good opportunity to take some time to help out the youth," said Sgt. Howard Ueckert, supply chief and euphonium player with the

Marine Forces Pacific Band, who officiated the push-up event. "I like to work with kids any little chance I get."

High school is one of the most impressionable times for teenagers, and this is a chance for them to see someone who can be a role model."

While some of the more than 20 servicemembers took time off from work to help out, others sacrificed their day off to lend a hand.

"It feels good to help them out — we were all kids once, you know," said Lance Cpl. Gabriel Jaramillo, a passenger section clerk with the Traffic Management Office aboard MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay, who spent his liberty time with the teenage athletes.

Many of the schools brought students who are part of the JROTC program, though each high school in Hawaii is invited to send as many as three teams to the competition, regardless of JROTC affiliation.

Those teams that place high in the Youth Physical Fitness competition have the opportunity to advance to the national level event, scheduled to be held May 12-13 aboard Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego.

Hutchison noted that Lanai High School, from the island of Lanai, traditionally brings some of the best teams to the event, and the 2000 competition was no exception.

Lanai High School's two boys' teams earned the top two male team spots, and the girls' team followed suit by winning first in the female division.

Kaimuki High School grabbed third place in the boys division, while Kahuku and Farrington were second and third, respectively, in the female team division.

"This is a significant event that determines whether or not they qualify for the national title," said Steven Haban, assistant coach at Lanai, who noted that the Lanai High teams practiced twice each day, at 4:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., to prepare for this event.

"They students get really hyped up to do their best here. The kids take it seriously and really put their hearts into it," Haban added.

The sit-ups and push-ups were timed, allowing two minutes for the athletes to rack up as many repetitions as possible.

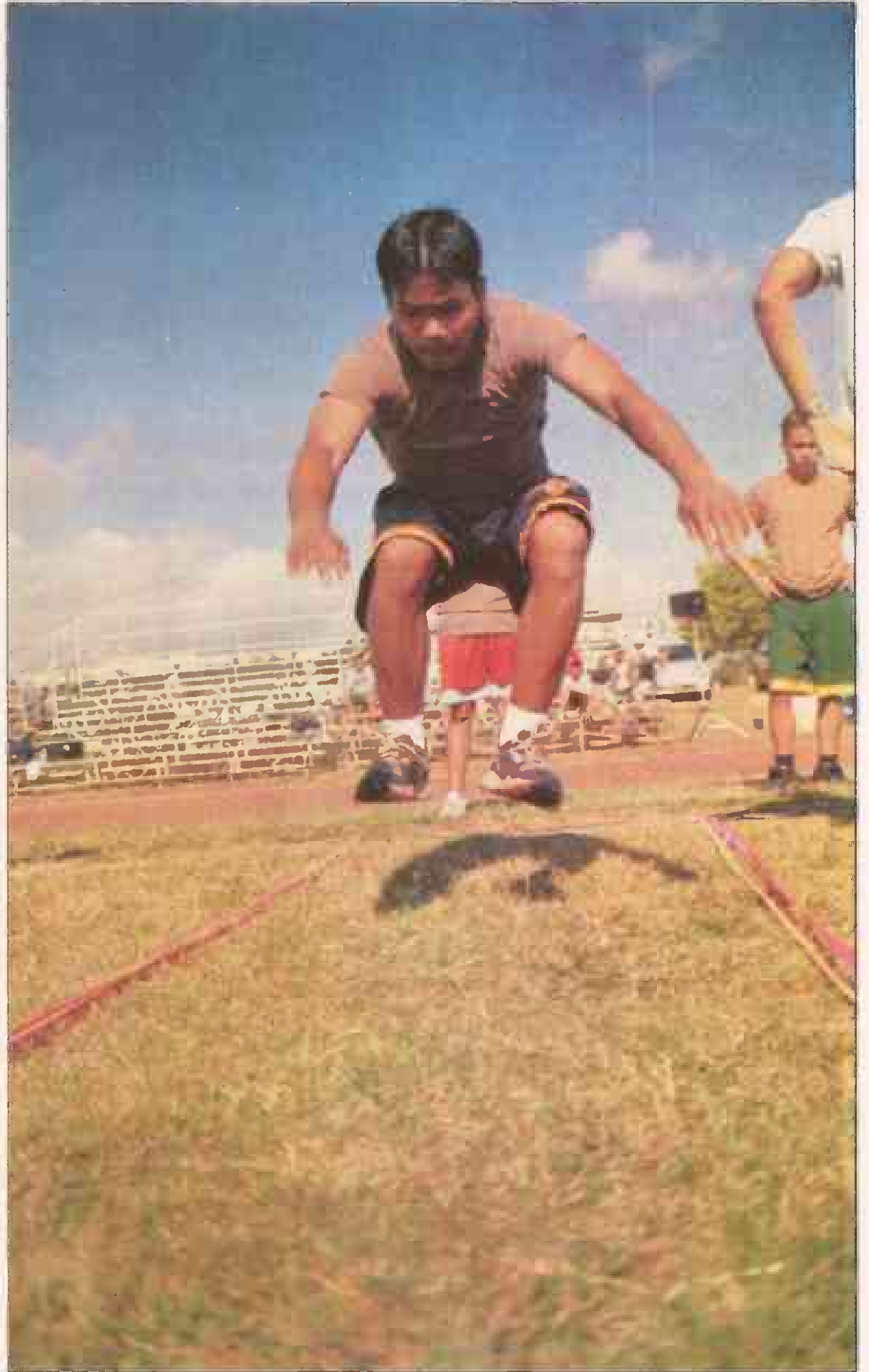

The pace didn't slow down, as there was a three-minute rest period in between each station.

The athletes received points for their performance, which went toward the six-member team total, and also qualified the students for individual honors, said retired Senior Chief Petty Officer Linda Naki, an assistant naval science instructor at Campbell High.

Earning points wasn't the only benefit the competitors enjoyed, though.

"It was great to get the opportunity to interact with students from other schools, especially the other islands," said Angela Mercado, 17, a Castle High School senior and member of the Marine

Corps JROTC program there.

"The physical fitness event gives us a goal — something to train hard for," Mercado added.

"The physical events are pretty fun," said Stephen Song, 16, a sophomore at Castle High. "I like how everybody is getting together and practicing teamwork."

Though hot, tired and sweaty after more than four hours in the morning sun, many of the young athletes appeared to have enjoyed their opportunity to show off their physical prowess.

Likewise, the equally hot, tired and sweaty Marines and Sailors said they were happy to have lent a hand to a worthy event.

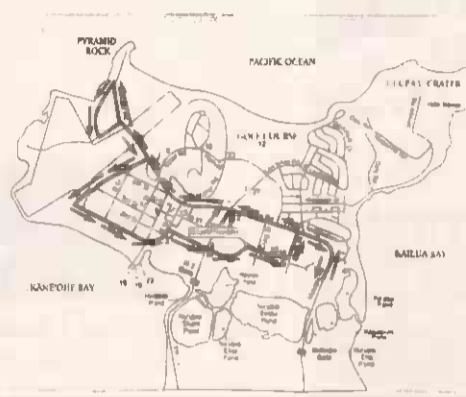
