FORT BRAGG, N.C. (May 5, 2015) - Lt. Gen. Stephen J. Townsend took command of the XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg during a change of command ceremony on Fort Bragg's Main Post Parade Field.

Townsend followed Anderson with brief remarks to the audience, thanking him and the Fort Bragg community for the warm welcome.

"I'll make one promise today: When the next crisis comes, and the phones start ringing, the XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg will be ready."
